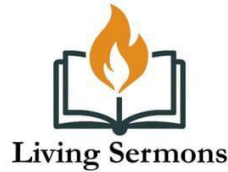

Arise, Shine

“Arise, shine; for thy light is come, and the glory of the LORD is risen upon thee.” — Isaiah 60:1 (KJV)

We are looking at Isaiah chapter 60 and verse 1. Isaiah chapter 60 will be a major consideration for this conference.

“Arise, shine; for thy light is come, and the glory of the LORD is risen upon thee. For, behold, the darkness shall cover the earth, and gross darkness the people: but the LORD shall arise upon thee, and his glory shall be seen upon thee. And the Gentiles shall come to thy light, and kings to the brightness of thy rising.” — Isaiah 60:1–3 (KJV)

Shout the loudest Amen!

Scripture makes it very clear that towards the end of the age, we are going to experience a drastic rise in the glory of God upon the earth.

In Haggai chapter 2, from verse 6 to verse 9, He said:

*“For thus saith the LORD of hosts; Yet once, it is a little while, and I will shake the heavens, and the earth, and the sea, and the dry land;
And I will shake all nations, and the desire of all nations shall come: and I will fill this house with glory, saith the LORD of hosts.
The silver is mine, and the gold is mine, saith the LORD of hosts.*

The glory of this latter house shall be greater than of the former, saith the LORD of hosts: and in this place will I give peace, saith the LORD of hosts.”
— Haggai 2:6–9 (KJV)

The Lord bless His Word, in Jesus’ Name.

The subject tonight is: **Arise, Shine**

Our objective is to understand our responsibilities in the season of glory.

There is one way to know that glory is about to hit the earth: it is when you see the manifestation of gross darkness. The manifestation of gross darkness confirms that the time is due for the glory of the Lord to explode.

Somebody say, “Glorious explosion!”

Those who must experience the glory that will explode must do two things:

1. They must arise.
2. They must shine.

To Shine, You Must Rise

I want to say three things by way of introduction.

“Arise, shine; for thy light is come, and the glory of the LORD is risen upon thee.”

The first thing to notice is this: to shine, you must rise.

You do not sleep to shine.

You do not sit to shine.

You rise to shine.

You do not dream about shining.

You do not wish to shine.

You rise to shine.

Many want to shine, but they are not willing to rise.

Secondly, if you can rise, you will shine.

How is that different from the first? It is very different. I want you to notice that the Bible did not say, "Arise and shine." We read it like that, but that is not what He said.

He said:

"Arise, shine..."

There is no gap between rising and shining. If you have risen, the natural consequence is shining.

Whatever cannot stop you from rising cannot stop you from shining.

If the devil cannot stop you from rising, he cannot stop you from shining. If the forces of darkness cannot stop you from rising, they cannot stop you from shining.

Thirdly, rising is a choice, and shining is also a choice.

Nobody rises by chance, and nobody shines by chance.

If anybody must rise, he rises by choice.

If anybody will shine, he shines by choice.

Nobody stood from a sitting position and said, "I don't know why I stood." No. He made up his mind to stand.

Nobody graduates with a first-class degree accidentally. Calculated decisions and deliberate actions produced that result.

So, rising is a choice, and shining is a choice.

If you have not risen in life, ministry, or assignment, there are choices you have not made.

If you are not shining, there are choices you have not made.

We are here in this conference to trust the Lord to know those choices that must be made in order to rise.

Rise From Sleep and Slumber

What does it mean to rise?

1. To Rise Means to Get Up From Sleep or Slumber

It is not possible for anybody to sleep their way into glory. It is impossible to slumber your way into glory.

In Romans 13:11–12, Scripture says:

“...now it is high time to awake out of sleep...”

And in Ephesians 5:14:

“Awake thou that sleepest, and arise from the dead, and Christ shall give thee light.” — Ephesians 5:14 (KJV)

Nobody can step into glory while asleep spiritually. It is not possible for a sleeping pastor to experience a glorious ministry. It is not possible for a slumbering businessman to experience a glorious business empire. If anybody must shine, there must be a waking up from slumber.

No wonder Amos 6:1 says:

“Woe to them that are at ease in Zion...” — Amos 6:1 (KJV)

That shall never be your portion in the precious Name of Jesus!

Archbishop Benson Idahosa of blessed memory told the story of a pastor who slept so much that church members would go to his house every morning to wake him up.

“Pastor, it is daybreak!”

