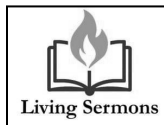

Introduction

For we have no business with the burning of incense. We have no business calling upon Your name. But, O Lord, Your mercy has found us in the places where we were—in the world, alienated from the commonwealth of Israel.

O my God, You saved us. Because of us, You created a pause in time just to bring us into Your will, that we should not perish.

In the name of Jesus.

Can somebody give glory to God? Can you praise the name of the Lord? He has made time for you, in the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth.

The Scripture says:

"Christ in you, the hope of glory." (*Colossians 1:27, KJV*)

But when you were born, you never had Christ in you. You never even had a plan of having Christ in you. It took Him coming to die for you.

Just imagine it.

There are many religions in this world, yet He chose you to know Him personally—to have a relationship with Him and to be engrafted into His purpose. It is not automatic. It is not something programmed into mankind. It takes the will and the mercies of God for a man to truly know Him. David asked:

"Who am I, O Lord God? and what is my house, that thou hast brought me hitherto?" (2 Samuel 7:18, KJV)

Who are we?

What is our father's house?

We were strangers. We had no hope.

Our only hope was to become candidates for hell. Yet God, in His infinite mercy, chose us. He called us out of darkness and brought us into His marvellous light.

Even that would have been enough. But He went further. He made us to become light in every territory where our feet shall tread.

The Price of Redemption

He clothed Himself with flesh.

He accepted the limitation called humanity simply to bear your shame, your temptations, and your guilt.

He who is righteous—He who knew no sin—Was made to become sin on our behalf, so that through His death we might be saved and called the righteousness of God.

It is because of His death that we are not consumed. It is because of His death that we can boldly approach His throne without the fear of being destroyed. It is because of His death that He now calls us sons and daughters.

Every night you go to bed. You set an alarm expecting to wake up the next morning. But what is the guarantee that you will wake up?

What is the guarantee?

It is the mercy of God. It is the compassion of God that is renewed every morning. That is why the psalmist declares:

"O give thanks unto the Lord; for he is good: for his mercy endureth for ever." (Psalm 136:1, KJV)

Again, the Scripture says:

"Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise." (Psalm 100:4, KJV)

The Testimony of the Blood

The Book of Revelation declares:

"And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb, and by the word of their testimony." (Revelation 12:11, KJV)

What is that testimony?

They recognised the workings of the blood. They confessed the power of the blood. They confessed the faithfulness of the blood. Testimony is not merely standing before people to narrate experiences. You must go deep within yourself and recognise the goodness of the Lord—the things He has done for you, His faithfulness throughout your life.

Then use those memories to build faith in Him. Know that the God who has done it before will surely do it again. Go deep down within yourself. Appreciate the goodness of God in your life.

The Scripture says:

"In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you." (1 Thessalonians 5:18, KJV)

Not in some things—In everything. Give glory to God. For thanksgiving is His will for you. Jesus Himself declared:

"The Father seeketh such to worship him." (John 4:23, KJV)

Yet many times, when we come into our secret place, we approach God only with our needs. We become so consumed with what we are asking for that we forget everything He has already done. Go deep within yourself. Recognise His goodness. Thanksgiving is the will of God for your life.

Eternal Life by Grace

There is nothing you did that earned eternal life. Nothing you did purchased your redemption. The price was far beyond anything man could ever pay.

The Scripture teaches that while we were yet sinners—before we even realised we needed salvation—Christ came and died for us. As a congregation, as The Burning Ones, we have come to realise that God has truly been good to us.

Look at the journeys.

Look at the paths He has brought us through. Look at where we have come from. Think about the tribulations. Think about the battles of attrition we have fought. Yet by the grace of God, we are still standing.

- It is not by the strength of man.
- It is not by the wisdom of man.
- It is not by any ability that belongs to man.

It is entirely by the grace, mercy, and goodness of God that we still stand together today. The devil has fought us. He is still fighting us. But we know there is a God.

We have seen His goodness in the past. We are experiencing His goodness today. And we know He will remain with us in the future.

In the name of Jesus.

Praying for the Land

If we continue thanking the Lord, we may take too much of our leader's time. So let us pray for the land. Before we do, let us read Ephesians 2:12–13.

There was a time when we were separated from Christ. We were not engrafted into the plans of God. Our leader said yesterday that it took the mercy of God to create an anomaly in time so that you and I could enter into His divine will.

We were hidden.

Even when the prophets spoke, they did not fully see us. From the beginning, we were hidden in Christ.

We were not originally part of the covenant people. The coming of the Messiah would have meant nothing to us. His death and resurrection would have had no effect upon our lives.

Our condition was terrible. We had no hope. The Scripture says that Christ is the hope of glory. Before salvation, it was not Christ dwelling within us. We were simply candidates for eternal destruction. But because of the blood of Jesus Christ and the mercies of God, we have now been engrafted into His divine purpose.

The will of God has now embraced us.

Bearing the Compassion of Christ

The people of this land may not yet realise that they need salvation. There was a time when you and I were exactly the same. So let us carry the same compassion Christ had for us. Consider His sacrifice. Imagine the glory He left behind. Our leader used Donald Trump as an illustration.

Donald Trump is merely a man, yet consider the influence and authority he possesses. Would he leave the White House to die for you?

Certainly not. Yet God—the One who created every ruler and every king—left His throne. He laid aside His glory. He clothed Himself with flesh. Flesh became a limitation upon His divine omnipotence. While He walked the earth, He willingly accepted human limitations.

He emptied Himself for our sake. Even before Calvary, His incarnation was already a sacrifice. He surrendered everything for you and for me.

Therefore, let us bear the same compassion He bore toward us.

