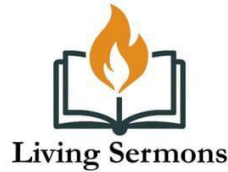

*Begins Here*



---

## *Introduction - A Heart Of Worship And Consecration*

---

Lift your hands and give Him the praise. Father, we worship You. Father, we honour You. Father, we adore You. Father, we magnify You.

Thank You, Father, for this privilege of knowing You—this privilege of connection to You for these almost weekly reigns of Your Spirit, reign of Your fire, reign of Your Word, and reign of Your presence. We thank You and we thank You.

Let no one here leave the same. Be glorified, Lord, in Jesus' precious name.

Give the Lord a praise.

Take your seat for one minute and welcome someone by your side. Come and have Your way this morning. This is an impartation service. An impartation is a transference of virtue from a vessel to another for the purpose of destiny transformation.

The impartation is going to help us to be who God wants us to be—or rather to do what God wants us to do with our lives.

I want to plead this morning that everybody should endeavour to do what God wants them to do with their lives, not to do something else. I don't want anybody to come under pressure to try to do things they have no grace to do, no calling to do, or no direction to do.

## *Divine Assignment And Different Graces*

---

Men like Oral Roberts, Kenneth Hagin, and T. L. Osborn lived in Tulsa, Oklahoma. They were friends. They moved together and functioned together.

But they never struggled to do what the other was doing or to outdo each other.

Kenneth Hagin's ministry was largely based in Tulsa, Oklahoma. He rarely travelled. Yet from one base, he ignited the whole world. Very few ministers today have not been influenced by his books.

So it is possible that God may plant you in one base and still use you to ignite the world from there. Oral Roberts was a healing evangelist. His ministry was largely based in America—crusades, television evangelism, tent meetings—yet his impact was global.

T. L. Osborn, however, was more field-based, travelling extensively across nations. He had a deep love for missions—India, Nigeria, and many other nations became his fields of harvest.

Three friends. Three distinct assignments. Three different expressions of grace. They strengthened each other. They challenged each other. They did not compete.

That is how life should be.

## *Pressure Without Comparison*

When crusade clips are shown, it is not to place pressure on anyone to copy another man's assignment. It is to stir diligence in your own calling.

If what you see aligns with your assignment, then let it sharpen you—not burden you.

God does not call us into imitation, but into obedience.

God connects His servants differently.

Kenneth Copeland was called to go around the world.

Another servant may be called to remain in one place and work deeply from there.

Every assignment depends on divine direction.

Even natural movement is sometimes governed by instruction. A man may be told by God to stay in one location, and not move beyond it for years.

What matters is obedience.

## *The Necessity Of Boldness - Part Six*

---

We now continue the teaching on **the necessity of boldness**.

We are rounding off this section and moving into the keys to boldness.

Let us revisit what we have learned:

### **1. Boldness helps us recover what belongs to us**

We go after the enemy and take back what is ours.

### **2. Boldness enables sacrifice**

It empowers us to dare all in order to fulfil the desire of our Master.

### **3. Boldness helps us stand in danger**

Like Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, we stand firm even in the face of fire.

### **4. Boldness helps us stand alone**

Even if others are not standing, boldness enables us to stand.

## **5. Boldness empowers resistance to ungodly decrees**

When laws contradict God's Word, boldness resists.

## **6. Boldness drives godly action**

Like Esther, like Joseph of Arimathea—boldness compels action for God's purpose.

## **7. Boldness withstands opposition**

It speaks even when envy and resistance rise.

## **8. Boldness makes us unstoppable**

It opens alternative paths and leads to enlargement.

## **9. Boldness Speaks What Others Fear To Say**

Isaiah declared boldly:

“I was found of them that sought me not; I was made manifest unto them that asked not after me.”

— *Romans 10:20 (KJV)*

Boldness makes us say what others fear to say. It makes us speak what others fear to speak. It makes us dare what others fear to dare. We live in a generation where silence is dangerous. There are moments when someone must speak—against evil, against darkness, against the devil.

But many are watching, grieving, and remaining silent. Boldness refuses silence.

Boldness speaks the unspeakable.

Boldness declares the unspoken.

Boldness does what others will not dare.

# **The Spirit Of Elijah – The Weight Of Boldness**

Elijah thought he was alone, but God revealed otherwise. There were prophets hidden in caves who never spoke. When God finds a man who dares what others refuse to dare, He multiplies grace upon that man.

Elijah carried what looked like the mantle of many prophets. One man functioned with the weight of hundreds. Because he spoke when others were silent.

## **10. Boldness Speaks The Mind Of God**

Boldness brings us into alignment with the exact will and mind of God. Sometimes the will of God is unpopular. Sometimes it is controversial. But truth does not change because it is unpopular. As was said, it is better to be controversial than to be inconsequential. Elijah declared:

“Thus saith the LORD, there shall not be dew nor rain these years, but according to my word.”

He was speaking the mind of God without fear.

