A LIFE CALLED UNTO EXPLOITS

This morning, I want to share with us, by the privilege I am given, on the topic: The Meekness Factor in the School of Exploits.

Every child of God is redeemed for a life of exploits, not mediocrity. Exploits simply means outstanding, record-breaking results. Everything about God is outstanding, and to be outstanding means to stand out—to be distinct, to be singled out from your contemporaries.

“Ye are the salt of the earth... Ye are the light of the world. A city that is set on an hill cannot be hid.” (Matthew 5:13–14, KJV)

Our lives are destined to be outstanding. Wherever you have been hidden, after this Shiloh, you shall come to light in the name of Jesus.

Where you are now may be good, but the good news is—it is not good enough. There is a new level waiting for you. Your current level is tired of you, and your next level is calling.

Until the results of God in your life begin to catch men's attention, it is not yet exploits. Your life, your family, your business, your vocation must become an attraction.

You are not ordained for an average life. You have nothing to do on the ground. Your place is already waiting for you, and by the power of God, you will occupy it in the name of Jesus.

ZION: THE PLACE OF GIANTS

God wants every area of your life to become a positive reference. Scripture declares:

“And I will make thee an eternal excellency, a joy of many generations.”
(Isaiah 60:15, KJV)

Where you have been rejected, you shall be accepted. Where you have been neglected, you shall be celebrated.

The end-time Church is ordained as a Church of giants—not dwarfs. We are in the family of giants; we cannot end up as dwarfs.

In Micah 4:1–2, Scripture reveals that the mountain of the Lord shall be established above all others, and nations shall flow into it. This is prophetic of Zion becoming a place of attraction.

Zion is a place for giants. Everything about your life will become attractive. Men will flow into your testimony.

Those who mocked you before shall be ashamed when they see what God has done in your life. Every battle around your destiny is turning into testimony.

No more struggle. No more defeat. Your head is lifted in the name of Jesus.

THE GENE OF GIANTS WITHIN YOU

Do not look at where you are now. There is a gene of giants inside of you. Where you are now cannot determine where you are going.

You may start small, but you are not permitted to end small. “A little shall become a thousand.”

Your position is changing in the name of Jesus.

THE PRINCIPLE OF MEEKNESS

There is a requirement to be enlisted in this end-time army of giants: **meeekness**.

Say it clearly—meeekness. This glory we have described is accessible, but not to all. It is reserved for the meek.

“Blessed are the meek: for they shall inherit the earth.” (Matthew 5:5, KJV)

The meek shall inherit the earth. They shall take charge in their various endeavours. Whatever Jesus died for becomes their legitimate possession. Meekness is humility. The opposite of meekness is pride.

Meekness is not natural personality—it is a fruit of the Spirit.

“But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace... meekness...” (Galatians 5:22–23, KJV)

So meekness is spiritual. It cannot be judged by outward appearance. Some look pious outside but are proud inside. Your spiritual depth determines your level of meekness.

Charisma may give you a place among men, but character—meeekness—sustains your place in eternity.



WHAT MEEKNESS DOES IN THE LIFE OF A BELIEVER

1. Meekness Enhances Access To Grace

We are not sufficient of ourselves.

“Not that we are sufficient of ourselves... but our sufficiency is of God.” (2 Corinthians 3:5, KJV)

Grace is divine enablement. It is God making us able. If there is anything good in your life, it is not you—it is God. Every good and perfect gift comes from above. God resists the proud, but gives more grace to the humble.

“But he giveth more grace. Wherefore he saith, God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace unto the humble.” (James 4:6, KJV)

To access continuous grace, remain humble. When God lifts a man, no one can bring him down.

2. Meekness Enhances Access To Increasing Revelation

“The meek will he guide in judgment: and the meek will he teach his way.”

(Psalm 25:9, KJV)

God teaches the meek. The proud cannot be taught because they already know everything.

The meek remain teachable, sensitive, and yielded to divine instruction.

The meek will He teach. The meek will He show His secrets.

God shows the meek His secrets, and what God shows you becomes what shows you to your world. What God reveals to you becomes what reveals you to your generation.

Revelation is what lifts a man in life. When you contact revelation, you keep going up.

Paul said, *“I went up by revelation.”* Revelation is what takes people upward.

I decree over your life: everything concerning you shall be going upward in the name of Jesus.

