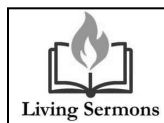

The Impartation of the Spirit of Faith

Many do not know what they want in life, so they are always in want. Faith is standing on the integrity of God's Word without wavering. It is simply an expression of your confidence in God and His Word, backed with corresponding action. That is what faith is. Faith is of inestimable value to every one of us. Christianity is worthless without faith because everything about the Christian life is by faith.

The Bible says:

“But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.”

(Hebrews 11:6 KJV)

Faith is an ever-winning, never-losing force. It is a producer of good reports.

“For by it the elders obtained a good report.”

(Hebrews 11:2 KJV)

Faith has only one source: the Word of God. **“So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.”**

(Romans 10:17 KJV)

But there are two dimensions of faith:

- The **Word of Faith**
- The **Spirit of Faith**

The Word of Faith and the Spirit of Faith

The Word of Faith is the written Word—*Logos*. You read it, you hear it, and faith is generated in your heart. But the Spirit of Faith is different. The Spirit of Faith comes by hearing the voice of God in a given situation—what we call *Rhema*.

It is that spoken Word of God to you personally that imparts the Spirit of Faith.

The Bible says:

“And the spirit entered into me when he spake unto me, and set me upon my feet...”

(Ezekiel 2:2 KJV)

The Spirit of Faith is speaking faith.

“We having the same spirit of faith, according as it is written, I believed, and therefore have I spoken...”

(2 Corinthians 4:13 KJV)

That means if you believe, you speak. The Spirit of Faith is released through bold declarations by the Holy Ghost in you.

Jesus said:

“For it is not ye that speak, but the Spirit of your Father which speaketh in you.”

(Matthew 10:20 KJV)

That is the Spirit of Faith.

The Spirit of Faith comes suddenly—without premeditation. One day, I stood in church and suddenly said, *“Tell that fox, any day he speaks against my father, he is in trouble!”*

There was no premeditation. That is the Spirit of Faith. It comes upon you and suddenly a lion nature rises from within you. You say things you did not plan to say. You do things you did not plan to do. And today, you shall be impacted with it in the Name of Jesus.

The Mystery of Impartation

I got this Spirit of Faith by impartation through my father in the Lord. Impartation is real. There are people walking around great men, yet they carry nothing. But when true impartation happens, there is a replication of grace. You begin to see the same spirit, the same audacity, the same results.

That is what makes impartation powerful. When the Spirit of Faith comes on you, fear is eliminated. You become incredibly bold. You do the unthinkable. You speak the unspeakable. You accomplish the incredible.

What the Spirit of Faith Produces

Everything you see around me today is secured by the operation of the Spirit of Faith. There was a time a sitting governor said we would not build. I sent several respected people to him. Every one of them came back with negative reports.

Then I declared: *“Not one inch of that land will be taken.”*

That kind of faith is not what you read in books. That is the Spirit of Faith. They held executive council meetings concerning the land. People came back worried.

But I said:

“Tell that fox, he has not been born.”

That audacity is the Spirit of Faith. And eventually, victory came.

Biblical Examples of the Spirit of Faith

Throughout Scripture, we see men who operated in this dimension:

Moses

At the Red Sea, Moses declared boldly and parted the sea.

(Exodus 14:15–16, 21)

Caleb

He brought a positive report and declared, “*We are well able.*”

(Numbers 13:30)

David

He stood before Goliath and declared his victory before the battle began.

(1 Samuel 17:46)

Elijah

He shut the heavens and later released rain by his word.

(1 Kings 17:1; 18:41–45)

Elisha

He declared abundance in the midst of famine.

(2 Kings 7:1)

Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego

They defied the king and entered the fire without fear.

(Daniel 3:15–18)

Jesus

At the tomb of Lazarus, He called forth life.

(John 11:43)

He also raised Jairus' daughter.

(Mark 5:39-42)

Peter

At the gate called Beautiful, he said:

“Silver and gold have I none; but such as I have give I thee...”

(Acts 3:6 KJV)

Then he lifted the lame man up, and he walked. That was the Spirit of Faith.

How to Receive the Impartation of the Spirit of Faith

The Spirit of Faith is fundamentally received via impartation. Impartation is the transmission of spiritual virtue from one vessel to another. It is God's approved medium for transferring spiritual gifts.

Paul said:

“For I long to see you, that I may impart unto you some spiritual gift, to the end ye may be established.”

(Romans 1:11 KJV)

But there are requirements.

Requirement One: Be Born Again

You must be genuinely born again.

“Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God.”

(John 3:3 KJV)

No sinner can operate in the Spirit of Faith.

Requirement Two: Refuse Carnality

After salvation, refuse to be carnal.

“To be carnally minded is death; but to be spiritually minded is life and peace.”

(Romans 8:6 KJV)

A carnal believer and a sinner can end in the same frustration.

You must stay spiritually minded.

Requirement Three: Hunger for It

Your hunger is your qualifier.

Only hungry vessels are filled.

Jesus said:

“Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled.”

(Matthew 5:6 KJV)

Miracles do not go where they are needed.

They go where they are expected.

Your thirst determines your flow.

God said:

“For I will pour water upon him that is thirsty...”

