Introduction

“But thou shalt remember the LORD thy God: for it is he that giveth thee power to get wealth, that he may establish his covenant which he sware unto thy fathers, as it is this day.” – Deuteronomy 8:18 (KJV)

We continue from where we stopped in the previous service as we examine the subject of **Power to Get Wealth.**

Before I proceed, I want to throw some light on a few things. You need to understand that your parents did not come together for you to be born. Your parents came together because you had to be born. You are not the effect of two people who could not control themselves. You are the product of two people God brought together to bring forth a giant.

Understand that your existence in this world is not a function of chance. You are a child of greatness. You are a child of positivity. You must settle that in your spirit.

Our Walk with God Is a Walk of Faith

The Bible says: *“The just shall live by faith.”* — **Romans 1:17 (KJV)**

Again:

“Now the just shall live by faith.” — **Hebrews 10:38 (KJV)**

Our walk with God is a walk of faith. However, Romans 3:27 speaks of **the law of faith**. That means faith is not merely a concept; it operates by law. The law of faith is activated by the force of faith.

Jesus said:

“...whosoever shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart... he shall have whatsoever he saith.” — **Mark 11:23 (KJV)**

Notice that the promise begins with action: **“Whosoever shall say...”**

Faith is not passive. Faith is active.

In physics, Isaac Newton's law of universal gravitation explains that there is a force that powers the law. The law exists because the force exists. In the same way, there is no manifestation of the law of faith without the force of faith.

Many people say: “I believe God for healing.”

“I believe God for a breakthrough.”

Yet nothing changes because they have not taken the step necessary to activate the law. Without the force, there is no operation of the law.

Wealth Is God's Will for the Believer

Why am I saying all of this?

Because God has already promised wealth to His people. But until you understand the forces that activate that promise, you may carry a Bible and still carry sickness.

You may possess treasure and still experience bankruptcy. You may carry abundance and still live in scarcity. There are people whose names are written in a will, yet they remain stranded because they are unaware of what has been left for them.

The Word of God is the Will of God. A will is a testament that has a testator. That is why we have the Old Testament and the New Testament. God's will for you is clear:

- That your light should shine.
- That you should advance and accelerate.
- That your life should be projected.
- That you should take charge.
- That wherever the sole of your foot treads, you should possess.
- That a thousand may fall at your side and ten thousand at your right hand, but it shall not come near you.
- That you should walk in health even as your soul prospers.
- That your seed should be blessed.
- That a little one should become a thousand and a small one a mighty nation.

The Lord will hasten it in His time.

Somebody say:

“I am walking in the will of God.”

The Covenant of First Things First

The third empowerment for wealth is the covenant of **First Things First**.

Somebody say:

“First Things First.”

This is God's law of priority.

A man named Bill Beckham said:

“We do what we value; that is why we value what we do.”

In economics, there is the concept of opportunity cost—the choice of one thing over another based on importance.

That is what priority is.

The law of first things first is the law of priority.

Many people never enjoy wealth because they do not understand that life is governed by laws.

To be lawless is to become lifeless.

To reject law is to remain low.

Every high flyer functions by laws.

Where there is no law, there is disorder. Where there is no law, people refuse to live within the boundaries of discipline. The strength of every nation lies in its institutions. When institutions lose discipline, society descends into chaos.

Somebody say:

“In the name of Jesus, I will follow the laws of wealth.”

You Are Defined by Your Priorities

Many people live without priorities. You do not simply wake up and go through life. You must live intentionally. A life of priority is a life of purpose.

Every act of boredom is often the result of a life that lacks priorities. Every man is defined by what he prioritises. If you are consumed by football, we call you a footballer or a football fan.

If you are consumed by God, we call you godly. If you are consumed by your profession, we call you a professional. If you spend your entire day discussing people, we call you a gossip. You are defined by what you prioritise.

Many people have great destinies but poor priorities. Priority means doing things in their proper order. It means identifying what is urgent and necessary before dealing with what is less critical.

Your value system reveals your priorities. Your daily schedule exposes your value system. What you consistently do is what you truly value. Some wake up every day focused only on opening their shop.

Others spend hours watching Netflix, eating popcorn and ice cream, moving from one series to another while life passes them by. The people you are watching are making impact while you are merely watching.

