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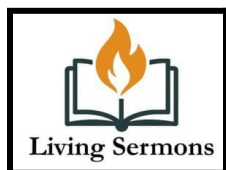
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## Foreword

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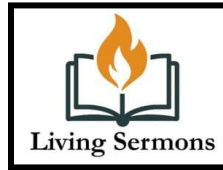

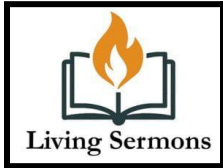
## **Opening Voiceover**

### ***Fire Is Not Noise—Fire Is Substance***

*Fire is not shouting “fire.” Fire is potency.*

*Fire is not shouting “fire.” Fire is authority.*

*Fire is not shouting “fire.” Fire is audacity.*



## The Law Summarised Into Love

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The law was summarised into two:

“Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind... Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself.” (Matthew 22:37–39, KJV)

Let me ask you a question:

“Thou shalt not commit adultery”—what law does that fall under?

If a man truly loves his friend, will he sleep with his wife?

If you love your neighbour as yourself, do you want someone to do that to you?

If you don't like it, can you do it to another person?

So when people ask, “Are we still to follow the Ten Commandments?”—understand this: the Ten Commandments have been summarised into two.

Every sin is against two persons:

**God or man.**

“Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart... and thy neighbour as thyself.”

A man that commits adultery has no love in his heart.

## **Love: The Centre of the Kingdom**

“And now abideth faith, hope, charity, these three; but the greatest of these is charity.” (1 Corinthians 13:13, KJV)

Love is the centre point of this Kingdom. If I love you and you offend me, I will present the matter in a way that allows resolution—not destruction. Why? Because love is at the centre of the conversation. Your inconsistency reveals your love level.

## **Jesus Plus Nothing**

### **Galatians 5:2**

If you think there is something you need to add to Jesus, it is a sign that you believe He is not enough. The Galatian Christians were told that Christ was not enough—that they needed circumcision to be righteous. But righteousness is not by works—it is by faith. All you have to do is believe.

Say it: **Jesus is enough.**

Say it again: **Jesus plus nothing.**

## **Understanding the Balance: Faith Expressions**

Now, let me address an extreme. Some people hear “Jesus plus nothing” and remove every expression of faith. They reject things like handkerchiefs, aprons, or anointing oil, saying they are additions to Jesus. That is not what Scripture teaches.

In the New Testament:

- Handkerchiefs and aprons were taken from Paul, and the sick were healed (Acts 19:11–12).
- The apostles anointed the sick with oil (Mark 6:13).
- James instructed believers to anoint the sick (James 5:14–15).

These are **faith contacts**, not replacements for Jesus. The problem is not using them—the problem is putting your faith in them instead of Christ.

## What Truly Heals?

“Is any sick among you? let him call for the elders of the church; and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord:

And the prayer of faith shall save the sick...” (James 5:14–15, KJV)

It is not the oil that heals. It is **the prayer of faith in the name of Jesus**. When you send a handkerchief, do not say, “This cloth has power.”

Say, “In the name of Jesus, let this be a point of contact.”

Never forget: **The power is in Jesus—not in the object.**

## Returning to the Law: Falling From Grace

### Galatians 5:3–4

If you go back to the law, you are obligated to fulfil all of it.

“Christ is become of no effect unto you... ye are fallen from grace.” (Galatians 5:4, KJV)

Yes—people can fall from grace.

“Looking diligently lest any man fail of the grace of God...” (Hebrews 12:15, KJV)

One way people fall from grace is by returning to what God has already finished. When God has moved on from a season and you insist on staying there, you will struggle. When you send yourself where God is not sending you, you will labour without grace.

Say: **I will not fall from grace.**

# Righteousness Comes by Faith

## Galatians 5:5

The Holy Spirit convinces us that righteousness comes by faith—not by labour. Many people are looking for dramatic encounters to validate their walk with God. Some think, “If I have not fallen under anointing, something is wrong with me.”

No.

Faith is not validated by drama.

