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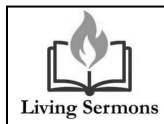

Introduction

Good day to you. How are you?

Today, I'm going to be sharing something powerful with you—something I am very excited about. I will be speaking on **The Dangers of Lukewarm Living**. It is a life where you are neither cold nor hot, and it is a very dangerous place to be.

Let us pray.

Prayer

Father, in the name of Jesus, we thank You for today. Thank You for the opportunity to share Your Word with Your people. Thank You for leading us. Thank You for helping us to stay lit. We give You all the praise.

Today, let Your Word come with power. Holy Spirit, glorify Jesus through this teaching. I am not the most qualified, neither am I the most anointed, but Your mercy qualifies me. Holy Spirit, glorify Jesus. You are co-equal and co-eternal with the Father. Glorify Jesus today and empower Your Word in my mouth.

Give me utterance, and let Your people be transformed. Father, take all the glory.

In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

CHAPTER ONE

Christ's Warning Against Lukewarmness

Our major text is **Revelation 3:15–17 (KJV)**:

"I know thy works, that thou art neither cold nor hot: I would thou wert cold or hot.

So then because thou art lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will spue thee out of my mouth.

Because thou sayest, I am rich, and increased with goods, and have need of nothing; and knowest not that thou art wretched, and miserable, and poor, and blind, and naked."*

Notice how much this condition grieves God. He said, *"I will spue thee out of my mouth."* You are neither cold nor hot—you are lukewarm. God hates that condition.

My prayer is that, at the end of this teaching, you will make a definite decision to stay **lit**. There is no place for lukewarmness, and there is no place for spiritual coldness.

What Lukewarmness Really Means

Lukewarmness is not rebellion. It is not that you have openly rebelled against God. It is not atheism. It is not that you have stopped believing in God. **Lukewarmness is almost.** You are almost where you should be.

But guess what?

Almost is very dangerous. That is why someone can be in church and still be lukewarm. The difficult part is that you can be in leadership and still be lukewarm. You can be in the worship team and still be lukewarm. You can even be in ministry and still be lukewarm. You can be actively serving while being spiritually neutralized.

You are active in service, but you have lost intimacy with God.

A Life That Resists Surrender

Let me define lukewarm living for you. Lukewarm living is a life that claims God but resists surrender. It is a life that says it knows God but denies His power by refusing complete surrender.

It is a heart that wants heaven but keeps flirting with comfort. You desire God's presence, yet you continue to entertain compromise. It becomes difficult to let go of certain habits. It becomes difficult to abandon certain lifestyles. That is why someone can be in leadership, ministry, or worship and still be lukewarm.

Lukewarm Living Is Deceptive

One of the greatest dangers of lukewarm living is deception.

Revelation 3:17 (KJV) says:

"Because thou sayest, I am rich, and increased with goods, and have need of nothing... and knowest not that thou art wretched, and miserable, and poor, and blind, and naked."

Lukewarm living deceives you. It makes you think everything is fine. You say, *"I'm still going to church."*

"I'm still praying."

"I still pay my tithe."

"I'm even a Sunday school teacher."

Yet, you are drifting spiritually.

Lukewarmness Binds You

Another danger of lukewarmness is that it binds you. You believe you are doing well because you still pray occasionally. At least you are not a bad person. At least you are not as bad as other people. But spiritually, you are drifting away. You may not be committing obvious outward sins.

- Perhaps you are no longer praying consistently.
- Perhaps you are not living in open immorality.

You simply tolerate thoughts and compromises that you once resisted. Lukewarmness quietly binds your heart.

Signs of Self-Deception

One major sign of self-deception is that you begin measuring growth by activity instead of intimacy.

You say,

"I led praise and worship today."

"I'm active in leadership."

"I'm coordinating the protocol department."

"Whenever there is a major meeting, I'm always serving close to the man of God."

You begin to measure your spiritual health by your assignments instead of your relationship with God. That is deception. That is lukewarmness.

Defending Instead of Fighting Weakness

Another sign is when you begin defending your weaknesses instead of fighting them. Rather than confronting sin, you begin explaining it.

You say,

"It's because of the season I'm in."

"It's because of where I am."

"It's because of the people around me."

You continue finding reasons to justify what God wants you to overcome. What you once confronted boldly, you now explain away. That is a dangerous sign.

When Conviction Feels Like Judgment

There comes a point where conviction begins to feel like condemnation. The same sermons that once made you cry before God now make you uncomfortable. Instead of saying,

"Lord, I repent,"

you begin saying,

"Why are you judging me?"