One actor dies in one movie and appears alive in another because he was paid to die in the first and paid to live in the second. You are not being paid to watch him. Instead, you are spending your own money on data.

Life is moving.

When will you achieve enough that people sit down to watch your own story?

That is a question of priority.

Excellence Begins in the Mind

The Lord spoke to me and said:

“Son, your ministry already has the fire. It already has the gift. It already has the anointing. Begin to teach your people excellence.”

That is why many of my teachings in recent months have taken a different dimension.

It is intentional.

It is meant to rewire your thinking.

This gutter mentality must go.

You cannot enter a palace with the mindset of a slave.

You cannot think retail and expect wholesale results.

Achievement begins with the mind.

Until the mind is renewed, nothing truly works.

Somebody say:

“Priority!”

God Must Be First

Your first priority in life must be God.

Jesus said:

“But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.” — **Matthew 6:33 (KJV)**

God is your first priority.

When you wake up in the morning, your first response should not be your phone.

Your first response should be God.

On your knees before your screen.

If God is your priority, He will handle your necessities.

Seek Him first.

Then money will be added.

Health will be added.

Peace will be added.

A sound mind will be added.

Everything else follows proper priority.

Joseph demonstrated this in Egypt.

When Potiphar's wife approached him, he said:

"...how then can I do this great wickedness, and sin against God?" — **Genesis 39:9 (KJV)**

To her, it was an opportunity. To Joseph, God came first. That must be your mentality.

Before every decision, ask: **"What will God say?"**

Before every action, ask: **"How will God feel?"**

God first.

Always.

The Three Measures of Priority

Priority is measured by three things:

1. Time

What you spend time on reveals your priority.

Examine your previous week.

What occupied most of your time?

That was your priority.

2. Energy

Whatever receives your energy receives your attention.

Your energy follows your priorities.

3. Resources

What you spend your money on reveals what matters most to you. Resources reveal priorities. Time reveals priorities. Energy reveals priorities.

God values the first. The issue between Cain and Abel was not size. God does not bless according to size. The difference was that Abel gave God the first.

“And Abel, he also brought of the firstlings of his flock and of the fat thereof. And the LORD had respect unto Abel and to his offering.” — Genesis 4:4 (KJV)

When you give God the first, He handles the rest. That is why Scripture teaches firstfruits, first offerings, and the principle of giving God the first place.

When God receives the first, He blesses what remains.

We Do Not Hustle — We Follow Principles

The Bible says:

“Ye adulterers and adulteresses, know ye not that the friendship of the world is enmity with God?” — James 4:4 (KJV)

The world here refers to the world's system.

Do not say:

“I am hustling.”

You are not a hustler.

A hustler does anything to survive.

A believer follows principles.

There are things we will never do for money.

There are laws we will never break for prosperity.

We love wealth.

We love prosperity.

But there are boundaries.

There are doors that are not God-doors.

There are opportunities that are not divine opportunities.

Sometimes what appears to be a breakthrough can become a breakdown. Some breakthroughs can break your head. So always put God first. When God says no, let it remain no.

Priority Number Two: Family

After God comes family.

Never joke with family.

A church is only as strong as the families within it.

God said concerning Abraham:

“For I know him, that he will command his children and his household after him...” —

Genesis 18:19 (KJV)

Strong families produce strong societies.

Broken families produce broken societies.

The collapse of society begins with the collapse of families.

The child you refuse to train today can become a problem for society tomorrow.

Family matters.

Family is priceless.

Building Strong Families

There are three important quadrants in building a healthy family.

1. Friendship

Friendship begins between husband and wife.

The friendship your children see between you and your spouse is what they learn from.

One of the greatest ways to show love to your children is to love their mother openly.

Laugh together.

Play together.

Talk together.

Enjoy one another.

Many homes are too serious.

There is no laughter.

No warmth.

No friendship.

Children should see affection, joy, and companionship. That atmosphere strengthens a family.

2. Fellowship

Fellowship strengthens friendship. Every member of the family must be connected to the same God. The fear of God must be the foundation of the home. A family that worships together develops spiritual strength together.

I have watched this over time. Many of us defend our children even when they are wrong. Do not defend nonsense. Are you following what I am saying?

Let your child know that there is something called the fear of God. Build that into the child. You must understand fellowship. In our house, when we wake up in the morning, we pray. You do not just step outside. We pray first.

