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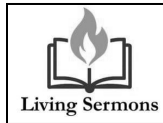

Introduction

Fire dies when intimacy is replaced. You cannot replace time with activity. Fire does not usually go out in a moment. It dies slowly. The enemy does not always attack your faith directly. He weakens your fire quietly. Big falls often begin with small allowances.

Every time you justify sin, you reduce your oil. Distraction is deadly because it looks responsible. One of the greatest dangers of distraction is that it makes you think you are doing the right thing. You may be busy serving the Lord, but if you are no longer soaking in God's presence, something is wrong. Service without soaking leads to burnout. It leads to irritation. You become tired of everything. Your fire does not die because you hate God. Your fire dies because you disconnect from Him. Anything that takes away your prayer life, your time in the Word, or your quiet time with God should be fought aggressively.

CHAPTER ONE

Two Major Killers of Fire

Today I will be sharing something very important with you. The title is **Killers of Fire**.

These are like AK-47s, grenades, machine guns, nuclear weapons, bombs—whatever you can think of that is used in warfare. These are spiritual weapons against your fire.

The two major killers of spiritual fire that we will examine today are:

- **Compromise**
- **Distraction**

Our anchor Scripture is:

Leviticus 6:12 (KJV)

"And the fire upon the altar shall be burning in it; it shall not be put out..."

God's instruction is clear: **The fire must never go out.**

Fire Dies Slowly

Let me say this to you:

Fire does not die loudly.

Fire rarely goes out instantly.

It dies slowly.

When you attempt to extinguish a raging fire, it does not disappear all at once. Even when a fire extinguisher is used, the fire gradually weakens before it finally dies.

Fire dies when it is no longer being fed.

It also dies when something capable of extinguishing it is introduced.

In the life of a believer, the two greatest spiritual fire extinguishers are:

- Compromise
- Distraction

The enemy does not always attack your faith directly. Please understand this. Our enemy does not always attack our fire head-on. Instead, he weakens it quietly.

That is why you may think everything is fine, while something inside you is slowly dying.

There is a popular expression in Nigeria:

"It is dying small, small."

The devil understands that if he attacks you suddenly, you may quickly recognize the danger and fight back.

Instead, he introduces gradual killers—small things that slowly drain your spiritual fire until you hardly recognize yourself.

Compromise: The Slow Leak

I define compromise as **a slow leak**.

It is not a massive leak.

It leaks little by little.

Compromise is not open rebellion.

Compromise is lowering your standard little by little.

You begin to reduce your convictions gradually.

You slowly lower the standards that once guided your walk with God.

It does not happen overnight.

It may take six months.

It may take one year.

It may even take several years.

But little by little, your standards are lowered.

CHAPTER TWO

Catch the Little Foxes

Song of Solomon 2:15 (KJV)

"Take us the foxes, the little foxes, that spoil the vines: for our vines have tender grapes."

Notice how the Bible describes them.

Little foxes.

They are not big. They are often unnoticed. Sometimes they appear insignificant. Sometimes they seem harmless. But they are powerful enough to destroy the vineyard. The instruction is clear:

Catch them.

Arrest those little foxes before they destroy the vineyard. Your spiritual fire may be strong today, but look carefully for those little foxes. Look for the slow leaks.

Those tiny compromises gradually drain your fire without you even realizing it.

How Big Falls Happen

I remember listening to one of Daddy G.O.'s messages many years ago. The message deeply challenged me.

He explained that if a congregation of one million people drops to 990,000, most people would never notice.

If it drops again to 950,000, many still would not notice.

Then it becomes 900,000.

Then 800,000.

The auditorium still looks full.

The decline is gradual.

He explained that there was a period when attendance was steadily decreasing, but it was difficult to notice until the Lord opened his eyes. Once they recognized what was happening, they made the necessary adjustments, and the numbers increased again.

That lesson stayed with me.

Small leaks.

Little by little. Big falls always begin with small allowances. Major failures do not happen suddenly. They happen gradually. One little allowance.

Another small compromise. Another excuse.

Eventually, the major fall becomes visible.

