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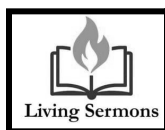
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Foreword

Warring With Prophecy

“This charge I commit unto thee, son Timothy, according to the prophecies which went before on thee, that thou by them mightest war a good warfare.” — *1 Timothy 1:18 (KJV)*

Warring with my prophecy.

We must have an understanding of the workings of God. There are people today who are stranded because they have not yet understood why they were born.

When a man says, “I don’t know why I am alive,”
when a man says, “I don’t know why I am living,”
when a man says, “I don’t understand where my life is going,”
when a man says, “I don’t know what is happening to me,”
when a man says, “The way my life is going, I have lost meaning for life,”

What that man is looking for is the prophecy upon his head. Prophecy is God’s intention and opinion for your destination. I repeat: prophecy is God’s intention and His opinion for your destination. Prophecy is God’s blueprint for your footprint.

Every man in life may not have a job. You may not have contact. You may not have money. You may not have connection. You may not have a helper. But every man has a prophecy.

Speaking concerning Timothy, Paul said:

“Timothy, I have given prophecies concerning you. I have spoken over your life. I have said things concerning you. But you must understand that every prophecy is tied to warfare.”

Every prophecy is tied to contention.

Every prophecy is tied to battle.

Use prophecy as a blueprint.

Use prophecy as motivation.

Use prophecy and war with it.

Six Ways Prophecy Comes

There are six ways prophecy comes, and you need to understand them.

1. Prophecies From Enemies

As you are seated right now, there are people issuing negative words over lives.

You want to go to school, and somebody declares it will not happen.

You want to get married, and somebody speaks against it.

There are prophecies from enemies.

In *Numbers 22–23*, Balak saw Israel rising. He saw them emerging in strength. Israel was unaware. Their hands were folded. They did not know someone from the camp of the enemy was issuing words against them.

Balak hired Balaam and said:

“Come and curse these people for me.”

There are people today speaking negatively over photographs. They pick your picture and make declarations. They attach evil words to your name.

Nehemiah also encountered this.

While rebuilding the walls, a prophecy was spoken over him. But in *Nehemiah 6:12*, Nehemiah perceived that God had not sent the man. Samballat and Tobiah had hired him.

In other words, it was a prophecy of doom.

You can have good intentions, good ideas, good expectations, good contacts, and still have people issuing evil words against your destiny.

But every prophecy from the camp of the enemy returns to where it came from in Jesus’ name.

2. Prophecies From Families

Family is the foundation for destiny.

In *Genesis 49*, Jacob gathered his sons and began to speak concerning their future.

To Reuben he said:

“Reuben, thou art my firstborn, my might, and the beginning of my strength, the excellency of dignity...” — *Genesis 49:3 (KJV)*

That was what Reuben was supposed to become. But then Jacob reversed it:

“Unstable as water, thou shalt not excel...” — *Genesis 49:4 (KJV)*

There are valuable lessons to learn when you study the history and trajectory of your family.

Somewhere along the line, covenants were made. Somewhere along the line, altars were raised. Somewhere along the line, things were done outside the ordinances of God. Do not let anybody deceive you into believing family foundations do not matter.

Even the New Testament opens with genealogy:

“This begat this... this begat this...”

Who begat you?

You must understand there are prophecies from families.

3. Prophecies From Character

Your character is a prophecy of your future. You cannot behave wrongly and expect not to become it.

You can pray.

You can fast.

But until your character aligns with God’s Word, destiny fulfilment is not in view.

Samson ruined himself—not because God wanted it, but because character became a disaster. A bad character can shatter a great destiny. You can joke with sin and escape temporarily, but there is a sin that traps a man beyond recovery.

Delilah was not a temptation. Delilah was a terminator. Before sin ruins you, run from it. When you know what you carry, there are things you cannot permit around your life.

Samson was a Nazarite. He was set apart. There were conditions attached to his consecration. He was not to touch dead things. Yet what many celebrated as Samson’s miracle was actually the beginning of his downfall. He tore a lion with his bare hands, but that contact violated his consecration.

Backsliding is gradual.

“And he wist not that the Lord was departed from him.” — *Judges 16:20 (KJV)*

The Holy Ghost announces His arrival, but He does not announce His departure. When He comes, you speak in tongues. When He leaves, you may still be speaking in tongues.