Am I communicating here?

In my house, we have morning devotion and night devotion. Before anyone sleeps, we gather to pray. Everybody participates. Today one person reads *Rhema for Living*; tomorrow another person reads it.

My daughter is about nine years old, going to ten. She is asked to explain what she has read, and she explains it. Then we tell her, “Pray,” and she prays.

That is life.

Do not allow children to do whatever they like.

A child comes home with a Mercedes and has no job, and as a mother you are applauding him. The day security operatives come and arrest him, you will pay for it. You may not like what I am saying, but that does not change the truth.

Introduce your children to God.

Wives, say, “Let us pray.” Husbands, say, “Let us pray.”

Before anyone goes out, there should be prayer. All of you must submit to one Deity, and that is Almighty God. Everyone in the house must know that there is a Boss in that home. We do not offend Him. There is One who rules this house, and we are all loyal to Him.

Am I communicating here?

I have said this several times: The more you love God, the more you love your spouse. The more you love God, the more you love your spouse. A threefold cord cannot be broken. Think of a triangle: husband, wife, and God.

As both husband and wife move closer to God, they inevitably move closer to one another. The more they approach God, the closer they become.

If you truly want to love your spouse, get closer to the God your spouse knows. The closer you get to God, the more you discover yourself loving your spouse, your children, and your family.

Am I communicating here?

Love Must Be Visible

This is my personal policy.

Any man I see looking significantly better than his wife, I do not respect him. If a man appears polished, successful, and impressive while his wife looks neglected and miserable, that is a sign of selfishness.

Do not do business with a selfish man. If he is self-centred at home, he will likely be self-centred in business. You will see it in his children as well. His thinking revolves around himself.

A wise man invests in his family. He ensures that his wife is honoured, valued, and presented well. That is a man who understands investment.

Followership in the Home

The third component of family empowerment is followership.

God has made the man the head of the home.

Children follow.

The wife follows.

The family follows.

Understand followership.

However, let me add this caveat:

People only follow those who lead well.

Nobody wants to follow a drunkard.

Nobody wants to follow an alcoholic.

Nobody wants to follow an abuser. Nobody wants to follow a bitter person. Nobody wants to follow someone who destroys the self-esteem of others. Nobody wants to follow a man who constantly makes his wife feel inferior. People willingly follow leaders who lead well.

As a man, lead.

Be a leader.

They say if you are leading and nobody is following, you are simply taking a walk. Leadership is influence. Leadership causes people to follow willingly, not by force. Every action you take reveals the kind of leader you are. Your wife depends on your counsel.

Your children depend on your direction.

Lead well.

There are times when discipline is necessary. I once told someone that child abuse is not only when a child is neglected or abandoned. When you refuse to discipline a child, that is also child abuse. Children must know that bad behaviour carries consequences.

Discipline Produces Honour

Growing up, I was often afraid when my father arrived home. The moment his car entered the compound, everyone became alert. Some would pretend to be asleep.

Others would quickly pick up books and pretend to be reading. But those experiences paid off. They taught respect. Even today, when my father speaks to me, I lower my head. He gave birth to me in his twenties and is now approaching eighty years of age.

Yet when he talks, I listen with honour. Respect matters. Honour matters. Discipline matters. Those values shape destiny.

Priority Number Three: Your Health

After God and family comes health. Your health is your wealth. Many people neglect their health and then wonder why they suffer. There are three major causes of sickness.

1. Chemical Imbalance

The first cause of sickness is chemical imbalance. If you eat unhealthy food continually and eventually become sick, it is not necessarily an attack from the enemy. Food is medicine. What you eat affects your body. Our grandparents lived long lives because much of their food was natural and organic. Many modern methods of excessive frying and processing reduce nutritional value.

Natural food promotes health. What you eat becomes medicine or poison to your body. If you want to stay healthy, eat wisely. Not everything should enter your mouth. Excessive sugar creates problems. Poor eating habits create problems. There are times when your digestive system should rest. Some people eat late into the night and immediately go to sleep. Others are constantly consuming food. You must be intentional about your health. Healthy habits help you remain healthy.

