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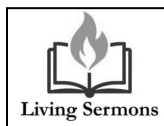

Foundational Scriptures

Exodus 30:1–10

Then make another altar of acacia wood for burning incense. Make it eighteen inches square and thirty-six inches high, with horns at the corners carved from the same piece of wood as the altar itself. Overlay the top, sides, and horns of the altar with pure gold and run a gold moulding around the entire altar.

Make two gold rings and attach them on opposite sides of the altar below the gold moulding to hold the carrying poles. Make the poles of acacia wood and overlay them with gold.

So it is wood, but overlaid with gold. Somebody shout, **“Gold!”**

Place the incense altar just outside the curtain that shields the Ark of the Covenant, in front of the atonement cover that is over the tablets inscribed with the terms of the covenant. And the Lord says:

“I will meet you there.”

That arrested me.

I thought God met with His priest in the Holy of Holies, but the text says:

“I will meet you there” — right at the golden altar of incense.

That blew my mind.

God meets you in prayer. You missed a good place to shout right there. God will meet you right in prayer. Every morning when Aaron maintains the lamps, he must burn fragrant incense on the altar. He does this morning and night. This must be done from generation to generation.

Do this with your children and your children's children. Do not offer any unholy incense on this altar. Somebody say, **"Nothing strange."**

Once a year Aaron must purify the altar by smearing its horns with blood. Somebody say, **"The blood."**

This is the Lord's most holy altar.

Luke 18:1–8

Jesus told His disciples a story to show that they should always pray and never give up. The King James says:

Men ought always to pray, and not to faint.

There was a judge in a certain city who neither feared God nor cared about people. A widow came to him repeatedly saying:

"Give me justice against my adversary."

For a while he refused.

But finally, he said:

"I don't fear God, and I don't care about people, but this woman is driving me crazy."

Your prayer will drive the enemy crazy.

He said:

"I will see that she gets justice because she is wearing me out with her constant requests."

Then the Lord said:

Learn a lesson from this unjust judge.

And will not God bring justice for His chosen people, who cry out to Him day and night?

Will He keep putting them off?

I tell you, He will grant justice quickly.

But when the Son of Man returns, will He find faith on the earth?

2 Chronicles 7:13–15

God said to Solomon:

“At times I might shut up the heavens so that no rain falls, or command the grasshoppers to devour your crops, or send plagues among you.

But if My people, which are called by My name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land.”

And verse 15 says:

“Now mine eyes shall be open, and mine ears attent unto the prayer that is made in this place.”

Would you gently grab your neighbour’s hand?

Brothers and sisters, I have been studying gold lately. Recently, it jumped to \$5,100 an ounce. Gold holds immense significance as a universal symbol of wealth, power, authority, and even divinity.

It has been valued for thousands of years because of its rarity, its radiant lustre, and its immunity to decay. Beyond adornment and currency, it serves as a safe haven against economic instability. Some would even call it a spiritual representation of the sun and immortality.

You say, “How?”

Because there was gold in the Garden of Eden.

Gold was in the land of Havilah. Put that in your pocket. Gold also has financial significance.

- It hedges against inflation.
- It stores long-term value.
- It is used in central bank reserves.
- It also has cultural significance.

Historically, gold has symbolised authority, prosperity, love, achievement, and prestige.
Some of you are wearing gold right now.

Gold also carries spiritual significance. In Revelation, John says there are streets made of gold.

Not paved with gold.

Made of gold.

There is a difference.

Gold was in Eden.

Gold is in Revelation.

It bridges the beginning and the end.

It connects the physical world to the spiritual world.

Sitting on Gold

One of the greatest investors of our time, Warren Buffett, says he dislikes gold.

That shocked me.

He dislikes it because he says it is nonproductive.

It just sits there.

And the Holy Ghost spoke to me.

He said:

The altar of incense in Exodus 30 just sits there too.

But it represents prayer.

It just sits there.

And I thought about all the people who don't realise the gifts and talents inside them because they are sitting on prayer.

You are sitting on gold.

You have a gift to pray, and you don't even realise it.

God has been shining His glory on you, and you're sitting on gold.