He continued such a life until he was captured before his time. Beloved brothers and sisters, divine visitation does not happen for those who are spiritually asleep.

The Bible says there were shepherds keeping watch over their flock by night when the angel appeared unto them. If they were asleep, visitation would not have happened.

If anybody here is to experience a visitation of glory, a visitation of light, that person must wake up from sleep and slumber. Wake up! Wake up! Wake up!

Do not delegate prayer to others while you remain asleep spiritually. John Wesley said that when God is about to work, He sets His praying people praying. Prayerlessness and glory cannot coexist.

2. To Rise Means to Get Up From the Position of Rest or Relaxation

This is different from sleep or slumber. This is the position of accomplishment, arrival, achievement, and success. There are people today who are settled with a level of result, a level of success, and it is a tragedy.

That was the challenge with Abraham’s father. Many people do not realise that Abraham was not the first person who attempted to go to Canaan. His father was.

Genesis 11:31 says:

“...they went forth with them from Ur of the Chaldees, to go into the land of Canaan; and they came unto Haran, and dwelt there.” — Genesis 11:31 (KJV)

He was going to Canaan, but he stopped at Haran and settled there. And the Bible says Terah died in Haran. When you stop moving, things around you start dying.

Everything around a man begins to die when he stops moving. There are people who stopped where God intended them to start.

Arise from complacency.

Arise from premature contentment.

People may clap for you in your smallness while Heaven is crying because you have not yet entered your true assignment.

Human beings compare you with other people and conclude that you have succeeded, but God sees farther than man sees.

There is a glory you have not yet touched.

There is a realm you have not yet entered.

Until we see Jesus face to face, there is always one more step to take, one more soul to save, one more impact to make, one more devil to cast out. When Abraham's father stopped and died, God picked Abraham and said in essence:

“What your father could not enter, move and enter it.”

And Abraham finished the journey his father could not finish. I speak to someone here today: the journey your fathers could not finish, you shall finish it!

The realm of glory, favour, and resources they could not touch, God shall enable you to touch that realm.

The Danger of Resting Too Early

Issachar had a tragedy.

Genesis 49:14–15 says:

*“Issachar is a strong ass couching down between two burdens:
And he saw that rest was good, and the land that it was pleasant...”* —

Genesis 49:14–15 (KJV)

The problem began when he saw that rest was good.

“I already have a good house.”

“I already have a good car.”

“I already run multiple services.”

“I have travelled around the world.”

And because he saw that rest was good, the Bible says:

“...he bowed his shoulder to bear, and became a servant unto tribute.”

That is the tragedy of those who decide to rest when they should rise. The man or woman who fails to embark on acceleration has surrendered to oppression. Those who think life is a permanent vacation eventually end in frustration.

There is a time to rest. God Himself rested after work. But when all of life becomes rest, everything begins to rust. When you align yourself permanently with ease, life becomes uneasy. One day, the Lord spoke to me and said, “The bird that stops flying is set to fall from the sky.”

Arise!

Like He told the children of Israel:

“Ye have dwelt long enough in this mount...” — Deuteronomy 1:6 (KJV)

You have stayed too long around this breakthrough.

Too long around this testimony.

Too long around this level.

Arise and take your journey!

3. To Rise Means to Get Up From Failure or Defeat

There are many people on the floor today because of failure and defeat.

But Proverbs 24:16 says:

“For a just man falleth seven times, and riseth up again...” — Proverbs 24:16
(KJV)

There is something worse than falling. It is refusing to rise again. It is discouraging to fail, but it is destructive to remain fallen.

Micah 7:8 says:

“Rejoice not against me, O mine enemy: when I fall, I shall arise...” — Micah
7:8 (KJV)

Catherine Kuhlman made mistakes that caused many people to reject her ministry. Invitations stopped. Doors closed.

But one day she cried to God and said:

“Lord, I am at the end of the road and at the end of myself. In the eyes of everybody, I am nothing. Can You use nothing?”

God heard her cry.

And the same woman became a terror to the kingdom of darkness. She rose from seeming failure into undeniable glory. Maybe you are here today and you feel like every effort has failed. Maybe it looks like everything has collapsed around your life and assignment. Hear this clearly:

In the Name that is above every name, every spell of failure and defeat over your life is broken!

You will rise again, and you will shine!

There Is Something the Enemy Could Not Destroy

In Judges 16:22, the Bible says:

“Howbeit the hair of his head began to grow again after he was shaven.” —
Judges 16:22 (KJV)

Somebody say, “Again!”

