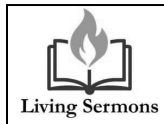

CHAPTER ONE

How Spiritual Fire Happens

Spiritual fire does not happen by accident. There is a biblical pattern for ignition.

It is not something that simply appears because you wake up one morning and desire it. There is a God-ordained process for experiencing genuine spiritual fire. One of the things I want to achieve through **Live Lit, Lead** is to demystify spiritual fire.

Fire is sacred, but it is not reserved for pastors alone. The vision is to see people burning for God in every sphere of influence.

I want to see the **lit tech professional**, the **lit creative**, the **lit doctor**, the **lit engineer**, and the **lit entrepreneur**—people carrying the fire of God wherever they are.

That is the goal.

Today, we are digging deep into the origin of spiritual fire.

Fire Has Conditions

Have you ever tried to pray, worship, or read your Bible, yet it felt like nothing was happening?

Have you ever prayed and wondered whether your prayers were even reaching heaven?

Let me tell you a story.

There was a time I decided to pray for **five hours**. For the first **four hours and thirty minutes**, I felt absolutely nothing.

It was one of those prayer sessions where, after a while, you begin giving yourself other assignments. You start sweeping, washing plates, arranging your room, making your bed—anything but praying.

I have experienced that before.

I have also read the Bible and understood almost nothing. It simply wasn't flowing. I have even tried worshipping and felt like someone singing completely off-key—and that person was me. Maybe one or two of you have experienced something similar.

Let me tell you this:

Fire does not start randomly.

Whether in the natural or in the spirit, there are conditions for ignition. In the natural, you need a matchstick, a lighter, or some other source of ignition.

Fire does not simply appear. The same principle applies spiritually. **You do not beg for fire. You build the conditions for fire.**

Build the Conditions for Fire

In **1 Kings 18:31–38**, Elijah rebuilt the altar with twelve stones.

After the altar was prepared, fire fell.

I once taught on **The Twelve Stones of Fire**, and by God's grace, it will also become a book very soon.

Those twelve stones represent the pillars that must be in place before fire falls.

If you want to remain lit, you must continually build the right conditions.

Never forget this:

Fire is God's idea.

The Bible says:

"And the fire upon the altar shall be burning in it; it shall not be put out..."
(*Leviticus 6:12, KJV*)

Again, Scripture declares:

"The fire shall ever be burning upon the altar; it shall never go out."
(*Leviticus 6:13, KJV*)

Fire has always been God's idea.

In **Leviticus 9:24**, the Bible says:

"And there came a fire out from before the LORD, and consumed upon the altar the burnt offering and the fat: which when all the people saw, they shouted, and fell on their faces." (*KJV*)

Notice something important.

The fire came **from God**, but it fell upon **a prepared altar**.

The fire was supernatural.

The preparation was natural.

The same principle still applies today.

You do not beg for fire.

You prepare for it.

John the Baptist also spoke about Jesus:

"I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance: but he that cometh after me is mightier than I... he shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost, and with fire." (*Matthew 3:11, KJV*)

This fire we talk about is God's idea.

But notice the pattern.

God supplies the fire.

Man prepares the altar.

Fire is supernatural, but preparation is natural.

1. Fire Starts with Hunger

Fire never falls on a casual altar. Fire does not come simply because you attend church. It does not come because you call yourself a Christian. There must be hunger.

Jesus said:

"Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled." (*Matthew 5:6, KJV*)

Fire never falls upon casual people.

There must be spiritual preparation that qualifies you for fire.

Hunger is your spiritual oxygen.

No hunger, no flame.

Let me ask you a question.

What do you crave more?

God or distractions?

God or attention?

God or social media influence?

God's presence or titles?

Answer that honestly.

If you want fire, you must hunger for more of God.

Fire falls upon prepared vessels—not casual ones.

Fire begins on the altar.

2. Fire Starts on the Altar

The altar is where something is laid down.

Romans says:

"I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service." (*Romans 12:1, KJV*)

Fire always requires an altar.

A sacrifice belongs on an altar.

If God asks you to present yourself as a living sacrifice, then you must willingly place your life upon His altar.

You cannot carry pride, sin, and distractions and still expect fire to fall.

Fire begins where everything is surrendered.