You must acknowledge what you receive. Three people can hear the same declaration—“God bless you”—but their outcomes will differ based on their response.

One receives it with faith.

Another ignores it.

Another doubts it.

You are the one that puts weight on what you receive. There are encounters that may not look dramatic—but they are real. You may not fall, but something has entered.

Many of you have heard testimonies and assumed your experience is not authentic because it lacked visible drama.

But the reality is this: **What matters is not the outward manifestation, but the inward reception.**

Are you aware that the woman with the issue of blood—her miracle was not ordinary?

Consider this:

Many people were touching Jesus. They surrounded Him—pressing, guiding, making contact with His body. Yet, nothing happened to them. Then came one woman.

“If I may touch but his clothes, I shall be whole.” (Mark 5:28, KJV)

She came from behind and touched the hem of His garment.

Jesus stopped and said, “*Who touched me?*”

They replied, “Everyone has been touching You.”

But Jesus said, “*There is a touch—and there is a touch.*”

There is a **touch of faith**. A touch that draws virtue—even when it is not consciously released.

## **The Power of Expectation**

Your hunger can draw what a man carries—even without his intention to release it.

Many were with Jesus.

They touched Him.

They walked with Him.

Yet, they received nothing.

Why?

There was no expectation. But this woman came prepared:

- She had decided beforehand.
- She had planned it.
- She had rehearsed it.
- She had prayed.
- She had come to the end of herself.

Many of you still have options—that is why you are not receiving. When she came, she had no alternatives left. “This is my last chance.”

## **Familiarity Blocks Impartation**

There are people who are close to the anointed, yet receive nothing. The difference is expectation. Some see a man as “our guy.” Others see a man as **a vessel of God**.

That difference determines what you receive. Why is it that guest ministers sometimes bless people more than their own pastors?

### **Familiarity.**

You see your pastor regularly.

You become used to him.

You begin to relate with him only in his humanity.

And when it is time to receive, you are no longer conscious.

## **Receiving the Prophet’s Reward**

“He that receiveth a prophet in the name of a prophet shall receive a prophet’s reward...” (Matthew 10:41, KJV)

If you receive him as a friend, you get the reward of a friend. If you receive him as a prophet, you receive the reward of a prophet. When you come around the anointed, be conscious. This is not about outward drama or posture. It is about **intentional reception**.

Impartation does not come by outward display—it comes by faith. When hands are laid on you: Even if you do not fall— **Know that you have received something**.

Not everyone falls under the anointing. On the day of Pentecost, Peter stood. What matters is not the outward manifestation, but the inward transaction.

“...that the communication of thy faith may become effectual by the acknowledging of every good thing which is in you in Christ Jesus.”

(Philemon 1:6, KJV)

Your faith becomes powerful when you acknowledge what you have received. Say it: **I have something.**

When you receive impartation, do not walk away casually. Go and pray it through. Say, “Father, what has been deposited in me—I receive it fully.”

## **Activating Spiritual Deposits**

There are things you have received that are still dormant. They are waiting for activation.

“And it came to pass, as they were burying a man... they let down the man... into the sepulchre of Elisha: and when the man was let down, and touched the bones of Elisha, he revived...” (2 Kings 13:21, KJV)

The bones of Elisha still carried power. That means impartation can remain—even after time has passed. You are not empty. There is something in you—It only needs activation.

## **Faith Over Drama**

Many people think something is wrong because their experiences are not dramatic.

You did not fall.

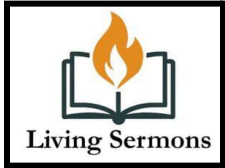
You did not cry.

You did not shake.

And so you assume nothing happened.

No.

Receive by faith. It does not have to be dramatic to be real.



## Guarding Your Belief System

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### Galatians 5:7–9

“Ye did run well; who did hinder you that ye should not obey the truth?

This persuasion cometh not of him that calleth you.

