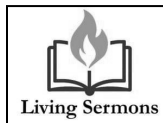

CHAPTER ONE

Moving from Knowledge to Partnership

Today, I will be sharing with you on **partnering with the Holy Spirit daily**.

The goal is to move you from having only a theoretical knowledge of the Holy Spirit to becoming an active partner with Him. Partnership with the Holy Spirit on a daily basis transforms your life. It transforms your prayer life, the way you lead, and the way you do everything.

My prayer is that you will move from merely knowing about the Holy Spirit to knowing the Person of the Holy Spirit.

Let me begin by saying this:

You can be saved and still live like an orphan.

You can be filled with the Holy Spirit and still live as though you are empty.

Why?

Because you do not understand what it means to partner with the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit is not just a doctrine to be debated. He is not merely a subject to study or a feeling to experience.

The Holy Spirit is a Person to be known.

Everything changes when you learn to walk with Him. Everything changes when you learn to walk with the Person of the Holy Spirit.

The Most Misunderstood Person in the Trinity

The Holy Spirit is co-equal and co-eternal with the Father and with the Son.

Yet, He is the most misunderstood Person in the Trinity.

Why?

Because many people simply do not understand Him.

Let me say this clearly:

The Holy Spirit is **not** a feeling.

Although you can feel His presence, He Himself is not a feeling.

He is not merely an atmosphere, even though His presence creates an atmosphere.

He is not a theological concept.

He is not merely a force or an energy.

Yes, there is the power of the Spirit.

Yes, there is the force of the Spirit.

But the Holy Spirit Himself is a Person.

The Personality of the Holy Spirit

The Scriptures reveal that the Holy Spirit possesses all the qualities of a person.

1. He Is a Person

The Holy Spirit is not an "it."

He is a Person to be known, loved, and walked with.

2. He Has a Mind

"And he that searcheth the hearts knoweth what is the mind of the Spirit, because he maketh intercession for the saints according to the will of God."

— Romans 8:27 (KJV)

The Holy Spirit has a mind.

He thinks, He understands, He knows the will of God.

3. He Has Emotions

The Holy Spirit can be grieved.

"And grieve not the holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption."

— Ephesians 4:30 (KJV)

Because He has emotions, our actions and responses toward Him matter.

4. He Has a Will

"But all these worketh that one and the selfsame Spirit, dividing to every man severally as he will."

— 1 Corinthians 12:11 (KJV)

The Holy Spirit distributes spiritual gifts according to His own will.

He decides.

He directs.

He chooses.

5. He Speaks, Teaches, Leads, and Intercedes

The Holy Spirit is active.

He speaks.

The Spirit speaks expressly.

He teaches.

Jesus said that when He comes, He will teach us all things.

He leads.

The Spirit led Jesus into the wilderness.

He intercedes.

The Scriptures tell us that we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit Himself makes intercession for us.

Jesus said:

"And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you for ever; Even the Spirit of truth..."

— John 14:16–17 (KJV)

Notice that Jesus called Him **another Comforter**.

That means One of the same kind—not someone inferior to Jesus.

The Holy Spirit is the continuation of the ministry of Jesus on the earth.

We see the dispensation of God the Father in the Old Testament.

We see the dispensation of God the Son during the Gospel accounts.

Now we are living in the dispensation of the Holy Spirit, beginning from the Book of Acts.

He is the One with us today.

He is the continuation of the ministry of Jesus Christ.

CHAPTER TWO

The Five Primary Ministries of the Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit does many things, but let me highlight five of His primary ministries.

1. He Indwells Every Believer

"What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you..."

— 1 Corinthians 6:19 (KJV)

If you are a child of God, the Holy Spirit lives inside you.

Your body is His temple.

He indwells every believer.

2. He Teaches

Jesus said:

"But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost... he shall teach you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance..."

— *John 14:26 (KJV)*

Every revelation you receive from God's Word comes through the ministry of the Holy Spirit.

It is not because you are smart. It is not because you are naturally deep. The Holy Spirit is the One who searches the deep things of God.