3. Fire Starts with Obedience

In **1 Kings 18:31–38**, Elijah repaired the altar according to God's instruction.

Only after the altar was repaired did the fire fall.

The sequence matters.

The altar came first.

The fire came afterward.

Let me say this clearly:

Delayed obedience is delayed fire.

Partial obedience produces a weak flame.

When obedience is incomplete, your fire becomes weak.

When obedience is delayed, your fire is delayed.

What has God instructed you to do?

Sometimes we expect dramatic encounters, yet God has already spoken.

He told you to pray tonight.

You said, "I'll pray tomorrow."

He instructed you again.

You postponed it again.

Every instruction from God is like adding firewood to the fire.

If you have ever seen a wood-burning fire, you know that fresh wood keeps the flame alive.

Obedience functions the same way.

When the prophets of Baal cried out, danced, and shouted, nothing happened.

Elijah did not begin by calling down fire.

He first rebuilt the altar.

I have already taught on **The Twelve Stones of Fire**, and if you visit my YouTube channel, you will find that teaching there.

As Elijah gathered those twelve stones, I believe they represented the necessary conditions—hunger, passion, the Word of God, and other spiritual pillars required for sustaining fire.

When those conditions are in place, the fire becomes inevitable.

Remember:

You do not beg for fire.

You prepare the conditions for it.

4. Fire Starts with Prayer

Before the fire of Pentecost fell, there was persistent prayer.

The disciples waited before God for ten days.

They prayed.

They waited.

They sought God together.

God does not pour His fire upon people who refuse to pray.

Prayer is the spark that ignites prepared hearts.

Acts records:

"And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place.

And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind...

And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them.

And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost..." (*Acts 2:1-4, KJV*)

Prayer is the spark that ignites a prepared heart.

When your heart is ready and you add prayer, the fire falls.

If you are going to stay lit, you must stay praying.

5. Fire Starts with the Word

Jeremiah declared:

"Then I said, I will not make mention of him, nor speak any more in his name. But his word was in mine heart as a burning fire shut up in my bones..." (*Jeremiah 20:9, KJV*)

Again, God says:

"Is not my word like as a fire? saith the LORD..." (*Jeremiah 23:29, KJV*)

The Word of God is fire.

If you want fire, remain with the Word.

The Word is fuel.

No Word, no firewood.

Let me say something that many believers need to hear.

You cannot scroll all day and expect to burn at night.

You cannot spend your day moving from one TikTok video to another, from Facebook to Instagram, from Snapchat to endless distractions, and then expect spiritual fire when you begin to pray.

The Word is your fuel.

Without the Word, there is no firewood.

If you want to carry fire, stay with the Word.

Sit with it.

I am not saying you must read twenty chapters every day.

Even if it is one chapter, sit with it.

Meditate on it.

Allow it to burn within you.

CHAPTER TWO

What Fire Is Not

Many people misunderstand what spiritual fire truly is. People often say, "That's fire," or "That person is lit."

But before we continue, let us establish something clearly:

Fire is not hype.

Many people misunderstand what spiritual fire truly is. People say, "That is fire!" or, "That person is lit!"

But let us establish this clearly.

Fire Is Not Hype

Someone may stand on a platform and sing with incredible charisma. They may have great stage presence and impressive energy.

That is not necessarily fire.

As we say in Nigeria, *"If e no dey, e no dey."*

If it is not there, it is not there.

Fire is not hype.

Fire Is Not Mere Emotion

Fire is not emotion alone.

Having goosebumps does not mean you carry fire.

Goosebumps are not equal to fire.

Anyone can stir your emotions.

Have you seen people attend concerts of music legends and become overwhelmed emotionally? Some even faint because of the atmosphere and excitement.

Emotion is real, but emotion alone is not spiritual fire.

Fire goes deeper than feelings.

Fire Is Not Noise

Fire is not noise.

Something may be loud, energetic, or trending, but that does not make it fire.

Popularity is not the same as God's presence.

Trending does not equal burning.

What Real Fire Looks Like

Real fire is **hunger-driven**.

If you carefully examine genuine spiritual fire, you will always find hunger behind it.

Anything that lacks hunger is not true fire.

Real fire is **sacrifice-fed**.

Every person who carries genuine fire has paid a price.

They have sacrificed time.