He called us out of darkness. He brought us into His light. More than that—He made us the light. So let us pray for this land.

May those who do not yet know they need salvation encounter the mercy of God. May they be brought into the commonwealth of Israel.

May they become partakers of eternal life.

Prayer:

O Lord, we have come to the realisation of all You have done for us. We have also realised that this land needs salvation. These people need salvation. As You showed mercy to us, calling us out of darkness into Your marvellous light, show mercy to them also. Bring them into Your covenant. Bring them into the commonwealth of Israel. Let them become partakers of eternal life. In Jesus' name. Amen.

Worship

(The congregation entered into an extended season of worship, prayer, prophetic songs, and spiritual ministrations.)

"For the spirit of man is the candle of the Lord, searching all the inward parts of the belly." (Proverbs 20:27, KJV)

The atmosphere became charged with worship as songs of adoration rose before the throne of God.

"Hallelujah to the One who sits upon the throne."

"Hallelujah to the Lamb upon the throne, who was slain for us."

"Who is worthy to open the scroll?"

A holy stillness settled over the congregation as the worship continued.

Speaker's Teaching Begins

We looked at something previously, and I do not have much time today. I have only about thirteen minutes. That river we experienced was an extension of something difficult to describe.

Are you with me?

God created the world. You often hear me speak about **main timeline events**. Perhaps today they will become clearer. God created the whole world.

Humanity fell into sin. Everything went out of course. God then needed to establish a lineage through which He would bring mankind back to Himself.

He found Abraham.

From Abraham came Isaac.

From Isaac came Jacob.

From Jacob came the twelve sons of Israel.

They settled in Canaan before eventually going into Egypt.

Afterward came the captivity, and during the days of Daniel the angel Gabriel appeared to him and declared that God's prophetic timeline was still unfolding.

The prophetic timeline was continuing.

Amen.

The angel said:

"Seventy weeks are determined upon thy people..." (*Daniel 9:24, KJV*).

Yesterday we examined those seventy weeks. After every seven weeks came the Jubilee—a season of release from captivity. Then Gabriel spoke of sixty-two weeks.

We looked carefully at what those "weeks" meant.

Were they weeks of days?

Or weeks of years?

We saw confirmation from Genesis 29, where Laban told Jacob:

"...Fulfil her week, and we will give thee this also for the service which thou shalt serve with me yet seven other years." (*Genesis 29:27, KJV*).

The "week" referred to seven years.

So, in Daniel's prophecy, these are weeks of years.

Everything from Abraham until the coming of Christ had followed one continuous prophetic timeline.

The only interruption—the only gap—was the Church Age. That mystery was completely hidden from the Old Testament prophets. The Church is a mystery.

A Place for the Gentiles

Think about it. God had no covenant obligation to save someone from Ghana. He had no covenant obligation to save someone from Morocco. In those days, your ancestors had no part in the covenant when God began His redemptive work through Abraham. That is why salvation is mercy.

Levi Paid Tithes in Abraham

Let us look at Hebrews.

"And as I may so say, Levi also, who receiveth tithes, paid tithes in Abraham." (*Hebrews 7:9, KJV*).

Remember that when Israel entered the Promised Land, the tribe of Levi received no territorial inheritance. The Lord Himself became their inheritance. The remaining tribes brought their tithes to support the Levitical priesthood. Yet Scripture makes an astonishing statement.

Levi—who would later receive tithes—had already paid tithes.

How?

Because he was still in the loins of Abraham when Abraham paid tithes to Melchizedek.

Melchizedek...

A King without recorded father. Without recorded mother. King of Salem. The Prince of Peace. When Jesus declared,

"Before Abraham was, I am." (*John 8:58, KJV*).

He was speaking far beyond chronological existence. Scripture also says:

"Thou art a priest for ever after the order of Melchizedek." (*Psalm 110:4; Hebrews 7:17, KJV*).

Abraham encountered Christ. Levi was present—in Abraham. That is why Scripture says Levi paid tithes.

Understanding Generational Reality

This helps us understand something profound. As your forefathers acted, you were represented in them. When Abraham paid tithes, Levi paid tithes.

Likewise, much of what we describe as generational realities began because descendants were represented in their fathers. People often ask, "Why should I suffer because of what my ancestors did?"

Yet Scripture presents humanity as deeply connected through covenant representation. That is why families could experience generational blessings and generational judgments.

Why Salvation Is Grace

Think about humanity during Abraham's day. The population of the earth was still relatively small. The decisions made by those early patriarchs affected generations after them. Abraham responded to God's call.

Others refused. That is why your salvation is entirely by grace. Scripture says:

"For by grace are ye saved through faith... it is the gift of God." (*Ephesians 2:8, KJV*).

God owed us nothing.

When He called our forefathers, many rejected Him. Yet in His mercy, He created a way to bring us into the covenant. That is grace.

Abraham Chose to Follow God

Perhaps Abraham was not the first person God called. His own father, Terah, served idols. Maybe God had called Terah first.

We are not told. But Abraham responded. He chose obedience. Through one man's faithfulness, God established a covenant line that would eventually bless all nations.

Every generation after Abraham inherited priestly truths. Isaac learned them from Abraham. Jacob learned them from Isaac.

Years after Abraham built altars unto the Lord, Jacob encountered God at those sacred places.

The faith of one generation became the inheritance of another.

God Had Mercy on Those Outside the Covenant

Those of us outside Abraham's natural lineage had no covenant claim. Yet God looked upon us with mercy. He said, "I will make a way to bring them in."

Jesus Himself declared:

"Behold, I stand at the door, and knock..." (*Revelation 3:20, KJV*).

Notice something.

When Genesis introduces Abraham, it says:

"Now the LORD had said unto Abram..." (*Genesis 12:1, KJV*).