A little leaven leaveneth the whole lump.” (KJV)

A little error can corrupt your entire belief system. A small wrong belief—if entertained—can spread and distort everything. Guard your heart. Guard what you believe.

There are impartations in your life that you have not activated.

They are not lost.

They are waiting.

Do not trivialise what God has given you.

You are not empty.

There is something you carry.

**Activate it.**

The Lord has brought you around certain circles to deposit something within you.

“Stir up the gift of God, which is in thee by the putting on of my hands.” (2 Timothy 1:6, KJV)

There is something in your life that you may not even be aware of. Fan into flame the gift that came by prophecy—by the laying on of hands. Many of you carry deposits you have not activated.

## **It Does Not Have to Be Dramatic**

You may not fall.

You may not cry.

You may not even have a dream.

It does not have to be dramatic. Drama is good—it excites the atmosphere—but it is not the proof of power. The fact that you did not fall does not mean you did not receive. However, your heart must be open.

God releases to the **hungry**.

If you came hungry—if you pressed in—if you believed—then receive it by faith.

## **The Atmosphere of Activation**

There are moments when God releases power for activation.

This is a night of activation.

This is a night of impartation.

There is a release—fresh release—by the Spirit of God. What has been dormant is coming alive.

There is liberation.

There is deliverance.

Chains are breaking.

Anything that has held you bound—break now in the name of Jesus.

## **A Night of Miracles**

This is a night of miracles. If you are sick, be healed now. If you need freedom, receive it now.

Take it.

Receive it.

The power of God is at work.

## **The Miracle Touch**

Just like the woman with the issue of blood, we have decided to receive. There is a **miracle touch** available. Everyone that needs a touch—receive it now.

Let there be a divine visitation. Let there be an impartation. Anything your life needs for completion and settlement—receive it now. Every door that must open—let it open. Every breakthrough you need—enter into it now.

In the name of Jesus.

## **Activation Into a New Season**

I prophesy:

- Activation of your anointing
- Activation of your fire
- Activation of your grace

From now—enter into a new season. Enter into a new dawn. Receive your miracles. Receive your breakthroughs.

## **Guarding Your Faith**

Returning to **Galatians 5:9**:

“A little leaven leaveneth the whole lump.” (KJV)

A little lie can corrupt your entire belief system.

One wrong belief can scatter your faith. Many have been believing God—until they heard a negative testimony. And that one voice corrupted everything. Be careful what you allow into your heart.

## **Beware of Extra-Biblical Practices**

There are teachings circulating today that are not rooted in Scripture. Be careful. Whatever you do not see in the New Testament Church—do not accept it under the guise of the prophetic.

The foundation is clear:

“Jesus Christ himself being the chief corner stone;  
In whom all the building fitly framed together...” (Ephesians 2:20–21, KJV)

The apostles and prophets laid the foundation. If it is not in their doctrine—run from it. The root of the prophetic is the Word.

You carry something. You are not empty. What has been deposited in you is waiting for activation. Guard your faith. Stay rooted in the Word. And walk in the fullness of what God has placed within you.

## **Beware of Little Lies**

Be careful of biblical things. A little lie can scatter your entire belief system. They told them that you have to add circumcision to this thing for it to work. For you to receive the righteousness of God, you have to add circumcision. You have to add ritual to it.

That little lie.

And many of us today, we have entered into error because of certain small lies that we accepted. They tell you that that's how they used to do it—God understands. Hello.

There are examples everywhere.

A little lie can pervert your entire belief system. I don't know the lie that has blocked your prophetic destiny, but I speak as God's prophet tonight—the Lord restore you back to the right order.

## **One Little Leaven**

### **Galatians 5:9 (KJV)**

*A little leaven leaveneth the whole lump.*

One little lie.

One little lie.

One little lie.

Be careful of small things. It is actually small things that corrupt big things. Any small thing that you accept can destroy your entire journey.

## **Jesus Is Enough**

Deep in my heart, I have faith that the Lord Jesus, the Anointed One, who lives in you, will bring you back around to the truth. And I am convinced that those who agitate you—whoever they think they are—will be brought under God's judgment.