They have sacrificed comfort.

They have sacrificed convenience.

They spend time reading the Scriptures. They spend time praying. They spend time fellowshiping with other believers.

Fire grows where sacrifice is present.

If there is no sacrifice, there is no fire.

Fire Is Protected by Obedience

Fire is obedience protected.

Remember Elijah.

He obeyed God, and then the fire fell.

This is how you recognize people who genuinely carry God's fire and not merely hype.

When you examine their lives, you will consistently find obedience.

Not complicated obedience.

Simple obedience.

The Scriptures say, "Do not do this," and they obey.

The Lord says, "Pray," and they pray.

The Lord says, "Go," and they go.

When you find someone consistently obeying God, you will find genuine fire.

This is not primarily about ministry.

It is not about people falling under the anointing.

It is not about rolling on the floor.

Real fire is carrying God's presence.

Real fire is carrying God's glory.

You may never stand behind a pulpit.

You may never pastor a church.

Yet, you can still carry fire.

A graphic designer can carry fire.

People look at the design and immediately recognize that something beyond human ability is present.

There is a divine signature upon the work.

A creative professional can carry fire.

A camera operator.

A video editor.

Someone watches your work and says,

"There is something different about this."

They may even experience conviction or transformation simply by watching what you created.

A public speaker can carry fire.

A doctor can carry fire.

A craftsman can carry fire.

Whatever your profession, your work can bear the unmistakable signature of God.

That is true fire.

It is not about making people fall.

It is about carrying God's presence and glory wherever He has placed you.

When you truly carry God's presence, your life will reveal sacrifice.

Fire Is Ignited by Prayer

Any fire that is not backed by prayer is not genuine fire.

How can someone claim to carry fire while living a prayerless life?

That is impossible.

If someone claims to carry fire but does not pray, then they are carrying something else.

Fire is sustained by a life of prayer.

Fire Is Sustained by the Word

True fire is:

- Hunger-driven.
- Sacrifice-fed.
- Obedience-protected.
- Prayer-ignited.
- Word-sustained.

The Word sustains the fire.

Prayer ignites the fire.

Obedience protects the fire.

Sacrifice feeds the fire.

Hunger drives the fire.

Can you see the progression?

Hunger produces it.

Sacrifice feeds it.

Obedience protects it.

Prayer ignites it.

The Word sustains it.

That is how spiritual fire begins.

It is not complicated.

Build a Life That Carries Fire

Suppose you decide today and say,

"Lord, I want more of You.

"I want You to be seen in my creativity.

"I want my life to reveal Your glory.

"When I show up, I want people to sense Your presence.

"When people come around me, I want them to experience You.

"When I speak, let them know something is different.

"When I work, let Your glory be evident."

If that is your desire, it begins with hunger.

You must genuinely want God.

Without hunger, you cannot experience fire.

It does not simply fall on people.

No matter the conference you attend...

No matter the anointed people you follow...

No matter how many powerful meetings you participate in...

Without hunger, fire will not rest upon you.

Fire is driven by hunger.

The Price of Sacrifice

After hunger comes sacrifice.

Sacrifice means letting go of certain things.

It means paying the price.

There is always pain before gain.

Sometimes you sacrifice your sleep.

Sometimes your meals.

Sometimes you fast.

Sometimes you spend the night praying.

Sometimes you set an alarm because you know you must meet God even when you are tired.

Sometimes you simply keep showing up faithfully in service.

Without sacrifice, there is no fire.

CHAPTER THREE

Obedience Protects the Flame

Then comes obedience. God speaks to your heart. He gives you instructions. He quickens your spirit. If you ignore His voice, your fire cannot remain protected. Hunger may start the fire. Sacrifice may feed it. But obedience protects it.

Imagine lighting a matchstick. What do you do next?

You shield it from the wind so that it does not go out. That covering is obedience. Without obedience, the fire is exposed. Eventually, the wind extinguishes it.

Prayer Ignites the Flame

Prayer ignites your fire. Spend time praying. I encouraged you in the previous teaching to pray **twenty minutes every day**.

That assignment was for beginners. The important thing is consistency. Consistency is what God is looking for.

If you want to stay lit, you must consistently show up.

Pray in the morning.

Pray during the day.

Pray at night.

