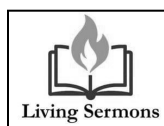

Introduction

Supernatural supplies are provisions that come from God. According to Ephesians 1:3, God has already blessed us with all spiritual blessings in heavenly places in Christ Jesus. In John 10:10, Jesus said:

“I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.”

God is not a God of shortage. The Scripture says:

“No good thing will he withhold from them that walk uprightly.” (Psalm 84:11)

Therefore, supernatural supplies are real.

Examples of Supernatural Supplies in Scripture

Throughout the Bible, we see undeniable manifestations of God's supernatural provision.

The Children of Israel in the Wilderness

In Exodus 16, God provided for the children of Israel in the wilderness. He fed them daily and they never lacked.

The Widow Whose Sons Were to Be Taken

In 2 Kings 4:1–7, a widow was indebted and her sons were about to be taken as bondmen. Through divine intervention, God supernaturally supplied her needs and settled her debt.

Somebody at a financial crossroads today, owing debts, shall experience supernatural intervention in the name of Jesus.

The Widow of Zarephath

In 1 Kings 17:9–16, God sustained the widow of Zarephath supernaturally through a season of famine and lack.

Provision at the Marriage Feast

In John 2:1–10, Jesus turned water into wine and supplied what was lacking at a marriage ceremony.

Someone preparing for a wedding, a celebration, or an important occasion, where resources seem insufficient, today God will supply in Jesus' name.

He turned water into wine.

Glory to God.

Hallelujah.

If supernatural supply is real, then this church itself is a testimony of supernatural supply.

Till tomorrow, I cannot fully explain how God keeps providing for Salvation Ministries. Looking at what God has done, nobody can honestly take credit for it. It is obvious that God is the One behind it all.

Supernatural supply is real.

But you do not sit down and wait for supernatural supplies. You provoke supernatural supplies.

Before I forget, all of you who went out for evangelism, may God reward you. Everyone who won souls, God reward you in Jesus' name.

Amen.

How to Provoke Supernatural Supplies

If supernatural supplies are real, how do we provoke them?

You do not wait passively. You do something to provoke them.

1. Through Divine Guidance

Divine guidance, or divine direction, is a lifetime adventure. Those who know what God is saying never lack supplies. Most frustrations in life and destiny can be traced to a lack of divine guidance. When a person cannot hear what God is saying, frustration becomes inevitable. Isaiah 48:17 says:

“Thus saith the LORD, thy Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel; I am the LORD thy God which teacheth thee to profit, which leadeth thee by the way that thou shouldest go.”

God says, “I will lead you, and profit will follow My leading.”

Verse 21 says:

“And they thirsted not when he led them through the deserts: he caused the waters to flow out of the rock for them...”

How can water come out of a desert?

Because God led them. No matter how difficult a place appears, when God leads you there, things happen. May God lead you to where things will happen. Psalm 23 declares:

“The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want.”

If the Shepherd is leading you, want disappears. The sheep will never lack grass if it follows the shepherd. Supplies cannot stop as long as the Shepherd is the One leading.

Examples of Supply Through Divine Direction

The Widow

In 2 Kings 4:1–7, the widow obeyed divine instruction and moved from emptiness into abundance.

Somebody is moving from emptiness into abundance today.

The Feeding of the Five Thousand

Matthew 14:15–21 reveals how Jesus multiplied limited resources and fed thousands.

Peter's Miraculous Catch

Luke 5:4–7 and John 21:3–6 show Peter frustrated after unsuccessful labour.

Then Jesus gave him a simple instruction:

“Launch out into the deep.”

And later:

“Cast the net on the right side of the ship.”

Divine direction ended frustration. Somebody's frustration is ending today. By divine guidance, God instructed me to move the church from Plot 35 to Plot 17. Frustration ended. By divine guidance, He instructed us to move towards the airport and build the cathedral.

Today, you will hear God. Your frustration will also end in Jesus' name.

Amen.

The Sweetness of Hearing God

How many of you love to hear God?