(Isaiah 44:3 KJV)

If you thirst for nothing, you go home with nothing. You must crave this dimension. You must desire boldness. You must desire authority. You must desire spiritual audacity. That is how the Spirit of Faith comes. And today, as you hunger for it, may that Spirit rest upon you in the Name of Jesus.

As you are praying, keep your eyes open. Who told you that until you close your eyes God will not hear you?

Stay alert.

Watch and pray.

That is why when God selected the army for Gideon, He said:

The ones who bend carelessly to drink water—do not pick them. But those who watched while drinking, keeping their hands ready—pick them.

Why?

Because spirituality is not only prayer; it is watchfulness.

Jesus said, *Watch and pray.*

Not just pray.

There is no monopoly of wickedness.

The world is wicked, and believers must not live carelessly.

The Need for Spiritual Readiness

God told Christians to be calm, yet Peter carried a sword.

He did not carry water.

He carried a sword.

That tells you something.

He was prepared.

When they came for Jesus, Peter was ready to defend his Master.

Though Jesus told him to put it away because prophecy had to be fulfilled, Peter's readiness teaches vigilance.

Believers must not be spiritually careless.

Watch.

Pray.

Stay ready.

Identify, Believe and Honour the Carrier

To receive the Spirit of Faith, there is another major requirement:

Identify the carrier.

Find who carries this grace.

Recognise it.

Believe in that person.

Honour that person.

When you identify a genuine carrier of the Spirit of Faith, and you believe God sent him, you become a partaker of that grace.

The Scripture says:

“Believe in the Lord your God, so shall ye be established; believe his prophets, so shall ye prosper.”

(2 Chronicles 20:20 KJV)

When you believe in the vessel carrying the virtue, you position yourself for impartation.

Honour Unlocks Virtue

You cannot benefit from a prophet you do not believe.

You must honour the carrier.

Honour him in your heart.

Honour him in your words.

Familiarity and dishonour are enemies of impartation.

Some people become too familiar.

They say, *“That’s my guy.”*

No.

A “guy” cannot impart you.

The anointing you do not value, you cannot draw virtue from.

Even Jesus could do no mighty works in certain places because of dishonour.

“And he could there do no mighty work...”

(Mark 6:5 KJV)

That means dishonour can block virtue.

Love, Believe and Receive

Jesus said:

“He that receiveth you receiveth me, and he that receiveth me receiveth him that sent me.”

(Matthew 10:40 KJV)

When you receive the carrier, you receive the grace upon him.

That is how impartation works.

You do not practise the Spirit of Faith.

It comes upon you.

And when it comes, you begin to operate differently.

Things you were once afraid of, you now confront boldly.

You begin to speak the unspeakable.

You begin to dare the impossible.

You begin to attempt the unthinkable.

That is the Spirit of Faith.

Guard Your Heart Against Distraction

Before impartation, you must frustrate every satanic distraction.

Distractions are not always physical.

Sometimes they are internal.

At the moment you are meant to receive, strange thoughts may arise.

Irrelevant matters may suddenly occupy your mind.

That is why you must guard your heart.

The enemy knows that if you receive, your life will change.

So he fights your focus.

But today, every distraction is broken.

Ask God for It

God is the giver.

Though He uses human vessels, He remains the source.

Jesus said:

“Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find...”

(Luke 11:9 KJV)

And again:

“How much more shall your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to them that ask him?”

(Luke 11:13 KJV)

You must ask.

Say:

Lord, impact me with the Spirit of Faith.

That desire is your access point.

Impartation Flows from Higher to Lower

Impartation flows from the higher vessel to the lower.

That is spiritual order.

You cannot receive from someone you judge.

Be careful how you treat men of God.

Pray for them.

Support them.

Advise when necessary.

But never sit in judgment over them.

God Himself defends His servants.

As He said concerning Moses:

“With him will I speak mouth to mouth...”

(Numbers 12:8 KJV)

That means God relates with His servants at dimensions others may not understand.

Respect that order.

The Power of the Spirit of Faith

The Spirit of Faith is powerful.

It is not limited to men.

It is for everyone.

When it comes upon you, boldness enters you.

Authority enters you.

Fear dies.

Weakness dies.

Defeat dies.

From that moment, what you declare in line with God's Word becomes effective.

That is the operation of the Spirit of Faith.

The Impartation Prayer

In the Name of Jesus Christ, receive the Spirit of Faith.

From this day, operate in boldness.

Operate in dominion.

Operate in spiritual audacity.

Whatever can confront Jesus shall not overcome you.

From this day, the spirit of fear dies permanently.

The spirit of weakness dies permanently.

The spirit of defeat dies permanently.

Boldness becomes your portion.

Victory becomes your lifestyle.

Go and conquer. No one connected to this impartation shall suffer defeat. Anything that proceeds from your mouth in line with God's Word shall stand. So shall it be.

In Jesus' Name.

Amen.

The First Qualifier: Salvation

The first qualifier is salvation. Without salvation, all spiritual transactions remain incomplete. Jesus said:

“Ye must be born again.”

(John 3:7 KJV)

If you are not born again, you cannot qualify for this dimension. That is where it begins.

Prayer of Salvation

Lord Jesus,

Come into my life.

I accept You as my personal Lord and Saviour.

I believe in my heart that You died and rose again to save me.

Today, with my mouth, I declare that You are Lord over my life.

Thank You, Father, for saving me. In Jesus' Name. Amen.