Character matters.

You are praying for a husband, but when heaven looks for you, you are with a married man. You are praying for greatness and opportunity, but when the angel comes looking for you, you are in places contrary to your destiny.

Your character can ruin your prophecy. Every appetite that makes you offend God must die. What you carry is too precious.

There were people in Scripture called eunuchs. Their duty was to take care of the queen. A eunuch was castrated so he would not misuse access. There are things God cannot entrust to certain people because their flesh is too alive.

In *Matthew 7:6*, Jesus said: “Give not that which is holy unto the dogs, neither cast ye your pearls before swine...” — *Matthew 7:6 (KJV)*

Then in verse seven He said: “Ask, and it shall be given you...” — *Matthew 7:7 (KJV)*

Many are asking, but nothing is happening because those entrusted with releasing answers have already received instructions not to give holy things to swine and dogs. You may pray for years, but if character is corrupt, destiny becomes resisted.

In *2 Chronicles 13*, two brothers stood in conflict—Jeroboam and Abijah.

Jeroboam had:

- More soldiers
- More experience
- Greater alliances
- A stronger army

Yet Abijah was eager to fight.

Why?

Because Jeroboam had forsaken the Lord.

Abijah declared:

“You have forsaken the Lord... but as for us, the Lord is our God.” — *2 Chronicles 13:10*
(KJV)

This battle was not physical. It was spiritual.

By reason of backsliding, Jeroboam weakened his destiny.

Character matters.

4. Prophecies Through Dreams and Visions

In *1 Samuel 28:6*, the Bible says God no longer spoke to Saul by dreams, prophets, or Urim.

God wants to show His people things before they happen. But many people today are under attack in their dream life.

They dream and forget.

They dream and cannot interpret.

They see confusion and contradiction.

But God wants to reveal mysteries.

He wants to show directions.

He wants to open eyes spiritually.

Your dream life shall be healed and restored in Jesus' name.

5. Prophecies From a Prophet

A prophet can speak over your life, and what he says may not resemble your present reality. God lives in eternity, not in time zones. The reason God sends prophets is to place a date on what He has already spoken.

In *Genesis 18*, Abraham encountered three men and perceived they were celestial beings. He brought them into his house. Without being asked, Abraham prepared food for them.

You need a miracle? Prepare for it.

You need a testimony? Activate it.

“With men this is impossible; but with God all things are possible.” — *Matthew 19:26 (KJV)*

The Scripture says “with God,” not merely “by God.”

There must be cooperation with God. After Abraham and Sarah served the visitors, the prophecy came: “According to the time of life, Sarah shall have a son.” — *Genesis 18:10 (KJV)*

Sarah laughed because the prophecy looked impossible. But prophecy is not based on present circumstances.

There was famine in the land during the days of Elisha. Conditions became so terrible that women began eating their own children.

Then Elisha declared:

“Tomorrow about this time shall a measure of fine flour be sold for a shekel...” — *2 Kings 7:1 (KJV)*

He did not merely announce abundance; he fixed prices.

The king’s officer mocked the prophecy and said:

“If the Lord would make windows in heaven, might this thing be?” — *2 Kings 7:2 (KJV)*

Sometimes prophecy sounds impossible because it contradicts visible reality. But when God speaks, impossibility loses its authority. Elisha was fixing prices in the middle of famine. The Bible says Elisha declared to the king’s officer:

“You shall see it with your eyes, but you shall not eat thereof.”

That is what happens when a man lives in unbelief. Greatness can happen around you, yet you do not partake of it. People can advance while you remain stagnant. Others can be lifted while you remain grounded.

Unbelief does not stop God—it stops you. Unbelief does not hinder God—it hinders the unbeliever.

“We have also a more sure word of prophecy...” — *2 Peter 1:19 (KJV)*

The Sixth Form of Prophecy: The Word of God

The sixth form of prophecy comes from the Word of God.

The Word of God cannot lie.

When you take God’s Word and hold it tightly to your heart, everything God has spoken becomes possible.

“Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away.” — *Matthew 24:35 (KJV)*

“The grass withereth, the flower fadeth: but the word of our God shall stand for ever.” — *Isaiah 40:8 (KJV)*

There is power in the Word of God.