It is sweet to hear God. When you hear God, doubt disappears. Even when everybody says no, you stand on what God has said. The whole world may go in one direction, but if God has spoken to you, you stand your ground and still succeed.

That is why divine guidance is precious. When I was leaving Bible School, my wife and I were classmates. At that time, Lagos was regarded as the centre of opportunities. When God instructed me to go to Port Harcourt, people questioned the decision.

They asked:

“Are you sure you heard God?”

I said, “God told me to go.” Port Harcourt then was not considered attractive compared to Lagos. But I heard God.

And that made all the difference.

No matter where people tell you to go, go where God tells you. Man's leading is not equal to God's leading. Everybody may go to America and prosper, but if God did not send you there, it will not work for you.

Conditions for Divine Guidance

Be Born Again

The first condition is the new birth.

Jesus said:

“My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me.” (John 10:27)

If you are not born again, you cannot hear His voice.

God's sheep hear God's voice.

Be Willing to Obey

The second condition is willingness to obey.

No matter your educational qualification or experience, when God speaks, obey Him.

Psalm 95:7–8 says:

“Today if ye will hear his voice, harden not your heart...”

Hearing is not enough.

Obedience is the key.

The Danger of Resisting Divine Direction

God spoke clearly to me: “Leave Lagos for Port Harcourt.”

But I loved Lagos.

I did not want to leave. Many believers are like that today. God is speaking, but they prefer their own plans. There is what we call the permissive will of God, which is different from the perfect will of God.

The permissive will is when God allows you to follow your preference even though He has shown you His better plan. God respects your will, but His will is superior to your will. For a period, I resisted.

I prayed. I fasted. I shouted.

Yet heaven remained silent because I already knew what God had said. Deep within me, I knew the answer. A friend wanted me to remain in Lagos. He promised support, accommodation, and financial assistance. Everything looked attractive. But not every open door is God's door. When I finally obeyed God and moved, heaven opened. If you are experiencing lack, check whether you are obeying God's voice. Sometimes people pray for a husband while holding on to a relationship God has told them to leave.

God says:

“Do you want a husband or do you want this boyfriend?”

Yet they refuse to let go. You cannot hold on to what God did not give you and expect Him to give you something new. Until one hand releases the wrong thing, it cannot receive the right thing. God may be speaking to someone right now. Let go of whatever God has not ordained so that you can receive what He has prepared.

Marriage Is God's Design

God created male and female. He created Adam and Eve. Marriage is God's idea and God's design. Many people claim they do not want to marry, but deep within, companionship is a desire God placed in humanity.

Both men and women desire meaningful companionship and covenant relationship. Therefore, trust God's timing and follow His guidance concerning marriage. Do not allow culture, trends, or societal influences to replace biblical truth.

Follow the Word of God.

Prayer for Unmarried Men

Speaking under the anointing, I prayed for every unmarried man in the congregation. I declared that heaven would open over them. Every obstacle standing in the way of marriage was broken. I declared favour over their lives.

The Scripture says:

“Whoso findeth a wife findeth a good thing, and obtaineth favour of the LORD.” (Proverbs 18:22)

May favour answer for you in Jesus' name.

Amen.

Continue to Inquire of the Lord

Never stop seeking God's direction. In 2 Samuel 5, David continually inquired of the Lord. The first time he asked, God said:

“Go.”

The next time he asked, God said:

“Wait.”

That is how believers should live.

Always ask:

“Lord, what are You saying?”

“Should I go?”

“Should I stay?”

“Should I pursue this opportunity?”

“Should I wait?”

Depend absolutely on the Holy Spirit. Make no alternative to God's direction.

Proverbs 3:5–6 says:

“Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths.”

When it comes to divine guidance, set aside personal opinion and the opinions of others.

Allow God's opinion to supersede every other voice. When you do, you will succeed. And you will succeed. Shout a better Amen!

Be a Covenant Practitioner

Bishop David Oyedepo once shared that when God called him into ministry, he loved Jos. At that time, Jos was a major centre of attraction and tourism.