People who are trying to tell you that the Word of God is not enough...

The Word of God works.

The name of Jesus works.

The blood of Jesus works.

They will try to tell you that it is not enough. But those who are trying to make you think that Jesus is not enough—may God bring them under judgment.

Jesus is enough.

**Proverbs 18:10 (KJV)**

*The name of the LORD is a strong tower: the righteous runneth into it, and is safe.*

**Romans 10:13 (KJV)**

*For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.*

The name works.

The Word works.

There is nothing that works like the Word.

That you have not seen a miracle does not mean you will not see it.

This is the pain of Apostle Paul:

“I showed you the gospel. I showed you the truth. I showed you the Word—but some people came and told you that you have to add rituals and laws to this thing.”

Jesus is enough.

## **Guarding the Flock from Error**

**Galatians 5:11–12 (KJV)**

*And I, brethren, if I yet preach circumcision, why do I yet suffer persecution? then is the offence of the cross ceased.*

*I would they were even cut off which trouble you.*

At this point, the pastor needs to shield his members from people who lie to them. This is what Apostle Paul is doing here.

He is trying to shield his members from fake men of God who are trying to blindfold them and move them away from the truth.

# **Freedom in the Spirit, Not the Flesh**

## **Galatians 5:13 (KJV)**

*For, brethren, ye have been called unto liberty; only use not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, but by love serve one another.*

Beloved ones, God has called us to live a life of freedom in the Holy Spirit. But do not view this freedom as an opportunity to indulge the flesh. Freedom means that we become so completely free from self-indulgence that we become servants of one another, expressing love in all we do.

Genuine freedom is not a license for sin—it is freedom from sin.

Now we are free to worship God without rituals, and we love one another. Because when you sin against your brother, it is because you do not love him.

## **A Prophetic Vision: A House of Transformation**

While I was studying this scripture yesterday on my flight, I saw a vision. I saw somebody join this church—ugly, tattered, afflicted, buffeted, tormented, oppressed. And in three months, he became the center of attraction.

I was caught up in a trance. As I read “base of operation,” I saw someone come into this church like a madman—and in three months, everything changed.

The Lord is saying: this church is a base of supernatural upgrade operations. People will come in, and in the twinkling of an eye—change.

## **The Law Fulfilled in Love**

Now, the liberty we have in Christ is not for us to live in sin. Just because nobody is saying, “Thou shalt not,” does not mean you should. Everything is now summarized under two laws:

- Love God
- Love your brother

The real “thou shalt” is love.

### **Galatians 5:14 (KJV)**

*For all the law is fulfilled in one word, even in this; Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself.*

Love completes the law of God.

The reason we fight is because we do not love each other.

The reason we backbite is because there is no love.

The reason we pull others down to rise is because there is no love.

If you follow this golden rule, you will not do those things.

## **Do Not Destroy One Another**

### **Galatians 5:15 (KJV)**

*But if ye bite and devour one another, take heed that ye be not consumed one of another.*

If you continue to criticize and come against each other over minor issues, you are acting like wild beasts trying to destroy one another. Many of the things happening in the body of Christ today contradict this verse. This is not against accountability. This is not against correction. But before you correct someone on social media—have you called them? If you do not have access to them, then find someone who does.

# The Right Way to Correct Error

There was a situation where a man of God took another man's sermon and went online to criticize him publicly. Meanwhile, they had spoken just two days before. They had each other's number.

That is not right. Eventually, they settled and apologized—but the damage had already been done.

So what do we do?

If a fellow believer does something wrong:

- Reach out privately
- Send a message
- Speak with humility

If they listen, they can correct it.

## **1 Corinthians 13:9 (KJV)**

*For we know in part, and we prophesy in part.* But today, many people rush online to criticize. That is not Christlike.

## **Kingdom Correction vs. Public Destruction**

How would you feel if your biological father made a mistake? Would you go online and broadcast it?

No.

So why do it in the body of Christ?