“Who being the brightness of his glory, and the express image of his person, and upholding all things by the word of his power...” — *Hebrews 1:3 (KJV)*

“I will worship toward thy holy temple, and praise thy name for thy lovingkindness and for thy truth: for thou hast magnified thy word above all thy name.” — *Psalm 138:2 (KJV)*

There is power in the Word.

Arrested by the Word

One day, soldiers were sent to arrest Jesus.

When they arrived, they heard Him teaching. They intended to wait until He finished speaking before arresting Him.

But as He continued preaching, something happened.

They dropped their weapons.

They forgot their assignment.

They stood listening to Him.

When they returned empty-handed, the leaders asked:

“Why have you not brought Him?”

And they answered: “Never man spake like this man.” — *John 7:46 (KJV)*

They came to arrest Jesus, but the Word arrested them. There is power in the Word of God.



Say Until You See

In Genesis chapter one, the phrase repeats itself continually:

“And God said...”

God kept speaking until manifestation came.

“And God said...” — *Genesis 1:3*

“And God said...” — *Genesis 1:9*

“And God said...” — *Genesis 1:14*

Until eventually: “And God saw...”

You must learn to say until you see. Every prophecy from God’s Word concerning your life, your family, your children, your finances, your health, and your lifting shall manifest in Jesus’ name.

The Power of a Prophetic Word

I once saw one of my sons in ministry bringing another young man with him whenever he came to see me. Only true sons introduce people directly to their fathers.

I observed the young man and discerned loyalty in him. So I laid hands on him and gave him a prophetic word. I told him he was going to become wealthy and greatly blessed.

At that time, all he possessed was a small six-room building. The prophecy did not appear realistic to him. But after that word, something changed.

He later told me that strangers began knocking on the doors of the building, asking for rooms to lodge in—as though the house was a hotel.

God converted a private house into a hotel in the minds of people. Eventually, the property was sold, another land was acquired, and multiple hotel structures were built.

What causes people to mistake an ordinary house for a hotel without a signboard?

There is power in the Word.

Timothy's Background

Why did Paul tell Timothy to war with prophecy?

If you study *Acts 16:1*, you will understand Timothy's background. His mother was a Jew, but his father was a Greek. The Greeks were deeply immersed in idolatry and pagan practices. Timothy was caught between two foundations:

- a praying mother,
- and a conflicting paternal background.

What do you do when your father's altar fights your mother's prayers?

Many people today are products of that conflict. They had mothers who prayed, but fathers who strayed. Paul told Timothy the first thing he must do is pray because the first attack against prophecy is diabolism.

The Reality of Spiritual Warfare

Do not let anybody deceive you into believing witchcraft and diabolism exist only in Africa. There is witchcraft everywhere. The only difference is that many Africans are loud about it.

There are occultic people in Europe and America dressed in suits and ties, carrying briefcases and Bibles, yet deeply involved in dark practices.

Life is spiritual.

You cannot fight spiritual battles with mere physical appearance. Marriage is not sustained by makeup. Destiny is not fulfilled by outward packaging.

Life is spiritual. I never fully understood deliverance until I saw a man who got married on Saturday and his marriage scattered on Sunday. Samson was not brought down merely by Delilah. Delilah was only a physical instrument empowered by spiritual forces.

In *Judges 16*, the Philistines praised their god Dagon for delivering Samson into their hands. Behind physical events, spiritual realities operate.

Understanding Spiritual Contention

Have you ever seen a man abandon a beautiful family and pursue destruction without explanation?

There are spiritual forces behind many irrational actions. Life is spiritual. Goliath understood this. Though trained as a warrior, when he confronted David, he moved beyond physical weapons and cursed David in the name of his gods.

He understood battles are not won merely by swords and spears. “For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holds.” — *2 Corinthians 10:4 (KJV)*

The enemy attacks first through thoughts and imagination. That is why Scripture says:

“Casting down imaginations...” — *2 Corinthians 10:5 (KJV)*

If you can stop evil thoughts at their conception, you can stop the manifestation of evil works. God answers thoughts with thoughts: “For I know the thoughts that I think toward you...” — *Jeremiah 29:11 (KJV)*

“My thoughts are not your thoughts...” — *Isaiah 55:8 (KJV)*

“How precious also are thy thoughts unto me, O God!” — *Psalms 139:17 (KJV)*

Family Patterns and Spiritual Cycles

There are families where destructive patterns repeat themselves generation after generation.

