This encounter night at Shiloh 2023 unveils the believer's covenant heritage to flourish even in difficult times through obedience, faith, and unwavering trust in God.



Redeemed to Flourish in Hard Times

Praise the Lord!

The world is going through hard times today, but hard times are not new. There has never been a generation without its challenges. Yet, in every generation, God has always preserved His people and caused them to flourish in the midst of adversity.

The good news is this: redemption exempts us from the devastations of hard times.

When God brought Israel out of Egypt, they came out with silver and gold, and there was not one feeble person among their tribes (Psalm 105:37). In the midst of hardship in Egypt, God distinguished His people.

The same God is here tonight.

The same covenant is still in force.

The same power is still available.

Flourishing Is Our Redemption Heritage

The believer is not ordained for survival alone. We are ordained to flourish.

Psalm 92:12 says:

“The righteous shall flourish like the palm tree: he shall grow like a cedar in Lebanon.”

Flourishing is not a motivational statement; it is a covenant reality. No matter the economic climate, the redeemed are ordained to flourish. No matter the hardship around the world, the covenant remains stronger than the economy of nations.

When men say there is a casting down, then thou shalt say, There is lifting up (Job 22:29).

That is our heritage in Christ.

Covenant Practice Secures Covenant Blessings

Every provision of redemption responds to covenant practice. We do not merely claim promises; we walk in the conditions attached to them.

Deuteronomy 28:1–2 says:

“And it shall come to pass, if thou shalt hearken diligently unto the voice of the Lord thy God, to observe and to do all his commandments...
And all these blessings shall come on thee, and overtake thee.”

Obedience is what commits God to confirm His Word in our lives. Many want the blessings, but few are committed to the demands of the covenant.

Every divine agenda has human responsibilities attached to it.

Isaac Flourished in Famine

One of the clearest examples of flourishing in hard times is Isaac. Genesis 26:1 says:

“And there was a famine in the land...”

Yet, in that same famine, Isaac sowed in the land and received in the same year an hundredfold.

Verse 13 says:

“And the man waxed great, and went forward, and grew until he became very great.”

Hard times are not strong enough to stop covenant people. Isaac prospered in famine because he followed divine instruction. While others were running to Egypt, God told him to stay. The key to flourishing in hard times is access to divine direction.

One word from God can terminate years of struggle.

Faith Remains the Master Key

Faith is what makes redemption deliver. Without faith, redemption remains a theological concept. Faith gives substance to the promises of God. Faith is not merely believing that God exists. Faith is acting on the Word of God with confidence in His integrity.

Hebrews 10:38 says:

“Now the just shall live by faith...”

We are not redeemed to be victims of circumstances. We are redeemed to reign in life. Faith positions the believer above the storms of life. When faith comes alive, fear loses its hold. Fear paralyzes destiny, but faith empowers exploits.

The Believer's Anchor

In times like these, believers must become addicted to the Word. The Word is our spiritual food. The Word is our covenant manual.

The Word builds faith.

Romans 10:17 says:

“So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.”

You cannot be word-filled and remain fear-filled. Every encounter with the Word is an encounter with light. And when light comes, darkness bows.

No matter how dark the world becomes, light will always dominate darkness.

The Covenant of Kingdom Advancement

One major covenant platform for flourishing is commitment to kingdom advancement endeavours.

Matthew 6:33 says:

“But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.”

When the kingdom becomes your priority, God takes responsibility for your welfare.

Those who make God's agenda their pursuit never lack divine supplies. God is too faithful to owe any man. The advancement of God's kingdom secures supernatural supplies for the saints.

The Power of Faith for Supernatural Turnarounds

Hallelujah!

Everyone bitten by the serpent had one opportunity. There was a brazen serpent that God commanded Moses to make, and as many as looked upon the serpent were made whole.

The Bible says:

“And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up.” — John 3:14

As many as look unto Him shall be saved. Fix your eyes on Jesus. He paid the price for you and me to live a life of fulfilment.

Jesus said:

“I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.” — John 10:10

Every imperfection around our lives, in our bodies, spiritually, socially, and whatever does not reflect the abundant life that Jesus offers, tonight they shall be laid to rest.

The Healing Virtue Is Present

They came to hear Him, and virtue went out of Him and healed them all. There is always healing virtue when the Word comes alive, but whether you plug into it or not is another matter.

Jesus said:

“Somebody hath touched me: for I perceive that virtue is gone out of me.” — Luke 8:46

He also said:

“Thy faith hath made thee whole.”