The Scripture says:

"...the Spirit searcheth all things, yea, the deep things of God."

— *1 Corinthians 2:10 (KJV)*

Every mystery unveiled comes through Him.

He teaches.

3. He Leads

"For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God."

— *Romans 8:14 (KJV)*

The Holy Spirit leads. He does not push. He does not force Himself on anyone. That is why sensitivity is required when walking with the Holy Spirit.

If you refuse His leadership, He will not compel you.

He leads those who willingly follow.

4. He Empowers

This is one of my favorite ministries of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus declared:

"But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you..."

— *Acts 1:8 (KJV)*

The same Spirit that raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you.

"...he that raised up Christ from the dead shall also quicken your mortal bodies by his Spirit that dwelleth in you."

— *Romans 8:11 (KJV)*

The Holy Spirit empowers everyone who surrenders to Him.

You cannot do the work of God without the Spirit of God.

You cannot do the work of God without the power of God.

The Holy Spirit transmits the power of God into the life of the servant of God to accomplish the work of God.

The man of God needs the power of God from the Spirit of God to do the work of God.

The Holy Spirit empowers.

Prayer for Empowerment

Can you pray this prayer with me?

Holy Ghost, empower me.

Holy Ghost, empower me.

I am ready for Your empowerment.

I cannot do it on my own.

Holy Ghost, empower me.

I am weak without You.

I am useless without You. **Holy Ghost, empower me.**

5. He Intercedes

The fifth primary ministry of the Holy Spirit is that **He intercedes**.

I love this part.

The Scripture says:

"Likewise the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered."

— Romans 8:26 (KJV)

The Holy Spirit not only empowers us—He also intercedes for us.

We do not know how to pray as we ought.

Yes, we pray, but many times we do not know exactly what to pray.

The Holy Spirit helps us.

He intercedes for us with groanings that cannot be uttered.

One of the ways He intercedes is not simply by taking your prayer requests and praying on your behalf while you remain passive.

No.

It is as though He takes you by the hand, and together you begin to pray.

He helps you pray the right prayers.

I call Him **Heaven's operating system**.

Why?

Because He knows the mind of the Father.

He knows exactly what the Father is doing.

So, He comes to me and says, "Pray this."

He is instructing me to pray in agreement with what the Father is already doing.

The Father desires to accomplish something in my life, and the Holy Spirit teaches me how to pray in line with that divine purpose.

Then, when I begin to pray in tongues, He takes over.

As I continue praying, the Holy Spirit begins to pray the very mind of the Father through me.

He is praying the Father's will through my life.

If you are not praying in the Spirit, you are cheating yourself.

If you are not partnering with the Holy Spirit, you are cheating yourself.

Whenever I begin to pray in the Spirit, I partner with the Holy Spirit to pray the will of the Father.

That is why those who consistently pray in tongues gradually enter into God's will, because they are praying the mind of the Father.

Can you give God praise?

Take one minute and pray.

Prays

Yes, Lord.

Glory!

Glory!

Thank You, Jesus.

Amen.

Amen.

It is sweet when the Holy Spirit is praying for you.

It is sweet when the Holy Spirit is praying with you.

It is sweet when the Holy Spirit is praying through you.

Can we partner with the Holy Spirit again?

Take one minute and pray.

Prays

Amen.

This is how the Holy Spirit prays through me.

He prays the will of the Father.

He prays the mind of the Father.

And as I partner with Him, I pray myself into God's will.

There are things I may not naturally be willing to do.

But as I continue praying in the Holy Spirit, I gradually pray myself into alignment with God's will.

CHAPTER THREE

How We Grieve the Holy Spirit

Earlier, I read to you from *Ephesians 4:30*:

"And grieve not the holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption."

— *Ephesians 4:30 (KJV)*

Many believers grieve the Holy Spirit without realizing it.

How do we grieve Him?

What are the things that grieve the Holy Spirit?

1. Unconfessed Sin

We grieve the Holy Spirit through unconfessed sin.