God had already been speaking before Abraham finally responded. Likewise, many of us responded only after God had been knocking upon the doors of our hearts repeatedly.

Such is His mercy.

Mercy Interrupted the Timeline

In Exodus, God declared that He visits the iniquity of the fathers upon the children. Later, through Ezekiel, He announced a new order:

"The fathers have eaten sour grapes, and the children's teeth are set on edge." (*Ezekiel 18:2, KJV*).

Then the Lord declared that this proverb would no longer govern Israel.

Why?

Because He introduced something entirely new.

He created space within redemptive history.

A mystery. The Church.

A mystery hidden from previous generations. This interruption in God's prophetic programme became the doorway through which the Gentiles could enter salvation.

Had the seventy weeks continued without interruption, many in Israel would immediately have recognised Jesus as the Messiah.

But because of God's purpose concerning the Church, a mystery was introduced into history.

Jesus sacrificed immensely to bring us into that covenant.

Like the shepherd who leaves ninety-nine sheep to seek one that is lost, Christ interrupted history itself to gather His Church.

Daniel's Prophetic Timeline

Yesterday's full teaching is available online. Let us continue.

Turn to Daniel chapter 2.

Now we enter prophetic timelines. Earlier I mentioned the Middle East. Whenever God raises genuine prophetic voices, their attention naturally gravitates toward Israel and the surrounding nations.

Why?

Because God's prophetic calendar follows Israel. We are adopted into that story. God does not use Ghana.

He does not use Nigeria. He uses Israel as the prophetic standard. The very history we read in Scripture is Israel's history.

Nebuchadnezzar's Troubling Dream

"And in the second year of the reign of Nebuchadnezzar Nebuchadnezzar dreamed dreams, wherewith his spirit was troubled, and his sleep brake from him." (Daniel 2:1, KJV).

Notice carefully. Nebuchadnezzar dreamed many dreams. Yet one dream disturbed him above all the others. There are lessons here.

If your dream life is under attack and you refuse to pray about it, you are cooperating with the enemy against yourself.

Some people dream.

They wake up.

They forget.

They roll over and sleep again.

Meanwhile, heaven may have been communicating something important.

Do not dismiss your dreams simply because you think you are "not spiritual."

Nebuchadnezzar was a Gentile king.

He worshipped idols.

Yet God still communicated with him through dreams.

Pharaoh received dreams.

Abimelech received dreams.

God has often spoken even to kings who did not know Him.

How much more His own children?

When God Disturbs Your Peace

Nebuchadnezzar's spirit became troubled. His sleep departed from him. Not every dream produces such restlessness. But when a dream robs you of peace, pay attention. Sometimes your spirit knows the importance of what your mind has forgotten.

Restlessness can become one of God's methods of speaking. Remember King Ahasuerus.

God withheld his sleep, and that sleepless night became the turning point that led to Haman's downfall and Mordecai's exaltation. God still speaks through holy restlessness.

Seek Understanding

Nebuchadnezzar summoned the magicians, astrologers, sorcerers, and Chaldeans.

He wanted the interpretation.

Whenever God speaks, pursue understanding.

Many believers have received dreams from God that remain unexplored simply because they never sought interpretation.

A Wise King's Test

The king said:

"I have dreamed a dream, and my spirit was troubled to know the dream." (Daniel 2:3, KJV).

The wise men replied, "Tell us the dream, and we will interpret it."

But Nebuchadnezzar refused. He understood something. If he described the dream first, anyone could invent an interpretation. Instead, he demanded:

"Tell me both the dream and its interpretation."

That requirement revealed remarkable discernment. He had noticed that previous interpretations often failed. This time he wanted undeniable proof. If they could reveal the hidden dream itself, then their interpretation could be trusted.

That is wisdom.

The Importance of Discernment

There is another lesson here. Do not reveal everything prematurely. Some matters require wisdom and discernment. Not every detail of your life should be placed before everyone.

Learn to guard what God entrusts to you. Secrets properly kept often preserve destiny. Nebuchadnezzar understood this principle. Only the one who truly had access to the revelation could reveal both the dream and its meaning.

The king answered and said,

"I know of certainty that ye would gain the time, because ye see the thing is gone from me." (Daniel 2:8, KJV).

He continued:

"If ye will not make known unto me the dream... ye have prepared lying and corrupt words to speak before me." (Daniel 2:9, KJV).

The king understood something. If he narrated the dream first, they could simply fabricate an interpretation. They could tell him whatever pleased his ears.

"O king, this dream means you are about to destroy all your enemies."

Anything could be invented. That is why he refused to reveal the dream.

Never Limit God to Your Own Experience

The Chaldeans replied:

"There is not a man upon the earth that can shew the king's matter." (*Daniel 2:10, KJV*).

Many people assume that because they cannot do something, no one else can. This has become one of the challenges within the Body of Christ. A pastor may not receive revelation concerning a particular matter, so when another servant of God does, he concludes that it cannot be from God.

Not because God has stopped speaking. But because he has not yet grown into that dimension. Sometimes people reject what they have never experienced. Yet Scripture reminds us that God acts:

"...to the intent that the living may know that the most High ruleth in the kingdom of men..." (*Daniel 4:17, KJV*).

At times, God performs extraordinary works simply to reveal His sovereignty.

No One Carries the Fullness Alone

Some ministers attack genuine ministries simply because they have not encountered that dimension of God themselves. Others are sincerely trying to protect the people entrusted to them.

Still others are guarding their own influence. So they search for verses that appear to support their objections. But the reality remains:

If God has not given you a particular grace, then He has not given you that grace. No single person carries the fullness of the Holy Spirit's operations. That is why Scripture says He gave:

- Apostles,
- Prophets,
- Evangelists,
- Pastors, and
- Teachers.