Some families experience repeated marital crises. Others battle addictions, rebellion, or strange setbacks. Before treatment, a doctor first diagnoses the problem. Patterns must be identified before they can be broken. I once discovered a strange pattern in my own family history.

At seventeen years old, I became rebellious and left home. Later, I discovered my elder brother had done the same thing at the same age. Then my father told me that he too became independent at seventeen, and even his own father had followed the same pattern.

Something spiritual was recurring through generations. Many people today are reacting to life from inherited patterns they have never discerned.

Spirits That Embarrass Destiny

A pastor once came to submit to our ministry. He confessed that he struggled with stealing. Not because he lacked necessities—but because there was a force pushing him toward disgrace. While we were speaking, I briefly stepped out. When I returned, one of my phones was missing.

The pastor had taken it. That is what destructive spirits do: they embarrass people in places where they should be honoured.

Some spirits push people into shame at the edge of breakthrough.

Breaking Evil Patterns

Another man came from a family plagued by alcoholism.

His father was a drunkard. His mother was a drunkard. His siblings were addicted as well. He was the only one not drinking, and he was already a pastor. But even the name of his church reflected the family pattern. There are patterns that contend against prophecy. But every evil cycle can be broken by the power of God.

“What do ye imagine against the Lord? he will make an utter end: affliction shall not rise up the second time.” — *Nahum 1:9 (KJV)*

What stopped your father will not stop you.

What stopped your mother will not stop you.

What stopped your family line will not stop you.

You serve a mighty God.

When God says yes, no man can say no. When God lifts a man, no power can bring him down. In *Genesis 49:19*, Jacob prophesied concerning Gad:

“Gad, a troop shall overcome him: but he shall overcome at the last.” — *Genesis 49:19 (KJV)*

A troop shall overcome him. A legion shall surround him. A legion shall contend with him. But at the end, he shall overcome. More than two thousand years later, that prophecy manifested. In *Mark 5*, Jesus arrived in the country of the Gadarenes—the territory connected to the descendants of Gad. There He encountered a man possessed by many demons.

Jesus asked:

“What is thy name?”

The spirit answered:

“My name is Legion: for we are many.” — *Mark 5:9 (KJV)*

What Jacob saw prophetically was now physically manifesting.

A troop had overcome him.

There was:

- disappointment,
- failure,
- delay,
- affliction,
- oppression,
- torment.

Everything was present in one man. But Jesus arrived to enforce the final part of the prophecy: “He shall overcome at the last.”

When Jesus commanded the demons to leave, they pleaded not to be sent far away.

Why?

Because demons understand territory. Spiritual forces are territorial by nature. They prefer atmospheres they already understand and influence.

The demons begged to enter a herd of swine nearby. And the moment they entered the pigs, the pigs rushed violently into the sea and drowned. Even pigs rejected those spirits. Yet there are people arrogant because of witchcraft and dark powers.

The very spirits they boast about were rejected by swine.



The War of Delay

Another warfare against prophecy is delay. If you understand the workings of God, you will realise that God often takes His people through a school of process and formation.

Sometimes, delay is part of divine training. If God loves you deeply, He may train you intensely.

God Trains Through Process

One day Ezekiel desired a greater dimension with God. Then the Lord spoke to him:

“Son of man, behold, I take away from thee the desire of thine eyes with a stroke...” — *Ezekiel 24:16 (KJV)*

God was speaking about Ezekiel’s wife. But then the Lord instructed him not to mourn publicly. “Neither shalt thou mourn nor weep...” — *Ezekiel 24:16 (KJV)*

God was dealing with Ezekiel’s emotions. The first thing God often confronts in a man He wants to use deeply is uncontrolled emotion. Many people lose spiritual focus because they are governed entirely by emotional reactions.

But intimacy with God swallows emotions. People who walk deeply with God may feel pain, but they are not destroyed by it.

God told Ezekiel:

“Do not cry.”

It was a school of spiritual formation.

Delay and Divine Timing

God does not live in time zones. God lives in eternity. That is why a prophetic word may be spoken immediately, yet manifestation may take time. Sometimes delays are introduced by spiritual contention. In *Genesis 15:13*, God declared that Israel would remain in bondage for four hundred years.

But in *Exodus 12:40*, Israel remained there for four hundred and thirty years.

God said four hundred years.

Who added the extra thirty?