Signs of Spiritual Compromise

Here are some common examples of compromise.

"It Is Not That Serious"

When you begin saying,

"It is not that serious,"

it has already become serious.

That statement often reveals that your standards are beginning to fall.

"Everybody Does It"

The moment your standard becomes,

"Everybody does it,"

you are already compromising.

There is a problem.

"God Understands"

Another dangerous statement is:

"God understands."

When you begin using these kinds of excuses, you are entering a season of compromise.

What Weakens Obedience

When a believer compromises, it is usually not because they have stopped loving God. They still love Him. But they stop obeying Him daily. They stop obeying Him fully. There is delayed obedience. There is partial obedience. Little acts of disobedience begin to appear.

That is compromise. Fire and compromise cannot coexist. Every time you justify sin, you reduce your oil. Every time you excuse sin, your spiritual reserve decreases.

Fire and compromise cannot live together.

Distraction: The Fire Drowner

Now let me address distraction. If compromise is a slow leak, then distraction is a fire drowner. It slowly drains your spiritual life. Imagine someone drowning in an ocean.

If your spiritual fire is an ocean, distraction is what causes people to drown inside it.

Martha and Mary

Luke 10:38–42 (KJV)

Consider the story of Martha and Mary. Jesus came into their home. Mary sat at His feet and listened to His words. Martha was occupied with many responsibilities.

She was cooking, serving, preparing food, and making sure everything was ready for Jesus and His disciples. Martha was not committing sin.

She was distracted.

Jesus said to her:

Luke 10:42 (KJV)

"But one thing is needful: and Mary hath chosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from her."

That is important.

Distraction is not always sin. Sometimes it is simply being occupied with things that pull you away from what matters most.

The Dangerous Nature of Distraction

Distraction is deadly because it looks responsible. It appears productive. It seems necessary. You genuinely believe you are doing the right thing. It looks legitimate.

You may not even be doing anything sinful. Yet, while you are busy with legitimate responsibilities, your fire is quietly being drained.

How Distraction Steals Prayer Time

One of the greatest dangers of distraction is that it slowly reduces your prayer life.

I had to establish personal rules, structures, and systems.

Let me say this to you:

When you hate rules, you will never become a ruler.

When you hate discipline, you eventually become low.

One of my personal rules is this:

I do not check my phone until I have completed my morning devotion.

I do not read anyone's messages until after I have prayed and spent time with God.

God's Word comes before the words of any man.

However, there have been mornings when I went to bed expecting an important message.

While praying, a thought suddenly comes:

"Maybe the message has arrived."

It sounds responsible.

It seems legitimate.

So you pick up your phone.

You check WhatsApp.

Then another message appears.

Then another.

Then another.

Before you realize it, two hours have passed.

It all began with one seemingly legitimate reason.

That is how distraction works.

It slowly steals your prayer time.

How Distraction Steals Your Time in the Word

Distraction also slowly removes your time in God's Word. Perhaps you have prayed for one hour, two hours, twenty minutes, or even three hours. Normally, after prayer, you should spend time reading the Scriptures.

In my experience, the best time to read the Bible is immediately after prayer. That is when you begin to see things in Scripture that you would not normally notice. Prayer prepares your heart to receive from God's Word. The best time to study the Word is after you have prayed.

There are times when you have what seems like a legitimate reason to check your phone. Perhaps you need to reply to someone quickly or make an urgent call. Those things appear responsible, but before you know it, you have lost your time in the Word.

One discipline I have cultivated is this: even if I can only read a few verses, I will sit with the Word before checking any message. Let me tell you the truth. When you miss that moment, you may lose it for the entire day. You may not have another opportunity because responsibilities will continue to demand your attention. If you miss that window, distraction has already begun its work.

It slowly removes your prayer time. It slowly removes your time in God's Word.

The Loss of Quiet Time

The third thing distraction steals is your quiet time with God. When your quiet time is affected, your study of the Word is affected. When your study of the Word is affected, your prayer life is affected. At that point, you are already experiencing distraction.

Notice this carefully.

You did not choose sin.