Unconfessed compromise blocks spiritual sensitivity.

The Holy Spirit is your Advocate.

He is fighting for you.

He is defending you.

Think about it this way.

When you have a lawyer fighting your case, you do not become arrogant before your lawyer.

You lay everything bare.

Likewise, when you confess your sins, you give the Holy Spirit the legal ground to intercede on your behalf.

Do not grieve Him through unconfessed sin.

2. Ignoring His Promptings

This one is very serious.

Whenever you ignore the promptings of the Holy Spirit, you grieve Him.

Repeated disobedience dulls the voice of the Spirit. He tells you to pray, but you ignore Him. He tells you to do something, but you refuse. Again and again, you resist His leading.

After a while, He becomes quiet.

Why?

Because He does not strive with people. He does not push.

He only leads.

Have you been ignoring the promptings of the Holy Spirit?

3. Busyness Without Stillness

The Holy Spirit often speaks in a still, quiet voice.

Yet many of us continually avoid stillness.

We avoid moments of quiet.

We avoid waiting.

We must learn to be still.

Quiet your spirit so you can recognize His voice.

Many times, when I need to hear God concerning a matter, I begin to pray.

As I pray, I am also listening.

Communication is always two-way.

You speak.

You also listen.

Sometimes, after praying for a long time, I intentionally pause.

I quiet my inner man.

As I speak, I listen.

As I pray, I hear.

Many believers never become quiet enough to hear God.

Sometimes, simply remain silent.

Say,

"Holy Ghost, I am ready to hear."

There is so much noise around us.

There is also so much noise within us.

Distractions are everywhere.

Because of this, many believers struggle to recognize His voice.

We grieve Him through busyness without stillness.

I would have missed many divine instructions if I had never learned to be still.

You must cultivate the discipline of stillness.

4. Treating Him as a Resource Instead of Your Source

Many believers only remember the Holy Spirit when they need something.

When they are about to minister, they begin praying in tongues.

When there is a crisis, suddenly they begin praying.

No.

Do not treat Him as a resource while expecting Him to be your Source.

That is not how relationships work.

You must learn to engage Him continually.

While you are driving, thank Him.

While you are walking, worship Him.

While you are at home, acknowledge Him.

While you are alone, sing to the Lord.

Spend your day fellowshiping with the Holy Spirit.

Remember the blessing we declare at the close of many church services:

"The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Ghost, be with you all. Amen."

— 2 Corinthians 13:14 (KJV)

If you want to enjoy the grace that belongs to Jesus, you must love the Lord.

And one of the clearest proofs of that love is fellowship with the Holy Spirit.

When you fellowship with Him, you access His grace.

Do not treat Him as a resource.

Treat Him as your Source.

Spend quality time with Him every single day.

Pray like this:

Sweet Holy Ghost, thank You.

I love You.

I honor You.

You are the Spirit of Truth.

You are the Revealer of Truth.

You are the Spirit who empowers.

Thank You, my Senior Partner.

Fellowship with Him consistently.

The Holy Spirit is not a vending machine.

He is a Companion.

Relationships require attention.

Imagine being married and never giving your spouse any attention.

That relationship cannot flourish.

The same principle applies to your relationship with the Holy Spirit.

Relationship requires attention.

The Holy Spirit desires your fellowship.

The love language of the Holy Spirit is **time**.

The love language of the Holy Spirit is **quality time**.

Let me make you smile.

Perhaps there is some truth in this observation.

The only title in the Bible that women share with the Holy Spirit is **Helper**.

God said concerning Eve that she would be "**an help meet**" for Adam.

The Holy Spirit is also our Helper.

Notice something about relationships.

People you love desire your time.

In the same way, the Holy Spirit desires your fellowship.

Time.

Quality time.

That is how you learn to walk with Him.

CHAPTER FOUR

Practical Ways to Partner with the Holy Spirit Daily

Now let me give you some practical ways to walk with the Holy Spirit every day.

1. Acknowledge Him Every Morning

As soon as you wake up, greet Him.

Say:

"Good morning, Holy Spirit."