Thirty years is enough time for:

- a child to become an adult,
- a generation to shift,
- destinies to feel postponed.

Delay is real.

Different Timings of Prophecy

The Bible reveals different prophetic timelines.

430 Years

Israel’s deliverance prophecy took 430 years.

70 Years

In *Joshua 6:26*, Joshua prophesied concerning Jericho:

“Cursed be the man before the Lord, that riseth up and buildeth this city Jericho...” — *Joshua 6:26 (KJV)*

Seventy years later, in *1 Kings 16:34*, the prophecy came to pass exactly.

One Year

In *2 Kings 4:16*, Elisha prophesied to the Shunammite woman:

“About this season, according to the time of life, thou shalt embrace a son.”

One year later, the prophecy manifested.

Twenty-Four Hours

In *2 Kings 7:1*, Elisha declared abundance during famine.

Within twenty-four hours, the prophecy came to pass.

Six Hours

Jesus told Peter:

“Before the cock crow, thou shalt deny me thrice.” — *Matthew 26:34 (KJV)*

A few hours later, it happened.

Five Minutes

In *Isaiah 38*, Isaiah told King Hezekiah:

“Set thine house in order: for thou shalt die, and not live.” — *Isaiah 38:1 (KJV)*

But before Isaiah could leave the palace court, God reversed the prophecy.

Five minutes changed everything.

I do not know how long you have waited:

- 430 years,
- 70 years,
- one year,
- twenty-four hours,
- or even a few minutes.

But God can change a story suddenly. The stone the builders rejected can become the chief cornerstone. When God says yes, no man can say no. No more delay:

- in your life,
- in your family,
- in your destiny,
- in your finances,
- in your advancement.

Delay Is Not Denial

People often say, “Such is life.”

But that is not always true. Delay becomes dangerous when it is accepted without resistance. The path of the just is not meant to move backward and forward endlessly.

“But the path of the just is as the shining light, that shineth more and more unto the perfect day.” — *Proverbs 4:18 (KJV)*

There are situations believers must reject spiritually. In *1 Kings 3*, the woman declared: “This dead child is not my son.”

That is the attitude of spiritual warfare. You must look at negative situations and declare:

“This is not God’s plan for my life.”

The Spirituality of Life

Life is spiritual.

The things I have seen over the years have convinced me deeply of the reality of spiritual warfare.

One day, while travelling to preach with one of my associates, we encountered a goat on the road. I struck the animal accidentally with the vehicle and continued driving.

Later, when we arrived at the meeting venue, the pastor informed us that the women's leader was critically ill and behaving strangely. When we saw her, she confessed that she had transformed herself spiritually and positioned herself on the road to attack us.

The collision disrupted her assignment.

Life is spiritual.

Wickedness Is Real

On another occasion, after a church programme, a woman approached swollen beyond recognition. Doctors had already concluded there was nothing medically they could do for her. As we prepared to pray, she confessed involvement in witchcraft.

She explained that she had infiltrated the church under false pretences, pretending to need help with her children. Her assignment was to gain access through compassion and eventually transfer affliction spiritually.

But according to her confession, when contact was made during prayer, the affliction reversed upon her instead. These experiences reveal an important truth: not every battle is physical. Many believers confess positively, but they never engage in spiritual warfare.

Confession is powerful, but prophecy must also be defended through spiritual engagement.

Warring With Prophecy

There are expectations over your life that require warfare.

Not everyone celebrating you genuinely desires your rising.

There are battles against:

- destiny,
- lifting,
- advancement,
- marriage,
- favour,
- and fulfilment.

That is why Paul told Timothy:

“War a good warfare.”

Prayer Declaration

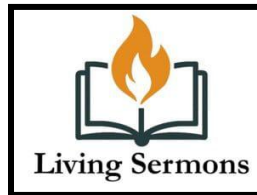
Every act of diabolic manifestation working against my life, scatter by fire in Jesus' name.

Amen.

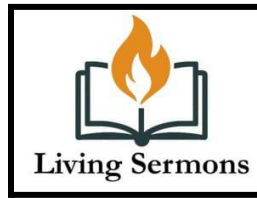

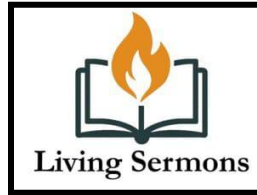