"Don't be judgmental."

"Who gave you the right to judge me?"

A simple instruction now feels like an attack. That is self-deception. You are already entering the valley of lukewarmness.

Hot, Cold, and Lukewarm

Let me say this carefully. Hot believers repent quickly. Cold believers know they are far from God. But lukewarm believers think they are fine.

That is the trap. If you are cold, you know you are cold. If you are on fire, it is obvious. But when you are lukewarm, you believe everything is fine. That is why lukewarmness is such a hidden monster. It is like medicine that tastes sweet on your tongue but becomes bitter after it goes down.

That is what lukewarmness looks like. You think everything is fine until you suddenly realize you have lost what once made you spiritually alive.

CHAPTER TWO

Lukewarmness Kills Spiritual Sensitivity

Lukewarm living destroys your spiritual sensitivity. When your fire reduces, your sensitivity also reduces. When your spiritual fire goes down, you stop hearing God the way you used to. One of the ways you can know something is wrong is when spiritual gifts that once operated freely in your life begin to disappear.

You used to hear God's voice clearly. Now you hardly hear Him anymore. There was a season in my own life when I did not realize I had lost something spiritually. I could still hear God while ministering. Whenever I preached, God would reveal things about people.

Someone would confirm, "Yes, that is me."

But I had lost something deeper. I had lost God speaking to me personally. I had lost hearing Him while driving. I had lost hearing Him during my daily walk. Because ministry was still flowing, I did not realize intimacy had been lost.

Until God showed me, *"My son, you are far away."*

Lukewarm living reduces your spiritual sensitivity. When your fire goes down, your sensitivity goes down with it.

When Souls No Longer Matter

One clear sign of lukewarmness is when you no longer carry a burden for souls. Everything becomes about success instead of salvation. For example, you organize a meeting. Your greatest concern is that the program should trend online.

There is nothing wrong with a meeting becoming popular. But while planning and praying, what occupies your heart?

Are you asking, "*Lord, let souls be saved,*" or are you only thinking,

"This program must trend."

Imagine organizing a three-day conference. No soul is saved. Yet, you are not moved because the videos went viral. That is lukewarmness.

Your Life Is Your First Sermon

Another sign appears when your life no longer influences people toward Christ.

People begin asking, "*Are you really a Christian?*"

Yet, it no longer bothers you. Remember this: **Your life is your first sermon.**

Your life is your strongest sermon. At your workplace, your lifestyle should convict people. Your conduct should encourage others toward Christ. There are things you deliberately avoid—not merely because they are wrong, but because you care about another person's soul.

When that burden disappears, you are entering the lukewarm zone.

No Hunger for God's Word

Another sign is when there is no hunger for God's Word. You can go an entire week without reading Scripture. You can go an entire week without praying. You stop listening to sermons. You stop feeding your spirit.

That is another indication that you are already entering the lukewarm zone.

When Worship Becomes Routine

Another warning sign is when worship becomes routine. You simply go through the motions. Your heart is no longer engaged. You no longer feel connected during worship.

Your worship has become mechanical. That is another symptom of lukewarmness.

When Prayer Becomes Need-Based

Prayer also changes.

Instead of prayer being intimacy and fellowship with God, it becomes a tool for getting things.

You only pray when you need something.

Prayer becomes work instead of relationship.

That is another sign of lukewarm living.

When Sin No Longer Bothers You

One of the most dangerous signs is when sin stops bothering you. You no longer feel conviction. Let me explain. If I called someone and mistakenly gave the wrong account details, after hanging up I would immediately feel uncomfortable.

I would call back to correct the mistake. There was a time when that was your nature. But suddenly, you no longer feel that way. Now you lie conveniently. You even call it wisdom. Things that once grieved your heart no longer affect you.

You exaggerate.

You compromise.

You lie.

And you feel nothing.

My brother, My sister, When sin no longer bothers you, you have entered the lukewarm zone.

A Seared Conscience

1 Timothy 4:2 (KJV) says:

"Speaking lies in hypocrisy; having their conscience seared with a hot iron."

A seared conscience no longer responds the way it should. I love how **The Passion Translation** expresses this truth. It speaks of hypocritical liars whose consciences no longer trouble them.

They are no longer bothered. They are no longer moved.

As I said earlier, there are things you do—and things you deliberately refuse to do—because you care about the souls of those around you.

Your desire is to stay lit and help others encounter God's fire.

But when your conscience becomes seared, none of those things bother you anymore.

You lie without conviction.

You desire another person's downfall without remorse.

You wish evil upon people, and your heart remains unmoved.

