# *Introduction*

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Today, we continue with **Bold As A Lion, Part Five**.

This session is specifically on **The Necessity of Boldness**—understanding why we need boldness.

Our foundation scripture is:

“The wicked flee when no man pursueth: but the righteous are bold as a lion.”

— Proverbs 28:1 (KJV)

We must understand why we need boldness because boldness is righteousness. We must understand why we need boldness because it is righteous to be bold.

It is righteous to be bold.

It is godly to be bold.

There are losses we experience when we lack boldness. So, we shall look at a couple of reasons why we must be bold. Boldness is not merely moving about with confidence, nor is it looking as if you want to intimidate or oppress everybody. It goes far beyond that.

We have a non-negotiable need to be bold, especially in the world we live in today.

# 1. Boldness Helps Us Go After the Enemy to Take Back What Is Ours

Boldness helps us go after the enemy. On a general note, boldness helps us engage the enemy. You need a heart that can confront the enemy. Boldness helps us go after the enemy to take back what is ours.

In Genesis 14:14, Abraham heard that his brother had been taken captive:

“And when Abram heard that his brother was taken captive, he armed his trained servants, born in his own house, three hundred and eighteen, and pursued them unto Dan.”

He pursued them.

Boldness helps us go after the enemy to take back what belongs to us. In 1 Samuel 17:34–37, David recounted his experience before Saul:

“Thy servant kept his father's sheep, and there came a lion, and a bear, and took a lamb out of the flock:

And I went out after him, and smote him, and delivered it out of his mouth...”

David said, *“I went after him.”*

It takes boldness to go after a lion.

In this case, it was lion versus lion—the generation of the Lion of the Tribe of Judah confronting the seed of the roaring lion, Satan the devil.

David said:

“I went after him, and smote him, and delivered it out of his mouth.”

There are many things the enemy has taken from people.

There are things the devil took because there were not enough people bold enough to confront him and say:

“Devil, stop there!

You cannot take this one.

You cannot carry what belongs to me.

You cannot resist my assignment.

You cannot resist my ministry.

You cannot take this from my hands.”

Because of the shortage of such people, the enemy took many things and appeared to keep them permanently.

## **Recovering What the Enemy Stole**

In 1 Samuel 30, David and his men returned to Ziklag and discovered that the Amalekites had invaded the city, burned it with fire, and carried away their wives, sons, and daughters.

The Bible says they lifted up their voices and wept until they had no more power to weep.

Without boldness, all they would have been left with was tears.

Imagine David, the warrior, weeping until there was no more strength left.

But then David looked at himself and said, “Wait a minute. What is happening here?”

The people even thought of stoning him because they were grieved over their families.

Then the Bible says:

“But David encouraged himself in the LORD his God.”

— 1 Samuel 30:6

That is the beginning of boldness.

He encouraged himself in the Lord.

He refused discouragement.

He refused depression.

He refused defeat.

He refused to sit down and cry.

I am here tonight because somebody must refuse to sit down and cry.

I do not know what the devil has stolen from you—whether from your family, your church, your ministry, or your assignment.

But hear this:

Nothing is too lost to be recovered in God. For the person who is bold, nothing is too lost to be found. David encouraged himself in the Lord and sought God. Then God gave him the instruction:

“Pursue: for thou shalt surely overtake them, and without fail recover all.”

— 1 Samuel 30:8

Arise.

Pursue.

Overtake.

Without fail, recover all.

Listen carefully:

Cowardice achieves nothing.

Fear achieves nothing.

Depression achieves nothing.

But boldness recovers everything.

Boldness recovers everything.

Boldness recovers everything.

David pursued.

And the Bible declares:

“And there was nothing lacking to them, neither small nor great, neither sons nor daughters, neither spoil, nor any thing that they had taken to them: David recovered all.”

— 1 Samuel 30:19

David recovered all. I announce to somebody in the Name of Jesus: you shall recover all. Very soon, people will look at you and say:

“Wait a minute! We thought they said you lost this. We thought they said you lost that. We thought they had written you off.”

There is an impartation of boldness coming upon you that will make you run after the devil and recover what he took from your family, your father’s house, your nation, and your community.

You will look at the devil and declare:

“I am taking it back.”

# The Boldness of Spiritual Aggression

From my youth, I have always been fascinated by people who are aggressive and bold in spirit.

The stories of Smith Wigglesworth interest me greatly.

The stories of Lester Sumrall also interest me greatly.

Lester Sumrall once encountered a witch doctor in a Latin American nation. The man was performing occult practices involving a bullfrog.

Without hesitation, Lester laid hands on him and cast out the devil.

The man could no longer perform his witchcraft operations.

That night, while Lester slept, his room suddenly came under satanic disturbance.

Everything began to vibrate.

The bed vibrated.

