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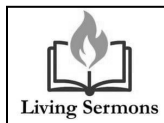

First of all, I have a burden for souls. Seriously, I have a burden for souls. I have a burden for people to come into the saving knowledge of Jesus Christ. That is a burden.

I also have a burden for people to grow in the things of God. Because I believe that salvation, although it is a perfected work once we come to faith, still requires growth if we are to fully actualise the purpose for which we were saved as it relates to what we do on earth.

So I have a burden to teach, to build, and to give tools. But in this moment, in this season we are in right now, I have an additional burden. That burden is to equip you and prepare you for the world we are living in now.

Are you tracking with me?

Because it's different.

Things are shifting. This is a way we have never been before. Not that God is ignorant to it—He is not—but it is a way *we* have never been before. And it requires things from us that we have not had to give in previous seasons.

That is why I do things like these masterclasses.

We're going to preach, teach, and get the Word—but I also want to sharpen you in other areas because there are tools we are going to have to use in order to survive and thrive in these times.

You've got to get more now for your effort in order not to get less.

Life costs more now.

And every moment is pregnant.

This moment you're standing in right now is pregnant.

That is why you have to be present, aligned, and connected so that you can extract what is in this moment, so it can create the momentum your life needs.

Amen.

The Value of the Soul

Let's go to work.

Matthew 16:26

“For what is a man profited, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul? or what shall a man give in exchange for his soul?” (KJV)

And then in **3 John 1:2**:

“Beloved, I wish above all things that thou mayest prosper and be in health, even as thy soul prospereth.” (KJV)

Lord, we thank You so much for this moment that You have blessed us with. We thank You for this opportunity to worship. We thank You for this opportunity to be together, to be in Your house, to hear Your Word. May the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in Thy sight.

Thank You, Lord.

I thank You for the spirit of wisdom, revelation, insight, knowledge, and prophecy—all that is required to minister to Your sons and daughters whom You love so richly and deeply. Move in this house in a profound way. In Jesus' name. Amen. My theme for today—what I want to walk out—is this: **As your soul prospers.**

A Journey Mate, Not an Expert

Let me transparently say this:

I do not come to you today as a subject matter expert. I do not come proclaiming to have all the answers about what we are going to talk about. To be more honest and transparent, I come to you as a journey mate. We're going to walk this thing out together.

One of the interesting things about being a mouthpiece for God is this:

Often, God will make you the message before He allows you to give the message.

Preachers, am I telling the truth?

He'll make you the message first. I'm thinking about Ezekiel, how God made him lie on one side, then another, prophesying. He had to literally become the word.

And they're not the only ones who became the Word.

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God."
— **John 1:1**

It is a divine thing. And transparently, I had to become this word.

When Something Is Missing

Recently, I experienced something that made me move differently. Since November, I've been very busy—multiple enterprises, most of them directly kingdom-related.

And I found myself lacking something. It was hard to pinpoint. My prayer life was on point.

I'm praying.

I'm working through my prayers.

I have a specific, regimented prayer that I pray every day.

I'm preaching.

I'm doing the work of the Lord.

I'm being generous.

I'm loving my wife.

I'm loving my children.

I'm doing everything I know to do.

And yet...

Something still felt like it was missing.

What do you do when you're doing all that you know to do?

What do you do when you believe you are checking all the spiritual boxes?

Obedience.

No visible compromise.

Prayer.

Word.

Service.

Surely everything spiritually should flow. That's what I thought. But I felt like I was withering. How do you wither while praying?

How do you wither while serving God?

How do you wither while showing up, loving people, preaching, and teaching?

How is that even possible?

That's what they teach us—the fundamentals: Read the Scriptures.

Pray.

Serve.

Walk with God.

I was doing all the right things.

Yet something was wrong.

And I sought the Lord.

Because sometimes, you have to stop faking inwardly.

Something was missing.

And I was perplexed.

Then there was a whisper.

Not from a strange place.

Not from an overly familiar place.

But from a deep place.

And it said:

“Worship Me.”

The Soul Speaks

What I realised quickly was the place to which that voice spoke.

It did not speak to my intellect.

It did not speak to my heart.

It did not speak to my spirit.

It spoke to something deeper.

It spoke to my soul.

The soul.

The soul is one of those conversations I call lightly dimmed.

The Bible says we see through a glass dimly.

And the soul—even in our desire to be studious—is something we try to describe and articulate.

But the reality is this:

We understand the soul dimly.

So much so that Hebrews 4:12 says:

“For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit...” (KJV)

That’s a fine distinction.