It is the same process today.

Virtue is present. Someone is healed of fever. Someone is healed of cancer. Someone else may not receive healing in the same service because one person plugged in while another did not.

May each one be sensitive tonight to plug into the virtue of Christ flowing on this altar, in the name of Jesus.

What you expect is what you experience. Expect your issues to be turned into raw miracles tonight, and that shall become your experience in the name of Jesus Christ.

Prayer of Encounter

Father, thank You for gathering us unto Yourself to manifest Yourself to each one of us tonight.

Manifest Yourself to every expectant soul.

Let no one return without his or her turnaround package.

As we behold You as in a glass, we are changed. Lord, cause every one of us to see You tonight through Your Word, in the name of Jesus.

Thank You, Heavenly Father.

In Jesus' precious name. Amen.



The Mandate Behind the Commission

The sight of the vision that birthed this Commission still seems to me like yesterday. I saw an array of afflicted and buffeted people — battered, beaten, and deformed. I heard them groaning for rescue. It was so overwhelming that I began to cry.

I was not asleep.

Then I said, “Why, Lord?”

And He answered:

“From the beginning it was not so. But the hour has come to liberate the world from all oppression of the devil, through the preaching of the Word of Faith, and I am sending you to undertake this task.”

I did not send myself. What you see happening here is the One who sent me proving Himself. Whatever God can do, as you put your faith on the line, your faith will make it happen. We know what God can do from what He did in His Word. He has not changed.

If He could bring out a four-day-dead man already in the grave, then there is nothing impossible for Him.

Put your faith on the line.

This is your night.

Faith Is the Connector to Divine Virtue

We are all thronging Him, but it is not just about being present. It is about tapping in.

And we tap in by faith.

Jesus said:

“Thy faith hath made thee whole.”

Faith is the only way to tap into the virtue that heals and sets free. People have always depended only on prayer, but no matter the anointing or the anointed, without faith on the receiving end, nothing will happen.

Jesus, the most anointed, stepped into Nazareth, and the Bible says:

“And he could there do no mighty work... And he marvelled because of their unbelief.” — Mark 6:5–6

The receiving end requires faith for delivery. Many say, “Pray for me,” yet remain disconnected in their hearts. The same Jesus in one place is the same Jesus everywhere. The difference is faith.

The Same God Is Still on the Throne

We are in for the best of times because the unusual will happen here. We have seen people come out of the mortuary after embalming. The same God is still on the throne today. Whatever is dead or dying in your body or around your life shall bounce back to life.

They said concerning Lazarus: “By this time he stinketh.”

But Jesus answered: “Said I not unto thee, that, if thou wouldest believe, thou shouldest see the glory of God?” — John 11:40

No matter how deadly the issue may be, if thou wouldest believe, you shall see the glory of God. Tonight is that night in your life.

Faith: The Mystery Behind the Triumph of the Saints

Faith is the mystery behind the triumph of the saints.

“This is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith.” — 1 John 5:4

Being born again does not automatically make a believer an overcomer. We overcome by faith. Faith makes the believer triumph over the challenges of life. Therefore, no born-again child of God is permitted to live a defeated life. You have a heritage of triumphant living by reason of redemption.

As light breaks forth tonight, faith will be triggered, and as faith is triggered, the supernatural will flow.

Expect the flow of virtue into every unsettled area of your life.

Fact About Faith

Faith is not merely a belief system that psychologists can explain. Bible faith is a spiritual weapon.

“Above all, taking the shield of faith...” — Ephesians 6:16

Faith has the capacity to quench all the fiery darts of the devil. It can handle every attack from anywhere with unquestionable victory.

Faith disarms the enemy.

Faith draws on the power of God to accomplish the impossible. The woman with the issue of blood had spent all her living seeking help, yet nothing changed.

But when faith came alive, the flow of blood ceased instantly. No matter how long you have lived with that plague, it is stopping right now. God delivered Daniel from the lions' den because he believed in his God. That is the power resident in faith.

Hungry lions could not touch Daniel because faith was at work. Whatever consumes others in the world shall be minus you.

Faith Strengthens the Believer

Through faith, Sarah received strength to conceive seed and was delivered of a child when she was past age because she judged Him faithful who had promised.

Faith strengthens believers to command exploits.