The curtains vibrated.

Everything shook.

Then one of the curtains rose and stood upright at a ninety-degree angle.

Lester stood up and declared:

“Satan, I recognise you.

I cast you out in the daytime, and I have not changed my mind.

Get out of here now!”

Everything continued vibrating.

Then suddenly, the vibration stopped.

The curtain dropped.

Peace returned.

But Lester noticed that the bed had shifted away from the wall during the disturbance.

Immediately, he ran to the window and shouted:

“Devils, come back here!

When you entered this room, you met this bed against the wall.

Push it back before you leave!”

The vibration resumed until the bed moved back to its original position.

Then he said:

“Now you may go.”

Tonight, we are not merely casting out the devil.

We are demanding restoration.

“Put it back.

Return it back.

Restore it exactly the way you met it.”

That is the kind of boldness heaven is looking for.

The devil must repair what he damaged.

He must return what he took.

He must restore what he tampered with.

And I have bad news for the devil:

For many of you here, the devil shall pay for what he tampered with in your life.

He shall pay for what he tampered with in your family.

In the Name of Jesus.

Amen.

Men and women who are ready to take their lives in their hands, risk anything, and dare anything are scarce.

Those who take care are plenty.

Those who take charge are few.

Those who take care are many.

Those who take charge are few.

I do not know about you, but I do not want the longing of my Master to continue unfulfilled.

I do not want the yearning of my Saviour to remain unmet.

So I am going to run.

I am going to dare the devil.

I am going to confront the forces of darkness.

I am going to dare anything necessary.

In the village, people used to say when they needed to confront a difficult situation and the outcome looked uncertain, "A person does not die twice."

That was their conclusion.

“I have already gone and I have already returned. A person does not die twice.”

I believe those three mighty men must have spoken to one another in that manner.

“We are going to bring this water for our master, even at the risk of our lives if necessary.”

Perhaps they said among themselves:

“If any one of us dies in the course of this expedition, so be it. No challenge. Let us go.”

The master must drink water.

And he must drink water from that well.

Since he specifically desired water from the well of Bethlehem, that is exactly where the water must come from.

Not just any water.

Water from the well of Bethlehem.

And they were determined to get it.

Whether they returned whole or wounded, whether with both hands or without a hand, whether with both legs or without a leg—the master must get the water.

# Discovering the Longing of the Master

When we finish tonight, between now and tomorrow, negotiate with your Master.

Discuss with Him.

Ask Him:

“What are You longing for that You want me to dare for You?”

“What is Your yearning over my nation?”

“What is Your yearning over my continent?”

“What is Your yearning over my generation?”

“What concern is in Your heart that You want me to address?”

“What are You desiring?”

“What are You longing for?”

“What do You want me to do?”

I am not speaking only to pastors.

I am speaking to Christian businessmen.

I am speaking to people in politics.

I am speaking to professionals in every sphere of society.

Ask God:

“What do You want me to do in my nation?”

“What is Your concern over my land?”

“What is Your concern over my community?”

“What is Your concern over my city?”

There are people God wants to use in business.

There are people He wants to use in politics.

There are people He wants to use in sports.

There are people He wants to use in industry.

And God is saying:

“This is My longing. This is My yearning.”

Then you respond:

“Lord, if this is Your yearning, count it done.

Consider it settled.

I am going for it.”

Let God know that He has somebody He can count on.

As far as your nation is concerned, your generation is concerned, your community is concerned, and your city is concerned, let God know there is someone available.

If He desires His passion fulfilled, count it done. If He desires His yearning fulfilled, count it done. If He desires His purpose fulfilled, count it done. Do not make Him repeat Himself.

Just say:

“It is done, Lord.”

### **3. Boldness Helps Us Take a Stand for God in the Face of Threat and Danger**

Why do we need boldness?

Boldness helps us take a stand for God in the face of threat and danger. Boldness enables us to stand for God when it is dangerous to do so.

In Daniel 3:16–18, everybody was commanded to bow to Nebuchadnezzar’s image or face death.

But Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego answered:

“O Nebuchadnezzar, we are not careful to answer thee in this matter.

If it be so, our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace, and he will deliver us out of thine hand, O king.

But if not, be it known unto thee, O king, that we will not serve thy gods, nor worship the golden image which thou hast set up.”

That is boldness.

Boldness helps us take a stand for God when it is dangerous to do so. In Daniel 6:10, when Daniel knew the decree had been signed, he went into his house, opened his windows toward Jerusalem, and continued praying three times a day.

That is boldness.

If Christians everywhere would take a stand for God—in government, in parliament, in the assemblies, in business, and in every sphere of influence—this world would not be the way it is today.

In many places, those promoting ungodly agendas are fewer than the believers who remain silent.

Boldness says:

“If I perish, I perish.”