If someone refuses correction:

- Call someone they respect
- Escalate wisely
- Seek restoration

Only after all this, if necessary, correction can be taught publicly—but without insults or name-calling. We must not use the system of the world to address spiritual issues. In the Kingdom, it is restoration before destruction.

## **Preach Jesus, Not Controversy**

There is a counsel:

Take men of God out of your pulpit—preach Jesus.

Take politics out of your pulpit—preach Jesus.

Focus on Christ, and you will last.

## **Walk in the Spirit Fully**

### **Galatians 5:16 (KJV)**

*This I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfil the lust of the flesh.*

As you yield freely and fully to the Holy Spirit, you will abandon the cravings of the flesh.

You can yield freely—but not fully.

Some yield in prayer, but not in purity.

Some yield in fasting, but not in forgiveness.

Some are strong in tongues, but strong in malice.

You can pray for hours and still hold offense. You can worship—and still be divided.

You say you are worshipping, but there is a wall in your relationship. That is not worship—it is “wall-ship.”

So ask yourself: Are you in worship—or in “wall-ship”?

## **Partial Yielding Is Not Enough**

“I yield to God in prayer—but not in my emotions.”

“I yield in fasting—but not in my relationships.”

Some cry during worship, broken before God—but only partially yielded.

God is not calling for partial surrender.

He is calling for total yielding.

When it comes to issues like fighting, malice, and jealousy, we must be careful. Jealousy is dangerous—it is the last class before entering the school of witchcraft. When you graduate from jealousy, you enter witchcraft.

No, not slowly—direct entry, 200-level straight into witchcraft. Some of you yield freely in worship, but when it comes to letting go of envy toward others, you are not fully yielded. The secret to abandoning the flesh is yielding—yield fully, without selectivity.

Sometimes, the process is tough. You may feel tired, annoyed, or like giving up. People around you may irritate you—but God says release them. Release them. You might not be close to them again, but ensure that when you see them, your heart is not troubled. If seeing someone’s success angers you, it reveals unresolved offense in your heart.

Do not wish harm on others for what they have done. Your inability to yield fully is a reflection of the state of your spirit.

Do you know that if Judas had repented in his final moments, he would have entered heaven? Mercifully, repentance and full yielding are key.

Yield freely—submit to God entirely, without selectivity. Yield to every prompting of the Holy Spirit. Do not hold back in certain areas of life while excelling in others. Partial submission is not true yielding.

## Practical Example of Yielding

The pastor demonstrated full yielding through an exercise:

- Lift your hands, move forward, backward, up, down, stretch, press—completely obeying instructions.
- No complaint, full participation.

This illustrates yielding freely and fully to God.

The way to abandon the cravings of your flesh is to submit—yield fully to the Word of God and the leading of the Holy Spirit. As you do, you gain the power to say **no** to fleshly desires.

Even strong Christians struggle. Some excel in prayer or fasting but struggle with malice, jealousy, or unforgiveness. Partial obedience is common—but God calls for total surrender.

Yield fully in every area: emotions, relationships, habits, and worship. Partial yielding leaves the flesh in control.

## Practical Guidance in Relationships

- **On friendships and disagreements:** If someone disagrees with you, first speak directly. If unresolved, escalate to a respected leader. Only after that, and if refusal persists, you may distance yourself—but without bitterness.
- **On family challenges:** A mother may provoke, correct, or frustrate you. Evaluate whether her correction is justified. If it is, adjust yourself; if it is persistent but not life-threatening, honour her, limit interaction, and pray.

### **Ephesians 6:2–3 (KJV)**

*Honour thy father and thy mother; (which is the first commandment with promise;)  
That it may be well with thee, and thou mayest live long on the earth.*

Even when parents are difficult, your cross is to honour them. Avoid unnecessary conflict, stay prayerful, and remember that your children will mirror your actions.

The commandments are summarised under the two loves: loving God and loving your neighbour. When you honour your parents, you are loving God. When you love God, you will honour and love people.