You chose to be busy.

When you choose busyness over intimacy with God, you have entered the zone of distraction.

Busy eventually becomes spiritual emptiness.

Anyone who continually chooses busyness over fellowship with God will become spiritually empty.

The devil does not need you to become evil.

He only needs you to become occupied.

For a man or woman who is on fire for God, the devil's goal is not necessarily to make you wicked.

Unbelievers are already living in evil.

For you, his strategy is different.

He wants you occupied.

He wants you distracted.

He wants everything to seem necessary.

That is why anything that takes away your prayer life, your study of God's Word, or your quiet time with Him must be fought aggressively.

CHAPTER THREE

Fire Dies When Intimacy Is Replaced

Fire dies when intimacy is replaced. You cannot replace time **with** God by doing activities **for** God.

Listen carefully.

Do the work of God.

Serve faithfully.

But never do so at the expense of your fellowship with God. Your service must flow out of your relationship with Him. It is from your time with God that you receive inspiration. It is from your time with God that you receive strength.

Do not sacrifice intimacy for activity.

Serving Without Soaking

Serving without soaking in God's presence leads to burnout. When you are constantly serving but no longer spending time with God, burnout becomes inevitable.

It leads to irritation.

- You become tired of people.
- You become tired of church.
- You become tired of ministry.
- You are still active in church.
- You are still serving.

But your heart is no longer refreshed by His presence. Service without soaking produces irritation. Service without soaking produces spiritual dryness. Perhaps you are serving on the camera team.

Perhaps you coordinate a department.

Perhaps you lead a ministry.

But you no longer spend quality time with God.

The result is predictable.

You become exhausted.

You become irritated.

You become spiritually dry.

Never allow anything to steal your time with God.

Fight for the Secret Place

If there is one thing I fight for, it is my quiet time. I fight for my time in the secret place.

My pattern comes from Scripture.

Mark 1:35 (KJV)

"And in the morning, rising up a great while before day, he went out, and departed into a solitary place, and there prayed."

I believe in rising before daylight to pray into the day.

That has become my lifestyle.

I enjoy beginning my prayer walk while it is still dark.

As daylight begins to break during my prayers, it is deeply symbolic to me.

It feels as though the day itself is breaking upon me.

That conviction came from **Mark 1:35**.

When You Wake Up Late

There are days when I wake up later than usual. Honestly, I do not like waking up after daylight has already broken. When it happens, I feel like I have missed something. I enjoy seeing the day break while I am already praying.

For a long time, whenever I woke up late, I felt as though the entire day had been wasted. The devil used that feeling against me.

He would whisper,

"You have already missed today."

"There is no point praying anymore."

One day, while struggling with those thoughts, the Holy Spirit spoke to me.

"I can answer prayer anytime."

That changed my perspective.

Yes, God answers prayer at any time.

Now, if I wake up at 9:00 a.m. because I attended a vigil, travelled, or was physically exhausted, I simply begin praying from that moment.

I refuse to allow anything to rob me of my prayer life.

I fight for it.

Protect Every Opportunity

There are days when all I can do is meditate on one verse of Scripture. Someone may ask, *"Pastor, just one verse?"*

Yes.

Perhaps I woke up late.

Perhaps I have a journey to make.

Perhaps I need to catch a flight.

I begin my day with prayer.

Then I hold onto one verse and meditate on it throughout the day.

One practical step I took was purchasing another phone dedicated solely to my audio Bible.

As I travel, the Scriptures continue playing in my ears.

I keep hearing God's Word.

I keep meditating on it. I do everything possible to ensure that I do not lose my day. I do not lose my fire. I do not lose my fellowship with God. There will be days when you cannot keep your usual schedule. Perhaps your normal routine is three hours every morning.

Some days that may not be possible.

Even if all you have is twenty minutes, make sure those twenty minutes contain both prayer and God's Word.

When you serve without soaking, you experience burnout, irritation, and spiritual dryness.

Jesus said:

John 15:5 (KJV)

"I am the vine, ye are the branches... for without me ye can do nothing."

