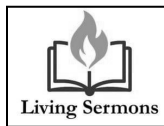

Introduction

Many believers spend their Christian lives trying to become what God has already declared them to be. They strive for acceptance, work tirelessly for approval, and serve as though they must earn God's love.

But the Gospel tells a different story.

In this teaching, Pastor P. Daniel Olawande reveals one of the greatest truths of the Christian faith: our service to God must flow from our identity as sons and daughters, not from the mentality of servants trying to earn a place in the Father's house.

Most believers are trying to become what God has already said they are. The problem is that many believers begin from the position of servants, hoping that one day they will become sons.

But that is not how the Kingdom works.

God is not trying to love you.

He already loved you.

The Christian life is not a journey toward God's approval. It is a journey of living from God's approval.

When a son is managing the family business, it is completely different from when a servant is managing it.

I am not doing ministry because I want God to bless me. I am already blessed in the Lord. After receiving Christ, my responsibility is to do ministry—to preach the Gospel and reach the world for Jesus.

CHAPTER ONE

Live From Who You Already Are

Today, I will be sharing on **Spiritual Identity and Sonship**. This is the understanding that helps you begin to live from who you already are, instead of living for who you are trying to become. I want you to begin living from who you are in Christ—not from who you hope to become someday.

My desire is to help you move away from a performance-driven Christian life into the settled confidence of sons and daughters who know their Father.

They live from security.

Not toward security.

There is a song we sing:

I have a Father, Almighty Father.

He is King of kings and Lord of lords.

I have a Father.

You must know your Father.

Who is your Daddy?

Who is your Father?

You have to know Him.

We cannot talk about fire until you know the Consuming Fire—your Father.

You cannot continue living with the mentality of a servant.

Fire Is Your Family DNA

Fire is your heritage.

Fire is our family DNA.

We were born to burn.

That is our life.

We burn for God.

For us, it is normal to burn.

You must begin to live from that revelation.

The problem is that many believers are trying to become what God has already declared them to be.

They are striving for acceptance that has already been given to them.

They are reaching for love that they already possess.

You are loved.

You are God's beloved.

You are accepted in the Beloved.

God has poured His love into your heart through the Holy Ghost.

Yet many believers still spend their lives searching for a love they already have.

They fight for a position in which they are already seated.

The Bible says we are seated together with Christ in heavenly places.

Why fight for a seat that has already been given to you?

The Christian life is not a journey toward God's approval.

It is a journey of living from God's approval.

You operate from God's approval.

When You Fall, Return Home

If you make a mistake, repent and return home. Do not run away. If you fall, acknowledge it.

Repent.

Ask your Father for forgiveness. Then come back home. Do not run away from the Father's house. The house is your house. Your Father is still your Father.

You need this consciousness if you are going to understand the purpose of the fire of God in your life.

The Greatest Identity Crisis

One of the greatest battles believers face today is identity crisis. Hear me carefully. Our greatest problem is not the devil. Our greatest problem is how we see ourselves. A person who does not know who they are will spend their entire life trying to prove who they are not. They will constantly seek to prove themselves before God and before people.

As a result, we now have:

- Performance-driven Christianity.
- Approval-seeking behaviour.
- Spiritual exhaustion.
- An inability to rest in God's presence.

Such believers become vulnerable to every voice that speaks over them because they do not know what God has already said about them. They do not know who they are in Christ.

CHAPTER TWO

Identity Before Assignment

Look at what the Father declared over Jesus.

"And lo a voice from heaven, saying, This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." — Matthew 3:17 (KJV)

Think about the timing of those words. This happened before Jesus performed a single miracle. Before He healed anyone. Before He preached a sermon. Before He went to the Cross.

The Father declared His identity before His assignment. He was beloved before He became useful. He was a Son before He served. This is where many believers miss it. They begin as servants, hoping to become sons.

But Jesus was first the Son of God. Then He served as the Servant of God. That is how we must serve. We should serve the Lord, minister before Him, and labour in His Kingdom from the revelation of sonship.

Not because we are trying to earn His acceptance. Jesus was loved before He was tested. He was loved before He was proven. His testing did not make Him a Son. He was already the Son. That is the order of the Kingdom.

Sonship Versus Servanthood

Let us clearly distinguish between sonship and servanthood. Both exist in the Kingdom. But they operate from different foundations. **Servants work for acceptance.** Sons work from acceptance. **Servants build their identity on performance.** Sons build their identity on relationship. A son knows where to return.