"Thank You, Holy Spirit."

"Spirit of the Lord, thank You."

"Holy Spirit, lead me today."

This is relationship.

Acknowledge Him every morning.

Pray:

Holy Spirit, thank You.

You are my Strength.

Strength like no other.

Spirit of might.

Spirit of counsel.

Spirit of the fear of the Lord.

Thank You, Holy Ghost.

Begin every day by acknowledging Him.

2. Practice Sensitivity Throughout the Day

Throughout your day, continually check your spirit before making decisions.

Develop the habit of asking,

"Holy Spirit, what are You saying?"

Pay attention when you suddenly feel a burden to pray.

Notice unexpected peace in difficult situations.

Recognize those gentle nudges directing you toward an opportunity or away from danger.

Sensitivity grows as you learn to respond to these promptings.

3. Obey His Promptings Immediately

Immediate obedience is essential.

Every time you obey a small prompting, your spiritual sensitivity increases.

Every time you ignore His prompting, that sensitivity begins to fade.

Obey quickly.

Respond immediately.

The more you obey the Holy Spirit, the more clearly you will hear His voice.

Whenever the Holy Spirit prompts you, respond immediately.

I remember reading a story in one of David Yonggi Cho's books about a woman who was in the marketplace when she suddenly felt a strong burden to pray.

Instead of ignoring it because she was in public, she moved to a quiet corner and began to pray.

She remained there until the burden lifted and she received what she described as a note of victory in her spirit.

Only later did she discover what had happened.

Armed robbers had attacked her street and robbed every house except hers.

Imagine if she had said, "I'm in the market. I can't pray here."

Many people have entered unnecessary trouble because they ignored divine promptings.

Many have suffered loss because they were not sensitive enough to obey the Holy Spirit.

I experienced something similar in my own family.

One day, while I was in my office, the name of my younger brother suddenly came strongly into my heart.

Immediately, I began to pray.

I did not know what had happened.

I simply kept praying.

I prayed until I sensed that same note of victory in my spirit.

Only later that evening, when I got home, I discovered what had happened.

My mother had bought a gas cooker.

My younger brother did not know how to use it properly.

He turned on the gas and then began looking for matches.

The lighter was close to the cooker, but for some reason he could not see it.

Eventually, he became frustrated and left the house.

By the time my mother returned later that evening, the entire house had filled with gas.

Thank God.

As I prayed, the Holy Spirit had already intervened.

He prevented my brother from igniting the gas.

Many people miss divine intervention because they fail to respond to divine promptings.

Learn instant obedience.

Every time you obey one prompting, your sensitivity increases.

More promptings will follow.

4. Pray in the Holy Spirit

The Scripture says:

"He that speaketh in an unknown tongue edifieth himself..."

— *1 Corinthians 14:4 (KJV)*

Praying in the Spirit builds your inner man.

When your natural words come to an end, praying in the Spirit continues to strengthen you.

The Bible also says:

"But ye, beloved, building up yourselves on your most holy faith, praying in the Holy Ghost."

— *Jude 20 (KJV)*

You must learn to pray in the Holy Ghost.

One challenge with our generation is that many people know how to pray in the Spirit, but they have not learned how to obey His promptings.

They have not learned daily acknowledgment.

They have not learned sensitivity.

That is why I am teaching these principles.

Pray in the Spirit.

Pray in the Holy Ghost.

The Connection Between the Holy Spirit and Spiritual Fire

Now let us go deeper.

What is the relationship between the Holy Spirit and spiritual fire?

The answer is simple.

Fire is not self-generated.

Fire is Spirit-sustained.

John the Baptist declared:

"I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance: but he that cometh after me... he shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost, and with fire."

— *Matthew 3:11 (KJV)*

The fire comes from God.

The Bible declares:

"For our God is a consuming fire."

— *Hebrews 12:29 (KJV)*

You did not manufacture the fire.

It was given to you.

The day you surrendered your life to Jesus Christ, God placed a spark of His fire within you.