Pray and Pray and Pray

It boggles my mind why we do not realise that we should pray and pray and pray.

Look at somebody and tell them:

Pray and pray and pray.

Many people quit praying because God has not changed the situation.

But what do you do when God does not change it?

What do you do when you have been praying, fasting, and believing?

Some of you have given up.

You still come to church.

You still worship.

You still praise.

But deep down, you stopped praying.

Because you thought God didn't hear you.

But prayer closes the gap between the subtle and the suddenly.

You're looking for the suddenly.

But the bridge between subtle and suddenly is your prayer life.

Prayer pushes you into the next dimension.

Prayer is dangerous if it just sits there.

And some of you have stopped praying.

The Danger of Not Praying

- If you stop praying, you will not experience the supernatural.
- If you stop praying, your healing will be delayed.
- If you stop praying, divorce may knock at your door.
- If you stop praying, your children may remain unsaved.
- If you stop praying, contracts will stop flowing.
- If you stop praying, your flesh will win.
- If you stop praying, the devil gains ground.
- If you stop praying, victory is delayed.
- If you stop praying, the journey is prolonged.
- If you stop praying, faith and hope begin to die.
- If you stop praying, dreams begin to fade.
- If you stop praying, depression can settle in.
- If you stop praying, anxiety can take over.
- If you stop praying, you may create cycles your children will have to break.
- If you stop praying, you may abandon your goals.

I came for the people who stopped praying.

You hit a wall.

But the wall is not there for you to knock it down yourself.

It's not by might.

It's not by power.

But by My Spirit, saith the Lord.

Don't stop praying.

Why People Stop Praying

We stop praying for three reasons.

I call it **P3**:

- Purpose
- Power
- Plan

We stop praying because we do not understand the purpose, the power, or the plan of God. Between your potential and your performance is pain.

And how you navigate pain determines whether you reach purpose. You pray well until something makes you cry. You pray well until somebody breaks your heart. You pray well until the answer does not show up at the door.

Then you quit. But Romans 8:28 says:

“And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose.”

You have purpose.

2 Timothy 1:8–9 says God saved us and called us with a holy calling according to His own purpose and grace. Ephesians 2:10 says:

“For we are his workmanship...”

The NLT says:

You are God's masterpiece.

Proverbs 19:21 says: **“There are many devices in a man's heart; nevertheless the counsel of the Lord, that shall stand.”**

Why did you stop praying?

Because God did not answer?

Or because God was changing you into what He wanted you to be?

You Still Have Power

Number two: We stop praying because we forget we have power. And in this life, you're going to need power.

- Dunamis power.
- Explosive power.
- Authority power.

2 Timothy 1:7 says:

“For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind.”

You have power.

- Power against the enemy.
- Power to change.
- Power to be delivered.

Acts 1:8 says:

“But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you.”

Jude 1:20 says:

“But ye, beloved, building up yourselves on your most holy faith, praying in the Holy Ghost.”

Prayer builds power.

Prayer releases strength.

Prayer activates faith.

What happened to your power?

Philippians 4:13 says:

“I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me.”

And Paul said in 2 Corinthians 12:8–9:

Three times I prayed. And God did not remove the thorn. Sometimes the thing God leaves in your life is the thing He uses to shape your power.

Sometimes what He doesn't remove is what He uses to humble you.

You are praying about something, and because it did not go your way, you want to take your ball and go home.

Like a little child, you want to leave because you did not get your way.

But what if God allowed it to break you so that you might have power?

Because when you are broken, you can feed more people. Paul said in 2 Corinthians 12 that after praying three times for the thorn to be removed, God answered:

“My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness.”

Not in your strength.

In your weakness.

That is where many of us struggle.

We want to appear strong in front of everybody.

We want to prove ourselves.

We want to perform.

And then we get frustrated when God keeps allowing weakness to expose us.

But sometimes God is calling you to humility.

Sometimes you have to depend on sufficient grace.

Paul said:

“Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.”

Not my power.

His power.

Trust the Plan of God

We stop praying because we do not understand purpose. We stop praying because we do not understand power.

And thirdly:

We stop praying because we do not understand God’s plan.

You want God to tell you everything.

But God says:

Trust My Word.