The diversity of gifts protects us from pride and reminds us that the Body needs every member.

When God Places You on the Payroll

The Chaldeans admitted:

"...there is none other that can shew it before the king, except the gods, whose dwelling is not with flesh." (Daniel 2:11, KJV).

In effect, they confessed their inability.

The king became furious because these men lived on the king's payroll.

They enjoyed the privileges of the palace, yet they could not provide answers when the kingdom needed them most.

There is a lesson here.

When genuine emergencies arise, those whom God has called must be able to stand in the gap.

I am not saying believers should become completely dependent upon ministers.

But when critical situations arise, there should be confidence that heaven has an answer.

Know the Grace God Has Given You

Daniel requested time.

Why?

Because he knew his relationship with God. There are certain situations where a believer should possess settled confidence—not confidence in himself, but confidence in the God he knows.

You ought to know the grace God has placed upon your life. Some know God for healing. Others know Him for divine provision. Others know Him for prophetic revelation. What will your God become known for through your life?

Elijah knew.

When confrontation came, he called for fire. He did not attempt miracles that belonged to another assignment. He functioned in the grace God had entrusted to him.

Every believer must discover that place of spiritual certainty.

Daniel Gathered His Companions

Daniel returned home and informed Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah. Notice something. Look at the company around Daniel. When a national crisis arose, he knew exactly who to call. Who surrounds your life today?

Many people are surrounded by companions who have no vision. Their conversations revolve around social media, entertainment, and passing distractions.

Yet destiny is greatly influenced by the people nearest to you. Daniel's friends immediately joined him in seeking God. That is the kind of company every believer needs.

The Power of Godly Friendships

There are moments when life catches fire.

A marriage enters crisis.

A family faces affliction.

Those are not moments for careless advice.

Godly friends lose sleep together.

They pray together.

They seek God's face together.

Instead, many today are surrounded by voices that encourage division rather than restoration.

One person says,

"Leave him."

Another says,

"Pack your things and go back to your father's house."

But true spiritual companions seek heaven's wisdom before offering earthly opinions.

Choose your company wisely.

The Company of Prophets

Even Samuel, mighty as he was, established a company of prophets at Naioth in Ramah.

Why?

Because no individual sees everything. Sometimes God speaks to someone standing beside you before He speaks directly to you. One believer may discern what another has missed.

Someone close to you may say,

"I sensed this in prayer."

"I saw this in a dream."

"Please pray about it."

That is one of God's gifts to the Body.

God Revealed the Secret

"Then was the secret revealed unto Daniel in a night vision."

(Daniel 2:19, KJV).

The king received the dream in the night. Daniel received the interpretation in the night. Imagine what was at stake. An entire generation of wise men could have been executed because one man forgot a dream.

Yet God intervened.

Honour Every Revelation God Gives

Daniel immediately blessed the Lord. He declared:

"Blessed be the name of God for ever and ever: for wisdom and might are his." (Daniel 2:20, KJV).

How many believers genuinely thank God for the revelations He has already given them?

Some wonder why fresh revelation does not come. Perhaps the last revelation God gave was never appreciated. Some people complain that their dream life has become dry. Yet the last meaningful dream they received was years ago, and they never even thanked God for it. Gratitude keeps the heart sensitive to further revelation.

God Rules Times and Seasons

Daniel continued:

"And he changeth the times and the seasons: he removeth kings, and setteth up kings..." (Daniel 2:21, KJV).

He gives wisdom to the wise. He grants knowledge to those who understand. He reveals deep and hidden things. Darkness hides nothing from Him.

Light dwells with Him.

Daniel thanked God because heaven had answered their prayers. Many believers continue praying about matters that God has already answered. The answer came through a dream. The answer came through a vision.

But because they failed to recognise God's response, they continued asking the same question. Learn to discern heaven's answers.

A Prepared Man Meets Opportunity

Daniel went to Arioch and said:

"Destroy not the wise men of Babylon: bring me in before the king, and I will shew unto the king the interpretation." (*Daniel 2:24, KJV*).

Preparation always precedes manifestation. Scripture teaches that a man's gift makes room for him. There comes a day when preparation meets opportunity. Someone else is unavailable. A crisis arises. Heaven opens a door.

If you prepared faithfully, that moment becomes your promotion. If you neglected preparation, the same opportunity becomes your greatest embarrassment.

The Day of Manifestation

At that time, Daniel was not even counted among Babylon's senior wise men. When Nebuchadnezzar summoned the astrologers, Daniel was not initially invited.

He was considered too insignificant. Too inexperienced. Too junior. Yet when every recognised expert failed, heaven brought Daniel forward.

There are days when God suddenly presents an opportunity that changes an entire destiny.

No announcement. No warning. Only preparation. Those who prepared quietly become visible publicly. Those who neglected preparation often discover that the opportunity they waited for has already passed.

Opportunity may arrive immediately after school. For another person, it may come years later. The timing belongs to God.

But whenever it comes, preparation determines whether the moment becomes promotion or regret.

There Is a God Who Reveals Secrets

Arioch hurried Daniel into the king's presence and announced:

"I have found a man of the captives of Judah, that will make known unto the king the interpretation." (*Daniel 2:25, KJV*).

The king looked at Daniel and asked:

"Art thou able to make known unto me the dream which I have seen, and the interpretation thereof?" (*Daniel 2:26, KJV*).

Daniel answered without hesitation:

"The secret which the king hath demanded cannot the wise men, the astrologers, the magicians, the soothsayers, shew unto the king." (*Daniel 2:27, KJV*).

Then came one of the most powerful declarations in Scripture:

"But there is a God in heaven that revealeth secrets..." (*Daniel 2:28, KJV*).