That is a dangerous place to be.

A seared conscience is not loud when you sin.

Instead, it remains silent in compromise.

Your standards slowly disappear.

You gradually abandon the convictions you once stood for.

And before long, you find yourself living in the dangerous territory called **lukewarmness**.

Your convictions no longer hold their ground.

They are no longer shaping your decisions.

The very things that once strengthened your convictions no longer matter to you.

You still attend church, but you are no longer engaged.

You still come for Bible study, but your heart is not there.

Perhaps you are present simply because you are one of the leaders.

You attend because people would notice your absence.

You still participate in devotion, but you are no longer connecting with God.

Your heart is no longer involved.

You still serve, but there is no oil upon your service anymore.

The freshness is gone.

The life is gone.

Lukewarm Living Makes You Vulnerable

Lukewarm living leaves you exposed. It makes you vulnerable to spiritual attacks. You can fall easily. You can drift into spiritual coldness without realizing it.

Jesus said in **Matthew 26:41 (KJV)**:

"Watch and pray, that ye enter not into temptation: the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak."

Lukewarm living makes you vulnerable. When passion drops, your prayer life weakens.

When your passion for God decreases, your spiritual alertness begins to fade.

Discipline gradually disappears.

Temptation suddenly becomes much easier to yield to.

CHAPTER THREE

What Keeps You Spiritually Charged

I have noticed this even in my own life. Whenever I neglect prayer, all kinds of thoughts and feelings begin to pass through my heart.

But prayer places you in a position where you remain spiritually charged. When you are charged, you are able to take charge. As your passion for God decreases, your prayer life weakens.

- Your alertness diminishes.
- Your sensitivity reduces.
- Your discipline begins to disappear.

The things you once confidently said "No" to become difficult to resist. You begin permitting what you once resisted. That is what happens at the point of lukewarmness.

Falling into temptation becomes very easy. Lukewarmness does not make you strong enough to resist sin. Instead, it leaves you vulnerable. It exposes you to sin. It weakens your resistance. Ironically, it does not even make you cold enough to run away from sin.

Lukewarmness will finish you if you are not careful.

A Life of Spiritual Disadvantage

When you are lukewarm, you live at a serious disadvantage. Your spiritual defenses have already been weakened. Compromise becomes easy. Falling becomes easy. The truth is this: You did not plan to fall.

You simply stopped staying on fire long enough to stand. When temptation came, there was no strength left to resist it. You had no spiritual capacity to say, "No."

Many people say, *"I didn't plan for this to happen."*

I believe you. But temptation comes to everyone. The difference is that when there is fire, you have strength to stand.

Lukewarm Living Rejects God's Fellowship

Another danger is that lukewarm living rejects God's invitation. It rejects God's desire to fellowship with you. It rejects what God wants to do in your life. It rejects His blessings.

Revelation 3:20 beautifully expresses this truth. In **The Passion Translation**, Jesus says:

"Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If your heart is open to hear my voice and you open the door within, I will come into you and feast with you, and you will feast with me."

Jesus was speaking to believers.

He was speaking to the church.

This was not addressed to unbelievers.

Think about that.

It is possible for a believer to leave Jesus standing outside. Imagine Jesus standing at your door, knocking, while you refuse to let Him in. That is what lukewarm living looks like.

- You leave Jesus outside your life.
- You leave Him standing at the gate.
- You leave Him at the door.

Wanting Control Instead of Surrender

Lukewarm living insists on remaining in control. Instead of surrendering to Jesus, you remain in charge. You decide what He can and cannot have. You determine where He is welcome. That is the danger. Lukewarm believers want blessings without burning.

They love the promises of God.

They gladly receive prophetic declarations.

They say,

"Amen!"

"I receive it!"

But they dislike spending time in prayer.

They avoid intercession.

They avoid waiting upon God.

They want salvation, but they dislike sacrifice.

They want success, but they resist surrender.

They desire stability, yet they refuse separation from the world.

They want God's blessings, but they resist His instructions.

They refuse to let go of anything that competes with Him.

That is a sign of lukewarmness.

It is like saying,

"Jesus, You may visit me, but You cannot take over."

"You can be present, but You are not in charge."

"I still want to control my own life."

Lukewarmness Grieves the Heart of God

Another reality you must understand is that lukewarmness disgusts God.

Revelation 3:16 (KJV) says:

"So then because thou art lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will spue thee out of my mouth."

That is a very strong statement.

Now, this is not simply about casually discussing whether someone loses salvation.

The point here is that a lukewarm believer becomes ineffective for Kingdom impact.

