A man of the house of Levi took a wife, a daughter of Levi. And the woman conceived and bore a son. And when she saw that he was a goodly child, she hid him three months. This was when they were killing boys.

There is something about this child—something different. The mother discerned it and hid him.

And when she could no longer hide him, she took for him an ark of bulrushes, daubed it with slime and pitch, and put the child therein. She laid it in the flags by the riverbank—the River Nile.

And his sister stood afar off, to see what would be done to him.

The daughter of Pharaoh came down to wash herself at the river, and her maidens walked along by the riverside. When she saw the ark among the flags, she sent her maid to fetch it.

And when she opened it, she saw the child. Behold, the baby wept; and she had compassion on him, and said, “This is one of the Hebrew children.”

Then said his sister to Pharaoh’s daughter, “Shall I go and call thee a nurse of the Hebrew women, that she may nurse the child for thee?”

Biblical stories are not just narratives. They are revealed to communicate messages, secrets, and divine patterns.

There are five "P's":

- **Pattern**
- **Principle**
- **Promises**
- **Processes**
- **Prophecy / Destiny (Future outcome)**

Anytime you study the Bible, look out for patterns.

Patterns In Scripture

A pattern is a consistent sequence of events revealed in Scripture. You know it is a pattern because it repeats itself again and again.

When you study David, you see it.

When you study Joseph, you see it.

When you study Moses, you see it.

Do not just read Bible stories and pass them by. They are there to teach deep spiritual truth. But understand this: if something happens only once, it is not yet a pattern. Biblical stories are case studies revealing principles. A principle is a fundamental law that is unchanging and produces predictable outcomes.

This is what the Bible calls the wisdom of God. When you pray, “Lord, give me wisdom,” like Solomon, what God ultimately gives you is understanding of principles—precepts, divine laws governing life. There are principles that govern:

- The universe
- Human relationships
- Success
- Financial productivity
- Spiritual life

The Scripture cannot be broken because these principles are immutable laws.

Whenever God wants to solve a problem or bless a generation, He often begins with a child in the womb of a woman. That is why every one of you is a message sent from heaven. You may not yet understand your assignment, but you were not a mistake.

The Mystery Of Birth And Destiny

The salvation of the world began with a promise:

“The seed of a woman.”

Babies are not conceived by accident. There is no such thing as an illegitimate child—only illegitimate parents. Even if a child is born out of wedlock, it does not cancel destiny. Even the birth of Jesus carried controversy. Yet it fulfilled prophecy.

God chose a virgin birth because the Redeemer could not carry the corruption of Adam’s seed. He came as the seed of a woman. Isaiah declared:

“Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Emmanuel.”
(Isaiah 7:14)

This means God Himself entered history to redeem humanity. Animal sacrifice could not do it. Prophets could not do it. Only God Himself stepping into time could redeem man.

The Human Body And Earthly Legality

Man is a spirit being, but spirits require legal access on earth. The body is your legal passport on earth. When a spirit enters a body, it gains legal presence here.

Therefore, your body is not just physical—it is your assignment vessel. Take care of it. You were not sent here for pleasure, but for purpose.

Children often carry a sense of destiny early in life, but as they grow, they are often miseducated or pressured by society. There are things you did not learn—you were born with them. There are internal deposits God placed in you.

You are like a computer:

- The operating system is already installed
- Additional programs are added later

So also, human beings come with built-in spiritual software—gifts, talents, instincts, and divine direction. Nobody fails when they remain in their assignment. Struggle begins when a person deviates from divine purpose.

You are not meant to become someone else—you are meant to become what you were created to be.

The Mystery Of John The Baptist

When John the Baptist was born, people tried to name him after his father, Zacharias. But an angel had already declared his identity:

“He shall be called John.”

And later, it was revealed he carried the spirit and assignment of Elijah—restoration.

Elijah represents restoration:

- Turning hearts back to God
- Restoring broken relationships
- Reconciling generations

You cannot truly help youth without understanding parents. And you cannot help parents without understanding youth. Restoration requires understanding both sides.

Jesus came as the perfect mediator between God and man. He experienced humanity so He could reconcile humanity to God. He knew temptation, pain, rejection, and suffering. That is why He can represent us perfectly before the Father.

There is a process attached to destiny. Some of those processes are painful, but they are shaping you to feel the pain of the people you are called to help.

Moses was preserved for a reason. While others were killed, he was kept alive because he carried deliverance for a generation.

Moses was raised in Pharaoh's house, yet born for Israel. His assignment was tied to the suffering of his people. Even when God wanted to destroy Israel, Moses interceded: "If You will not forgive them, blot my name out of Your book."

That is the heart of a deliverer.

Christ - The Greater Mediator

In the Old Testament, a man stood between God and Israel. In the New Covenant, we have a greater mediator—Jesus Christ Himself. He overcame sin, temptation, and death, and now His righteousness is given to us as a gift.

One man's disobedience brought death.