## **11. Boldness Preaches Without Fear**

Boldness enables the preaching of the full counsel of God.

There is a time to rebuke.

There is a time to correct.

There is a time to confront.

The Word of God is not adjusted to comfort men—it is preached as it is. Many compromise because of influence, money, or pressure. But the true messenger of God does not shape the Word to his lifestyle; he shapes his lifestyle to the Word.

The Word is the standard—not man.

Many people only preach what does not touch their personal lives. But true boldness says:

“If it is in me, I will preach it against myself first.”

The truth of God must remain the standard—even if it corrects the preacher himself. There was a Methodist evangelist—his name was Andrew Johnson. He was preaching one day, and the American President, Andrew Jackson, was seated in the service.

He preached with authority and audacity and declared: “*The soul that sinneth, it shall die.*” He told everyone plainly that sinners are on their way to hell. Even when a president was present, he did not soften the message. He did not adjust truth for influence. He did not dilute conviction for status. These were men who did not spare their lives. They cared only about the Word of God.

## **The Call To Preach Without Reservation**

I want everyone to rise up and preach the whole counsel of God—the whole truth, regardless of who it touches, including yourself.

The Word of God is not selective. It does not exclude the preacher. It must be declared fully, without fear, without compromise.

## *Scriptural Foundation - Boldness Without Fear*

---

“And many of the brethren in the Lord, waxing confident by my bonds, are much more bold to speak the word without fear.”

— *Philippians 1:14 (KJV)*

“We were bold in our God to speak unto you the gospel of God with much contention.”

— *1 Thessalonians 2:2 (KJV)*

The early church spoke the Word boldly. They did not speak it cautiously. They did not speak it selectively.

They were bold to speak the Word—bold to declare truth under pressure.

## 11. Boldness Represents God To A Generation

Boldness empowers us to represent God to our generation. Elijah declared:

“As the LORD God of Israel liveth, before whom I stand, there shall not be dew nor rain these years, but according to my word.”

— *1 Kings 17:1 (KJV)*

He stood as God’s representative on the earth.

Daniel was another example. His life was so publicly aligned with God that the only accusation against him was his devotion.

“Then said these men, We shall not find any occasion against this Daniel, except we find it against him concerning the law of his God.”

— *Daniel 6:5 (KJV)*

And when Daniel knew the decree had been signed:

“He went into his house... his windows being open... he kneeled upon his knees three times a day, and prayed, and gave thanks.”

— *Daniel 6:10 (KJV)*

Even in a hostile climate, he represented God boldly.

# ***Boldness In A Compromised Generation***

When it is not fashionable to be a Christian—when faith is ridiculed and truth is diluted—boldness becomes essential. In a climate of compromise, believers must stand visibly, openly, and without shame.

You represent God to your generation. Say it clearly. Stand firmly. Live visibly. There are moments in history where servants of God took bold stands that shifted atmospheres.

When a gathering of witchcraft was announced in a city, a servant of God declared it would not stand.

And it did not stand.

Because boldness is not noise—it is authority backed by heaven.

When a man stands as God’s representative, he speaks with heaven’s endorsement.

# *Keys To Boldness*

---

Now we move quickly into the keys to boldness.

## **1. Wisdom – Access To The Mind Of God**

“A man's wisdom maketh his face to shine, and the boldness of his face shall be changed.”

— *Ecclesiastes 8:1 (KJV)*

Wisdom is access to the mind of God. When you know what God is doing and how He is doing it, boldness becomes natural. You no longer move by guesswork. You move by revelation. Jesus demonstrated this:

In the feeding of the multitude, He knew what to do. In the turning of water into wine, He gave clear instructions without hesitation. When heaven reveals direction, fear disappears.

We must stop living by assumption and start living by revelation. We must stop acting blindly and start acting with divine clarity. When God shows you what He is doing, boldness becomes effortless.

# *A Personal Encounter With Divine Direction*

There are times when situations look impossible—pressure, opposition, even fear surrounding an assignment.

But when God speaks, clarity replaces fear.

When revelation comes, boldness rises.

And once you know God is with you, no devil, no opposition, no circumstance can stop what He has ordained.

## **2. Walking In Righteousness**

“The wicked flee when no man pursueth: but the righteous are bold as a lion.”

— *Proverbs 28:1 (KJV)*

Righteousness produces boldness. Guilt destroys confidence. A clear conscience produces courage. A child can stare at danger without fear because there is no guilt in them. But when the conscience is stained, boldness disappears.

Adam said, *“I heard Thy voice, and I was afraid.”* Fear entered through guilt.

Those who slander, cheat, or live with hidden compromise often cannot stand boldly before others.

But a life of integrity produces strength of spirit.

Even when accusations rise, a clear conscience gives confidence.

## **Living In Honesty Before God And Man**

“And herein do I exercise myself, to have always a conscience void of offence toward God, and toward men.”

— *Acts 24:16 (KJV)*

We may not be perfect, but we must be sincere. Honesty before God produces strength before men. Many lack boldness because something is unsettled in their walk with God.