A necessary distinction.

The Word has the ability to divide soul and spirit because they are so deeply intertwined.

The writer compares it to marrow and joints.

The joint connects the bones.

The marrow is hidden inside the bone.

Yet everything the body needs—life, blood, strength—is sourced from that hidden place.

That is the line of demarcation between soul and spirit.

Soul Awareness

We tend to the things that are accessible to us. We tend to our minds because we can recognise our thoughts. We tend to our bodies because when something is wrong, it shows up. Even our spirits get attention because we recognise there is something more to us than what is visible.

Mind.

Body.

Spirit.

These things get attention. But often there is one thing neglected: The soul.

We are often self-aware. But we are not soul-aware. And I almost called this message:

When the Soul Cries

Because there are people here right now—your soul is crying. Something feels off.

You can feel it.

But you cannot access it.

That's your soul.

And you cannot escape it.

Jesus asked:

“What shall a man give in exchange for his soul?” — Matthew 16:26

You cannot exchange it.

You cannot work your way out of it.

You cannot become rich enough to outrun it. Your soul has to be tended to.

Your soul has to be dealt with. And your soul cannot be ministered to by just anything.

The Soul Keeps Score

We all have a soul. And here's what I know: The soul is impressionable.

There's a book called *The Body Keeps the Score*. Somebody needs to write one called:
The Soul Keeps Score

Because it does. The soul is shaped by the things we experience in life. When I was sixteen years old in South Los Angeles, I got shot. My body healed in months.

But my soul took decades. That one thing left an imprint. The soul is impressionable. Everyone in this room is showing up the way you are because of the impressions on your soul.

And your soul is delicate. It is sensitive. It is resilient—but delicate. I know you think you're tough. And maybe you are. But your soul is delicate. And that is why Jesus was so protective of children. Because children carry delicate souls. And what touches them leaves impressions. And impressions shape destinies.

The Delicate Nature of the Soul

Children—their souls are precious. And we all know that children are impressionable. But did we know they are impressionable because their souls are impressionable?

When the disciples, or anyone else, mishandled children, Jesus was very clear:

“Let them alone.”

And He became passionate about it. He said it would be better for a millstone to be tied around your neck and for you to be thrown into the sea than for you to offend one of these little ones.

Why?

Because He was aware of the preciousness and delicate nature of the soul.

And He also said:

Except you are converted and become like one of these children, you will have a challenge in kingdom things.

Are we tracking?

The soul is impressionable. It takes shape from our experiences—and often, we do not even realise it. That's why I look at people differently now. A lot of times we look at what a person did, but we do not consider what happened to their soul that made them do what they did.

When you have soul consciousness—when you carry a soul perspective—it makes you far more compassionate towards others. And it will make you watch your mouth. Because one of the ways the soul gets damaged is through reckless words.

There are people under the sound of my voice right now who have unaddressed damage in their souls.

And you've learned to live with it. That's okay. But the only reason God is bringing this message to you is because you cannot go where He is calling you to go until there is restoration of your soul.

And here is the beautiful thing:

God specialises in restoring souls.

An Injured Soul

Jesus said:

“For what is a man profited, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul?” — Matthew 16:26 (KJV)

That word *lose* there is deeper than just losing something.

It means *injure*.

An injured soul.

What will it profit a man if he gains everything—but injures his soul?

Hear me clearly:

There is nothing wrong with winning.

We saw that in **3 John 1:2**:

“Beloved, I wish above all things that thou mayest prosper and be in health, even as thy soul prospereth.” (KJV)

So Jesus is not saying, “Do not realise everything assigned to you.”

He is saying:

If you gain it all at the expense of your soul, you are in trouble. The inward mission is soul restoration. David said in **Psalms 23**:

“He restoreth my soul.” (KJV)

That word *restore* in Hebrew means *to turn back*.

So I am on a mission to turn my soul back to its original intention and form.

The Original Design of the Soul

The soul was fashioned in the context of safety. Go back to the Garden. Go back to the beginning. The soul was formed in uninterrupted relationship, covering, and protection with the Creator. That means it could afford to be vulnerable. It could afford to be delicate. Because the environment was safe.

But now we take this delicate soul and live life with it. And if we do not address what has damaged it along the way, we will produce in a deformed way.

The Soul Is Like Roots

Psalm 1 says:

“And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season...” — Psalm 1:3 (KJV)

There are so many places in Scripture where God compares people to trees.

And the soul is like the roots. This all happens underground. What makes a tree healthy?

What makes it fruitful?

Not what you see above ground. It is what is happening underground. The root system.

That hidden place.

The thing nobody sees. And the Holy Ghost told me He’s about to do something in your life from the inside out. Because some souls are getting restored in this place.

Some souls are being renewed right now.

Prioritising the Soul

The Holy Ghost said: “I’m about to do something in you in a place that is neglected too often.”

And you’re wondering why the fruit is withering. You’re wondering why the leaves are no longer green. It is because it is time to prioritise your soul.

I don’t see people.

I see souls.

I don’t see distractions.

I see hungry souls.

That’s why we’re here.

Years ago, the Lord appeared to me.

I wasn’t asking for it.

I wasn’t looking for it.

But in that encounter, one thing I could not shake was the look in His eyes.

It was serious.

Focused.

Compassionate.

Locked in.

And I asked Him:

“Lord, what is that look?”

He said:

“Souls.”

You see people.

You see problems.

I see souls.

That’s why He came:

“To seek and to save that which was lost.” — *Luke 19:10 (KJV)*

Fruit-Based Living vs Root-Based Living

Many of us live trying to get better at the fruit level. “If I can just fix the fruit, I’ll be alright.”

So we study systems. Processes. Strategies. Books.

But it is all fruit-based.

Rarely root-based.

And God is saying: You do not need another strategy.

You need soul healing.

Some of you have learned how to limp around with a wounded soul, not realising the fruit is rotten.

That dysfunction of the soul does not always show up immediately.

Psalm 1 says:

“...whose leaf also shall not wither...”

That means there can still be fruit on a tree while the leaves are withering.

Why?

Because fruit can remain from previous connection.

You can cut a branch from an orange tree and the fruit will still be there for days.

And it creates the illusion of health.

That's the danger of not being soul-aware.

You can be disconnected from the river and not know it.

Because people are still applauding.

Still calling your name.

Still celebrating your fruit.

Not realising the roots are drying up.

But once the roots disconnect from the river, it is only a matter of time before everything dries up.

According to the Prosperity of Your Soul

John says:

“Beloved, I pray that thou mayest prosper in all things, and be in health, even as thy soul prospereth.”

That word *as* is not equality.

It means *according to*.

I pray that you prosper according to the prosperity of your soul.

That means there is a direct connection between the condition of your soul and the condition of your life.

Jesus confirmed it:

“But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.” — *Matthew 6:33 (KJV)*

When your soul is not satisfied, you overcompensate.

You over-index on money.

You over-index on relationships.

You over-index on business.

Because you are trying to satisfy a hunger that only one source can satisfy.

That is why billionaires can still be starving.

That is why preachers can preach powerfully and still have sick souls.

That is why doctors can heal others while they themselves are withering.

No one escapes the thirst of the soul.

How the Soul Prospers

So the question becomes:

How does the soul prosper?

In short:

Only God can prosper the soul.

Only God.

There was a song we used to sing:

Jesus, lover of my soul.

Because worship is soul love.

Your soul was fashioned in the environment of agape.

Unconditional love.

Pure love.

That is the atmosphere your soul was made for.

And when your soul experiences anything less than that for too long, it begins to short-circuit.

Your soul was meant to be loved. And when the soul is loved, it becomes the anchor of your life. The writer said: **“Which hope we have as an anchor of the soul...”** — *Hebrews 6:19 (KJV)*

Your soul will be anchored somewhere.

It may be anchored in drama.

It may be anchored in addiction.

Or it can be anchored in the Lord—The One who fashioned it.

And it happens through worship.

Notice what I mentioned when I started.

I said I was praying.

I was reading my Word.

I was serving and ministering.

I was working hard.

I was being benevolent, generous, and a blessing to people.

But one thing I did not mention was worship.

I mean *real* worship.

Worship in the context of what worship truly is.

Singing is not worship.

It can be a part of how you worship—but singing itself is not worship.

Praising is not worship.

It can be part of worship, but it is not worship.

Reading Scripture is not worship. It can be a part of how you worship, but it is not worship. Prayer in and of itself is not worship. It can be part of worship, but it is not worship.

Worship is less about what you do and more about how you show up.

- Vulnerable.
- Open.

- Honest.
- Humble.
- Hungry.
- Convinced.

Sometimes the purest worship is not lofty language.

It is not merely:

“The God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.”

“Elohim.”

“El Shaddai.”

“Jehovah.”

That is beautiful.

But sometimes the deepest worship is simply:

Daddy.

Abba, Father.

Lover of my soul.

Jesus called Him Father more than He called Him anything else.

David, the same writer who said, “*He restoreth my soul,*” called Him:

My God.

“*The Lord is my light and my salvation...*”

“*The Lord is my shepherd...*”

But Jesus consistently called Him Father.

The Return to the Father

There is something powerful in this.

Even on the cross, Jesus called Him Father—until that moment of unbearable separation.

For the first time, He shifted:

“My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?”

— *Matthew 27:46 (KJV)*

That shift was not small.

It marked distance.

Father. Father. Father.

Then:

My God.

Distance.

But before He departed, He returned to position.

“Father, into thy hands I commend my spirit.”

— *Luke 23:46 (KJV)*

That is worship.

Surrender.

Here I am.

All of me.

I hide nothing from You.

Remember when You made me a living soul?

I was naked and unashamed.

I was not hiding from You.

And when He restores my soul, He returns my soul to its original context.

Love. Agape.

And love heals the soul like nothing else can. It reforms it. It reshapes it.

You Are More Than What Happened to You

God told me that today He was going to do a work in your soul. As He does this healing work, I can feel it. I can look at people and see what they've been through.

I can see it in your posture. I can see it in your face. And if I can see it—Jesus can see it. But hear me: You are more than what you've been through. That is why He came.

“For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that he might destroy the works of the devil.”

— 1 John 3:8 (KJV)

Yes, the enemy threw something at you. Yes, it hurt. Yes, it devastated. Yes, it was destructive. And that is why Jesus had to experience devastation. He had to become what hit you. He had to let what hit you hit Him. So that He would be qualified and anointed to restore you.

He is a restorer.

You will not stay there.

From the inside out.

God is healing from the inside out.

This Is Not Your Portion

Sometimes we want to keep running. And I understand—God has things for us to do. But sometimes we cannot run because we are limping from what happened to our soul.

And we call it:

“My portion.”

“My cross to bear.”

No.

That is not your cross.

“He which hath begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ.”

— *Philippians 1:6 (KJV)*

Taking up your cross is about laying down your life.

It is not about remaining broken.

It is not about staying in bondage.

It is not about staying wounded.

That is a lie.

It is about dying to self—not staying stuck.

Let the Lover of Your Soul Love You

So I want to pray for you.

If you feel God tugging on you—If you just need a moment to let the Lover of your soul love on you—Come.

Draw near.

Because He is going to touch you. He is going to unclog some things. Heal some things. Some of you have not even met the real you yet.

You have not even seen yourself yet. When your soul is loved—When you become aware that your soul is loved—You show up differently.

You move differently.

You live differently.

“Draw nigh to God, and he will draw nigh to you.”

— *James 4:8 (KJV)*

It is time for soul love.

Only One Has Access to Your Soul

I love my wife deeply.

She is my best friend.

And I am hers.

But I cannot love her soul. I do not have access there. And she cannot love mine. There is only One who has access to the deepest part of you. And the good news is—He loves you.

Not just *has* love for you.

He *is* love toward you.

And it never shifts.

It never changes.

People say:

“I disappointed God.”

That is impossible.

Because disappointment requires ignorance.

To be disappointed means you expected one thing and got another.

But God sees the end from the beginning.

He knows all things.

He cannot be surprised.

So the enemy uses that lie to make you question how God feels about you.

But the truth remains:

He is the Lover of your soul.

Be Loved

Look at how 3 John begins:

Beloved.

Almost like a command:

Be loved.

The whole strategy is in that one word.

Before prosperity.

Before health.

Before fruitfulness.

Be loved.

Because your soul prospers in the context of love.

It thrives there.

It grows there.

The love of God is like sunlight to a plant.

Like water to roots.

And when both are present—Flourishing happens.

Not just flourishing—Blossoming.

A blossom is the revelation of the plant's true essence.

It was closed until it received what it needed.

And once it received it—It opened.

That is what God is doing in you.

Some of you have not even seen yourselves yet.

Your family has not seen you yet.

Your church has not seen you yet.

Your children have not seen you yet.

Your spouse has not seen you yet.

But that is about to change.

Because the Holy Ghost said:

He is going to love your soul.

And as He loves your soul—You will blossom.

And offer to the world the beauty that has always been inside you.

Closing Prayer

Father, I thank You for the privilege of becoming Your message before carrying it. I thank You for every person under the sound of this anointing. Thank You for the healing taking place from the inside out. For those who knew You only as God—Jehovah.

Yahweh.

Elohim.