Whatever you have lost has the capacity to grow again.

There are mantles, graces, and manifestations that once disappeared from your life that shall return and grow again. Do not forget this for the rest of your life: They cut Samson’s hair, not his head.

The worst mistake the enemy made was leaving the head intact. Whatever the enemy has done to your life, there is something he could not do. There is something God did not permit him to touch. That remaining thing is the key to your recovery.

No matter what you have lost, there is something left. And what is left is the link to restoration. There is something God did not allow the devil to take from you. That surviving remnant is connected to your complete recovery.

Somebody shout:

“I am rising from failure!”

“I am rising from defeat!”

“I am rising from frustration!”

There Is Always Something Left

How do I know?

The wall of Jericho had a segment that did not collapse. As Samson called unto the Lord and said:

“O Lord GOD, remember me, I pray thee, and strengthen me, I pray thee, only this once...” — Judges 16:28 (KJV)

Samson took hold of the two middle pillars upon which the house stood. But listen carefully: Samson said something he should not have said.

He said:

“Let me die with the Philistines.”

That was unnecessary. Because the house of Rahab the harlot was built upon the wall of Jericho. Joshua chapter 2 tells us clearly that Rahab’s house was located upon the wall itself. The spies told her to tie the scarlet cord upon the window, and when the wall collapsed, her portion remained standing.

Joshua 6:22–23 says:

“But Joshua had said unto the two men that had spied out the country, Go into the harlot's house, and bring out thence the woman, and all that she hath, as ye sware unto her.

And the young men that were spies went in, and brought out Rahab...” —
Joshua 6:22–23 (KJV)

That means a segment of the wall remained intact. The house of the Philistines could have collapsed without Samson dying with them. Hear this carefully: no matter how desperate you are, never confess the wrong thing.

God performs the word of His servant and fulfils the counsel of His messengers. No matter what is lost, there is always something left. And what is left is the link to complete recovery.

There is something God did not allow the devil to touch.
There is an area God did not allow the enemy to invade.

That untouched portion is the key to restoration. I prophesy to someone here tonight: may God open your eyes to see what is left around your life!

What is left in your ministry, your destiny, your assignment — may God reveal it to you tonight.

4. To Rise Means to Get Up From Weariness and Tiredness

Weariness is different from failure. It is possible to be tired without being defeated.

Elijah had not failed, but he became weary.

In 1 Kings 19:4, he said:

“It is enough; now, O LORD, take away my life...” — 1 Kings 19:4 (KJV)

He was tired of the warfare, tired of confrontation, tired of Jezebel and Ahab.

But Galatians 6:9 says:

“And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not.” — Galatians 6:9 (KJV)

Tiredness on the journey is a doorway to the unfulfilment of destiny.

The moment a person becomes exhausted and gives up, assignment remains unfinished.

When Elijah insisted he could go no further, God told him:

“Go and anoint Hazael.

Go and anoint Jehu.

Go and anoint Elisha.”

In essence, God was saying:

“What I gave one man to carry must now be distributed among three people because you are tired.”

You will finish your assignment!

The demons of your father’s house shall not weary you out.

Occultic powers shall not weary you out.

Foundational battles shall not weary you out.

Somebody say:

“I refuse to be tired!”

Between you and the devil, the devil will be the one tired first.

The enemy’s strategy is to weary you until you turn your back and run.

But the weapons of our warfare have no provision for the back.

“...having your loins girt about with truth... the breastplate of righteousness...” — Ephesians 6:14 (KJV)

There is no armour for retreat because you were never designed to run from the enemy.

The last time you turned your back on the devil in defeat shall be the last forever!

Say it loudly:

“I am not tired!

I cannot be tired!

I refuse to be tired!”

Deliverance Comes Through the Word

Real deliverance is not merely prayed; real deliverance is preached. Jesus preached deliverance to the captives. As the Word goes forth, chains break, yokes break, burdens lift, and oppressions scatter.

Even right now, as these words are being spoken, deliverance is taking place.

Things are breaking.

Yokes are breaking.

Oppressions are breaking.

5. To Rise Means to Get Up From Visionlessness and Goallessness

When a man has no vision, he has nothing to rise for. Action is the harvest of vision. Motion is fuelled by vision.

Where there is no vision, there is no action.

Where vision is absent, elevation cannot happen.