One Man's obedience brought life.

Whatever you have gone through is not wasted. Even abuse, rejection, or suffering can become the foundation of your assignment. The broken often become the ones who mend others. But your perception must change.

Stop saying, "They did this to me."

Begin to see, "God is shaping me through this."

Joseph - Turning Pain Into Purpose

Joseph understood this revelation when he said: “You meant it for evil, but God meant it for good.”

What was meant for destruction became the pathway to destiny. He could not have become a prime minister sitting comfortably in his father’s house. You actually were the ones that bought me the visa that sent me to where my destiny is. It is true—you meant it for evil, you planned evil against me, but it was God that sent me ahead of you to preserve your life.

He has now converted his pain to power. He has now discovered purpose in his pain. So he is no more a hurting person—that is why he becomes a saviour.

He loved them and took care of them. If God had not done this, this family would have wiped out what God was trying to do.

As long as you are walking around with bitterness, it shows you have not healed. And if you have not healed, you cannot start your assignment—because your assignment is revealed in your pain.

Some of you, your assignment is connected to single mothers, rape survivors, broken homes, and wounded families. Some of you, your assignment is young people. Some of you, your assignment is marriages. Some of you, your assignment is politics—the injustice in your country burns something inside you.

Some of you, God will expose you to certain things like police brutality so that you can pick it up as passion. And that passion will become so deep you cannot stop it. Even in music, even in movies—what the enemy is using to pollute young people—God can use the same platforms.

The Power Of Story And Media

Do you know how many blockbuster stories are in the Bible?

Mel Gibson's production of *The Passion of the Christ* shows what happens when someone is willing to carry a burden for a message.

Many in Hollywood rejected it. He sold properties and invested everything. Yet it became one of the most successful films, reaching billions and generating hundreds of millions in revenue.

But beyond money, it touched nations.

There were testimonies of deep spiritual encounters during filming. Even actors went through intense experiences, suffering, and transformation.

One actor, while portraying Christ, went through physical and emotional trauma that later shaped his spiritual journey. He eventually became a minister of the gospel.

This shows something: when you carry divine stories seriously, heaven responds.

We must not reduce biblical narratives into shallow portrayals. The stories of Scripture are not folklore—they are kingdom realities. There is a need to retell them in modern expressions:

- Moses and the Exodus
- The burning bush encounter
- The descent of God's glory

These are not myths. They are spiritual realities. Even the visions of Ezekiel reveal dimensions of divine movement and heavenly order.

God is not static—He is a moving God.

This generation carries technology, creativity, and media influence. There are seven vehicles for preaching the gospel. At the top are:

- The spoken Word
- Movies and music
- Technology and digital platforms
- Christian literature and publishing

Books will go where preachers cannot go. Christian literature has shaped generations—even from writers who are no longer alive. God is raising a generation that will exceed previous spiritual eras. He is not afraid of this generation. He is saying: He has faith in them. He believes in them. All they need is guidance, direction, and help to discover what they carry within.

The Love That Heals Identity

The love of parents is important, but the greater love is the love of the Heavenly Father. His affirmation heals wounds. David said:

“When my father and my mother forsake me, then the Lord will take me up.” (Psalm 27:10)

Even when David was overlooked among his brothers, God still called him forward. David was not considered among Jesse’s sons. He was left in the field. Yet God said, “We will not sit until he comes.”

He was anointed not because of human approval, but because of divine selection. Even his brokenness became part of his story. He cried:

“Behold, I was shapen in iniquity...” (Psalm 51:5)

Yet he also prayed:

“Create in me a clean heart, O God...” (Psalm 51:10)

And God restored him.

God uses the foolish things, the weak things, and the broken things to confound the wise. Your past does not disqualify your purpose. There is no illegitimate child—only illegitimate actions of men.

Your destiny is not cancelled by human failure.

Understanding Value And Legality

There is a difference between ownership and theft. If something is bought legally, it is yours. If it is stolen, the issue is not the product—it is the method. In the same way, human destiny is not invalid because of how a person came into the world.

Even Jephthah, rejected and driven away, later became a deliverer of Israel. The same people who rejected him later went to him for help.

This is the pattern:

God often raises deliverers from rejection.

The Pattern Of God's Work

Whenever God wants to solve a problem, He puts a baby in a womb. Whenever God wants to change a system, He raises young people.

- Jesus: began ministry young
- David: called young
- Joseph: dream started young
- Esther: raised young
- Moses: prepared early

This is not coincidence—it is pattern. And patterns reveal divine principles.

The Principle Of Discernment

When you see two or three witnesses of a truth, it becomes established. Do not build doctrine on one scripture alone—confirm it across Scripture and through lives that demonstrated it.

That is how wisdom is formed.

Closing Charge

You are not random. You are a custodian of divine wisdom. You are a carrier of heaven's secrets. When you discover patterns, principles, and processes, you step into the wisdom of God—and begin to produce results aligned with heaven.