You take a stand.

Nebuchadnezzar may threaten the fire, but you stand.

And one discovery has remained true:

If you refuse to bow, you will not burn.

They did not bow.

And they did not burn.

## **Righteousness Requires Boldness**

I want every Christian under this commission, every Christian connected to this ministry, and everyone hearing the sound of my voice to understand this truth:

Boldness is part of righteousness.

There is no righteousness without boldness.

Holiness is not merely about what you do not drink, what you do not wear, or what you refuse to participate in.

Your holiness includes your boldness.

Your righteousness includes your boldness.

You cannot fully demonstrate righteousness while living in fear.

## **4. Boldness Helps Us Stand Even When We Stand Alone**

Boldness helps us take a stand even when it means standing alone. Boldness enables us to stand when the majority hold the opposite opinion. This was what Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego did. They were not the only Jewish captives in Babylon.

Others were there.

Yet they were the ones thrown into the fire. Daniel was not the only Jew in Babylon. Yet he was the one who opened his windows and prayed. Sometimes, even fellow believers may fail to stand with you. You expect others to join you, but they withdraw.

You expect support, but fear silences them. The time may come when you appear to be standing alone. At the cross of Christ, only one disciple remained visibly present.

The others had disappeared.

Jesus said:

“Woman, behold thy son!... Behold thy mother!”

— John 19:26–27

John was there.

Peter had denied Him.

Judas had betrayed Him.

The others had vanished from the scene.

They may not have committed gross sin.

But they lacked courage.

They lacked backbone.

They lacked the heart to stand.

The earthworm is crushed because it has no backbone.

The millipede is crushed because it has no backbone. Beloved, be prepared to take a stand after this conference. Even if you are the only one in your office. Even if you are the only one in your city. Even if you are the only one in your community.

Be ready to stand.

I have been in many situations where I thought there was a crowd, only to discover there were one or two people left. I have attended meetings where I was the lone dissenting voice.

Many years ago, I attended a gathering of Christian leaders where a political matter was being discussed. A position was being supported that I believed was wrong. Though I was younger than everyone present, I stood my ground.

When I spoke, some were offended by the boldness with which I spoke. But when principles are involved, sentiment cannot be allowed to rule. And in time, the position we took was vindicated. Beloved, there will come a time when you need to be bold.

And when you stand for God, God stands with you. You may stand alone before men, but you never stand alone before God.

He stands beside you.

He confirms your stand.

He establishes your conviction.

Because ultimately, it is not merely your stand—it is His stand.

## **5. Boldness Is Needed to Reject Ungodly Laws and Decrees**

Boldness is necessary for rejecting and reacting against ungodly laws and decrees. It does not matter where such laws originate. If they are spiritually unlawful and contrary to God's Word, they must be resisted. Many people quote Scripture concerning submission to authorities and obedience to the laws of the land.

Indeed, believers should not be rebellious people. However, Scripture also gives us examples of men whose allegiance to God was greater than their allegiance to earthly authority. Daniel was a government official.

He was effectively the highest-ranking administrator under the king. Yet when a law was enacted prohibiting prayer to God, Daniel chose spiritual conviction over political position. His spiritual persuasion was superior to his governmental office. His commitment to God outweighed his commitment to personal advancement.

He took a stand.

Any law that directly contradicts the law of God must never replace obedience to God. Boldness becomes necessary whenever decrees are ungodly. Whether in government, business, or any institution, there are times when a believer must say:

“This is wrong.”

There are policies designed to enrich organisations while harming ordinary people. There are practices built on dishonesty and exploitation. There are decisions driven solely by profit rather than righteousness. In such moments, boldness is required.

You must be able to say:

“This is wrong.

Life is not all about money.

I reject this.

Proceed if you choose, but I will not be part of it.”

God may not hold you responsible for failing to stop every ungodly action around you.

But He expects you to make your position known.

He expects you to refuse participation.

He expects you to stand for truth.

You may not always have the power to change a system.

But you must never lose the courage to declare what is right and what is wrong.

That is the work of boldness.

## **Boldness in the Face of Envy, Opposition, and Resistance**

Here you are impacting nations—touching lives in places such as the Philippines, Argentina, and beyond. Yet you will find some insignificant critic somewhere, unknown even in his own neighbourhood, questioning what God is doing through your life.

If you ask those around him who he is, they may hardly know him. Yet he feels qualified to announce who is or is not a man of God.

You discover that it is often a person who has never made any significant impact in life who sits in judgment over those who are affecting nations.

They ask, “Why build a 10,000-seater church? Why not give the money to the poor?”

That was the same argument Judas Iscariot used. He asked, “Why was this not sold and given to the poor?” Yet he was the one carrying the money bag. In essence, he was saying, “Why not give me the money?”

