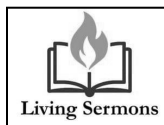

Introduction

God started something last week—a word.

It was more than a word. It was the beginning of a real breakthrough as your soul prospers.

We are going to continue what God began.

Our foundation is found in **3 John 1:2**: *"Beloved, I wish above all things that thou mayest prosper and be in health, even as thy soul prospereth."* (KJV)

In other words, I want you to prosper and thrive and be blessed in every area of your life—from the crown of your head to the soles of your feet, in everything that concerns you. I want you to prosper, to do well, to be fruitful, to multiply, not to go backwards, but to always move forward—as your soul prospers.

Then there is another powerful truth in **Mark 3:7–9**: *"But Jesus withdrew himself with his disciples to the sea..."*

A hidden nugget of wisdom in the midst of miracles.

The Scripture says: *"And he spake to his disciples, that a small ship should wait on him because of the multitude, lest they should throng him."* (Mark 3:9, KJV)

That small boat mattered. And today, we're going to understand why.

The Neglected Part of Us

Last week, I transparently acknowledged that I am not a subject matter expert on the soul. I would never claim to be. I'm simply a journey mate with you—trying to figure this thing called life out.

No one but God has all the answers.

That's why it is critical to have a relationship with God—to lean on Him, depend on Him, trust Him, and walk with Him, because we learn as we go. But it became very clear to me that God was calling our attention to a part of us that is often neglected: **The soul.**

We talked about how the other parts of us—our mind, our body, and even our spirit—are easier to recognise.

We are conscious of our thoughts. We are conscious of our physical bodies. We are even conscious that we are spirit beings.

But the soul?

The soul is deeper. It is the deepest part of who we are. And because it is deep, it is often hard to access. But it is also deeply impressionable.

The Soul Is Delicate

Things that happen to you in life happen to your soul. Your soul is impressionable. It is delicate. And it is supposed to be.

Why?

Because you were created in the safe environment of God. here were no threats there.

- No trauma.
- No fear.
- No betrayal.

Your soul was designed for God to shape it. That is why the soul is delicate—like fine china. Not weak. Valuable. Precious. Sensitive.

That's what your soul is. When I was sixteen years old, I got caught in a drive-by in Los Angeles and was shot. My body healed in months. My soul took decades.

And the craziest part?

I didn't even know it was wounded. The bodily wound was obvious. The soul wound was hidden. But I started showing up differently. Because you are shaped by what shaped your soul.

As Goes the Soul, So Goes the Life

According to the health of your soul determines the output of your life. Who you are right now is a reflection of the shaping of your soul.

Sometimes we think:

“This is just who I am.”

And that's only half true.

Who you are is the result of the shaping you've experienced. Which means we have to pay attention to the soul. Because if we don't deal with the soul—the soul will deal with us. The writer in 3 John wasn't comparing prosperity with the soul.

He was emphasising the soul. He was saying: If your soul does well, your life will do well.

The human body was not wired for this much chaos. Certain things have become normalised. We've become anaesthetised. Things that used to shock us now seem expected. But hear me clearly:

That is not normal. The intake we constantly receive is wild. And it is affecting us in ways we do not even realise.

The Brain Craves Predictability

The brain is wired for predictability. It craves it. It longs for it. And when the mind can no longer predict what's next, it enters a fight-or-flight state.

The creative part shuts down. The protective part turns on. Now imagine years of chaos. Weeks of unpredictability. Scenario after scenario. Eventually, you stop being able to predict peace. This is the state of humanity right now. And that state does not naturally bring out the best version of us.

That's why we have decision fatigue. Should I stay or go?

Should I start it or quit it?

Should I move or stay put?

Why?

Because the system is short-circuiting. And either you do nothing—or you move in fear and do something irrational.

God Restores the Soul

The soul needs something unique. The soul needs God. **Hebrews 4:12** teaches us that the Word of God divides soul and spirit. That means there is a distinction. And if the soul is distinct, then what it needs is distinct. The spirit needs God. The body needs care. The mind needs renewal. But the soul?

The soul needs restoration. David said in **Psalms 23**:

"He restoreth my soul." (Psalm 23:3, KJV)

That is what separates God from everything else.

- A person can guide you.
- A person can protect you.
- A person can anoint you.

But only God can restore your soul. The word “restore” literally means **to turn back**.

To bring back to original design. God knew life would disfigure our souls. And He already prepared Himself to be the One who reshapes us. Because you cannot show up in life beyond how your soul is shaped.

Root Problems, Not Fruit Problems

Most of what we are taught focuses on fruit.

How to have better relationships.

How to make more money.

How to succeed.

But very few talk about roots.

What determines fruit is root.

I don't fix fruit at the level of fruit.

I fix output at the place of input.

Because input determines output.

God compares us to trees throughout Scripture.

Psalm 1:3 says:

"And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season..." (KJV)

The secret isn't the fruit.

The secret is where the roots are planted.

If you are not planted by the river, fruit will not be consistent.

And for somebody reading this:

It's a root problem.

You think it's a fruit problem.

But it's root.

Your Job Is to Abide

Jesus said in **John 15**:

"Abide in me..."

Your job is not to produce fruit.

That's not your assignment.

Your assignment is to abide.

Master abiding.

Master staying rooted.

Master keeping your roots in the river.

Because if you stay rooted, fruit will come automatically.

The soul is like the roots.

And God is like the river.

If the roots are healthy, the expression will be healthy.

What people admire above ground is determined by what is happening underground.

Where nobody sees.

That's where everything happens.

If my soul prospers, I will prosper.

If my soul prospers, I will be the husband I want to be.

The parent I want to be.

The entrepreneur I want to be.

The fruit is automatic.

Soul Maintenance

So now we come to soul maintenance.

Now that I realise I have a soul...

Now that I realise my life rises or falls based on my soul...

Now that I realise life leaves dents and dings on my soul...

I must become intentional.

Soul maintenance is not mainly about labour.

It is about two things:

Regulating.

Receiving.

Be Careful What You Receive

Your soul is impressionable.

It is shaped by what it receives.

To be devout means to take well.

To receive carefully.

To guard what enters.

I don't just receive anything.

I don't just go anywhere.

I don't just expose myself to everything.

Why?

Because I have a soul to protect. I am careful what I watch. Careful what I hear. Careful what I feed into my spirit and soul. Because as goes my soul—so goes me.

We have to become more devout.

More intentional.

More guarded.

The Small Boat Principle

This is why Mark 3 matters. Jesus is healing. Preaching. Casting out devils. Ministering.

And in the middle of all that—He whispers to His disciples: “Get a small boat ready.”

Not just a boat. A small boat. A boat so small not everybody could fit in.

That was His strategy of escape. Not just from physical pressure—but soul pressure.

Jesus understood: I cannot keep pouring out without protecting my soul.

That’s why He often withdrew. To the mountains. To the sea.

Early in the morning. Away from the crowds.

Why?

Because He was protecting His soul. And some of you need your own small boat.

- A place your friends cannot fit.
- A place your children cannot fit.
- A place even your spouse cannot fit.
- A sacred place.

Reserved only for you and God. Because as wonderful as people are—they cannot heal your soul. Only God can. And you need a place where your soul can be worked on.

That is soul maintenance. Watch this—Jesus did not wait until His soul was injured. He already had a strategy. That’s the problem with many of us. We are self-aware, but not soul-aware. Most of us only realise our soul is in trouble after the damage has already surfaced.

After you lose your mind on your co-worker. After you completely flip out on your spouse—in the name of Jesus. Too late.

And hear me clearly, family:

We are living in times where we are going to have to be the best version of ourselves.

Because things are about to move so quickly—so fast, so hot, and so heavy—that you will not have time to catch up.

You are going to have to already be ready.

It’s about to get dangerous.

And here’s what I mean:

The space between error and getting it right is shortening. That’s why God is sharpening us. That’s why He is giving unusual tools, unusual paradigms, and unusual perspectives.

Because we are going to need accuracy. We used to be able to fall seven times. Baby—we’re on time number seven. There is an accuracy we are going to have to move in.

A clarity.

That clarity will set you apart. Because when your soul is not clouded by damage, you see clearly. And clear vision changes everything.

From Questions to Source

The Bible says:

"But the people that do know their God shall be strong, and do exploits." (**Daniel 11:32**, KJV)

In the last days, those who know their God will move in something powerful. Prolific. Prophetic. Protected. Prosperous. But that does not happen if the soul is unhealthy. Some people are constantly looking for answers.

"What should I do?"

"How should I move?"

But if all you do is look for answers, you will spend your life chasing answers. What we need is not answers. What we need is **source**.

If the tree is planted by rivers of water, it does not concern itself with seasons.

Seasons belong to God.

Fruit belongs to God.

But grounding your soul?

That belongs to you. We must move from questioning to knowing. And knowing happens when we tap into Him.

What the Soul Needs Most

What does the soul need to flourish?

What does the soul need to be restored?

What does the soul need to turn back to original design?

The soul needs **agape**.

God's love.

Unshakable love.

Love that is not dependent on the actions of the person receiving it.

It simply is.

It doesn't bend.

It doesn't weaken.

It is not diminished when it is not reciprocated.

It is settled.

Stable.

Perfect.

Paul prayed in **Ephesians 3:18–19**:

*"May be able to comprehend... what is the breadth, and length, and depth, and height;
And to know the love of Christ, which passeth knowledge..." (KJV)*

He was saying:

If you truly understand this love, you will be filled with the fullness of God.

That's how powerful agape is.

Perfect Love Evicts Fear

The apostle John teaches us:

"There is no fear in love; but perfect love casteth out fear..." (1 John 4:18, KJV)

Think about that.

Imagine facing the scariest moment of your life—and not being able to access fear. That is what the revelation of God's love produces. Fear cannot coexist where God's love is deeply known.

God does not merely have love.

God is love.

And when I become conscious of His presence, I become conscious of His love. And His love heals me.

It makes me whole.

And when I am whole, I can trust my thoughts again. Because the way I think in fear is different from the way I think when I know I am loved.

When I know I am loved—I become bold.

Courageous.

Faith-filled.

I become dangerous to darkness.

Who you are when afraid is not the fullest version of you. Who you are when confused, doubtful, and shaken is a diminished version of you.

But when you know you are loved—you become different.

- How you think changes.
- How you move changes.
- How you forgive changes.

When you are rich in love, you lack nothing. That's why unforgiveness is rooted in poverty.

It says:

“What you did damaged me permanently.”

But that's a lie.

When you know God loves you, you know nothing can take from you what God has secured in you.

- Love makes forgiveness possible.
- Love restores dignity.
- Love restores strength.
- Love restores identity.

My soul thrives on agape.

Why?

Because it was formed in agape. It was fashioned in love. That means the soul is always trying to get back there. Back to the garden.

Back to being naked and unashamed. Back to existing without pretending. Some of you are still hiding like Adam.

- Hiding behind achievements.

- Hiding behind image.
- Hiding behind performance.

Because you still don't know how God feels about you. But hear the Lord: Don't cover yourself with fig leaves.

The Bible says:

"Charity shall cover the multitude of sins." (1 **Peter 4:8**, KJV)

- His love covers.
- His love restores.
- His love heals.

Worship Is the Doorway

Everybody is looking for love. That's why people chase validation, Status, Cars, Clothes, Success. But what they are really searching for is love.

And that brings us to worship. I used to think worship was just church. I thought singing songs was worship. But singing is only a part of worship. The soul is a receiver.

God is a filler.

In **Genesis 2:7**, God breathed into man. Man became a living soul. That means the soul was formed through reception. It was designed to receive. So worship is opening your soul to receive from God. Worship is not for God.

He doesn't need it. If He did, the elders around the throne are already doing it day and night. Worship is for us. Worship is where the soul receives what it has always needed.

Worship is saying: “Here I am.”

All of me. Nothing hidden. Nothing covered. The lie of hiding from God is absurd. You can’t hide from Him. He sees everything. And He loves you anyway. Some people worship halfway. Because they don’t believe God can handle the whole truth. But what you hide cannot heal. What you conceal cannot be restored. Agape is the love language of the soul. And worship is the environment where that love is received. There are moments in worship where freedom comes.

- Healing comes.
- Direction comes.
- Deliverance comes.

You can literally worship your way into freedom.

Build Soul-Friendly Environments

Your soul needs intentionality. Jesus went to the sea. Sometimes to the mountains. Sometimes alone. You have to discover what environments nourish your soul.

Sometimes it’s not the place—it’s the time.

If 3 a.m. creates an environment where you meet God deeply—wake up at 3 a.m.

That’s how important this is. Protect your environment.

Protect your soul.

The Posture of Worship

Here are the directives:

Be Vulnerable

Naked and unashamed.

Shame is not from God.

God will never shame you.

He has seen it all—and still loves you.

His love is not diminished.

Not one bit.

Be Honest

Tell Him the truth.

“God, I’m jealous.”

“God, I’m envious.”

“God, I’m angry.”

Why?

Because He cannot heal what you cover.

1 John 1:9 says:

"If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us..."
(KJV)

Confession creates agreement.

And agreement releases breakthrough.

Be Humble

Jesus gave us the perfect picture in **Luke 18**.

The Pharisee came bragging. Talking about his righteousness. Comparing himself to others.

But the sinner?

He would not even lift his eyes. He beat his chest and cried: *"God be merciful to me a sinner."* (**Luke 18:13**, KJV)

And Jesus said he went home justified.

Why?

Because humility attracts God.

Before You Pray, Worship

Before you do anything—worship. Before you pray—worship. By the time you finish worshipping, you may already know what to pray. Or better yet—you may discover there's nothing left to pray about. Because God has already affirmed you.

Validated you.

Spoken truth over you.

That's why when the disciples asked Jesus how to pray, He started with worship:

"Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name..." (**Matthew 6:9**, KJV)

Worship first. Always.

Then you start asking.

But watch this:

Before you read your Word—worship. Because you do not always know what is sitting in your soul. You do not always know what is unresolved, what is wounded, what is shaping your perception. And if you open the Bible without first letting God settle your soul, you might read something completely out of context.

You might be angry, wounded, offended—and then open your Bible and see:

"Take now thy son, thine only son Isaac... and offer him..." (Genesis 22:2, KJV)

And think:

"That's my sign."

No.

It isn't. Worship first. Before we do anything, we must first give the soul what it needs.

Your Soul Carries Impressions

Tending to your soul is everything.

We cannot outgrow it.

We cannot bypass it.

Our souls get hurt.

They get scarred.

They get damaged.

And many times we deny it.

We say:

"I'm okay."

But no—you're not.

That hurt.

The divorce damaged your soul.

The abuse damaged your soul.

The betrayal damaged your soul.

None of us escape the impressions life leaves on the soul.

But here is the beautiful thing:

God knows how to turn it back.

He knows how to restore it.

He knows how to take what the enemy meant for evil and turn it for good.

The Lover of Your Soul

If you are here and you want to give your life to the Lord—to the Lover of your soul—this is your moment. Maybe there has been distance. Maybe you have been trying to figure this God thing out.

Maybe you have questions.

And who doesn't?

None of us have a full lock on all there is to know about God. But there are moments where clarity comes. Moments where you suddenly become aware of your need for Him.

This is one of those moments. God is drawing you. He is gathering you. He is calling you back. He is saying:

“You belong to Me.”

Come Out of Hiding

Some of you have had a difficult time worshipping. Not because you do not love God—but because you do not feel worthy.

You have felt too broken.

Too stained.

Too far gone.

And so you have hidden. But today, God is calling you out of hiding. Like Adam in the garden.

He is saying: Come out.

You are safe with Me.

You do not have to hide anymore.

You do not have to run anymore.

You do not have to carry shame anymore.

Jesus tore the veil.

There is no more distance.

There is no more separation.

Come close.

Be Your Own Worship Leader

There is a passage in **Ephesians 5:19**:

"Speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord;" (KJV)

That's worship too.

Because there will be moments when you leave the corporate environment.

No worship team.

No musicians.

No church atmosphere.

Just you.

And God.

And in those moments, sing.

Make melody in your heart.

Make up songs about His faithfulness.

About His goodness.

About His love.

It doesn't have to be polished. It just has to be honest.

To Him, it will be beautiful. Be your own worship leader. Something happens in the soul when you sing unto the Lord.

A Restored Soul Is Priceless

He restoreth my soul.

There is nothing like a restored soul.

Nothing.

It's better than a holiday.

Better than money.

Better than success.

A restored soul changes everything.

And God is saying:

Where you are is not where you will always be.

Your portion will not be tears forever.

He says:

"Thou hast turned for me my mourning into dancing..." (Psalm 30:11, KJV)

He is turning it.

Turning mourning into dancing.

Turning weeping into joy.

Turning sorrow into strength.

And He will give you double for your trouble.

God's Promises Over You

The Lord says:

"For I know the thoughts that I think toward you... thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end." (**Jeremiah 29:11**, KJV)

He says:

"Fear thou not; for I am with thee: be not dismayed; for I am thy God..." (**Isaiah 41:10**, KJV)

He says:

Run to Me.

Do not run from Me.

I am your Saviour.

I am your Maker.

I am your Redeemer.

I will fight for you.

No weapon formed against you shall prosper.

"When thou passest through the waters, I will be with thee..." (**Isaiah 43:2**, KJV)

When you go through fire—you will not smell like smoke.

When you go through floods—they will not overflow you.

I am your God. I will raise up a standard for you.

You belong to Me.

The Secret Place

"He that dwelleth in the secret place of the most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty." (Psalm 91:1, KJV)

That secret place matters. That's where God whispers. That's where He says: "This is the way—walk in it."

That's where direction comes. That's where covering comes. That's where covenant is renewed. That's where the soul is strengthened.

Draw near.

Come close.

Get filled again.

God has already ordered your steps.

You are good to go.

Worship and Watch God Work

God says: Just worship Me.

And watch Me work.

You worship.

I work.

You abide.

I provide.

You plant yourself.

I produce fruit. That is the Kingdom pattern. Worship is not passive. Worship is warfare. Look at Jehoshaphat. When the enemy came against him, the Lord said:

"Ye shall not need to fight in this battle..." (**2 Chronicles 20:17**, KJV)

What did He tell them to do?

Send the worshippers first. And while they worshipped—God fought.

That is still the strategy.

- While you worship—God wars.
- While you worship—God heals.
- While you worship—God restores.
- While you worship—God renews.

Worship Is Wisdom

Some of you thought worship was weakness.

No.

Worship is wisdom.

- It is strength.
- It is surrender.
- It is strategy.
- It is positioning.
- It is trust.

And while you worship, heaven moves. Angels move. Healing moves. Deliverance moves. Renewal moves. This is why we worship. Because God inhabits it. Because the soul is restored in it. Because breakthrough is birthed in it.

His Final Word Over You

God says:

I am touching you right now.

Because I love you.

Because I am for you.

Because I have your back.

I have seen every tear.

Not one has escaped My notice.

"Put thou my tears into thy bottle..." (Psalm 56:8, KJV)

I counted them all.

And your latter shall be greater than your former.

"The glory of this latter house shall be greater than of the former..." (Haggai 2:9, KJV)

The sufferings you endured—they are not worthy to be compared to the glory I am working in you.

I am for you.

I set My love upon you.

You belong to Me.

So bless the Lord, O my soul—and all that is within me.

Bless His holy name.

A Sovereign Work in the Soul

“So Lord, not by might, nor by power, but by Your Spirit, do a work in every soul under the sound of my voice.

Do a sovereign work.

A work evidenced by liberty, freedom, renewal, and strength.

Do it in every heart.

Do it in every soul.

Thank You, God.”

I cannot think of any spiritual discipline—not prayer, though I pray much; not meditation on the Word, though I do it daily—that has had more impact on my life than worship.

Worship is one-on-one.

Even though we gather collectively, true worship is simply a collective of individuals who have opened up their souls to the Lover of their souls.

The One who fashioned it.

The One who formed it.

The One who knows it.

The One who sees it.

The One who understands it.

And therefore has the power to restore it.

That happens through worship.

Be intentional about it.

Create space for it.

Create environments for it.

If morning is your time, go to bed earlier.

I'm in bed by 8:30 or 9:00 most nights—not because there aren't things I want to do, but because I'm serious about my worship time.

Are you hearing me?

Prepare your little boat.

What is your little boat?

Notice—Jesus didn't prepare it after.

He prepared it beforehand.

He already made provision for His soul.

Because life will crush you without an escape to worship.

And when you get there, know God loves you.

No performance.

Sometimes you don't even have to talk.

Just get there.

Get open.

"Here I am."

The physical expression works.

There's something about it.

The physical is a representation of the spiritual.

Lay down.

Stretch out.

Go prostrate.

Get low.

Envision the throne.

Read Revelation chapters 4 and 5.

Join in with the angels and the elders.

Why is it there?

It's showing you how to do it.

Envision it.

God will show you.

You can worship and go from your living room into the throne room.

From your car into the throne room.

From the bathroom stall at work into the throne room.

Go into the bathroom frustrated.

Come out with the joy of the Lord.

Flourish As Your Soul Prospers

“Father, we thank You for this time together.

I thank You for the privilege of sharing thoughts that will bless and help Your beloved creation.

I thank You that Your Word will not return unto You void, but it shall accomplish that for which You sent it.

I thank You for the tool, the strategy, and the wisdom You have given to Your sons and daughters.

I thank You that their souls will prosper. That they will prosper from the inside out. And that the work You do in their souls no man can disrupt and no enemy can steal.

It is a sacred place.

A sovereign place.

A holy place.

Seal this work.

And I pray that we would become prolific guardians of our souls. That we would be devout. That we would not receive just anything and everything. But that we would guard and protect the most precious part of who we are. Father, I pray that they would know Your love in a way unlike ever before.

That they would feel that rich agape that drives out all fear. To the effect of a flourishing unlike anything they’ve ever experienced.

Flourish.

As your soul prospers.

God says:

‘I’ve got you.

You will never be by yourself.

Even when you thought you were by yourself—you were not.

You were seen.

You were known.

You were loved.

You were accompanied.’

“I will never leave you nor forsake you.”