Habakkuk 2:2 says:

“Write the vision, and make it plain upon tables, that he may run that readeth it.” — Habakkuk 2:2 (KJV)

A man without vision has nothing to run towards. Paul the Apostle said:

“I went up by revelation...” — Galatians 2:2 (KJV)

If you are going to rise, it will be because you saw something. The reason many people have not left where they are is because they do not know where to go.

The Four Lepers and the Power of Vision

The four lepers at the gate of Samaria remained stagnant until vision appeared. Then one of them said:

“Why sit we here until we die?” — 2 Kings 7:3 (KJV)

That question changed everything. They said:

“If we enter into the city, then the famine is in the city, and we shall die there: and if we sit still here, we die also...” — 2 Kings 7:4 (KJV)

In other words:

“It is better to die moving than to die stagnant.”

Motion is superior to stagnation. The death of a hero is superior to the life of a coward. Martin Luther King Jr. died, yet he still speaks. Those who fear death die the quickest, but those who are not afraid of death make death afraid of them.

The moment vision appeared, movement began. And once they moved, God moved with them.

God moves with movers. The Red Sea parted before movers. Mark 16:20 says:

“And they went forth, and preached every where, the Lord working with them...” — Mark 16:20 (KJV)

The Lord works with movers. Those lepers moved, and God amplified the sound of their footsteps until the Syrians heard the sound of mighty chariots. Imagine lepers producing the sound of an army. There is a sound heaven wants your generation to hear, but that sound is waiting for your movement.

Destiny may hang on one person’s vision. Those lepers saved an entire nation from famine.

The destiny of your family may depend on your vision.

The destiny of your generation may depend on your action.

Prophecy Requires Action

The fulfilment of prophecy is waiting for somebody’s action. Elisha prophesied abundance, but the prophecy needed the movement of the lepers for manifestation.

To refuse to act is to allow prophecy to remain unfulfilled. To refuse vision is to allow generations to sink. Something is happening tonight.

God is about to do very rapid things.

A Generation Rising in Glory

I went to North America with expectation. I did not go there to waste time. We entered lands where revival generals once shook territories for God, and we trusted God for fresh manifestations of His power.

People testified of healings, miracles, and mighty demonstrations of God's power. A woman testified that after prolonged eye treatment and injections, she encountered the healing power of God instantly.

Another testified concerning Parkinson's disease and tremors. And I announce in the Name that is above every name, Jesus Christ the resurrected Lord:

Whatever has blurred your vision and deprived you of purpose, it is over forever!

What It Means to Shine

When you have risen, you shine.

So, what does it mean to shine?

1. To Shine Means to Be Outstanding

Refuse to blend into obscurity.

Refuse to die unnoticed.

2. To Shine Means to Release Content and Deploy Potential

If you want to step into the glory realm, release what God has deposited inside you.

Deploy your potential.

In Luke 9:29, when Jesus prayed:

“...the fashion of his countenance was altered, and his raiment was white and glistening.” — Luke 9:29 (KJV)

What was inside Him began to come out.

3. To Shine Means to Engage Mentality and Deploy Intelligence

When people say a student is shining academically, it means the person has engaged his mind.

God did not give anybody a useless mind. Spirituality does not cancel intelligence.

Engage mentality.

Deploy intelligence.

Bring your mental resources to bear upon your assignment.

4. To Shine Means to Release Inherent Light

The light inside you must be released.

The knowledge God deposited in you must find expression. Push that light into your work, your assignment, and your calling.

5. To Shine Means to Polish and Upgrade Yourself

Just as shoes shine through polishing, lives shine through refinement.

Upgrade yourself.

Upscale yourself.

Do not leave your potential unpolished.

When you determine to rise and determine to shine, no devil can stop you from seeing glory.

I see a generation rising out of this place tonight.

The devil will be shocked at your return to your city, your church, your community, and your generation.

Say after me:

“I shall not abandon my life.

I will not abandon my destiny.

I refuse to abandon my assignment.

I shall shine!”

The Glory Ahead

This message is foundational for the things to come. Not every believer will step into end-time manifestations. Not because they are not saved, but because they are not prepared. Romans 8 speaks about:

“...the manifestation of the sons of God.” — Romans 8:19 (KJV)

There are children who have not matured into sons.

There are people who will merely watch others step into supernatural manifestations because they refused the responsibility of rising and shining. We may be in the same church, but we have not accepted the same responsibility.

Your children cannot inherit your degree certificate. They must study for themselves. In the same way, every believer must personally rise.

Lift your voice and pray:

“Father, I am ready for the glory ahead.

I receive the grace and discipline to arise.

And I determine to shine!”