“The people that do know their God shall be strong, and do exploits.” —
Daniel 11:32

Faith strengthens the believer spiritually. When faith is at work, spiritual strength comes alive to dare the impossible and forcefully take delivery of your inheritance.

Strong faith rides the storms of life with ease.

Faith Provokes the Healing Power of God

When faith comes alive, sickness and disease must give way.

Jesus said:

“Virtue is gone out of me.”

Immediately, the flow of blood stopped.

That incurable disease shall stop today.

That plague without medical solution shall cease.

Faith has the capacity to heal all manner of sickness and all manner of disease.

Bible Faith Is of the Heart

Bible faith is of the heart, not merely of the head.

“For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness...” — Romans 10:10

Faith is domiciled in the heart.

Jesus said:

“Whosoever shall say unto this mountain... and shall not doubt in his heart...
he shall have whatsoever he saith.” — Mark 11:23

The faith that works is heart faith.

Faith Partners with the Invisible God

Bible faith establishes the believer's partnership with the invisible God, thereby empowering us to do the impossible.

Moses endured as seeing Him who is invisible. Faith makes God real to the believer. Faith sees beyond what natural eyes can see.

“While we look not at the things which are seen... for the things which are seen are temporal; but the things which are not seen are eternal.” — 2 Corinthians 4:18

The faith that works comes from God speaking to you through His Word. Rhema faith is the foundation of raw miracles. The Lord appeared again to Samuel by His Word.

God still appears through His Word today.

Today Is Your Day

Do you believe that Jesus is able to deliver your expectations tonight?

Will He be more powerful tomorrow than He is tonight?

Every day is God's day.

The day you believe becomes your day.

May today be your day.

“Behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation.” — 2 Corinthians 6:2

Whatever you do not want shall leave you tonight. Whatever makes men ask, “Where is your God?” shall be taken away from your life. Whatever has made you a mockery among men shall turn around tonight.



There Is No Irreversible Case with Bible Faith

Tonight, there is no irreversible case with Bible faith. There is no “too late” case with Bible faith. Every time faith comes alive, God steps in.

Martha said:

“Lord, if thou hadst been here, my brother had not died.” — John 11:21

But Jesus proved that He is never late. Bible faith is never late for delivery. Whenever your faith comes alive, God steps into your situation.

There is no closed case with faith.

Someone once had mouth cancer. Medical science had exhausted every option. They returned the person from America because there was no more help available. But Jesus appeared in the night and ripped that growth out. That was not stage four — that was the final stage. Yet, there is no closed case with Bible faith.

Medical science does not have the final say concerning your health. Jesus has the final say. The economy does not have the final say over your wellbeing. The covenant has the final say. In the precious name of Jesus, you will not miss your encounter tonight.

Prophetic Instructions and Liberty

If you wrote anything down anywhere around the world, place it on the floor where you are seated and expect it to come under your feet — bruised and reduced to nothing.

The Scripture says:

“And the God of peace shall bruise Satan under your feet shortly.” — Romans
16:20

Take prophetic instructions and walk into your liberty. Many who were called barren are being released right now. Generational curses are being broken now.

Many oppressed by the devil are being set free now. Whatever touches this floor tonight comes under your feet for life. Cancer is humiliated tonight.

Say with me:

“There is no irreversible case with Bible faith.”

Faith Releases Power Through the Tongue

Bible faith has its base in the heart, but it releases its power through the tongue.

Jesus said:

“I will give you a mouth and wisdom, which all your adversaries shall not be able to gainsay nor resist.” — Luke 21:15

With the heart man believes, but with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.

Salvation means rescue.

As powerful as Bible faith is, it only delivers through the engagement of the tongue.

Life and death are in the power of the tongue.

What you believe in your heart is important, but what you declare is what gets delivered. You may believe in your heart, but until you declare it, it cannot manifest.

“Whosoever shall say unto this mountain...” — Mark 11:23

It has to be declared before it can be delivered.

The Faith That Speaks

We were only two months away from dedicating this Faith Tabernacle when the Lord appeared to me and said:

“It took Me six days to create the world and the fullness thereof. I will not need two months to finish an ordinary building.”

I came down and said, “Two months is too much.”

And we kept declaring it. All the angels of heaven moved into action, and within two months, it was completed.

The faith that delivers requires the tongue for delivery. Bible faith cannot deliver outside your confession.

Somebody once said, “I normally have headaches.”

I replied, “If it is normal, then it can stay.”

Do not normalise affliction. No discomfort is normal. No pain is normal.