He says,

"I will go back to my Father."

Servants fear failure.

Sons may fail, but they return home. Like the prodigal son, they say, *"I have made mistakes, but I am returning to my Father."*

Servants need validation.

Sons carry validation within themselves. They know what God has said concerning them. Do not merely sing,

"I know who God says I am."

Live it.

Servants are motivated by duty.

Sons are motivated by love. "I am loved by the Father." "I am His beloved."

That becomes the motivation for everything they do. **Servants ask,** *"Have I done enough?"*

Sons know, *"I am enough in Christ."*

Sonship Produces Greater Service

Do not misunderstand sonship. Sonship is not permission to become lazy. In fact, true sonship makes you serve even more. Now that you know who you are, you say, "Lord, I will serve You." "I will minister to You." "I will wait upon You."

Because this is my Father's business. Think about the difference between asking a servant to manage a company and asking a son. The servant works for a salary. The son works because the business belongs to his father.

The servant thinks, "They will pay me at the end of the month."

The son thinks, "This is my inheritance."

"It must not collapse."

When a true son manages the company, it is completely different from when a servant manages it.

The servant protects his income.

The son protects his inheritance.

That is how ministry should be.

You say,

"This is my Father's work."

"I must reach the people."

"I must preach the Gospel."

Not because it is a duty. But because your Father gave everything to save the world.

Jesus died on the Cross for humanity. His sacrifice must not be in vain. That is why the Apostle Paul declared:

**"...woe is unto me, if I preach not the gospel!" — 1 Corinthians 9:16
(KJV)**

That was the cry of a son.

"This work must not fail."

You reach the point where the words of Jesus become your burden:

**"The harvest truly is plenteous, but the labourers are few..." —
Matthew 9:37 (KJV)**

Your prayer becomes, "Lord, raise more sons."

"Raise more sons who will spread the Gospel."

"Raise more sons who will reach the nations."

You are no longer serving merely out of duty.

You are serving out of responsibility.

You have moved from duty to responsibility.

The Elder Brother's Mistake

The prodigal son's elder brother had the position of a son but the heart of a servant. He served faithfully. Yet he never truly enjoyed his Father's house. The Bible records his complaint in **Luke 15:29–31 (KJV)**.

He wondered why his father had never thrown a celebration for him. But the father answered with a profound truth:

"...Son, thou art ever with me, and all that I have is thine." — Luke 15:31 (KJV)

Everything already belonged to him. The Father did not need to organize a celebration to prove that he was a son. He was already one. That is the point every believer must arrive at.

Living From Sonship, Not Performance

I am not doing ministry because I want God to bless me. I am already blessed in the Lord. My responsibility after receiving Christ is to do ministry—to reach the world for Jesus.

A servant may preach for what he hopes to receive. But a son says, *"The One who died for me—I cannot keep quiet."*

The world must know. The world must burn with the knowledge of Jesus Christ. I cannot remain silent. Hear me carefully. The enemy's greatest attack is against your identity. The first words Satan spoke to Jesus were:

"And when the tempter came to him, he said, If thou be the Son of God, command that these stones be made bread." — Matthew 4:3 (KJV)

Notice what Satan attacked. He did not question Jesus' power. He questioned His identity. *"If You are the Son of God..."*

The enemy knows that if he can destabilize who you are, he can control what you do. Every temptation is ultimately an attack on your identity. In **Matthew 3:17**, the Father declared,

"This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."

Immediately afterward, in **Matthew 4:3**, Satan questioned what God had already spoken. That is exactly how the enemy operates.

He will always fight your identity. He whispers questions like:

"If God really loved you, would this be happening to you?"

"If God were truly with you, wouldn't your life look different by now?"

"You are too broken."

"You are too ordinary."

"God doesn't really love you."

The devil is always trying to make you believe that God loves someone else more than He loves you. These thoughts are not random. They are carefully targeted missiles aimed at the foundation of your sonship.

The devil is strategic. He keeps asking questions designed to make you doubt who you are.

"Are you really loved?"

"If you truly belonged to God, would your life look like this?"

Never forget this. His goal is to destroy your confidence as a son or daughter of God.

CHAPTER THREE

What Sonship Really Means

What does sonship actually mean?

1. You Have Full Access

As God's child, you have full access to the Father. The Bible says:

"Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need." — Hebrews 4:16 (KJV)

Notice the word **boldly**.

Not cautiously.