Notice Daniel's boldness. Standing before the most powerful ruler on earth, he was not ashamed to mention God. Many believers become uncomfortable speaking the name of Jesus before influential people.

They do not want to appear "too religious."

Daniel did not hide his source. Had he taken the credit for himself, Nebuchadnezzar would never have glorified the God of heaven. Jesus warned:

"...whosoever shall deny me before men, him will I also deny before my Father which is in heaven." (Matthew 10:33, KJV).

Never be ashamed of the One who gave you the grace.

A Prophecy of the Latter Days

Daniel continued:

"...there is a God in heaven that revealeth secrets, and maketh known... what shall be in the latter days." (Daniel 2:28, KJV).

Underline those words:

The latter days.

Everything Daniel was about to explain was prophetic. At that moment, none of these events had yet happened. He was not recounting history. He was unveiling the future.

The Great Image

Daniel described exactly what the king had seen.

"Thou, O king, sawest, and behold a great image..." (*Daniel 2:31, KJV*).

Its appearance was magnificent. Its brightness was extraordinary. Its form inspired fear. Yet there is an important lesson. Not everything that shines before men is precious before God. What appeared glorious to Nebuchadnezzar represented a succession of earthly empires whose value steadily diminished in the eyes of God.

Daniel described the statue:

- **Head** — Fine gold.
- **Breast and arms** — Silver.
- **Belly and thighs** — Brass.
- **Legs** — Iron.
- **Feet** — Iron mixed with clay.

Then the king saw something astonishing. A stone, cut out without human hands, struck the image—not on its head, nor upon its chest—but upon its feet.

The entire statue collapsed.

- Iron.
- Clay.
- Brass.
- Silver.
- Gold.

Everything was crushed together until it became like the chaff blown away from a threshing floor. No trace remained. Meanwhile, the stone grew into a great mountain that filled the whole earth.

Nebuchadnezzar Was the Head of Gold

Daniel then explained the vision.

"Thou, O king... art this head of gold." (*Daniel 2:38, KJV*).

Nebuchadnezzar ruled the Babylonian Empire. God Himself had granted him authority, power, strength, and glory.

Notice carefully.

Daniel did not flatter the king. He acknowledged the true source of earthly authority. The kingdom belonged to Nebuchadnezzar because the God of heaven had permitted it.

Successive World Empires

Daniel continued:

"After thee shall arise another kingdom inferior to thee..." (*Daniel 2:39, KJV*).

This is remarkable. Historically, the kingdom that conquered Babylon appeared stronger. Its military power increased. Its territory expanded.

Yet from God's perspective, its value decreased. Human history measures greatness by military strength. God measures kingdoms differently. The prophetic image demonstrates this decline. Gold gave way to silver.

Silver gave way to brass.

Brass gave way to iron.

Each empire became less valuable, even while appearing more powerful. Not everything that impresses men carries weight before God.

The Silver Kingdom – Medo-Persia

The silver chest and two arms represented the Medo-Persian Empire. Notice the symbolism. There are two arms. Likewise, there were two united kingdoms:

- The Medes.
- The Persians.

God illustrated history with astonishing precision. Even the structure of the statue reflected the political composition of the empire.

The Brass Kingdom – Greece

After Medo-Persia came another empire. The kingdom of brass.

This was Greece under Alexander the Great. History unfolded exactly as Daniel had prophesied centuries beforehand.

The Iron Kingdom – Rome

After Greece arose the Roman Empire. Daniel saw two iron legs. Again, the symbolism is exact. Rome eventually became divided into two great divisions:

- The Western Roman Empire.
- The Eastern Roman Empire.

Even this detail appeared in the prophetic image long before history unfolded. When Daniel first received this revelation, only Babylon existed as the ruling empire.

Everything beyond Babylon was still future. Yet every kingdom appeared exactly as God had revealed.

The Feet of Iron and Clay

The final kingdom is represented by the feet. Iron mixed with clay. Daniel declared:

"...the kingdom shall be partly strong, and partly broken." (*Daniel 2:42, KJV*).

The iron represents strength. The clay represents weakness. This final world system will possess both characteristics simultaneously. It will appear powerful.

Yet internally it will be unstable.

Where Does This Kingdom Appear?

Remember the prophetic timeline we studied earlier. The sixty-nine weeks concluded with the coming of Christ. Then came the mystery of the Church Age. Jerusalem was destroyed by Titus in A.D. 70 while the Roman Empire still ruled.

Rome extended across the Church Age. That means this final kingdom emerges after Rome. We are therefore awaiting the appearance of this fifth prophetic kingdom.

Iron Mixed with Clay

Daniel gave another explanation:

"...they shall mingle themselves with the seed of men..." (*Daniel 2:43, KJV*).

Notice the language. Throughout previous kingdoms, there was only the ordinary seed of humanity. Now something different appears. There is a mingling.

This echoes an earlier event recorded in Genesis 6, where the sons of God came unto the daughters of men, producing an unlawful mixture upon the earth. It also recalls Jesus'

parable of the wheat and the tares. The Lord sowed good seed. The enemy secretly sowed tares among the wheat.

When the servants asked whether they should uproot the tares immediately, the Master instructed them to wait until the harvest. Only then would separation take place. The tares would be gathered and burned. The wheat would be gathered into the kingdom. Likewise, this final kingdom will exist until Christ returns to establish His everlasting reign.

The Ten Toes

The feet consist of ten toes. These represent ten kings or ten kingdoms that will arise together in the last days. Among those ten rulers, one dominant leader will emerge.

This individual will activate the final prophetic week spoken of in Daniel's prophecy.

