Introduction

Take your hands and just go ahead and thank Him. He is drawing people close to Himself today, drawing people close in intimacy.

Receive the grace for intimacy. Paul the Apostle said:

“That I may know Him, and the power of His resurrection...” (*Philippians 3:10, paraphrased KJV intent*)

Grace to know Him like never before is released.

Thank You, Master. In Jesus’ precious name, Amen.

I welcome everyone here today—everyone who has come from all around the world, from fourteen nations. People watching from across the world—you will never remain the same in Jesus’ name.

We have been looking at this subject: **Unravelling the Mystery of Faith**. From midweek service, we began to understand that faith, though a mystery to many, is both understandable and operable.

Our objective has been:

- To understand the mystery of faith
- To understand the profit of faith
- To understand the way that leads to faith

We began by identifying what defines faith.

What Faith Is - Foundation Truths

Faith As Word, Revelation, Conviction, Declaration And Action

Faith is a combination of:

- Word revelation
- Heart conviction
- Right declaration
- Right action

When the Word of God brings revelation, it produces conviction in the heart. That conviction leads to correct confession, and then correct action. The outcome is the manifestation of results.

Faith As Word-Based Responsibility

Faith is carrying out required Word-based responsibility in order to experience desired Word-based possibility.

There are things the Word of God expects you to do. When you do them, you step into what the Word has promised.

Faith As Trust In The Reality Of God

Faith is laying hold on the reality, reliability, and trustworthiness of God.

God is real. God is reliable. God can be trusted. When you lay hold on this truth, you step into His possibilities.

Faith As Seeing Beyond The Visible Realm

Faith is seeing beyond the visible realities of the natural world into the invisible realities of the spiritual world.

You may see poverty, but you see beyond it.

You may see sickness, but you see beyond it.

“By His stripes we are healed.” (*Isaiah 53:5, KJV*)

That is faith—seeing supernatural manifestation beyond natural limitation.

Faith As Agreement With God

Faith is coming into agreement with the Almighty for the fulfilment of His commitment.

When God speaks, you agree. When God commands, you obey. That agreement is what we call belief.

Faith As Walking The Word

Faith is walking the Word to dominate your world.

You do not only hear the Word—you walk in it, and it produces dominion.

Faith As A Spiritual Sense

Faith As The Sixth Sense

Faith is a spiritual sense that is sharpened or strengthened by the light of God's Word, and functions beyond and contrary to natural senses.

“For we walk by faith, not by sight.” (*2 Corinthians 5:7, KJV*)

Faith operates as another dimension of perception—higher than the natural senses.

The Natural Senses And The Spiritual Sense

We have five natural senses:

- Sight
- Hearing
- Smell
- Taste
- Touch

But in the spirit, there is one major sense: **faith**.

Faith functions beyond what sight can see, beyond what hearing can confirm, beyond what natural understanding can explain.

“Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard... but God hath revealed them unto us by His Spirit.” (*1 Corinthians 2:9–10, KJV*)

The Spirit reveals what natural senses cannot access.

Faith is strengthened by the Word of God. It allows you to act beyond natural confirmation.

Some things do not make natural sense—but they make spiritual sense.

Faith That Defies Natural Reasoning

The Ten Lepers – Faith That Obeys Before Manifestation

In Luke 17:11–14, Jesus met ten lepers.

He said:

“Go shew yourselves unto the priests.” (*Luke 17:14, KJV*)

But they were still lepers. According to the law, a leper only goes to the priest after healing. Yet Jesus told them to go while still unclean. That instruction did not make sense—it required faith. As they went, they were cleansed. Faith sometimes requires action before manifestation.

Walking Before Seeing

Faith humbles the senses. It sometimes places them aside so that obedience can take over.

That is why Scripture says:

“We walk by faith, not by sight.” (*2 Corinthians 5:7, KJV*)

The Blind Man At The Pool Of Siloam

In John 9:1–7, Jesus healed a man born blind. He spat on the ground, made clay, anointed the man’s eyes, and said:

“Go, wash in the pool of Siloam.” (*John 9:7, KJV*)

The man obeyed while still blind. He walked before he saw. Faith moved him before sight confirmed anything. Even when natural resources fail, faith sustains movement.

Faith is what carries a man when sight cannot.

God's assignment is never dependent on human begging or pressure. Where God sends, He supplies. If supply ceases, assignment is complete. Faith does not operate from pressure—it operates from trust in divine supply.

You do not move only by sight. You do not move only by hearing. You move by faith. Faith is what makes you act even when nothing around you confirms it.