Are you following what I am saying today?

As Bishop Benson Idahosa once said, if boldness were a gift of the Spirit, he had it. I can say the same. If you are going to make your mark on the earth, you must deafen your ears and thicken your skin against the voices of envy, jealousy, and opposition.

Deafen your ears. Thicken your skin.

Is there anyone here determined to do that tonight? Shout the loudest Amen!

The Jews saw the crowd gathering around Paul and became envious. They said, “We have been in this synagogue all these years and no crowd gathered. Who is this stranger who just arrived in town?”

Listen carefully: if you do not want envy, avoid results.

If you do not want criticism, avoid manifestations.

If you do not want people talking about you, avoid achievement.

But if you desire results, then tell envy:

“Go ahead and hate me. You may hate me, but you cannot hurt me. You may hate me, but you cannot stop me. Go ahead and backbite me.”

Do you know why people backbite? Because they are behind you. They remain at the back, so they bite from the back.

The more they bite, the more you move forward.

Stand on your feet wherever you are.

You need to be bold. Do not be chicken-hearted.

“Everybody is talking about me.”

“All the pastors do not like me.”

“All my friends have abandoned me.”

“People in the office are speaking against me.”

Move on as though you are unaware of what they are doing.

Sometimes, even surprise them.

Buy them a gift.

Tell them, “I travelled and thought about you, so I brought this for you.”

Hallelujah!

Lift your right hand and say:

**“In the Name of Jesus, I proceed in boldness.”**

## **Boldness Makes Us Unstoppable**

The Bible says:

“Then Paul and Barnabas waxed bold, and said, It was necessary that the word of God should first have been spoken to you: but seeing ye put it from you, and judge yourselves unworthy of everlasting life, lo, we turn to the Gentiles.” (Acts 13:46, KJV)

They were essentially saying:

“We came to help you. You rejected us. You have not stopped us—you have only redirected us.”

And that redirection became the explosion of Paul’s ministry to the Gentiles.

This brings us to the next point:

Boldness causes us to identify alternative courses of action.

The bold person says:

“Devil, do whatever you want. You cannot stop me.”

I am unstoppable.

I am irresistible.

I am indomitable.

The devil cannot stop me.

Weak people are stopped.

Bold people are unstoppable.

Can the wind be stopped?

Place a roadblock before the wind and all you have done is create more pathways. It goes left, right, above, or around the obstacle.

When they resisted Paul, they only opened the door to his greatest ministry. His calling to the Gentiles was unlocked by resistance.

Weak people end their journey when opposition comes.

Bold people begin their journey after opposition comes.

Everything before the opposition was only preparation. Their real ministry and destiny begin when others try to stop them.

Somebody here is about to start a new journey.

You have been opposed.

You have been resisted.

You have been talked about and talked against.

But your journey is only beginning.

Paul's ministry opened after opposition.

Isaac found Rehoboth after resistance.

He dug one well and they stopped him.

He dug another and they stopped him.

He dug a third, and eventually they pushed him into Rehoboth—his place of enlargement.

His place where he could no longer be stopped.

I believe God is raising a generation of bold lions.

A generation that no principality, power, or territorial authority can stop.

Some of you came from nations that barely knew you existed.

But after this conference, your influence will become undeniable.

If you believe that, shout Amen!

## *The Eight Reasons We Need Boldness*

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### **1. Boldness Helps Us Go After the Enemy to Recover What Is Ours**

Boldness helps us pursue the enemy and recover what belongs to us.

### **2. Boldness Helps Us Dare Everything to Fulfil the Desires of Our Master**

Boldness enables us to risk everything to satisfy the desires and purposes of God.

### **3. Boldness Helps Us Take a Stand for God in the Face of Threat and Danger**

Boldness enables us to stand firm even when danger is present.

#### **4. Boldness Helps Us Stand Even When We Stand Alone**

Boldness gives us the courage to stand regardless of who joins us.

Say:

**“Boldness helps me take a stand, even if I have to stand alone.”**

#### **5. Boldness Is Needed to Reject and React Against Ungodly Laws and Decrees**

Boldness refuses to accept anything that opposes God’s will.

#### **6. Boldness Is Needed to Take Godly Action in the Interest of God and His People**

Remember Joseph of Arimathea.

Boldness acts when action is required.

#### **7. Boldness Helps Us Stand Firm and Speak Out in the Face of Envy and Opposition**

Boldness keeps us focused and vocal despite criticism.

#### **8. Boldness Makes Us Unstoppable and Irresistible**

Boldness causes us to identify alternative courses of action and ushers us into our place of enlargement. When the weak are resisted, they stop. When the bold are resisted, they advance. Resistance becomes the doorway to enlargement. Rehoboth becomes their testimony. Their place of enlargement. Their place where they can no longer be stopped.