Pray while driving.

Pray throughout your day.

Let prayer become your lifestyle.

The more you pray, the stronger your fire becomes.

The Word Sustains the Fire

Many people say,

"When I attended that conference, I was on fire."

"When I came back from church, I was on fire."

"But after a few days, everything disappeared."

The reason is simple.

Fire is sustained by the Word.

The more time you spend with God through His Word, the longer your fire lasts.

The longevity of your fire depends upon your culture of studying the Scriptures.

Start small if necessary.

Read two chapters each day.

Or even one chapter.

What matters is consistency.

A believer who faithfully studies one chapter every day is stronger than someone who reads twenty chapters only once a week.

This is not a competition to see who finishes reading the Bible first.

We are talking about staying lit.

Consistency is the key.

As you remain faithful, your capacity will grow.

If you want to carry lasting fire, your fire must be sustained by the Word.

A Final Reminder

Before I pray with you, let me remind you of what we have learned today.

I asked you a question earlier:

What do you crave more?

God...

Or distractions?

God...

Or fame?

Never forget this:

Hunger is your spiritual oxygen.

No hunger, no flame.

The goal is to build the right conditions for the fire to keep burning.

You must intentionally build the structures that sustain your fire.

That is what **Build Lit** is about.

Live Lit means carrying God's fire and purpose every day.

Build Lit means establishing spiritual structures that keep you burning.

Lead Lit means helping others catch the same fire.

Stay Lit means remaining consistently on fire for God.

Closing Prayer

As we close, I want to pray with you. I also want you to pray.

Say:

Father, restore my hunger.

I lay myself upon Your altar.

Let Your fire fall upon me afresh.

Restore my hunger.

It is possible for your spiritual hunger to be restored. In **Luke 24:32**, after Jesus spoke with the two disciples on the road to Emmaus, they said:

"Did not our heart burn within us, while he talked with us by the way, and while he opened to us the scriptures?" (*Luke 24:32, KJV*)

Now continue praying:

Father, restore my fire.

Ignite my fire again.

Let Your fire fall upon me afresh.

I lay myself upon Your altar.

I need fresh fire.

Let the fire begin again.

In Jesus' name.

Amen.

I pray for you in the name of Jesus that your fire will burn again.

May your spiritual fire be rekindled.

May the Lord ignite your heart once more.

May your hunger be restored.

May you carry fresh fire.

May you burn brightly for God.

May you live lit.

May you build lit.

May you lead lit.

May you stay lit.

In Jesus' name.

Amen.

Build the Altar and God Will Send the Flame

Remember this:

You do not wait for fire.

You build the altar.

Fire does not fall upon casual altars.

You build the altar.

You bring the sacrifice.

You stay hungry.

Then God sends the flame.

That is God's pattern.

Present your body as a living sacrifice.

Build your secret place.

Your altar is your secret place.

Lay yourself upon that altar.

Remain hungry for more of God.

Then watch God send His fire.

Declaration

Declare this boldly:

I will Live Lit daily.
I will Build Lit intentionally.
I will Lead Lit boldly.
I am sent to carry the fire into my world.

Again:

I will Live Lit daily.
I will Build Lit intentionally.
I will Lead Lit boldly.
I am sent to carry the fire into my world.

One more time:

I will Live Lit daily.
I will Build Lit intentionally.
I will Lead Lit boldly.
I am sent to carry the fire into my world.

Weekly Assignment

Let me give you an assignment for this week. Fast at least **one meal** during the week. Choose a meal that actually costs you something. If you normally skip breakfast, then skipping breakfast is not a fast. Choose the meal that is hardest for you to miss.

Perhaps lunch. Perhaps dinner.

This is how you cultivate a fasted life. For example, you may decide that for one week you will eat breakfast but not eat again until the following morning.

I have done that before. Remember, this is not dieting. This is fasting.

What makes fasting powerful is that you replace the time you would have spent eating with prayer and the Word. Do not skip your meal only to spend the time watching television, Netflix, or movies. Convert that time into prayer and Bible study.

Fast one meal this week. I believe you will have a testimony.

Final Charge

I cannot wait to see you in the next teaching.

Never forget:

Stay lit.

You are called to:

- Live Lit.
- Build Lit.
- Lead Lit.
- Stay Lit.