Psalm 32:8 says:

“I will instruct thee and teach thee in the way which thou shalt go: I will guide thee with mine eye.”

Psalm 37:23 says:

“The steps of a good man are ordered by the Lord...”

Proverbs 16:9 reminds us:

“A man's heart deviseth his way: but the Lord directeth his steps.”

Philippians 1:6 says:

“Being confident of this very thing, that he which hath begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ.”

Sometimes God starts something in you, and you become frustrated because the process is uncomfortable.

But just because it is uncomfortable does not mean He has stopped.

Jeremiah 29:11 says:

“For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, saith the Lord...”

God says: I know the plans. I have not forgotten My plan over your life. Thoughts of peace. Not evil. To give you an expected end.

A future. And a hope.

Touch somebody and tell them:

It's already done.

God Turns Pain into Power

God is about to take your anger and turn it into anointing.

- Your anguish and turn it into acceptance.
- Your bad and turn it into beauty.
- Your conflict and turn it into the cause of Christ.
- Your doubt and turn it into destiny.
- Your debt and make you dream again.
- Your emptiness and turn it into excellence.
- Your frustration and turn it into fruit.

What looked like garbage, God says:

“I’m going to make it gorgeous.”

He will turn your hell into hallelujah.

Your opposition into opportunity. Your mountain into manifestation. Your pain into power.

- Your problem into promise.
- Your tragedy into trust.
- Your worst into a win.

It’s already done. Somebody shout: **It’s already done!**

Some of you stopped praying, but you do not realise:

One more push.

One more prayer.

And breakthrough is at the door.

Prayer is Partnership

If it is already done, then why do we pray?

Because God wants partnership. He wants divine collaboration. Prayer is not informing God. Prayer is partnering with God. Some of you are used to working for people. But God says: I am elevating you into partnership.

- Partnership means access.
- Partnership means agreement.
- Partnership means responsibility.

But before you are exalted, you must humble yourself. That is where many miss it. They want elevation without humility. But prayer is humility. Prayer is surrender. Prayer is alignment.

Why We Pray

Why do we pray?

- We pray to build our faith.
- We pray to remind the devil his time is short.
- We pray to confirm what God has already done in heaven.
- We pray to shift atmospheres.
- We pray to testify of the goodness of God.
- We pray to motivate others.
- We pray to ignite fire in others.
- We pray to build relationship with God.
- We pray to keep our flesh under subjection.
- We pray to reduce distress.
- We pray to move mountains.
- We pray to develop patience.

- We pray to resolve conflict.
- We pray to prophesy clearly.
- We pray to see the glory of God.
- We pray for clarity.
- We pray to keep from sinning.
- We pray to keep from falling.
- We pray to keep from fighting.
- We pray to keep from addiction.
- We pray to preserve our marriages.
- We pray to preserve our minds.
- We pray to preserve our businesses.
- We pray to preserve our callings.
- We pray to preserve our purpose.

We pray.

Prayer is Spiritual Water

While preaching, I took a drink of water. And the Lord showed me something. As that water moved through my body, I felt it restoring me. And the Holy Ghost said: That is what prayer does.

- Prayer refreshes you.
- Prayer fills you.
- Prayer restores what life drained out of you.

When you pray, something drops inside of you. Something pulls you back into alignment. When you start walking in flesh, prayer pulls you back into spirit.

Jesus said: **“Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled.”** (*Matthew 5:6*)

Are you thirsty? Are you hungry? Because prayer satisfies spiritual thirst.

The God of Gold

And then the Holy Ghost shifted me. He said: You are praying to the God of gold.

The altar of incense was gold. Pure gold. The golden altar represented prayer. The God of gold is the God who meets you at the altar. In the outer court was the brazen altar — judgment.

- Then the laver — cleansing.
- Then the table of showbread — provision.
- Then the golden candlestick — illumination.

But before the priest could enter the Holy of Holies, there was the altar of incense.

Prayer.

He could not go beyond the veil without prayer.

That is the revelation.

You keep fainting because you are trying to go beyond the veil without prayer.

Jesus said:

Men ought always to pray, and not to faint.