You become spiritually ineffective.

You lose your influence.

The Tragedy of a Lukewarm Believer

A lukewarm believer does not intimidate the devil. The devil is not moved by their prayers. The devil is not disturbed by their presence. It is like the sons of Sceva in **Acts 19:15**, where the evil spirit replied,

"Jesus I know, and Paul I know; but who are ye?"

Lukewarm believers also fail to inspire others.

They do not stir the church.

They do not challenge people toward deeper intimacy with God.

They neither frighten hell nor encourage heaven's people.

Their prayers struggle to rise.

They are present, but they are not powerful.

They attend church.

They attend prayer meetings.

But there is no spiritual weight behind their words.

Their utterances carry little power.

People encounter them but leave unchanged.

Heaven does not celebrate lukewarm Christianity.

God said,

"I will spue thee out of my mouth."

CHAPTER FOUR

How to Escape Lukewarmness

Now let me close with this. How do you escape lukewarmness?

Revelation 3:18–19 gives us the answer.

The **Passion Translation** says:

"So I counsel you to purchase gold perfected by fire so that you can truly be rich. Purchase white garments to cover and clothe your shameful nakedness. Purchase eye salve to be placed over your eyes so that you can truly see. All those I dearly love I unmask and train. So repent and be eager to pursue what is right."

The **King James Version** summarizes it this way:

"...buy of me gold tried in the fire... be zealous therefore, and repent."

There are three practical steps to getting your fire back.

1. Honest Repentance

Stop making excuses.

Call sin what it is.

Do not say,

"It is just my weakness."

If it is sin, call it sin.

Stop excusing your spiritual coldness.

Stop giving it attractive names.

Stop glorifying your weaknesses.

Stop explaining them away.

Do not give compromise a respectable title.

Call it exactly what it is before God.

2. Rekindle Spiritual Discipline

Return to prayer. Return to consistent prayer. Return to God's Word every single day.

Develop daily fellowship with God again. Make worship intentional.

Spend quality time in worship. Sometimes, simply close your eyes and focus on Him.

Say,

"Lord, I worship You."

"Lord, I give You my heart."

Be deliberate.

Give your energy to worship. Position yourself to truly connect with God. Pray consistently. Feed on God's Word daily. Make worship a lifestyle instead of a routine.

3. Remove What Is Cooling Your Fire

Remove whatever is extinguishing your fire. Some relationships are fire extinguishers.

Some habits are fire extinguishers. Some distractions are fire extinguishers. You cannot surround yourself with spiritual ice and expect to remain on fire. Stay around fire-lighters—not fire extinguishers.

Sometimes social media becomes one of those distractions. You cannot spend your entire day scrolling endlessly on TikTok or other platforms and expect your spiritual fire to remain strong.

Stay away from spiritual ice. Identify whatever is cooling your passion for God. Walk away from it. Leave it behind. Run from whatever distances your heart from God.

God's Call Is to Burn

Today, God is calling you to burn. Lukewarmness is comfortable. That is why it is dangerous. It convinces you that everything is fine. But fire transforms.

Fire changes lives.

Fire changes people.

Fire changes environments.

Closing Prayer

I do not want you to remain in a place where God says, *"I will spue thee out of my mouth."*

Let us pray together.

Prayer

Father, I refuse to be a carnal Christian.

Set me on fire again.

Remove every lukewarm area of my life.

I choose to burn.

Help me.

Set me on fire again.

I refuse to be casual.

I refuse to be lukewarm.

Increase Your fire within me.

Lord, I choose to burn for You.

In Jesus' name. Amen.

I pray for you today: You will burn for God. You will not become casual. You will remain passionate for Jesus. You will carry His fire everywhere you go.

In Jesus' name. Amen.

Weekly Declaration

Say this after me:

I live lit daily.

I build lit intentionally.

I lead lit boldly.

I am sent to carry the fire into my world.

Let us declare it again.

I live lit daily.

I build lit intentionally.

I lead lit boldly.

I am sent to carry the fire into my world.

One more time:

I live lit daily.

I build lit intentionally.

I lead lit boldly.

I am sent to carry the fire into my world.

The goal of **Live Lit, Build Lit, Lead Lit** is this:

Live lit.

Stay on fire.

Remain awake to your purpose.

Build lit.

Create structures around your life that protect your spiritual fire.

Lead lit.

Light the lamps of others.

Ignite the candles of those around you.

Do not burn alone.

Bring others into the fire.

Remain on fire twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week, throughout the year.

Stay lit.

Build lit.

Lead lit.