Do not seek justification to dishonour them—even if their behaviour is challenging. Limit interaction if needed, but always maintain respect.

## **Final Exhortation**

Yield freely and fully. Release malice, envy, and jealousy. Honour parents and leaders, even imperfect ones. Submit to God completely, and let the Holy Spirit guide your every action.

This is the pathway to freedom, maturity, and peace in your spiritual walk.

A final question was raised regarding **Ephesians 6:4** and the principle of not provoking children, alongside the challenging question of whether hatred is ever justifiable.

Parents are instructed:

### **Ephesians 6:4 (KJV)**

*And, ye fathers, provoke not your children to wrath: but bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.*

Parents must not provoke their children to anger, but even if provocation occurs, children are still called to **honour their parents**. Honouring is not about constant proximity or excessive communication; it is about maintaining a posture of respect and fulfilling your part of the law.

## On Hatred and Justice

Hatred is a sin; there is **no justification for hatred**, regardless of the offence. While it is natural to feel anger toward grievous sinners—such as pedophiles or abusers—the believer’s response must separate justice from the heart’s posture.

- **Justice:** Let the law handle consequences. Those who commit crimes must face rightful punishment.
- **Forgiveness:** Release them from your heart. Forgiveness is not closeness or excusing sin—it is a **heart issue** that frees you spiritually.

Even the worst offenders, if they repent, remain eligible for salvation. But your heart must release them from personal hatred to move forward.

Holding grudges blocks progress. Trauma and abuse, if unresolved, can imprison the soul for decades. The Holy Spirit works as the greatest therapist:

- Address your hurt if possible in a safe space.
- Speak out, share your pain, or seek reconciliation where safe.
- Release your emotional charge to God—do not let anyone control your joy.

### **Proverbs 18:14 (KJV)**

*The spirit of a man will sustain his infirmity; but a wounded spirit who can bear?*

Unforgiveness keeps you spiritually “imprisoned,” even when the offender is unaware. Healing requires letting go.

## Practical Steps for Healing from Pain and Abuse

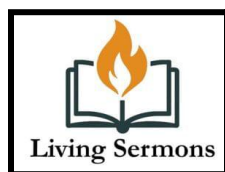
1. **Release the offender to God:** Pray for them, forgive them in your heart, and let justice take its course externally.
2. **Address unresolved emotions safely:** Use systems of accountability, counseling, or mediated conversation.

3. **Forgive fully:** Saying “I forgive you” is healing. Send voice notes or written messages if safe—it releases the burden from your soul.
4. **Do not allow past pain to control your present joy:** Your happiness and spiritual freedom belong to you and the Holy Spirit, not to anyone who harmed you.

## **Living Fully Yielded to the Holy Spirit**

- **Control your joy:** Do not let others dictate your emotions.
- **Live freely:** Fully yielded to the Holy Spirit, not to pain, trauma, or grudges.
- **Embrace destiny:** Sacrifice, forgiveness, and full yielding pave the way for spiritual growth and freedom.

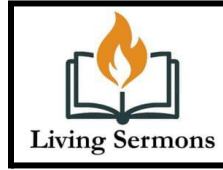
**Key principle:** Forgiveness does not negate justice, but it releases you to live fully and pursue your God-given path without being burdened by the past.



## **Closing Exhortation**

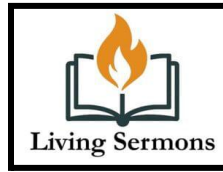
*Live freely, live fully yielded. Let the Holy Spirit govern your heart. Do not allow trauma, abuse, or others' sins to control your joy. Forgive, release, and walk in freedom, for your spiritual journey depends on the posture of your heart.*

*Give God a shout of glory for the freedom He offers through forgiveness and yielding.*

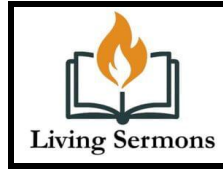
**Living Sermons** is a Spirit-led publishing platform dedicated to transforming timeless messages of God’s servants into books that can reach and impact lives across the world.