- Prayer in the morning.
- Prayer at noon.
- Prayer in the evening.
- Prayer at night.
- Continual prayer.
- Persistent prayer.
- Consistent prayer.

No Strange Fire

God told them:

Do not offer strange incense.

And that speaks loudly even now.

No strange fire.

No witchcraft.

No divination.

No sorcery.

No palm readers.

No psychics.

No ungodly substitutes.

The people of God are called to pray.

Not to dabble in darkness.

We cast out devils.

We plead the blood.

The blood still works.

The blood still covers.

The blood still protects.

The blood still delivers.

Plead the blood over your family.

Plead the blood over your children.

Plead the blood over this generation.

The blood.

The blood.

The blood.

The blood over Gen Z. The blood over Alpha. The blood over schools. The blood over nurseries. The blood over our jails. The blood over our unhoused neighbours. The blood.

I know you said, “*Preacher, where is the blood? Preacher, it’s a golden altar.*” Well, where’s the blood? You missed the text. Look at about verse eight or so.

You missed the text.

I need to show you something, because I’m so tired of our seniors being picked on. They didn’t have as much education. They didn’t have AI. They didn’t have Google. But they had the Holy Ghost. They had power.

And they knew that you better grab ahold of the horns of this altar.

They knew this altar of incense had horns.

Oh, you missed the horns, didn’t you?

These horns came from animals. These horns are what you hold on to until God changes your life.

These horns are what—

Oh God... I feel the anointing.

Gold on Wood

Wait a minute.

I can't explain the horns until I tell you what's underneath the gold.

I told you God was getting ready to partner with you.

You missed it.

Acacia wood is underneath the golden altar of incense.

God says:

“I won't do this without you.”

Wood in Scripture represents humanity. Gold represents divinity. So underneath this altar of incense is wood. It's built in the structure of wood, but the strategy is gold.

Some of you missed it. God has given you a structure called humanity, but He must be the strategy of heaven. In other words: **God says, “I'm going to put My super on your natural.”**

You can't even see it. People don't even recognise you changed. They don't know you used to gang bang.

- They don't know you used to cuss.
- They don't know you used to be loose.
- They don't know you used to be at the club.

You know why?

Because God put His gold on your wood.

Come on.

You didn't get saved by yourself. He snatched you out of the pit of hell. And underneath this gold is acacia wood.

The Danger of Repeating What God Has Already Done

Elder Carter, this blew my mind.

Because acacia wood is akin to gopher wood.

But if you do a deep dive, what blows my mind is this:

Gopher wood was what was used for Noah's ark.

And the reason we don't see gopher wood used again is because God says:

"I allowed this wood to be supernatural."

Here's the problem.

You're trying to repeat something God did supernaturally.

Some things God will do for you instantly.

A miracle.

A healing.

Cheques in the mail.

Money.

A house.

A business.

And then there are other things you're trying to conjure.

That's witchcraft.

That's rebellion against God.

You're trying to conjure up something God has already settled in the heavenlies.

He says:

“Don’t use gopher wood. That’s My thing.”

This is why Moses got in trouble.

The first time, God said:

“Smite the rock.”

He struck it, and water came out.

The second time God said:

“Speak to the rock.”

But Moses got frustrated and hit it again.

God said:

“I never do something like that twice.”

That rock was Christ.

It represented that the Son of Man would only be crucified once.

When you do what God didn’t tell you to do, you crucify Him afresh.

Stop following the devil’s wisdom.

The devil’s wisdom makes you feel good.

The devil’s wisdom puts money in your pocket, but you’re stealing.

The devil’s wisdom says:

“She’s fine. Nobody will find out.”

The devil’s wisdom takes shortcuts.

The Horns of the Altar

Underneath this gold is acacia wood. You're the wood. And gold was on wood at the cross. The God of gold was on wood at Calvary. Everything you need to know about the cross is hidden in the golden altar of incense.

And God says:

“Once a year, on the Day of Atonement, sprinkle blood on these horns.”

This is why the old saints used to say:

“Hold to the horns of the altar.”

Because there are things that will pull you away.

Lust will pull you away.

Money will pull you away.

Opportunity will pull you away. Disobedience will pull you away. Flesh will pull you away. Procrastination will pull you away. People will hurt you.