But that fire must be sustained through the ministry of the Holy Spirit.

As you continue responding to Him and adding fresh wood every day through fellowship, prayer, and obedience, the flame God placed within you continues to burn.

Your responsibility is not to create the fire.

The fire belongs to God.

Your responsibility is to keep it burning.

The Scripture says:

"The fire shall ever be burning upon the altar; it shall never go out."

— *Leviticus 6:13 (KJV)*

The Holy Spirit is the One who helps you sustain that fire.

The Lord says:

"...Not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, saith the LORD of hosts."

— *Zechariah 4:6 (KJV)*

Everything you attempt to sustain through human strength will eventually fail.

Whenever you try to fulfill God's assignment in the energy of the flesh, you will become exhausted.

But the Holy Spirit is willing to help you.

He is the Spirit of Fire.

He helps you keep burning.

Pray this simple prayer:

"Holy Ghost, help me. I cannot do this on my own."

Stop trying to live the Christian life without the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit is not a supplement.

He is the Source.

Yield to Him.

Yield again and again.

Watch your life become something beyond human explanation.

Submit to Him.

Surrender to Him.

What the Spirit produced cannot be sustained by the flesh.

The fire you carry is Spirit-born.

Flesh cannot sustain Spirit-produced fire.

So what do you do?

Partner with the Holy Spirit.

Respond to Him.

Walk with Him.

How the Holy Spirit Sustains Your Fire

One of the primary ways He sustains your fire is through the Word of God.

Jesus said:

"It is the spirit that quickeneth; the flesh profiteth nothing: the words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life."

— *John 6:63 (KJV)*

The Word is Spirit.

As you feed on God's Word, your fire is sustained.

As you pray in the Spirit, you yield yourself to the Holy Spirit.

As you surrender to Him, He begins to order your steps.

The Holy Spirit led Jesus into the wilderness.

Later, Jesus returned in the power of the Spirit.

Then He declared:

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me..."

— *Luke 4:18 (KJV)*

Whenever the Holy Spirit leads you, He also leads you into power.

You cannot live this life through your own energy.

Partner with Him.

Acknowledge Him.

Fellowship with Him.

Obey His promptings.

Become sensitive to His voice.

Refuse everything that grieves Him.

Pray continually in the Holy Spirit.

As you do these things, you are partnering with Him.

You become an explosion waiting to happen.

He wants to empower you.

He wants to dwell within you.

He wants to teach you.

He wants to lead you.

He wants to intercede for you.

Your responsibility is simply to say:

"Holy Ghost, I am ready. Hold my hand. Lead me."

Never forget this truth:

What was planted by the Spirit cannot be sustained by the flesh.

It takes the life of the Spirit to sustain the fire of the Spirit.

A life in the Spirit is a life fully yielded to the Holy Spirit.

It is a life of surrender.

Pray:

"Holy Ghost, You are the Guardian of my life.

You are the Driver.

You are the Director of every affair of my life today."

Submit to Him.

As you pray, you are submitting to Him.

As you study the Word, you are submitting to Him.

As you listen to Him, you are submitting to Him.

As you follow Him, you are submitting to Him.

Then you will begin to see the results in your life.

Declaration and Closing Prayer

Father, we thank You.

We give You all the praise.

Holy Ghost, we thank You.

Now declare this after me:

I do not walk alone.

The Holy Spirit lives in me.

He teaches me.

He leads me.

He empowers me.

He intercedes for me.

I choose to acknowledge Him every day.

I will not grieve Him through carelessness or disobedience.

I will not ignore His promptings.

I will never treat Him as a resource.

He is my Companion.

He is my Counselor.

He is my Comforter.

My fire is Spirit-sustained.

I yield to Him, and I will watch what becomes possible through my partnership with the Holy Spirit.

Let me pray for you.

In the name of Jesus, your fire will never die.

I pray that God will give you the grace to continually yield to the Holy Spirit.

May you surrender to Him daily.

May you partner with Him continually.

May your life burn with supernatural fire.

You will burn for God.

You will blaze for His Kingdom.