Revelation Confirms Daniel

Turn to Revelation 13. John writes:

"And I stood upon the sand of the sea, and saw a beast rise up out of the sea, having seven heads and ten horns..." (*Revelation 13:1, KJV*).

Notice the ten horns. They correspond to the ten toes of Daniel's image. The beast receives authority to rule for forty-two months. This prophetic period aligns with the final phase of end-time events.

As we continue, these prophetic symbols will become even clearer, especially concerning the rise of the final world ruler and the fulfilment of Daniel's last prophetic week.

The Final Kingdom and the Ten Toes

I think that is what I wanted to show you. There are going to be ten kingdoms—ten nations that will eventually unite. Yesterday I showed you something about the G7. We will come back to those things later because I do not want to rush.

Already, you can see systems beginning to emerge. You have the AU, the EU, the UN, and many other international alliances. Nations are already learning how to come together to form larger structures. Yesterday we saw how organisations like the G7 influence global economics and world affairs. That is the direction in which the world is moving.

Iron Mixed with Clay

Why is the final kingdom represented by iron mixed with clay?

Remember what I told you about Genesis 6. When the sons of God—the angelic watchers—came and took wives from the daughters of men, giants were born. Their extraordinary physical strength gave them superiority in warfare, because in those days survival depended largely on military power.

When you read about God commanding Israel to destroy certain nations, do not conclude that God delights in killing people. He was removing a corrupted race.

When God instructed Israel to destroy the Amalekites and other nations, many of those peoples had become thoroughly corrupted.

The Scripture says:

"There were giants in the earth in those days; and also after that..."

(Genesis 6:4, KJV)

Notice the phrase, "**and also after that.**"

Even after the Flood, giants still appeared. That explains why Goliath existed centuries later. When God judged the earth with the Flood, those physical bodies perished, but their spirits remained. Those spirits became what we know today as demons—disembodied spirits seeking habitation. Jesus explained this reality:

"When the unclean spirit is gone out of a man, he walketh through dry places, seeking rest..." (Matthew 12:43, KJV)

Why?

Because these spirits had once experienced embodiment. They long to inhabit flesh again.

A Different Advantage in This Generation

In our generation, the strategy is different. The advantage is no longer physical size or military strength. The advantage is intelligence.

- Knowledge.
- Technology.
- Influence.

That is why some of these individuals become CEOs, owners of powerful technology companies, political leaders, and influential global figures. Their advantage today is intellectual superiority rather than physical dominance.

You hear world leaders defending immoral ideologies and compelling entire nations to embrace them. Satan is still attempting to mix with the sons of men.

Daniel said:

"...they shall mingle themselves with the seed of men..." (Daniel 2:43, KJV)

This final kingdom will arise through that mixture.

Among these ten rulers will emerge one supreme leader who will broker peace in the Middle East and activate the final prophetic week spoken of by Daniel.

The Final Week

Return to Daniel chapter 2.

The formation of this kingdom must occur before the final seven-year covenant begins. Yesterday we saw that Artaxerxes' decree to rebuild Jerusalem initiated Daniel's seventy weeks. Likewise, there will come a future peace agreement in the Middle East that will activate the final week. Daniel 8:25 speaks about this coming ruler:

"...by peace shall destroy many..." (Daniel 8:25, KJV)

This individual will present himself as a peacemaker. When you begin to see a global peace agreement centred upon the Middle East, understand that the prophetic timetable is moving rapidly. The Church will witness the rise of this kingdom before the Lord returns.

Policy, Craft, and Global Control

Notice Daniel's description carefully.

"...through his policy also he shall cause craft to prosper..." (Daniel 8:25, KJV)

The Bible is remarkably precise. This coming ruler will govern through policy. He will influence systems. He will shape technology. Today the world is already engaged in technological competition, particularly in artificial intelligence. Nations are making laws concerning data, security, and technological advancement.

When this ruler appears, his governmental policies will greatly accelerate these developments.

Daniel says:

"...he shall magnify himself in his heart, and by peace shall destroy many..."
(Daniel 8:25, KJV)

Eventually, the one who first appears as a man of peace will demand worship.

If you see a leader bringing unprecedented peace to the Middle East while presenting himself as humanity's solution, understand that the return of Christ is drawing near.

The Kingdom That Shall Never Be Destroyed

Daniel continues:

"And in the days of these kings shall the God of heaven set up a kingdom, which shall never be destroyed..." (Daniel 2:44, KJV)

Notice carefully.

It is during the reign of these ten kings that God establishes His everlasting Kingdom. This points to the return of Christ after the battle of Armageddon, when He establishes His millennial reign upon the earth.

The ten-toed kingdom will be the final human government before the visible return of Jesus Christ.

The Stone Cut Without Hands

Daniel explains:

"...the stone was cut out of the mountain without hands..." (Daniel 2:45, KJV)

The stone strikes the image at its feet. Then it grows into a great mountain that fills the whole earth.

While Daniel was speaking to Nebuchadnezzar, only Babylon existed. Everything beyond Babylon—the Medes and Persians, Greece, Rome, and the final kingdom—was still future prophecy.

What we now read as history was prophecy when Daniel first declared it. Today, we are living at the threshold of the final stage represented by the feet.

Nebuchadnezzar Honours God

Then King Nebuchadnezzar fell upon his face before Daniel and commanded that an offering be presented. Daniel did not seek the glory for himself. The king declared:

"Of a truth it is, that your God is a God of gods, and a Lord of kings, and a revealer of secrets..." (Daniel 2:47, KJV)

Notice what happened. Because Daniel openly acknowledged God before interpreting the dream, the king himself glorified the God of heaven. Never be ashamed to identify with God before influential people.

If you deny Him before men, you should not expect Him to honour you before them.