2. Sin

The second cause of sickness is sin. The Bible frequently links forgiveness and healing. *“Who forgiveth all thine iniquities; who healeth all thy diseases.”* — Psalm 103:3 (KJV)

Isaiah 53 also connects Christ’s sacrifice with both forgiveness and healing. Jesus told the man He healed: *“Sin no more, lest a worse thing come unto thee.”* — John 5:14 (KJV)

Sin opens doors. Sin creates vulnerability. Sin exposes people to attacks. An immoral lifestyle weakens both spiritual and physical wellbeing. Purity carries benefits. Holiness carries benefits. There are physical benefits to living right.

Even dishonesty affects health. A lie creates anxiety. Anxiety affects blood pressure. Fear affects the body. But truth brings peace. The truth remains the truth every day.

3. Demonic Attacks

The third cause of sickness is demonic attack. Job experienced affliction that was directly connected to satanic assault. There are attacks that come from the kingdom of darkness. That is why believers must pray and remain spiritually alert.

Remember:

- Chemical imbalance
- Sin
- Demonic attacks

These are major gateways through which sickness can enter.

Do not tolerate sin.

Do not tolerate error.

Evil has no relatives. Never support wrongdoing because of personal relationships.

The Church Is a Place of Restoration

The church exists to change lives. A person may have a difficult past, but Christ still offers transformation. The Apostle Paul once persecuted believers, yet God transformed him into a mighty apostle.

Therefore, we must be careful not to become judges of people.

When God reveals a weakness in someone's life, our responsibility is to pray, counsel, encourage, and help restore them. Christianity is not about condemning people. It is about helping people become what God intends them to be.

Priority Number Four: Fire

Somebody say, “Fire!”

Fire is a platform for wealth. In the days of Elijah there was famine and scarcity throughout the land. Then Elijah declared:

“The God that answereth by fire, let him be God.” — 1 Kings 18:24 (KJV)

Fire precedes harvest. Fire precedes abundance. Before wealth manifests, there must be spiritual fire. God's language is fire.

“For our God is a consuming fire.” — Hebrews 12:29 (KJV)

There are things that must be burned away before abundance can appear.

Characteristic One: Fire Commands Attention

In Exodus 3, Moses saw a bush burning with fire, yet it was not consumed. The fire attracted attention. When a person carries fire, they cannot be ignored. When a business carries fire, it cannot be ignored. Many people have been ignored by society because they lack spiritual fire.

When fire comes:

- Rejection turns into acceptance.
- Disrespect turns into honour.
- Mockery turns into celebration.
- Obscurity turns into visibility.

Fire commands attention. The same place where you were ignored becomes the place where you are celebrated.

Characteristic Two: Fire Produces Colour

Fire has colour.

There is white fire.

There is yellow fire.

There is red fire.

There is blue fire, which carries the greatest intensity. Fire produces colour. And colour speaks of honour, distinction, splendour, dignity, and visibility.

A person carrying fire cannot remain colourless. Fire brings flavour to life. Fire brings honour. Fire brings distinction. Fire causes people to value you. Fire opens doors. Fire grants access. Wherever fire is present, honour follows.

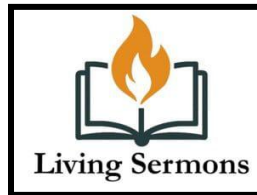
Characteristic Three: Fire Exposes Hidden Things

In Acts 28, Paul gathered sticks and unknowingly carried a viper among them. It was the fire that exposed the serpent. The snake remained hidden until the heat came.

Fire exposes what is hidden. Fire reveals enemies disguised as friends. Fire reveals traps disguised as opportunities. Fire uncovers secret attacks. As the fire of God moves, hidden things lose their covering.

What has been concealed is brought into the light. When fire comes, deception is exposed. When fire comes, darkness loses its hiding place. You do not serve a dead God.

You serve the living God. He is the same yesterday, today, and forever. When God says yes, no man can say no. When God lifts you up, no man can bring you down. God is on your side. Power is on your side. Glory is on your side. Favour is on your side. Somebody shout: **“Fire! Fire! Fire!”**

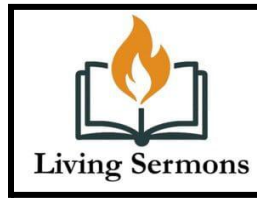

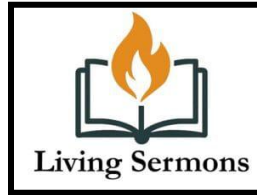
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