### ***A Testimony Of Integrity And Boldness***

A judge once shared how he was handling a capital case involving witchcraft pressure and intimidation.

He faced spiritual attacks whenever he sat on the case.

Yet he declared boldly: if he had taken no bribe, no diabolical power could affect him.

That is boldness rooted in righteousness.

And heaven backs such boldness.

## **3. Being With The Lord**

“Now when they saw the boldness of Peter and John... they marvelled; and they took knowledge of them, that they had been with Jesus.”

— *Acts 4:13 (KJV)*

Association produces transformation. Being with Jesus produces boldness like a lion. You cannot walk with fear and expect boldness. Communion with God imparts a lion nature.

In worship, in prayer, in fellowship with the Holy Ghost, something is transferred.

Fear is replaced with authority.

Timidity is replaced with courage.

Weakness is replaced with boldness.

The presence of God lionises a believer.

You will no longer move by assumption. You will move by revelation. You will no longer walk in fear. You will walk in boldness. You will no longer be silent when God has spoken. You will represent God boldly in your generation.

Amen.

One day, I was scheduled to minister in Kogi State for a citywide crusade. I had just finished a healing and deliverance service on Tuesday and I was exhausted.

As I considered the journey ahead—from Abuja through difficult roads, long distances, rough terrain—I told the pastor, “I am sorry, I cannot come today. Please take tonight’s service. I will come tomorrow, God willing.”

He responded, “Yes sir.” But then he reminded me: people had been waiting since morning—sick, blind, crippled—waiting for a service that would only begin in the evening.

Something broke in me. Tiredness died. Weakness died. A new boldness rose within me. I said, “Just prepare everything. I am on my way.”

I rushed home, entered the car, and drove as though I had received new strength. I did not feel tired again. I ministered like one from another realm. Miracles, signs, and wonders broke out, and the afflicted were not disappointed. There are moments when inconvenience disappears because something higher has taken over—love, compassion, and divine burden.

Some things are not being dared because love is not strong enough—love for God, love for people. But when love rises, boldness follows.

## *The Raw Path Of Passion And Sacrifice*

---

In earlier days of ministry, there was nothing like luxury or convenience. No helicopters. No private flights. No comfort-driven missions.

We went by road. We went by motorcycle. We went into villages that had no access roads.

At times, I was the driver myself—moving from one difficult terrain to another, from one region to another.

There were nights without light. I prepared messages using phone torchlight. There was no hot water, no comfort, no convenience—only assignment.

Today, many only see the glamour of ministry. But real impact is often born in hidden sacrifice.

Yet, even in those places, love made everywhere the same. Whether city or village, whether developed or remote, the burden remained the same—souls.

If God sends two angels—one to a developed city and another to a dangerous village infested with darkness—it does not matter to them. What matters is obedience. What matters is assignment. So it is with those who carry divine love. Geography does not matter. Comfort does not matter. Reputation does not matter.

Only obedience matters.

## *A Life Ruled By Passion For God*

There are places we still go today—not because they are convenient, but because love compels us.

Love for God. Love for people.

Because of that love, distance becomes irrelevant, difficulty becomes secondary, and comfort loses its voice.

When love dominates a man, boldness becomes natural.

## *Divine Encounter That Produces Boldness*

Boldness is also born out of divine encounter. Moses was once afraid, running from Pharaoh. But in Exodus 3, he encountered God. That encounter transformed him completely. The same man who fled Pharaoh returned and said:

“Let My people go.”

Not once. Not politely. But repeatedly and boldly. An encounter changed everything. Gideon was also afraid—hiding, confused, unsure of himself. But when the angel of the Lord met him, everything shifted.

“The Lord is with thee, thou mighty man of valour.”

That single encounter destroyed fear, inferiority, and timidity. Gideon rose and became a deliverer.

# *An Encounter That Rewrites Identity*

When God meets a man, identity changes.

Fear gives way to courage. Confusion gives way to clarity. Weakness gives way to authority.

One encounter can turn a timid man into a lion.

One encounter can turn hesitation into authority.

One encounter can make a person unrecognisable—even to himself.

God does not make men one-dimensional.

There is a tenderness like the Lamb—compassion, tears, sensitivity.

But there is also the Lion—authority, fire, dominion, and boldness.

The same Jesus wept, and the same Jesus overturned tables.

When divine purpose demands gentleness, the Lamb appears. When darkness must be confronted, the Lion arises.

# *Final Prayer Burden*

Lift your hands.

There is an expectation in creation waiting for the manifestation of the sons of God. Your generation is waiting. Communities are waiting. Nations are waiting. May God grant you a divine encounter that will remove fear permanently.

An encounter that will make you bold in purpose, bold in assignment, and bold in destiny.

In the name of Jesus Christ.

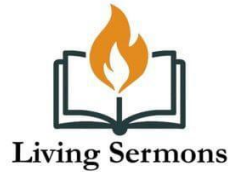