Notice something important.

A branch does not die because it hates the vine.

It dies because it becomes disconnected from the vine.

Likewise, your fire does not die because you hate God. Your fire dies because you disconnect from Him. Your fire dies because fellowship is broken.

Distraction disconnects. Compromise contaminates. Both are killers of spiritual fire.

Why These Enemies Are Dangerous

Why are compromise and distraction so dangerous?

Because they are subtle.

Compromise whispers,

"Just this once."

Distraction whispers,

"You can pray later."

Both assure you,

"It will not affect your fire."

But gradually they weaken you.

Your passion begins to fade.

Your spiritual sensitivity begins to diminish.

Your convictions become weaker.

Until one day you suddenly realize:

"I am no longer burning like I used to."

The painful part is that this decline may have been happening for a long time without your noticing it.

Then, when you finally recognize it, it often takes fasting, prayer, and retreat to recover what was lost.

How to Protect Your Fire

1. Guard Your Private Life

Who you are when nobody is watching determines who you will become in public.

Guard your private life.

2. Remove Small Compromises Early

Do not tolerate little compromises.

Remove them while they are still small.

Do not allow them to mature into something beyond your control.

Do not manage sin.

Eliminate it.

3. Stay Accountable

Stay accountable.

Isolation makes compromise easier.

Make sure there is someone who can speak into your life.

Belong to a community of believers.

Do not walk alone.

4. Schedule Intimacy with God

If intimacy is not planned, distraction will always win. That is why I intentionally schedule my time with God. My early morning prayer life did not happen by accident.

It is planned.

Do not say,

"Today I do not feel like praying. I will pray later."

That is self-deception.

Your time with God must be scheduled.

For me, my alarms begin ringing at 3:30 a.m.

Then 4:00 a.m.

Then 4:30 a.m.

Then 5:00 a.m.

If I miss one, another reminds me.

The structure is intentional.

The schedule protects my intimacy with God.

Any time I know I will be keeping a night vigil, the alarms are already in place.

I do not assume I will wake up naturally.

It is planned.

Be Light for Your Flight

Let me add this.

If you plan to keep a night vigil, do not eat heavily beforehand. For my Nigerian brothers and sisters, you cannot eat a heavy meal of eba or starch and expect to wake up easily in the middle of the night to pray.

Eat light.

You need to be light for your flight.

I remember travelling from Egypt to Jordan.

When we arrived, I discovered that my luggage had not arrived.

The airline apologized and explained that the aircraft had become too heavy, so some luggage had to be removed.

Even an airplane must be light before it can fly efficiently.

How much more a believer pursuing spiritual flight?

Many believers have become too heavy.

Too heavy with compromise.

Too heavy with distractions.

Too heavy with unnecessary things.

Examine Your Life

Ask yourself this question:

Are the things I am doing increasing my fire or cooling my fire?

Are they feeding my fire?

Or are they extinguishing it?

I pray for you in the name of Jesus:

You will not lose your fire.

Remember this.

You do not lose your fire because God leaves you.

You lose your fire because something else replaces Him.

Closing Prayer

Let us pray together. Make these declarations sincerely before the Lord.

"Lord, expose every compromise in my life."

Now pray:

"Lord, remove every distraction that is stealing my fire."

Pray it again.

"Lord, remove every distraction that is stealing my fire."

Then declare:

"I choose to protect the flame You have placed within me."

Again:

"I choose to protect the flame You have placed within me."

Remember this: Fire is not automatic.

It is protected. If your fire is going to last, you must protect it.

Final Declaration

I believe you have learned something today. I pray, in the name of Jesus, that your fire will never die.

- You will stay lit.
- You will remain on fire.
- You will protect your fire.
- You will refuse compromise.
- You will remove distractions from your life, in Jesus' name.

Now declare after me:

- **I will live lit daily.**
- **I will build lit intentionally.**
- **I will lead lit boldly.**
- **I am sent to carry the fire into my world.**

Do not keep this message to yourself.

Share it with your friends, your family, and everyone connected to you. As you continue to burn for God, help others to burn as well.