If your senses dominate you, you will struggle with faith. But when faith dominates you, you rise above fear, limitation, and natural restriction. Faith carries you where senses cannot take you.

Lift your right hand and declare:

“Father, I receive the grace to develop the sense of faith—the sixth sense. I receive it now in Jesus’ name.”

People who are slaves of the senses remain strangers to faith. But those who walk by faith are led beyond natural limitations into supernatural reality.

Faith As Taking Scriptural Steps

Faith is taking scriptural steps, even when they appear contrary to natural facts, in order to experience supernatural proofs.

Faith often requires actions that do not align with what the natural realm is saying.

Faith Is A Work And A Responsibility

“The work of faith with power.” (*2 Thessalonians 1:11, KJV*)

Faith is work. It is responsibility.

“Your work of faith, and labour of love...” (*1 Thessalonians 1:3, KJV*)

Faith is not passive—it is active obedience.

Faith That Moves Before Evidence

The Red Sea – A Scriptural Step Of Obedience

In Exodus 14:21, Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and the Lord caused the sea to go back.

Moses did what he could do—God did what only God could do.

In the journey of faith:

- Man does what he can do
- God does what man cannot do

You cannot heal yourself, but you can obey God’s instruction. You cannot supply all your needs, but you can trust God and act on His Word.

“My God shall supply all your need...” (*Philippians 4:19, KJV*)

Faith is doing your part so God can do His part.

The Valley Of Dry Bones – Prophetic Obedience

In Ezekiel 37:7, Ezekiel prophesied as commanded, and the bones came together. Ezekiel could not assemble bones—but he could speak the Word of God.

As he obeyed, God performed the impossible.

Faith As Drawing From The Living Word

Faith is drawing spiritual virtue from the Living Word of the Living God to produce living proofs.

The Word of God is not dead—it is alive and powerful.

“The words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life.” (*John 6:63, KJV*)

“Where the word of a king is, there is power...” (*Ecclesiastes 8:4, KJV*)

The Word carries life, power, and creative force.

“If thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus...” (*Romans 10:9, KJV*)

At creation, the Word of God was the force that brought everything into existence.

“And God said, Let there be light: and there was light.” (*Genesis 1:3, KJV*)

What God said became what God saw.

Faith In Action – The Woman With The Issue Of Blood

In Mark 5:25–34, the woman with the issue of blood said: If she could touch His garment, she would be made whole. She acted on revelation—and virtue flowed.

Faith draws power through revelation and action.

How Virtue Is Released Through Faith

1. By Revelation

Faith begins when God opens your understanding through His Word. Revelation makes Scripture become personal instruction.

2. By Action

Faith is completed through obedience. When revelation meets action, spiritual virtue is released. When the Word becomes light, it becomes instruction. Revelation is when God causes you to hear His Word in a personal and actionable way. At that point, the Word becomes alive in your spirit.

Testimony Of Virtue In Action

A young man once held in bondage was brought before ministry.

The instruction came by revelation:

“Leave him.”

“Lose him.”

It did not make natural sense. But at that moment, spiritual authority was released. The situation shifted instantly. This is what happens when revelation meets obedience—virtue flows. The authority of the believer is activated when the Word becomes alive in the spirit.

“No weapon that is formed against thee shall prosper...” (*Isaiah 54:17, KJV*)

Revelation transforms Scripture into living force. Faith is drawing spiritual virtue from the Living Word to produce undeniable results. Where the Word is alive, proofs are undeniable.

The Benefits Of Faith

1. Secret Of Victory

Faith is the secret of victory in life's battles.

2. Secret Of Supernatural Power

Faith produces supernatural ability for exploits.

3. Secret Of Possibilities

“All things are possible to him that believeth.” (*Mark 9:23, KJV*)

4. Secret Of Possessing Promises

Faith is how believers take possession of what belongs to them in God.

5. Secret Of Testimony

Faith produces evidence, good report, and testimonies.

“By faith Enoch was translated...” (*Hebrews 11:5, KJV*)

6. Secret Of Escape

Faith delivers from danger and disaster.

7. Secret Of Exploits

Faith enables results that command attention.

The Way Of Faith

Knowing God

“They that do know their God shall be strong...” (*Daniel 11:32, KJV*)

Knowing The Word

Faith comes by hearing the Word of God. Anything not rooted in the Word is not faith.

Final Charge - Living By Faith

Faith is essential for a victorious life.

“Without faith it is impossible to please Him...” (*Hebrews 11:6, KJV*)

The knowledge of God and His Word are foundational to a life of faith.