No sickness is normal.

Therefore, expect every abnormality to clear off your system tonight.

Faith Is a Kingdom Mystery

Faith is not an ideology. Faith is not merely a belief system. Faith is a mystery of the Kingdom that puts believers above the situations of life.

Before we step into the ministration tonight, understand this clearly: There are no private revelations in the Kingdom.

Jesus said:

“What I tell you in darkness, that speak ye in light.” — Matthew 10:27

And:

“What I say unto you I say unto all.” — Mark 13:37

Every truth of Scripture applies to whosoever believes. There are no private testimonies in the Kingdom either. Every testimony is a pointer to what is available to you.

“Thy testimonies have I taken as an heritage for ever.” — Psalm 119:111

Every testimony is your heritage if you are interested enough to receive it.

Testimonies Trigger Faith

One woman here at the Faith Entrance had been crippled for twenty-three years. Without anyone laying hands on her, she rose up by the power of God.

A dead child came back to life in Kogi State during Shiloh.

Someone else was healed of full-blown blood cancer all the way from America.

Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever.

Whatever you have seen God do through His Word and through testimonies, expect your own package tonight.

Build Your Faith Before Storms Arise

“If thou faint in the day of adversity, thy strength is small.” — Proverbs 24:10

Keep building your faith against stormy days so that you will not collapse when storms arise.

Faith does not grow on assumptions. Faith grows through cultivation. We once lost an engine mid-flight while travelling. I noticed the aircraft slowing down and asked the pilot what had happened.

He said, “We just lost one engine.”

I told him, “Turn back now.”

The pilot was sweating heavily, but I remained at peace. I returned to the cabin and asked the passengers if they wanted snacks. We all began eating in the midst of the storm.

Why?

Because faith had already been built before the storm arrived. Build your faith before the storms arise, or you will surrender when challenges come. Faith does not jump on people.

You grow your faith.

Every Miracle Answers to Faith

The prayer of faith cannot deliver without the faith of the recipient at work. Get your faith on the line. Jesus repeatedly asked people:

“Believe ye that I am able to do this?” — Matthew 9:28

Every miracle answers the faith question before delivery.

To ministers and labourers in ministry: do not try to become the healer. You are not the healer. Do not force healing.

People must grow their faith personally. You cannot transfer into someone's hand what their faith is not ready to receive.

“He that receiveth a prophet in the name of a prophet shall receive a prophet's reward.” — Matthew 10:41

You cannot access what a prophet carries without believing.

Every Good Thing Is Your Entitlement in Christ

“He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all, how shall he not with him also freely give us all things?” — Romans 8:32

If you have received the Son, then every good thing becomes your entitlement in Christ. Tonight, your marital destiny is settled. Your career issues are settled. Your family concerns are settled. The health of your children is settled.

Every terminal disease brought to Shiloh from anywhere around the world is terminated tonight. Good things are not our ambition; they are our heritage in Christ.

“No good thing will he withhold from them that walk uprightly.” — Psalm 84:11

Say with me:

“Every good thing of life is my entitlement in Christ.”

The big question is this:

What you wrote down — is it a good thing?

Does Jesus Christ have the power to make it happen tonight?

Then it has happened.

Declare Your Miracle

We were in Bauchi for a crusade in 1987 when a woman returned home and told her husband:

“I am pregnant.”

Nothing had happened physically yet, but she received it by faith and declared it with her mouth.

Barrenness ended.

From today, when people ask you concerning that issue, what will you say?

Say:

“It is done.”

Because:

“Ye shall have whatsoever ye say.” — Mark 11:23

Every good thing is your right in Christ.



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A Call to Salvation

Before God releases these packages tonight, someone here must settle the issue of salvation. How much more shall your heavenly Father give good things to those who ask Him?

But He must first become your Father. You cannot claim the inheritance of a Father you do not belong to. Jesus said:

“I know my sheep, and am known of mine.” — John 10:14

Does God know you as His child?

If not, tonight is your night. And if you once walked away from Him, return now. Until you return, restoration cannot take place. Whatever is not good around your life is not God. Struggling endlessly is not God. Bondage is not God. Spiritual dryness is not God. Tonight, Jesus is calling you home.

If you want to become a child of God and partake of the inheritance of the Father, stand to your feet wherever you are around the world and say:

“Jesus, save my soul tonight.”

“Jesus, forgive my sins tonight.”

“Jesus, I return back home tonight.”