But God told him:

"Jos is not where I sent you."

You may love a place, but that does not mean it is where God wants you to be. I loved Lagos. Yet Lagos was not my place. Never mistake personal preference for divine direction.

Be a Covenant Practitioner

The second way to provoke supernatural supplies is to be a covenant practitioner. What do I mean by being a covenant practitioner?

Pay your tithes and give quality offerings.

Malachi 3:10, Genesis 8:22, Proverbs 11:24, and Luke 6:38 all reveal the covenant principles of giving and receiving.

Giving and receiving must become a continuous lifestyle if you want to enjoy supernatural supplies. As long as the earth remains, seedtime and harvest shall not cease. Every seed reproduces after its kind. If you desire money, what do you sow?

Money.

When God wanted sons and daughters, He sowed His Son. You cannot sow singing and expect financial harvest. You cannot sow preaching and expect money. Pastors, hear this carefully.

No matter how gifted a preacher is, if he desires financial increase, he must sow financially. There is no shortcut.

The Bible says:

“Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap.” (Galatians 6:7)

If you sow clapping, what will you reap?

If you sow singing, what will you reap?

If you want financial harvest, then financial seed must be sown. You cannot sow poor seed and expect a great harvest.

Keep Promoting God's Kingdom

To enjoy continuous financial supplies, keep promoting God's Kingdom.

- Build churches.
- Sponsor soul-winning.
- Support Kingdom projects.
- Invest in raising labourers for the harvest.

Ecclesiastes 11:6 says:

“In the morning sow thy seed, and in the evening withhold not thine hand...”

When giving becomes continuous, harvest becomes continuous. Where giving stops, harvest also stops.

Avoid Complaining After Giving

One major mistake many believers make is destroying their harvest through murmuring.

Philippians 2:14 says:

“Do all things without murmurings and disputings.”

Never give and then begin to complain. Never give and then start murmuring. You will destroy your harvest. Giving is a privilege.

Let me share a true story.

Years ago, one of our pastors used to buy fuel for the church generator. One day, while carrying out that assignment, he thought within himself:

"Every time I am the one buying fuel."

He did not say it aloud.

Nobody heard him.

But God heard him.

As he was returning, God instructed him:

"Turn back."

When he turned, he saw a pepper grinder carrying two jerrycans of fuel.

The Lord spoke to his heart:

"I can use anybody. I am only giving you a privilege."

That day he became humble.

Many believers become arrogant concerning their service.

They complain.

They murmur.

They act as though God cannot do without them.

But God can raise anybody.

The same God who lifted you can lift another person.

Whatever privilege God has given you in His Kingdom, treat it as a privilege.

Stop murmuring.

Stop complaining.

God is the One who gives opportunities.

Talk Right

Many people give correctly. Many people follow divine direction. Yet they speak wrongly. You can either preserve your harvest or destroy it by your words.

Proverbs 18:20–21 says:

“A man's belly shall be satisfied with the fruit of his mouth... Death and life are in the power of the tongue...”

You can kill your seed with your mouth. You can destroy your harvest through negative speech. God wants to bless you, yet you keep saying:

"Nothing works in this country."

If you keep saying nothing works, then nothing will work for you. Many believers do not understand the power of words. You may have just given an offering, and moments later you begin saying:

"Things are hard."

"Things are difficult."

"Nothing is moving."

You are cancelling your harvest with your own mouth.

Jesus said:

“...he shall have whatsoever he saith.” (Mark 11:23)

Anything you continually say eventually becomes your reality. Many people serve God faithfully, yet they talk themselves out of their harvest.

There is a policy in our organisation.

No accountant is permitted to say:

"There is no money."

There is always money.

There is always a supply.

Years ago, bills worth millions of dollars were presented.

The accountant became concerned.

I smiled and said:

"Before the money is needed, it will come."

The following day, someone who was not even a member of the church walked in and gave two million dollars.

God can bring provision from anywhere.

But if I had declared there was no money, I would have closed the door with my own mouth.