Not conditionally.

Boldly.

Why?

Because you know who you are.

You do not approach God's presence as a stranger.

You come as a son.

Let me explain.

There was a meeting in church one day.

The auditorium was full.

I was standing there as the pastor, ministering to the people.

Then my daughter walked up to me.

She lifted her leg and said,

"Daddy, my leg is hurting."

She was completely unconcerned about the crowd.

She did not observe protocol.

No church member would do that.

But she did.

Why?

Because she is my daughter.

I carried her.

I rubbed her leg.

Later, while I was eating, she rested her head on my chest and played with me.

The atmosphere was serious.

Prayer was going on.

Yet she was completely comfortable.

Why?

Because she was not relating to me merely as the pastor.

She was relating to me as her father.

Other people know me as their pastor.

She knows me as Daddy.

That is confidence.

That is sonship.

2. You Carry the Family Name

The Bible says:

**"For this cause I bow my knees unto the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, of whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named."
— Ephesians 3:14–15 (KJV)**

Another translation says that every family derives its name from Him.

You carry the family name.

You did not earn it.

You were born into it.

More accurately, you were born again into it.

The day you gave your life to Christ, you received the family name.

You are a child of God.

3. You Are an Heir

The Bible says:

"And if children, then heirs; heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ..." — Romans 8:17 (KJV)

You are not merely a recipient.

You are an heir.

A joint-heir with Christ.

Heirs do not beg for what already belongs to them.

They walk confidently in their inheritance.

You belong to this family.

You have an inheritance in this Kingdom.

You are not a stranger.

4. You Are Unconditionally Loved

The Scriptures declare:

"...nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord." — Romans 8:38–39 (KJV)

Nothing can separate you from God's love.

Not failure.

Not a dry season.

Nothing.

When you genuinely repent of sin, that sin no longer has the power to separate you from the Father.

The only sin that separates is unconfessed sin.

When you repent, you receive forgiveness.

You are loved.

Never forget that.

Live From Your Identity

My counsel to you today is simple:

Live from your identity.

Do not live trying to earn it.

I pray because I am loved and because I desire more of Him.

I am not praying so that God will begin to love me.

I serve God because I am already pleasing to Him through Christ.

I am not serving so that I can earn His acceptance. I simply want more of Him. I want to live this life to its fullest. I fast because, as His child, I am already positioned for breakthrough. I fast because there are things my Father has instructed me to do.

I obey Him as a son.

Stop Striving

Never forget this.

Stop striving.

Start resting in God.

Move from earning to receiving.

Learn to receive what Christ has already made available.

The Bible says we have been blessed with every spiritual blessing.

Receive it.

Move from proving yourself to knowing who you are.

Know your identity in Christ.

You do not earn your place in the Father's heart.

You are already there.

Stop performing for an audience.

Stop trying to impress everyone.

Heaven has already welcomed you.

The Bible speaks of a great cloud of witnesses.

Live from love.

Lead from love.

Everything flows from knowing who you are—and whose you are.

Sons Extend the Father's Kingdom

Your fire will continue to burn when you realize that burning is your family identity.

Your fire will touch the ends of the earth when you understand that your Father wants His Kingdom to spread throughout the nations.

You are serving as an ambassador.

You are serving as a son.

You are extending the frontiers of your Father's Kingdom.

I am not trying to please God by reaching the world.

I am reaching the world because that is what sons do.

Now, every son who pleases the Father experiences His pleasure and His blessings.

Even in a natural family, when a son does something that delights his father, the father says,

"My son, I am proud of you."

There are blessings attached to pleasing the Father.

But our motivation is different.

We do not serve in order to become sons.

We serve because we are sons.

It is the responsibility of sons to extend the frontiers of their Father's Kingdom.

That is why I teach LIT every week.

My desire is to help you burn for God.

This teaching does not earn me acceptance before God.

The Father is pleased with obedience, but I am not teaching to gain His approval.

I am teaching because every child of God should know how to burn.

If you belong to the LIT Tribe or the LIT House, my assignment is to help make your journey with the Father smoother.

As a son, I cannot watch you struggle when I can help you.

I cannot remain silent when I can share my journey.

That is why I share these LIT teachings.

So that you can stay lit.

Lead lit.

Build lit.

This is what sons do.

Defensive Role of Sons

Sons defend their Father's house. Sons extend the frontiers of their Father's Kingdom. Sons protect the integrity of their Father's house. That is what sons do.