MEEKNESS ENHANCES OBEDIENCE

Meekness enhances believers’ obedience. It produces a heart that delights in swift response to divine instruction.

“Blessed is the man that feareth the Lord, that delighteth greatly in his commandments.” (Psalm 112:1, KJV)

Such a man becomes mighty on the earth. Wealth and riches are in his house because he delights in obeying God.

Meekness does not question instruction. It does not rationalise divine direction. It simply obeys.

The moment you begin to struggle with God's instruction, meekness is absent. Contesting God's Word is an expression of pride.

May the spirit of obedience rest upon us in the name of Jesus.

MEEKNESS MAKES GREAT

Every meek person ultimately ends up great.

“Now the man Moses was very meek, above all the men which were upon the face of the earth.” (Numbers 12:3, KJV)

And the same Moses became very great in Egypt—in the sight of Pharaoh, his servants, and the people.

Meekness leads to greatness. We must stop praying only, “God make me great.” Rather, we must pray, “Lord, baptise me more with the spirit of meekness.”

There are those who were vibrant in service, but when promotion came, pride entered, and they lost access to God's continuous lifting. When shoulders go up, grace departs. God cannot promote a man He cannot access. I decree: the spirit of pride is broken over your life in the name of Jesus.

THE DANGER OF PRIDE

Do not be deceived by applause or people's comments. It can be a subtle trap. Pride is a heart issue. Meekness is also a heart condition. Some people may not say it with their mouth, but their heart already agrees with praise.

Such people remain stagnant even though greatness has been ordained for them. God has great destinies for many, but pride keeps them grounded. In homes, in marriages, in relationships, pride destroys progress. When neither party is willing to humble themselves, communication breaks down and stagnation sets in.

Every tension caused by pride in your life is cancelled in the name of Jesus.

MEEKNESS AND DIVINE GUIDANCE

Meekness enhances access to divine guidance, which leads to triumph in life. When God leads a man, He leads him into safety, into exploits, and into surplus. Even in famine, God's leading produces abundance.

“And they thirsted not when he led them through the deserts... he clave the rock also, and the waters gushed out.” (Isaiah 48:21, KJV)

When God leads you, impossibility becomes possibility. Hard places become supply centres.

If God is leading you, you will always go up, even when others are going down.

EXAMPLES OF MEEKNESS THAT PRODUCED GIANTS

Abraham

In Genesis 13, Abraham gave Lot the choice of land. Though he had the right, he yielded.

Meekness is not weakness; it is strength under control. Abraham did not lose—he gained divine approval.

God later established His covenant with him because of his heart posture.

Isaac

In Genesis 26, despite famine, Isaac obeyed God and sowed in the land. That obedience produced supernatural harvest—hundredfold increase. Meekness makes obedience swift, even when conditions are unfavourable.

Joseph

Joseph consistently pointed glory back to God.

“It is not in me; God shall give Pharaoh an answer of peace.” (Genesis 41:16, KJV)

He refused to take God’s glory. That meekness positioned him for elevation to second-in-command in Egypt.

Even the ring and the robe were not misplaced—they were reserved for him from the foundation of destiny.

God tests before He approves, and approval produces promotion.

Gideon

Gideon saw himself as the least, but God called him a mighty man of valour.

God is not looking for the strong, but the yielded. He qualifies the disqualified.

Paul the Apostle

Paul acknowledged his unworthiness:

“But by the grace of God I am what I am.” (1 Corinthians 15:10, KJV)

He laboured abundantly, yet gave all glory to grace.

Meekness preserves grace, and grace produces exploits.

MEEKNESS AND CONTINUOUS LEARNING

No believer outgrows knowledge. We will always need to learn more.

“Better is a poor and a wise child than an old and foolish king, who will no more be admonished.” (Ecclesiastes 4:13, KJV)

Meekness keeps a man teachable. It keeps the heart open to correction, instruction, and divine direction.

A wise man listens. A foolish man resists instruction. We must remain humble before God and before those He sends to instruct us.



FINAL PRAYER AND DECLARATION

Lift up your voice and receive the spirit of meekness.

Lord, engrace me with the spirit of meekness— to obey Your instructions without resistance, to walk in humility, and to remain teachable before You.

In Jesus' mighty name.

From this day forward, you will walk in meekness in the name of Jesus.