Preparation Before Promotion

The king greatly promoted Daniel. He gave him gifts. He elevated him over the province of Babylon. He made him chief over all the wise men. Moments of promotion come suddenly. If you fail to prepare before your appointed moment arrives, your opportunity may pass.

There are days God presents one opportunity that changes everything. Daniel was not even among the chief wise men originally summoned before the king. Yet preparation positioned him for sudden elevation. The gift of a man truly makes room for him and brings him before great men.

Do Not Forget Your Companions

After receiving honour, Daniel remembered Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah. These were the companions who prayed with him when the crisis arose. Daniel requested that they also be promoted. Never forget the people who stood with you before your breakthrough.

Many people rise to greatness and abandon those who laboured with them in secret. Daniel did not. He understood that although he stood before the king alone, he had not fought the battle alone.

Daniel Remained at the Gate

The Scripture concludes:

"But Daniel sat in the gate of the king." (Daniel 2:49, KJV)

This is deeply prophetic. Even after promotion, Daniel remained spiritually watchful. He did not stop seeking God because he had become successful. Had Daniel abandoned prayer after his promotion, Gabriel would not have appeared to him in the later visions recorded in Daniel chapters 8 and 9.

Comfort must never replace consecration. Promotion must never replace prayer.

Belshazzar and the Handwriting on the Wall

Consider Daniel chapter 5.

Belshazzar took the sacred vessels from God's Temple and drank wine from them. Immediately a mysterious hand appeared and wrote upon the wall.

The king became terrified.

No one could interpret the writing.

Finally, Daniel was summoned. Daniel declared that God had blessed Nebuchadnezzar with greatness and dominion, but Belshazzar had profaned the holy vessels of God.

Therefore God's judgment had come. That very night, Belshazzar was slain. The Scripture records:

"In that night was Belshazzar the king of the Chaldeans slain. And Darius the Median took the kingdom..." (Daniel 5:30–31, KJV)

Think about it. The Medes and Persians could not have arrived instantly.

They were already approaching Babylon before Belshazzar committed his final act of rebellion. Yet had he not defiled God's holy vessels, God could still have defended him. Instead, at the very moment he needed God's protection most, he dishonoured God.

That is one of Satan's greatest strategies. Just when your enemies are nearest, he tempts you to offend the very God who protects you from them. Never allow disobedience to remove the covering that God has placed over your life.

For as Jesus declared:

"...the prince of this world cometh, and hath nothing in me." (John 14:30, KJV)

Preparing for the Days Ahead

Yesterday, I sent a screenshot of someone's post to the group. Millions of people were talking about it. Almost everyone kept mentioning the period after Donald Trump leaves office.

Many servants of God have been praying concerning this season and speaking about the importance of this particular window of time. His current tenure marks a prophetic window—a *kairos* moment.

The close of that window is marked by the end of his term in 2029. Many men of God across the world have been saying, "Five more years. Five more years to prepare."

If the rapture occurs during the Church Age, then we are not far from it. At the same time, I am also encouraging you to prepare in case you must endure the Tribulation, because there are many differing views within eschatology.

Some hold to amillennialism.

Some to premillennialism.

Others to postmillennialism.

Some believe in a pre-tribulation rapture, others in a mid-tribulation or post-tribulation rapture. Each group presents Scriptures to support its position. Whatever your position may be, one thing remains certain:

You must be ready.

The Spirit of the Age

Everything happening around us points to the nearness of Christ's return. We are entering an age unlike anything previous generations have experienced.

The seed shall mingle. Artificial intelligence. Robotics. Advanced technology.

You already hear people like Elon Musk speaking about the future of AI. Read Revelation 13 carefully. The Bible says that the image of the beast will be given power to speak and to compel worship.

There is coming a time when the system will compel people to depend upon artificial intelligence—not simply because they choose to, but because participation in society will increasingly require it. That world is coming. If you do not know Jesus, the system will overwhelm you.

- It will pressure you.

- It will oppress you.
- It will seek to silence you.

This is the spirit of the age.

Find Jesus Now

Find Jesus now. Develop a genuine relationship with Him. Build spiritual capacity now. Buy oil for your lamp. The prophet Joel declared:

"The sun shall be turned into darkness, and the moon into blood..." (Joel 2:31, KJV)

Only those who possess His light will know how to navigate those dark days. Jesus said:

"But if a man walk in the night, he stumbleth, because there is no light in him." (John 11:10, KJV)

The man who does not stumble is the one whose life has been illuminated by Christ. His Word is:

"...a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path." (Psalm 119:105, KJV)

Find Jesus now. Many of the things competing for your attention are merely distractions. They are bait. Some people are baited through friendships. Others through the little money they are making. Others through ambition.

The enemy uses these things to draw people away from God.

The University Is an Altar

Let me tell you something. The university is an altar. It is an altar for both light and darkness. You will either truly find Jesus there, or you may spend years drifting further away from Him. The choice is yours. The Scripture says:

"It is good for a man that he bear the yoke in his youth." (Lamentations 3:27, KJV)

Bear it now. Seek Him now. Know Him personally. The world you are entering as adults is not the same world your parents entered. The systems are changing rapidly. The spirit of antichrist is already at work. Even if the Church is taken before the Tribulation, ask yourself:

Are you truly ready?

Are You Certain?

Some of you still wonder:

"Will I go when Jesus comes?"

If you continually doubt your readiness, settle that matter today before God.

There should come a point where your confidence rests completely in Christ.

The Lord says:

"Behold, I come quickly; and my reward is with me..." (Revelation 22:12, KJV)

Jesus is coming. God has beautiful plans for your life. Find Him now.

Your ability to survive what is coming depends entirely upon your knowledge of Him.

That knowledge is eternal life.

A Prayer for Preservation

Lift your hands toward Him.

Ask Him to help you navigate the darkest days ahead.

Tell Him:

"Lord, be my light.

I cannot do this by myself.

Many things compete for my attention.

Many things appear attractive.

Help me.

You are the only way.

No one comes to the Father except through You.

Feed me with Your life."

Christianity is not merely a list of rules.

It is life.

Holiness is not sustained by human effort.

It is produced by the life of Christ within.

Ask Him to impart that life into you.

Bread of Heaven

As we prepared to close, I heard this song rise within my spirit:

**Bread of Heaven,
Bread of Heaven,
Feed me till I want no more.**

I had taken the communion elements before coming, not knowing what the Lord intended to do tonight.

Then I remembered what God told Israel.

"Take to them every man a lamb..." (Exodus 12)

They were instructed to place the blood upon their doorposts. When the destroying angel passed through Egypt, every house marked by the blood was preserved.

Tonight, may God mark you by the blood of Jesus.

May that blood preserve you throughout these last days.

Marked by the Blood

The Lord will place His seal upon you. You will not wander from the faith. Jesus warned:

"Because iniquity shall abound, the love of many shall wax cold." (Matthew 24:12, KJV)

Sin will become normal. Immorality will become celebrated. Serving God will appear outdated. Many young people will abandon the faith because they desire pleasure more than God.

But tonight, may the blood of Jesus mark your life.

Jesus declared:

"Except ye eat the flesh of the Son of man, and drink his blood, ye have no life in you." (John 6:53, KJV)

Many disciples left Him because of those words. Yet Peter answered:

"...thou hast the words of eternal life." (John 6:68, KJV)

May the blood and the bread become the reason you never depart from Christ. Even when others abandon the faith, you shall remain steadfast. May your heart be preserved. May your spirit be preserved. May your soul be preserved.

May the Lord grant you discernment to recognise every bait of this generation. In Jesus' Name. Amen.

Our Citizenship Is in Heaven

We hold nothing here except the life of Christ within us. Naked we came into this world. Naked we shall leave it. Our true home is not here. It is the New Jerusalem.

No wonder Jesus said:

"The foxes have holes, and the birds of the air have nests; but the Son of man hath not where to lay his head." (Matthew 8:20, KJV)

We are strangers here. We are only passing through. Do not build your life as though this world is your permanent home. If you sleep tonight and do not wake again, your earthly journey has ended.

What account will you give before Christ?

What will you say you did with the breath He placed within you?

When He asks what you accomplished with the life He entrusted to you, what will your answer be?

Living for That Day

One day we shall stand before Him. We shall enter His gates. We shall bring our report. We shall say, "Master, I have served You."

When the books are opened and every man's work is tested by fire, may we be found faithful. May we hear Him say:

"Well done, thou good and faithful servant..." (Matthew 25:21, KJV)

Do not come before Him empty-handed. You came into this world with divine purpose. You came according to God's eternal plan.

Live for that purpose.

Whatever the Cost

Do not be ashamed of Jesus. Do not be ashamed to attend prayer meetings. Do not be ashamed to identify yourself as His disciple. Will you hide your faith because people call you a fine boy or a fine girl?

Will you fear the opinions of friends more than the approval of Christ?

We do not care where this Gospel leads us. Whether we live or die, Christ remains worthy. One day every distraction will disappear.

- Every relationship.
- Every possession.
- Every earthly achievement.

Only eternity will remain. Ask yourself: **What is distracting you from Christ today?**

The Covenant of Communion

The Lord Jesus took the bread and said,

"This is my body which is given for you..." (Luke 22:19, KJV)

Then He took the cup and said,

"This cup is the new testament in my blood..." (Luke 22:20, KJV)

As we partake of this communion, we enter afresh into covenant with Him.

Prayer

Father, we bless these elements in the Name of Jesus. As we receive them, mark us by the blood of Christ. Keep us from the distractions of this age.

Raise up men and women who will make You proud. Let the life of Christ become active within us.

Prepare us for the days ahead. May we never deny You. May we fulfil everything written concerning our lives. Hide us from every fiery arrow directed against this generation. Deliver us from sexual immorality and every corruption of this age.

Purify our garments.

Keep oil in our lamps.

May we be found worthy before You.

In Jesus' Name.

Amen.

Do Not Allow Yourself to Become Isolated

Let me leave you with one final word. When Satan intends to destroy someone, his first strategy is isolation. When Adam sinned, God asked:

"Adam, where art thou?" (Genesis 3:9)

Adam had moved outside the fellowship of God's presence. A fish dies outside water. A tree dies when uprooted from the ground. Likewise, believers flourish within the life God has ordained for His Church.

When Satan isolates someone from the fellowship of believers, he creates an opportunity to destroy them. Think about a herd of deer. A lion rarely attacks the entire herd. Instead, it chases until one separates from the group. The isolated one becomes the target. That is exactly how Satan works.

Sometimes offence becomes his tool. Perhaps someone corrects you. Perhaps someone hurts your feelings. Perhaps a leader rebukes you. Then you decide:

"I am not coming to church again."

You are not hurting the church. You are hurting yourself. If someone in church offends you, do not let Satan use that offence to separate you from Christ. The Church may disappoint you. Jesus never will.

Do not allow offence to isolate you from the grace God has provided through the fellowship of believers. Bring every offence before God. Let Him deal with people. Do not abandon the congregation of the saints because of human weakness. The enemy is searching for isolated believers. Remain planted. Remain faithful. Remain connected.

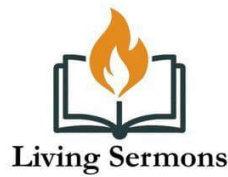
Our vision is built upon three foundational pillars:
