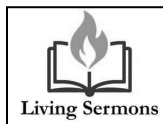

CHAPTER ONE

There Is a Frequency You Are Meant to Walk In

There is a spiritual frequency you are supposed to walk in.

Many believers are living beneath God's expectation for their lives. Perhaps God's intention is for you to operate at the level of one hundred, but you are presently functioning at fifty.

Today, I want to show you how to operate in the full capacity of the God-ordained authority He has already given to you.

There is something God has placed inside you, and you are meant to walk in the fullness of that dimension.

Understand this:

Spiritual authority is not earned.

It is not based on titles.

It is not based on seniority.

It is not determined by the office you occupy.

You may bear the biggest title in ministry and still discover that an ordinary brother, with no title at all, walks in greater spiritual authority.

Why?

Because spiritual authority is:

- Inherited through identity.
- Activated through faith.
- Exercised through obedience.

Let me repeat that.

Spiritual authority is inherited through identity, activated through faith, and exercised through obedience.

Why Many Believers Live Below Their Authority

Most believers are living below the authority God has already given them. Not because God withheld it from them. But because no one taught them that they already possess it.

You are not begging God for power from a distant heaven. You are not pleading with a distant God to empower you.

You are a son.

You are a daughter.

The authority of heaven backs you. The Bible says:

"Now unto him that is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that worketh in us."

— *Ephesians 3:20 (KJV)*

If you are a child of God, there is already a measure of God's power at work within you.

As you yield yourself to God, submit to Him, and faithfully use what He has already entrusted to you, you begin to experience greater dimensions. Then, as you continue to submit to the Holy Spirit, higher measures are poured upon you.

There is a greater release.

However, many people are crying for greater measures when they have not yet used the measure already deposited inside them.

There is a divine measure within you.

You must be faithful with what you have before more is entrusted to you. To the one who faithfully uses what has been given, more will be added. Do not cry for more when you have not yet done anything with what you already carry.

You are not qualified for more until you have done something with the measure God has already placed in your hands.

CHAPTER TWO

The Foundation of Spiritual Authority

You must first understand that **authority is delegated**. When you study the subject of power in Scripture, two Greek words are often discussed:

- **Dunamis** — the dynamic, miraculous power that carries the ability to produce results.
- **Exousia** — delegated authority.

All authority originates with God. God is the One who says, "Take this authority and represent Me."

You are not operating with your own authority.

It is given.

It is delegated.

Jesus declared:

"All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth."

— *Matthew 28:18 (KJV)*

Authority is given. Jesus did not claim independent authority. He acknowledged that all authority had been given to Him by the Father. Then immediately, He delegated that authority to us.

The Scripture continues:

"Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost:

Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen."

— *Matthew 28:19–20 (KJV)*

Jesus also declared:

"Behold, I give unto you power to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy: and nothing shall by any means hurt you."

— *Luke 10:19 (KJV)*

All authority comes from God.

God delegated it to Jesus.

Jesus delegated it to us.

This is not merely symbolic.

It is a legal delegation. You carry authority not because of who you are, but because of **Whose** you are.

You belong to Jesus.

You are a child of God.

Authority has already been delegated to you.

Two Kinds of Authority Every Believer Must Understand

1. Positional Authority

Your first authority comes from your position in Christ.

The Bible says:

"And hath raised us up together, and made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus."

— *Ephesians 2:6 (KJV)*

As a child of God, you are seated with Christ in heavenly places, far above principalities and powers.

You are not standing on the ground looking up at the enemy.

You are seated above.

You are looking down.

You must understand this positional authority.

Your authority does not fluctuate with your feelings.

It is fixed in your identity.

It is not determined by whether you feel strong or weak today.

Your feelings do not change your position in Christ.

If you are a child of God, a difficult day does not reduce your authority.

A good day does not increase it.

Your authority remains stable because it is rooted in Christ.

The day you were born again, you were seated with Christ in heavenly places.

Say it:

"I am seated with Christ in heavenly places."

Far above principalities.

Far above powers.

You are not looking up to them. You are looking down on them. Let this sink into your spirit. Sickness is beneath you. Principalities are beneath you.

Powers are beneath you. The forces of darkness are beneath you.

Why?

Because you are seated with Christ in heavenly places.

2. Practical Authority

Practical authority is the authority you exercise through active faith and obedience.

The Bible says:

"Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you."

— *James 4:7 (KJV)*

Notice the order.

First, submit to God.

Then resist the devil.

Authority flows from alignment. I remember something my father in the Lord shared during one of our Holy Ghost meetings. He said, *"You cannot cast out demons if you are not submitted to authority."*

The centurion understood this principle.

He said:

"For I am a man under authority..."

— *Matthew 8:9 (KJV)*

Submission comes first. Do not attempt to resist the devil while refusing to submit to God. The devil will ask, "Who are you submitted to?"

The Scripture records:

"...Jesus I know, and Paul I know; but who are ye?"

— *Acts 19:15 (KJV)*

Submission to God comes before resisting the devil. Resisting is never first. Submission is first. You cannot exercise authority over what you have not first submitted to God.

Why Many Believers Do Not Walk in Authority

1. Identity Confusion

Many believers still see themselves merely as sinners saved by grace instead of sons and daughters carrying delegated authority.

Yes, you have repented. Yes, you have given your life to Christ. Yet some people continue to feel unworthy. They say, *"I cannot cast out demons."*

There is a sense in which humility is good.

But when it comes to spiritual authority, you must understand your identity.

You are a son of God.

You are saved.

You have been washed by the blood of Jesus.

At that moment, delegated authority was given to you.

Jesus said:

"Behold, I give unto you power to tread on serpents and scorpions..."

— *Luke 10:19 (KJV)*

Some believers become afraid. They think, *"If I confront the devil, he may become angry and attack me."*

That is identity confusion.

The Bible declares:

"There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit."

— *Romans 8:1 (KJV)*

Now that you are saved, you are no longer who you used to be. Your past is gone.

God is not keeping a record of your former life. Because of your identity in Christ, you can command the devil. Remember this: **How you see yourself determines how you stand.**

If you do not see yourself in the light of who you are in Christ, you will not have the confidence to confront the things troubling you.

2. Fear of Presumption

Many believers are afraid to exercise spiritual authority because they think doing so is arrogance. But listen carefully. The Holy Spirit wants you to understand this.

God gave you the authority. You are not arrogant for using what He has given you. Imagine I transfer money into your account and tell you to spend it. Would you be arrogant for spending the money I gave you?

Of course not.

You are simply using what has been entrusted to you. In the same way, God has given you authority.

Use it.

Using what God has given you is not arrogance.

It is obedience.

Did you hear me?

It is obedience.

3. Unresolved Sin and Compromise

Another reason many believers do not exercise spiritual authority is unresolved sin and compromise.

You dare not confront the devil while deliberately living in sin. He will slap you.

Authority flows through clean vessels.

Hidden sin creates cracks in your spiritual standing.

For you to confront the devil effectively, you must maintain a right standing with God.

The devil knows those who truly belong to God.

The Scripture says:

"...Jesus I know, and Paul I know; but who are ye?"

— **Acts 19:15 (KJV)**

If you are going to exercise spiritual authority, your life must remain submitted to God.

4. Lack of Practice

Authority grows through use. Every time you exercise your authority in faith, it becomes more natural. Every time you step out in faith, your confidence increases.

However, every time you withdraw out of fear, spiritual authority begins to feel distant. Perhaps God is prompting you to cast out a demon, but fear holds you back. Soon, exercising authority begins to seem impossible because you have never used it.

But when you step out today, tomorrow becomes easier. When you pray for the sick today, praying for the sick tomorrow becomes easier. The more you cast out demons, the more confidence and boldness you develop.

The more you shrink back, the farther spiritual authority appears to be.

Authority grows through use.

CHAPTER THREE

What Spiritual Authority Looks Like in Practice

Spiritual authority is not always loud.

It is not always dramatic.

Sometimes it is.

Sometimes it isn't.

The important thing is not the volume of your voice but the confidence of your faith.

1. Speaking God's Word with Conviction

Spiritual authority looks like speaking God's Word with conviction over every situation.

Perhaps you are sick.

The symptoms are real.

Yet you declare,

"By whose stripes ye were healed."

— 1 Peter 2:24 (KJV)

You say,

"Sickness, leave my body in the name of Jesus!"

Perhaps your body is still shaking.

You still speak.

Why?

Because we do not speak from our feelings.

We speak from who we are in Christ.

We speak from the revelation of God's Word.

We do not speak based on what we feel.

That is spiritual authority.

2. Refusing to Agree with Fear, Doubt, and Hopelessness

Spiritual authority refuses to agree with fear.

It refuses to embrace doubt.

It refuses to accept hopelessness.

Everyone around you may be panicking, yet you refuse to panic.

I remember flying from Atlanta to Lagos.

Something happened, and the aircraft had to return to Atlanta.

Everyone was afraid.

Everyone was panicking.

I was sleeping.

When I woke up, they explained what had happened.

I simply said, "Thank God," and began listening to messages.

People were asking,

"What if we don't land safely?"

Yes, fear may try to present itself.

But you refuse to agree with it.

I know what God has spoken concerning me.

He said,

"Fear thou not..."

— *Isaiah 41:10 (KJV)*

I know what He has said about my life.

My journey is safe.

He never told me I would die on the way. Although the facts may suggest fear, we do not walk by facts. We walk by faith. Facts are not the final authority.

God's Word is.

3. Commanding Peace into Anxious Situations

Spiritual authority commands peace into troubled environments. Just as Jesus stood before the storm and declared,

"Peace, be still."

— *Mark 4:39 (KJV)*

Everyone else may be panicking.

But because you know your authority in Christ, you release peace.

You say,

"Peace, be still."

"Jesus is here."

I once heard Bishop share a humorous story.

He was driving with his wife when the vehicle suddenly developed a problem.

His wife began shouting,

"Jesus! Jesus!"

He replied,

"Be quiet! One Jesus is enough!"

Then he spoke with authority, and the situation changed.

That is understanding your authority in Christ.

4. Interceding with the Confidence of a Son

Spiritual authority prays with confidence.

It does not beg like a stranger.

It approaches God as a son.

The Scripture says:

"And this is the confidence that we have in him, that, if we ask any thing according to his will, he heareth us."

— **1 John 5:14 (KJV)**

When you pray, you pray knowing your Father hears you.

You are not behaving like a servant trying to convince God.

You are praying as His child.

That is not arrogance.

That is revelation.

Consider these two approaches.

One person says,

"Oh Lord, please heal me."

Another says,

"Devil, take your hands off my body. Sickness, leave my body. I am healed in the name of Jesus."

Both are praying.

But they are praying from two different levels of understanding.

Someone else says,

"Lord, please take this sickness away. I'm tired."

Meanwhile, God is saying,

"I already dealt with it. Now I am waiting for you to command it to leave."

So you declare,

"My body is the temple of the Holy Ghost. There is no room for sickness here."

"Spirit of infirmity, out now in the name of Jesus!"

Perhaps your body is still shaking.

Keep declaring it.

Your body must eventually agree with your confession.

Do not check your symptoms to determine the volume of your voice.

Speak from where you are seated.

Do not speak from how you are feeling.

You are seated in Christ.

That is the position from which spiritual authority speaks.

5. Declaring What God Says Is True

Spiritual authority declares God's Word even when circumstances disagree.

The Scripture says,

"With long life will I satisfy him, and shew him my salvation."

— **Psalm 91:16 (KJV)**

Circumstances may suggest an early death.

The world may tell you otherwise.

Declare what God has said.

Stand on His Word.

Perhaps circumstances remind you that you are getting older and still unmarried.

Yet God's Word declares that none shall be barren or unfruitful among His people (see **Exodus 23:26**).

You declare God's promise instead of your situation.

Perhaps the economy is difficult.

People are saying things are getting worse.

The Scripture says,

"The young lions do lack, and suffer hunger: but they that seek the LORD shall not want any good thing."

— **Psalm 34:10 (KJV)**

Others may say,

"Nigeria is difficult."

But you declare,

"As for me and my household, we shall live in abundance because the Lord is our provider."

That is spiritual authority.

You declare what God says is true.

You do not allow circumstances to become your confession.

6. Rebuking What Does Not Belong

Spiritual authority rebukes everything that has no place in your life.

You rebuke sickness.

You rebuke confusion.

You rebuke division.

You command them to leave in the name of Jesus.

That is spiritual authority.

Anything that does not belong in your life according to God's Word should be confronted with the authority Christ has given you.

You do not tolerate what heaven has already defeated.

Something is not right?

Rebuke it.

Do not accept it.

Do not manage it.

Do not pamper it.

Anything you pamper grows.

Anything you rebuke weakens.

The Bible says:

"Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you."

— James 4:7 (KJV)

Resist the devil.

He shall flee.

Do not allow the devil to gain a foothold in your life.

Declare:

"Sickness has no place here."

"Cancer has no place here."

"Confusion has no place here."

Even when you find yourself in the middle of confusion and do not know what to do, declare:

"I cannot be confused. I know what to do."

Your confession in the middle of confusion determines the conclusion of that situation.

When your account balance is dropping, do not begin to declare poverty.

Instead say,

"I cannot be broke."

"I cannot be stranded."

Never declare what you do not want to experience.

If you do not want sickness, do not keep confessing sickness.

If you do not want failure, do not keep speaking failure.

Declare only what God's Word says.

Jesus said:

"For verily I say unto you, That whosoever shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he saith."

— Mark 11:23 (KJV)

Speak to your mountains.

Do not spend your time explaining your mountains.

Speak to them.

Do not allow your mountains to speak to you.

You speak to the mountain.

You do not beg the mountain.

You speak with authority.

Hallelujah!

The Connection Between Authority and Character

As I begin to close, let me emphasize something very important. There is a direct connection between authority and character. Authority without character is dangerous.

The account of the seven sons of Sceva reminds us of this. They attempted to use the name of Jesus without having a relationship with Jesus.

The result was humiliation.

(See **Acts 19:13–16.**)

Authority is not a formula. Authority is a lifestyle.

The Character of a Person Who Walks in Authority

1. Submission to God in Private

The person who consistently walks in authority is first submitted to God in private. You cannot go out making bold declarations when your private life is empty.

If you have no prayer life...

If you have no study life...

The devil will expose you.

A man or woman who walks in authority is first submitted to God in the place of prayer.

2. Clean Character

A person who exercises authority must live a clean life.

You cannot be living in immorality while confronting demons.

They will expose you.

Men may not know.

Demons know.

They know whether you carry spiritual rank.

Authority flows through clean character.

3. Obedience to the Promptings of the Holy Spirit

You cannot continually disobey the Holy Spirit and expect Him to defend or empower you.

The believer who walks in authority obeys the promptings of the Spirit.

Obedience positions you to exercise delegated authority.

4. Being Rooted in the Word

It is the Word of God that you use to rebuke the devil.

You do not rebuke the devil with eloquent speech.

You rebuke him with Scripture.

It is not merely what you say.

It is what God has already said that you declare.

5. Walking in Genuine Faith

A person who walks in authority is a person who walks in faith.

No faith produces fear.

Faith gives authority expression.

Hear me carefully.

Character is the container for authority.

As your character grows, your capacity to carry authority grows with it.

Remember these characteristics:

- Submit to God in private.
- Maintain a clean character.
- Obey the promptings of the Holy Spirit.
- Remain rooted in God's Word.
- Walk in genuine faith.

You Are Not a Beggar

Let me say this to you.

You are not a beggar standing at the gate of heaven.

You are a son.

You are a daughter.

You are seated with Christ in heavenly places.

Declare after me:

"I am not a beggar at the gate of heaven.

I am a son.

I am a daughter seated in heavenly places, backed by the Name above every other name."

Say it again:

"I am a son seated in heavenly places, backed by the Name above every other name."

From today, begin to live in this reality.

Speak from this reality.

Stand in this reality.

The authority belongs to you.

You are not a beggar.

You are a son.

You are seated in heavenly places.

You carry delegated authority.

God gave it to Jesus.

Jesus gave it to you.

Therefore, resist the enemy boldly.

Speak to the mountains.

Do not negotiate with them.

Authority flows from your identity, not from your feelings.

You may feel weak.

Yet you stand strong because your authority comes from your identity in Christ.

Perhaps your body feels sick.

Still, your authority says,

"I can speak to this mountain."

Your feelings do not control your authority.

Your authority controls your feelings.

Your authority remains active until your feelings align with the truth of God's Word.

Walk in this reality.

Remember this:

Jesus backs every word that is spoken in faith.

The Name of Jesus backs every word spoken in faith.

Declare:

"I walk in authority."

"I walk in authority today."

"I walk in authority every day, in the name of Jesus."

Authority Begins with Submission

I want to encourage you. This is what spiritual authority looks like. It is not about making a bold face. It is not about sounding intimidating. Authority is standing upon God's Word and declaring what He has said.

But never forget this:

The person who will walk in authority must first be submitted to God. Authority begins with submission. Submission to God. Submission to those God has placed ahead of you.

When you submit to God and to godly authority, your words begin to carry weight in the realm of the Spirit.

The Scripture says:

"And having in a readiness to revenge all disobedience, when your obedience is fulfilled."

— 2 Corinthians 10:6 (KJV)

You are not qualified to confront disobedience until your own obedience is complete.

When you obey the Lord, then you can resist the devil, and the devil will flee from you.

Closing Prayer

I pray for you in the name of Jesus. As you walk in the light of this teaching, everything standing against you shall bow. Every opposition shall give way.

As you exercise your spiritual authority, may every mountain before you be removed, in Jesus' name. Always remember:

Your authority is not rooted in your feelings. It is rooted in where you are seated.

It is rooted in your identity in Christ.

It is activated through faith and exercised through obedience.

Let us pray.

Father, we thank You today. We give You all the glory. Be exalted forever in Jesus' name.

Lord, I pray that as we continue to walk in obedience to You, we will exercise the authority You have given us. We appropriate spiritual authority by faith. From today, let the devil flee. Let sickness be removed. Let every mountain disappear. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.