Sons pray because they understand that prayer is partnership with the Father. God desires to do many things on the earth, yet He looks for willing vessels through whom He can work. The Scripture says:

"And I sought for a man among them..." — Ezekiel 22:30 (KJV)

That is why sons pray.

They say,

"Father, partner with me."

"Let Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

"Use me."

Sons Desire to Know the Father

Sons study because they want to know their Father more. Imagine a family with three children. The child who spends the most time with the father will naturally know him the best. The child who never talks with the father and is never around him will never become truly close to him. Closeness produces knowledge. The child who stays near the father understands the father's heart.

Yes, you are a son of God. But are you close to Him?

You are a child of God. The question is:

Are you living close to your Father?

Closeness Determines Trust

I know you are a son of God.

But are you close to Him?

It is not that God loves some of His children more than others.

His love is the same for all.

"For God so loved the world..." — John 3:16 (KJV)

He loves everyone.

However, a son who continually stays close to the Father is entrusted with greater responsibility.

Think about it even in a natural family.

Among siblings, there is usually one child who spends more time with the parents, talks with them more, and understands them better.

That child is often entrusted with greater responsibilities.

The parents send that child on important assignments because trust has been built through relationship.

It is the same with God.

God loves you.

God loves me.

But you may not receive the same assignment I receive if you are not walking closely with the Father.

Many believers are too busy with life.

Too busy with work.

Too busy with distractions. Yet only those who remain in the secret place receive the secret things. The hidden things of God are entrusted to those who dwell in His presence. We are all sons and daughters of God. There are no grandchildren in God's family. But those who cultivate intimacy with Him become trusted with greater responsibilities.

The way to become trusted by God is simple:

Spend time with Him.

Spend time in His Word.

Do His will.

Obey His instructions.

Walk in obedience.

Stand upon His Word.

Love Him sincerely. Remain committed to His purpose. Carry out every instruction He gives you. Then the Father says, *"This is My son."*

"This is My daughter."

Remember this carefully.

God is not declaring His love for you after you obey Him.

He loved you before you ever began.

He already loved you.

Loved Before the Assignment

Think again about Jesus.

Before Jesus had done anything publicly, the Father declared,

"This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." — Matthew 3:17 (KJV)

But after Jesus had completed His earthly assignment, Scripture says:

****"Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name:**

That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow... And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." —**

Philippians 2:9–11 (KJV)

Notice the order.

The declaration of love came first.

The exaltation came later.

Jesus was loved before He served.

He was exalted after His obedience.

Your love is not negotiable.

You are already loved.

God is not trying to love you.

He already loves you.

The real question is this:

Will He be able to entrust you with greater responsibility?

That depends on you.

How far you go with God is your decision.

How close you become to Him is your decision.

How deep your walk with Him becomes is your decision.

How much of God you carry is your decision.

The love is the same.

But the measure of responsibility entrusted to each believer is different.

Love and Delight

Let me close with this thought.

In life, people often say that love is stronger than liking.

But in the Kingdom, there is another dimension.

There is the realm of God's delight.

God loves every one of us.

There is no question about that.

But there is a place where God delights in a person's life.

That is a deeper realm.

A realm of delight.

A place where your life brings joy to the Father's heart because you consistently walk with Him in obedience and intimacy.

You can confidently say,

"God delights in me."

"God is pleased with me."

There is something beautiful about living a life that brings delight to the Father.

He already loves every one of His children.

But delight grows out of intimacy, obedience, and faithful fellowship with Him.

A Prayer for Greater Intimacy

I pray for you today.

May the Lord delight in you.

He already loves you.

But may your life become one that continually brings Him pleasure.

May your commitment to Him deepen.

May your obedience increase.

May your intimacy with Him grow.

He has already poured His love into your heart through the Holy Spirit.

You are not trying to earn His love.

That has already been settled.

But if you desire to walk in greater intimacy—to become a friend of God—that depends on your decision.

Choose to stay with Him.

Choose to spend time in His presence.

Choose to obey His voice.

Choose to become everything He has called you to be.

Final Prayer

I pray for you in the name of Jesus.

May God give you the grace to live from your identity.

May He give you the grace to walk in the reality of your sonship.

You are already loved.

You are already accepted.

Now step into the responsibility that comes with that love.

Love always brings responsibility.

To whom much is given, much is required.

May God grant you the grace to be faithful with all that He has entrusted to you.

In the name of Jesus.

Amen.