Never speak defeat.

Never speak lack.

Never speak limitation.

Speak What Is Written

Repeat after me:

Everything I have spoken wrongly against my destiny, I cancel by the blood of Jesus.
From today, I declare:

It is well with me.

It is well with my health.

It is well with my finances.

It is well with my life.

Even when you are sick, do not allow your confession to agree with the sickness.

Faith does not deny facts.

Faith simply denies the right of facts to remain.

Pain may be present.

That is a fact.

But faith says:

“By whose stripes ye were healed.” (1 Peter 2:24)

Therefore, the pain must leave.

You do not speak what is happening.

You speak what is written.

You may not have money in your pocket today, but you declare:

“My God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus.” (Philippians 4:19)

Your body may be in pain, but you declare healing.

Speak God's Word continually.

Your body will respond.

Your circumstances will respond.

Talk Your Expectation

Do not talk what you are passing through. Talk what you expect to see. When darkness covered the earth, God did not focus on the darkness. He said:

“Let there be light.”

Many families continually speak poverty. Every conversation is about lack. Every discussion is about hardship. Yet they desire prosperity.

That is not how faith speaks.

Instead declare:

"Everyone in this family will come out of poverty."

"No one in this family will remain poor."

"Our family is rising into abundance."

That is Kingdom language.

Christ became poor so that we might become rich.

Speak your expectation.

Many believers give generously but speak poorly. Protect your harvest with your words.

Avoid Idleness

If you want supernatural supplies, avoid idleness. Engage in something legitimate. God does not bless laziness. Proverbs 19:15 says:

“Slothfulness casteth into a deep sleep; and an idle soul shall suffer hunger.”

Idleness never attracts supernatural supplies. God blesses the work of your hands. Therefore, stay productive.

Stay diligent.

Stay engaged.

Never Stop Giving

As I close, let me repeat this truth. Do not stop giving. To prosper, you must give. To continue prospering, you must keep giving. To remain prosperous, you must continue giving.

The day you stop giving is the day you begin to stop receiving.

Galatians 6:9 declares:

“And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not.”

Remain faithful.

Remain consistent.

Remain committed.

Your harvest will surely come.

Prayer for Grace to Give

Rise to your feet and pray:

"Lord, I receive grace to give."

"I receive grace to be a giver."

"I receive grace to support Your Kingdom."

"I receive grace to honour You with my substance."

Thank You, Father. In Jesus' mighty name.

Amen.

Recovering What Belongs to You

Haggai 2:8 says:

“The silver is mine, and the gold is mine, saith the LORD of hosts.”

If God owns the silver and the gold, why are sinners controlling so much wealth?

Many people do not realise that wealth and influence are first controlled in the spiritual realm before they manifest physically.

Haggai 2:6 declares:

“Yet once, it is a little while, and I will shake the heavens, and the earth, and the sea, and the dry land.”

There are dimensions of blessing represented by the heavens, the earth, the sea, and the dry land.

The believer must understand the power of spiritual recovery.

Ephesians 1:3 tells us that we have already been blessed with spiritual blessings in heavenly places in Christ.

Therefore, we pray:

"Every blessing due to me in the heavenlies, be released now in the name of Jesus."

"Every blessing assigned to me on the earth, be released now in the name of Jesus."

Isaiah 60:5 declares:

“...the forces of the Gentiles shall come unto thee.”

The wealth of the nations belongs to God's people.

Therefore, we decree:

"Every blessing being held by unbelievers that belongs to me, be released in the name of Jesus."

Finally, Proverbs 6:30–31 reveals that when the thief is found, he must restore sevenfold.

Therefore, we pray:

"Whatever Satan has stolen from my life, be restored sevenfold in the name of Jesus."

Prophetic Declaration

The month of May will end with positive surprises.

Go with that word.

Keep celebrating.

In Jesus' mighty name.

Amen.

You will hear God's voice when you become one of His sheep.

If you desire to surrender your life to Jesus Christ, pray this prayer:
