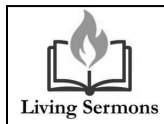

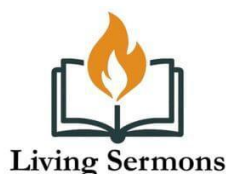

I started a conversation last week called *I See Angels*, and God moved upon us in a powerful way. Today, we are going to continue in that same vein. The scripture that will anchor us—although we will be moving through several passages today—is:

1 Samuel 16:13 (KJV)

"Then Samuel took the horn of oil, and anointed him in the midst of his brethren: and the Spirit of the Lord came upon David from that day forward. So Samuel rose up, and went to Ramah."

Let us pray.

Lord, may the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in Your sight. God, I thank You for what You have intended for us today. Your Word is a lamp unto our feet and a light unto our path.

God, send Your Word that we might eat to the full—that the Word would strengthen us, edify us, align us for the work and for the assignment You have called us to.

We love You so much, and we are so grateful for Your Word.

Now God, I thank You for the spirit of wisdom, revelation, insight, knowledge, prophecy, and full access to Heaven's resources—to be a blessing to Your sons and daughters both near and far. My prayer is that we will leave here changed, seeing better, seeing more accurately, and as a result of that, moving more circumspectly.

A Season That Demands Clarity and Boldness

I always like to give a bit of a recap when I'm continuing in a message, just in case you weren't here or there was something communicated that you missed. Last week, we started by talking about how we are in a season where we need clarity and boldness unlike ever before.

There is so much confusion. There is so much manipulation. As it relates to manipulation, most of the bestselling books over the past five to ten years are basically books about how to manipulate you.

Are you hearing me?

When you get up in the morning, people already have a strategy on how to get you to do what they want you to do.

You are moving through life, doing your own thing, making decisions and choices—not realising that even the tech companies at the highest levels, their programmers and researchers are studying how to get you to respond the way they want you to respond.

Do you think it is a coincidence that you cannot put your phone down?

Do you think that just happened by chance?

No.

There is a strategy to manipulate you because we are living in an attention economy.

That means people profit by making you look. That is why we have to be clearer now than we have ever been before. Because just because something feels urgent does not mean it is anointed.

The system has been rigged in such a way that it will make you think that because you are drawn to something strongly, it must be God.

No, baby.

We are living in a time where clarity is absolutely necessary. And you will hear me talking about clarity all year long. But not just clarity—boldness.

Boldness Is the Byproduct of Clarity

You cannot be bold if you do not know what you are being bold about. Boldness is the byproduct of true clarity. When I can see right, I can be bold.

Because I know in whom I have believed.

I know in whom I have trusted.

And I know what the One I trust has said.

Clarity, when it fully matures, takes you beyond believing into knowing. Believing will get you into Heaven. Thank God for that.

Ephesians 2:8 (KJV)

"For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God:"

Belief gets us into Heaven. But knowing gives you the power to bring Heaven to earth. Because the reason you are still here is because there is a predetermined expression of the Kingdom of Heaven that you carry. And when you know that you know that you know—you are carrying something—it brings boldness.

And you are able to bring on earth as it is in Heaven.

From Believing to Knowing

I am moving past believing. Believing is sufficient for Heaven. It is insufficient for destiny. That is why the disciples said: “Lord, I believe.”

But they did not stop there.

They said:

“Help my unbelief.”

My belief is not the issue.

It is just deficient for what is on my life.

I have got to move from believing to knowing. Because when I move from believing to knowing, I stop hesitating and I start flowing. The Bible does not say those who believe their God shall be strong.

It says:

Daniel 11:32 (KJV)

“...but the people that do know their God shall be strong, and do exploits.”

Knowing is the highest level of faith. That is where I want to get.

Seeing Is a Process

Clarity is not just about being clear. It is about having the ability to see differently. Seeing is a process. You evolve in your seeing. You go from seeing to believing to knowing. We looked at Nicodemus.

At first, Nicodemus came to Jesus by night because he saw something—but seeing had not yet become belief. He was asking questions. Trying to intellectualise what was spiritual.

But Jesus told him:

John 3:3 (KJV)

"Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God."

Something spiritual had to happen. Later, Nicodemus became bolder. He defended Jesus in the Sanhedrin. And after Jesus was crucified—when it was most dangerous—Nicodemus openly identified himself with Him.

That is growth.

That is evolving in your seeing. Even Jesus Himself grew. At twelve years old, He was both speaking and asking questions.

And the Bible says:

Luke 2:52 (KJV)

"And Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favour with God and man."

Even Jesus had a process.

There Is More

Paul prayed in Ephesians 1 for believers. Meaning these were already people who had seen and believed. Yet he prayed:

Ephesians 1:18 (KJV)

"The eyes of your understanding being enlightened..."

In other words:

God is not finished with you. There is more. Turn to your neighbour and tell them:

“There’s more.”

Open My Eyes

We talked about Elijah's servant in **2 Kings 6**.

They were in the same battle. One was panicking. The other was peaceful.

Why?

Because one could see. Elijah discerned the problem immediately:

"Your eyes are not open."

And he prayed:

"Lord, open his eyes."

When God opened the servant's eyes, he saw that what looked like defeat was actually divine covering.

2 Kings 6:16 (KJV)

"Fear not: for they that be with us are more than they that be with them."

That is why seeing matters. Because if you do not know your resources, you will fight with the wrong weapons.

Fighting with the Right Weapons

If you do not realise angels are backing you up, you will fight with carnal weapons. And carnal weapons bring you down to the level of your opponent.

Paul taught us:

Ephesians 6:12 (KJV)

"For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers..."

Some of you are fighting spiritual battles with earthly weapons. That is why the battle keeps continuing. But when you take up the sword of the Spirit—which is the Word of God—and begin to pray and decree a thing, the enemy cannot stand.

You have got to know your tools. The angels are connected to your prayer life. There are angels assigned to the purposes of God on your life.

Alignment Activates Angelic Assistance

Joshua was preparing to take territory when he encountered a man with a sword.

Joshua asked:

“Are you for us or for our adversaries?”

And the answer came:

Joshua 5:14 (KJV)

"Nay; but as captain of the host of the Lord am I now come."

In other words:

I am committed to the purposes of God. Meaning if you are in alignment with God, Heaven backs you. Angels ensure victory where alignment exists. Turn to your neighbour and say:

“I see angels.”

How God Changes What We See

Today I want to talk about how God changes what we see. I love practical things. I can release the Word, but I also want to teach you how to walk it out.

How to apply it.

But before we get into the “how,” let me make something clear.

This is spiritual.

You cannot pay for it.

You cannot intellectualise your way into it.

Some things are taught.

Other things are caught.

There are not seven steps to seeing better.

We need the Holy Ghost.

When Nicodemus struggled with understanding, Jesus gave him the analogy of the wind.

John 3:8 (KJV)

"The wind bloweth where it listeth, and thou hearest the sound thereof, but canst not tell whence it cometh, and whither it goeth..."

You do not know where it comes from.

You do not know where it is going.

But you cannot deny it.

And that is how the Spirit works.

Jesus said in **John 3:8 (KJV)**:

"The wind bloweth where it listeth, and thou hearest the sound thereof, but canst not tell whence it cometh, and whither it goeth: so is every one that is born of the Spirit."

In other words, you do not know how the wind happens. You do not know where it comes from, and you do not know where it goes when it leaves you. But one thing you know—when the wind hits you, you know it. He said that is how it is with those who are born of the Spirit.

David: A Case Study in Changed Sight

I want to bring us into a case study, and we are going to make David that case study. Because we know David's eyes changed. Let us go back to **1 Samuel 16**.

The Bible says:

"Then Samuel took the horn of oil, and anointed him in the midst of his brethren: and the Spirit of the Lord came upon David from that day forward..."

— **1 Samuel 16:13 (KJV)**

This was not some small vial of oil. This was a horn of oil. Samuel poured it over David's head. Then he took his hand and smeared it into him. This was dramatic.

It was symbolic, yes—but it was powerful. The oil was poured on him. Then it was worked into him. And after that, the Spirit of the Lord came upon David from that day forward. Something shifted.

David was not anointed at the battle. He was anointed before the battle. And that anointing changed his perspective.

It prepared him to see differently.

The Spirit Pushes You Forward

That word *came* in the Hebrew carries the idea of pushing forward. The Spirit did not come to sit on David. The Spirit came to push him. To propel him. To move him into destiny.

Have you ever felt God pushing you?

Like you could not stay where you were?

Like you could not ignore what He was calling you into?

One of the ways God pushes you is by changing your sight. The Spirit recalibrated how David interpreted reality. And this is important. Because the Spirit does not just make you powerful. The Spirit makes you perceptive. You can feel powerful and still not see right. But when the Spirit comes, He recalibrates your reality.

Seeing What Others Cannot See

This is why David saw differently than Saul. Saul saw liability. Israel saw defeat. The army saw danger. But David saw a dead man walking. Before he ever reached the battlefield, he had already seen Goliath on the ground.

He saw victory before the fight started. That is why David started negotiating. “What shall be done for the man who kills this giant?”

Why?

Because when you know the fight is fixed, you move differently. He knew the outcome before the battle began. His eyes had been recalibrated. And because of that, his courage changed.

His confidence changed. Everything changed because his vision changed.

When You See Right, You Know You Are Enough

When Saul offered David his armour, David refused.

Why?

Because when you see right, you stop depending on what other people think you need.

David said:

“I do not need that.”

Because he already saw the giant defeated. When you see right, you realise:

You are more than enough. There is somebody under the sound of my voice who thinks you are not ready. You think you need more money.

More approval.

More support.

But God is getting ready to change your eyes. And when He changes your eyes, you will realise:

You are more than enough.

Say it:

“I am more than enough.”

“I have everything I need.”

“I am sufficient for the task.”

The enemy has lied to you long enough. But God is changing your sight. You are about to see yourself the way God sees you. And you are ready.

Great Exploits Are Waiting on You

When this revelation settles in you, you will move and do great exploits. You are not waiting on great exploits. Great exploits are waiting on you.

The real you.

Not the you you think you are.

But the you God says you are.

Romans 8:19 (KJV)

"For the earnest expectation of the creature waiteth for the manifestation of the sons of God."

Creation is waiting for your unveiling.

God is opening eyes in this season.

New eyes for the journey.

The Spirit and the Language of Sight

All throughout the Old Testament, prophecy was about sight. Those who sat in darkness saw a great light. This is why many of Jesus' first miracles involved opening blind eyes.

Sight matters. So somebody might ask:

"Well, David had oil poured on him. Samuel laid hands on him. But what about me?"

Good question. Because Samuel is gone. And most of us have never had a horn of oil poured over our heads.

So does that disqualify us?

Absolutely not.

The Upper Room Experience

Let us go to **Acts 2**.

"And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place."

— **Acts 2:1 (KJV)**

Then suddenly:

"There came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind..."

— **Acts 2:2 (KJV)**

Notice:

It does not say a wind came. It says a sound came. A sound like a mighty rushing wind. That word *sound* carries the idea of an echo. An echo is when something happens in one place and reaches you where you are. What happened in Heaven echoed into their environment. Heaven invaded their room. The upper room became an extension of Heaven.

When Heaven Invades, Sight Changes

Then the Bible says: *"And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire..."*

— **Acts 2:3 (KJV)**

Notice: They saw something. Heaven invaded. And when Heaven invades, sight changes. God allowed them to see what Heaven was doing. Then what happened?

"And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak..."

— **Acts 2:4 (KJV)**

Do you see the pattern?

The Spirit comes. The sound comes. With the sound comes sight. And with sight comes activation. They manifested on earth what Heaven revealed.

God Pours Out More Than Power

Then Peter explains:

Acts 2:17 (KJV)

"And it shall come to pass in the last days, saith God, I will pour out of my Spirit upon all flesh..."

David was anointed by man.

But in these last days, God says:

I will pour out My Spirit Myself.

Not through a horn.

Not through a vessel.

But directly from Heaven.

And how will you know?

Your sons and daughters shall prophesy.

Prophecy is when you see what Heaven is saying and speak it into the earth.

You become a vessel.

A conduit.

A mouthpiece.

And when you decree what God has revealed, it becomes established.

Your Problem Is Perception

God does not just pour out power. He pours out perception. And the Holy Spirit told me:

Your problem is not what you think it is. It is a perception problem. Hear me clearly. When you are in covenant with God through Jesus Christ, your only real problem is how you see. Because if you can see right, you can stand right. If you can see right, you can trust right. That is why Job said:

Job 13:15 (KJV)

"Though he slay me, yet will I trust in him..."

And God says:

Jeremiah 29:11 (KJV)

"For I know the thoughts that I think toward you... thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end."

So no matter what comes your way, it is working together for your good.

Captivated by Heaven

Back in Acts 2, that word *appeared* is powerful. It means to gaze with wide-open eyes at something remarkable. Not casual observation. Not passive sight.

But being captivated. Completely arrested by what Heaven is revealing. That is what God wants to do. Not just let you glance at spiritual things. But to captivate you with divine reality. There is voluntary observation—and then there is gazing.

There is a difference between simply seeing something and being captivated by it.

In Acts chapter 2, the word *appeared* carries the idea of gazing with wide-open eyes at something remarkable.

It is not passive.

It is not casual.

It is arresting.

It grips you.

And I wanted to understand where else this word was used in Scripture. One place that stood out to me was in **John 1:50–51**.

Jesus said to Nathanael:

"Because I said unto thee, I saw thee under the fig tree, believest thou? thou shalt see greater things than these."

— **John 1:50 (KJV)**

Then He said:

"Verily, verily, I say unto you, Hereafter ye shall see heaven open, and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of man."

— **John 1:51 (KJV)**

Jesus was telling him:

You are about to move from seeing, to believing, to knowing.

Jacob's Hard Place

That brought me back to **Genesis 28**.

Jacob was in a place of fear, uncertainty, and despair. He did not know where his life was headed.

He took a stone—not a pillow, but a stone—and laid his head on it. He slept in a hard place. And then the Bible says:

"And he dreamed, and behold a ladder set up on the earth, and the top of it reached to heaven: and behold the angels of God ascending and descending on it."

— **Genesis 28:12 (KJV)**

And the Lord stood above it and reaffirmed the covenant promises. Promises of inheritance. Promises of blessing. Promises of divine presence. And then Jacob woke up and said:

"Surely the Lord is in this place; and I knew it not."

— **Genesis 28:16 (KJV)**

That is powerful. Because before that moment, Jacob had a perception of where he was.

Not just physically.

But emotionally.

Spiritually.

Mentally.

He saw himself in despair.

In fear.

In uncertainty.

But God opened his eyes. And everything changed.

Divine Activity Everywhere

Jacob saw angels ascending and descending. That means he saw divine activity everywhere. He moved from despair to divine perception. What if God opened your eyes today and you realised that Heaven has been active around you all along?

What if you discovered there is more with you than with them?

What if you realised the armies of Heaven are surrounding you right now?

What if you truly understood that God has your back?

You would move through life differently. You would be bold. You would be courageous. You would close the mouths of lions. You would walk on water. If God said jump, you would ask, "How high?"

That is what sight does.

God Is Still on the Throne

Jacob saw the ladder. He saw angels moving. He saw the Lord above it all. And sometimes in life, we get distracted by what is happening around us. We see injustice.

Chaos.

Confusion.

People saying and doing all kinds of things. And you wonder: Am I going to be okay?

But hear this: Not only are angels ascending and descending.

Not only are you surrounded by Heaven's host. But the Almighty God who sits high and looks low has not left His throne.

He is still seated. Right now.

Psalm 121:1–2 (KJV)

"I will lift up mine eyes unto the hills, from whence cometh my help. My help cometh from the Lord..."

Your help comes from the Lord.

God reigns.

He reigns undistracted.

He reigns unbothered.

So why should you come down from your high place to argue with the enemy?

Stay high.

Stay fixed.

Stay focused.

When They Go Low, You Look High

Do not be distracted by nonsense. It is just a distraction. When they go low, you look high. Lift up your eyes.

Do not diminish the holy calling on your life by entangling yourself with the affairs of this world.

1 Corinthians 15:58 (KJV)

"Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord..."

Be steadfast. Be unmovable. Do not come down to wrestle with distractions.

Just declare the One who reigns.

Seeing Clearly Makes You Unoffendable

When you see clearly, you become hard to offend. You cannot offend someone who is living high. We are too easily offended. But when your eyes are fixed on Heaven, petty things lose their power over you.

Stay high.

Stay elevated.

Because there are angels ascending and descending. And God is still on the throne.

Jesus: The Door to the Realm

Jacob saw the Almighty above the ladder. But Jesus reveals something deeper. He tells Nathanael:

"Ye shall see heaven open, and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of man."

Jesus is the door to that realm.

He is the bridge.

The access point.

The ladder.

And the Father is above it.

The two are one.

That means you are blessed coming in and blessed going out.

Covered here. Covered there.

Covered every step of the way.

The Two Disciplines of Seeing

Now let me give you the two disciplines of seeing.

Two twin forces.

Two twin disciplines.

Expectation.

Hunger.

These do not open your eyes. But they position you for your eyes to be opened. The Word of God is designed to create expectation. When God spoke to Abraham and told him:

"Get thee out of thy country... unto a land that I will shew thee."

— **Genesis 12:1 (KJV)**

That word was not just information. It was an invitation into expectation. Every time God speaks to you, write it down.

Why?

Because when you write it, you take what is spiritual and begin bringing it into the natural. That is the first step toward manifestation.

Habakkuk 2:2 (KJV)

"Write the vision, and make it plain..."

Write it.

Do not leave it in your head.

Expectation and Hunger

Expectation is the knowledge of what is available to you. Faith is built on expectation.

Hebrews 11:1 (KJV)

"Now faith is the substance of things hoped for..."

Expectation says:

I know this is available to me.

Not I think.

Not I hope.

I know.

And hunger says:

I must have it.

Not I want it.

Not maybe.

But I must have it.

Jacob had that spirit.

That is why later he wrestled with God and said:

"I will not let You go until You bless me."

Because he knew there was more.

He knew what was available.

And he refused to leave empty-handed.

Desperation That Moves Heaven

Blind Bartimaeus had this hunger.

He cried:

"Jesus, thou Son of David, have mercy on me."

— **Mark 10:47 (KJV)**

They tried to silence him.

But he cried louder.

Why?

Because he knew who Jesus was.

He knew Jesus was Messiah.

He knew mercy was available.

He was desperate.

Sometimes we are not desperate enough.

David said:

"I cried unto the Lord with my voice..."

— **Psalms 3:4 (KJV)**

Hannah poured out her soul before God.

And Heaven responded. There is a kind of cry that produces life-changing response. Sometimes the pressure you are under is cultivating your cry.

Cultivating your hunger.

Cultivating your desperation.

Hunger Is Intentional

This is why we fast. Not to manipulate God. Fasting is not manipulation. It is a signal. It tells Heaven: I am serious.

It tells God:

I have moved from believing to knowing. Because some miracles require more. Some breakthroughs require deeper hunger. The disciples asked Jesus why they could not cast out the demon. And before He mentioned fasting, He said:

"O faithless generation..."

— **Mark 9:19 (KJV)**

It was a belief issue first.

Because hunger and expectation always work together.

Expectation says:

I know it is mine.

Hunger says:

I will not leave until I have it.

Nevertheless, in order to get to that level of belief and knowing, this kind comes out by prayer and fasting. In other words, you have to cultivate the type of spirit for certain things.

We're almost there. Hunger is serious.

Put up a bat signal.

When you put up that bat signal—not a believing bat signal, but a knowing bat signal—the eyes of the Lord go to and fro throughout the whole earth, looking to show Himself strong on behalf of those whose hearts are perfect towards Him.

Sometimes, when you are not hungry on the level that you need to be, you have to be hungry for hunger. I wish I could say that better. You have to learn to hunger when you fall into apathy and you know it. You have to hunger for hunger. Are you tracking?

You've got to go after it.

There is a prophetic word that God spoke to me. There are a lot of giants in this generation. A lot of giants. And I used to pray, "God, remove these giants."

I don't pray that anymore.

I pray, **"God, restore my clarity."**

Because if I can see right, I can deal with the giants. See, if I see right, I will realise that the only reason I'm calling them giants is because of my perspective. Because if I really saw what was going on in the atmosphere, they would look like grasshoppers.

That's why the Bible says, "*O magnify the Lord with me*" (Psalm 34:3). Make Him bigger than what you're afraid of. That's what your praise does.

It's a Sight Problem

The Lord spoke this to me. I'm going to release this, and then we're going to pray.

He whispered this to me as I sat in the secret place concerning this message. And I believe it's going to resonate.

God told me to tell you:

It's a sight problem.

It's not a money problem.

It's not complicated.

It's not impossible.

It's a sight problem.

It's how you're looking at it. Your issue is your perception about it. Our problems are never our biggest problems. Our problem is how we perceive them, and how that perception creates our inner life. We have a promise for every problem.

Every problem you face in life, there's a promise for it. But God told me to tell you: **He's opening your eyes today.** He's not going to leave you in that place. He's going to do what only He can do. He wants you to see.

Remember that story when God touched the blind man's eyes, and he couldn't fully see? He saw men as trees. God didn't leave him there. He didn't leave him with foggy vision.

God touched him again until he could see clearly.

God's going to touch you again.

Another touch is coming.

Another touch is coming to change your eyes.

From Stones to Pillars

Some of you are like Jacob.

I get it.

It's been so rough that where you lay down has felt hard. No comfort. Or maybe you haven't had comfort in a long time.

You've been laying on a stone. And maybe you've believed that's all you're worthy of—or that it's just your cross to bear.

But God told me that He's going to move you **from stones as pillows to pillars of testimony**.

From pillows to pillars.

He's going to use that very thing that was hard.

I want to pray for some people. Come on, stand with me. God's going to touch you.

He's going to touch your eyes.

Change your perspective.

Change your perception.

And you're not just going to see angels—
you're going to see **everything** differently.

I've Seen Angels

Many of you know I'm from California—Los Angeles. I grew up in Watts, South Central LA, and I've seen it all.

One day, I was driving through there. I don't do it as much anymore, but I used to like to drive through and revisit some of those places.

I thank God for every step in my journey. *"The steps of a good man are ordered by the Lord"* (Psalm 37:23). I wouldn't change anything, because if I changed one thing, I wouldn't be me.

I don't do regret.

But I was moving through the city one day, not paying attention. At the time, I was driving a nice car, moving through the projects, and then got back on the freeway towards home.

And it dawned on me:

Wow. That was dangerous.

A little thought of not being safe came over me.

And then the Lord opened my eyes.

He showed me—literally—an angel. A massive angel, with its forearm covering my whole car.

Just the forearm.

So I thought I was surrounded by trouble, not realising there was an angel saying,

“Ain’t nothing going to happen to you, son.”

When I say *I see angels*, that’s not a cute little thing. And that wasn’t the first time.

I see angels.

And God’s going to open your eyes, and you’re going to see angels too.

You’re going to see who’s got your back.

Who’s for you.

Who loves you.

The Call to Salvation

If you’re here, as I mentioned last week, you must be born again.

Nicodemus was trying to figure this thing out. “How is this going to happen?”

And Jesus said, “*Ye must be born again*” (John 3:7).

This is spiritual.

It’s not even a religious thing. Nicodemus had religion worked out. He was on the Sanhedrin council. He had the Torah. He had the prophets. He had it all.

But religion wasn't enough.

It was an encounter with Jesus.

And that encounter opened his eyes and evolved his sight until he was willing to risk it all to walk with Jesus.

If you've never opened your heart to Jesus—maybe He's been your mother's Jesus, your grandmother's Jesus—but now it's time for Him to become **your Jesus**, this moment is for you.

He wants to open your eyes so you can see and walk out who you are.

Because confusion, fear, and uncertainty are symptoms of sight that hasn't been healed yet.

And the Lord is calling you now.

The Final Prayer

Father, I thank You for Your beloved sons and daughters. Thank You for the privilege of being a voice into their lives.

Anything You reveal, You intend to fulfil.

You've shown us through Scripture the reality of sight changing as we draw near to You. You've created expectation and cultivated hunger.

So Father, I pray for everyone under the sound of my voice.

Just like Elijah prayed for his servant in **2 Kings 6:17**, I pray:

Open their eyes.

Just like Paul prayed in **Ephesians 1:18**, I pray:

That the eyes of their understanding would be enlightened.

That they would know the hope of their calling.

That they would know the riches of the inheritance in Christ.

I thank You that Your sons and daughters will leave here with new eyes. Clearer eyes.

That they will perceive who You are, who they are, and the resources that are with them every day.

That they will move differently.

Obey more swiftly.

Live undistracted.

Live unbothered.

Hallelujah.

We are getting spiritual LASIK.

You are causing us to see the way we were always designed to see.