They call it church hurt now.

But God says:

“Hold on.”

Because on these horns—**there's blood.**

Every time you grab the horn, you grab blood.

Every time you hold on, you're touching sacrifice.

To Every Prayer Warrior Who Dropped Their Torch

God told me:

“Come after every prayer warrior that dropped their torch.”

I’m after you tonight.

You’re backslidden and still saved.

I’m after you.

No wonder Jeremiah said:

“Heal our backslidings.”

Because you keep getting pulled back to a lack of prayer.

And you know you’re a prayer warrior.

If you would open your mouth and pray, people around you would get delivered.

But you’ve become selfish.

The Lord told me to tell you:

Keep praying.

- Pray until they get delivered from methamphetamines.
- Pray until your son gets out of jail.
- Pray until estrangement breaks.
- Pray until joy comes back.
- Pray until holiness comes.
- Pray until glory manifests.

Pray until God does a new thing. Keep praying. Because God says: **“I’ll meet you there.”**

The Persistent Widow

This woman in Luke 18 had vengeance in her spirit. The unjust judge represents the world system. The world doesn't care about you. The text says he didn't fear God and didn't care about people. But the woman—**she kept praying.**

She was a widow. No husband. No support. No backup. But she hit the altar. And she kept praying until demons trembled. She kept praying until the judge answered. She kept praying until things changed. That's what God is calling for.

- Pray until they come home.
- Pray until there's deliverance.
- Pray until the prison doors open.
- Pray until mental illness is cast down.
- Pray until healing comes.
- Pray until breakthrough comes.
- Pray until your faith rises again.
- Pray until joy returns.
- Pray until worship returns.
- Pray until praise breaks out.

Birth It in Prayer

No wonder Hannah prayed: **“Lord, give me a child lest I die.”**

Some of you are not carrying a physical child. But you’re carrying:

- a business
- a dream
- an organisation
- a book
- an idea
- a calling

And God told me to tell you: **Get ready to get pregnant.**

You’re about to birth something. Pray on your most holy faith.

Pray.

He Heard You

And while I was studying, the Holy Ghost said:

“Keep reading.”

He said:

“Bring it back. Rewind.”

And then He showed me Zacharias.

Zacharias was praying in the temple.

Burning incense.

And while he prayed—

Gabriel appeared.

And said:

“Your wife is pregnant.”

Wait a minute...

That’s what God is saying.

When you get into deep prayer, there’s an angel standing beside you.

Gabriel is the messenger.

Michael fights for you.

And Gabriel is there to tell you:

The baby is about to be birthed.

I don’t know who I’m talking to—

but God says:

You’re about to birth something the world has never seen.

He heard you.

You’ve been praying.

You’ve been believing.

And God said:

“I heard you.”

Zacharias—

I heard you.

She’s pregnant.

Go get the bassinet.

Go get the crib.

Get ready to call him son.

Not Zacharias.

John.

Because—I'm **doing a new thing.**

And it was here that I finally understood something.

All this time, I had wanted to go behind the veil. But God said, *“You do not need to go behind the veil.”*

Behind the veil was the Ark of the Covenant. Inside it were three things:

- Aaron's rod that budded — representing fruitfulness.
- The tablets of the covenant — representing divine instruction.
- The pot of manna — representing divine provision.

And God said:

“I will make you fruitful right here if you listen to Me in prayer.”

He said:

“If you follow Me by My Spirit, I will show you what to do and what not to do.”

He said:

“I will provide for you consistently.”

The priest went behind the veil to represent Jesus Christ, who went there once and for all.

When His blood touched the mercy seat, our sins were forgiven forever. That is justification. Just as if I had never sinned. His blood covered:

- past sins,
- present sins,
- future sins.

That does not give us a licence to sin. It means His grace is sufficient. And some of you have stopped praying because you have not forgiven yourself. Some of you have stopped praying because you think until you feel worthy, you cannot pray.

But hear me:

God never required perfection before prayer. He only required surrender.

The God of Gold

He is the God of gold.

- The same God who formed deserts.
- The same God who made the oceans.
- The same God who created mountains and volcanoes.
- That same God lives in you.
