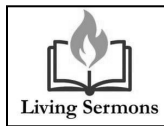

Introduction

Daisy and I are soul winners because we do not want the blood of the unconverted on our hands.

As a young Christian, one of the Bible passages that deeply impressed me was **Ezekiel 3:17–20**.

God specifically speaks to His servants about the purpose of sharing His message with people so that they can be blessed.

Here are some of His words:

"Son of man, I have made thee a watchman unto the house of Israel: therefore hear the word at my mouth, and give them warning from me. When I say unto the wicked, Thou shalt surely die; and thou givest him not warning... the same wicked man shall die in his iniquity; but his blood will I require at thine hand."

— Ezekiel 3:17–18 (KJV)

Again, in **Ezekiel 33:6**, God repeats this message:

"But if the watchman see the sword come, and blow not the trumpet, and the people be not warned... he is taken away in his iniquity; but his blood will I require at the watchman's hand."

— Ezekiel 33:6 (KJV)

Then, in **Ezekiel 33:8**, the same truth is emphasized once more. Here are three witnesses that let us know we can do something about the unconverted that will cause them to be saved instead of being lost.

A Personal Application

I am a great believer in applying Scripture in a personal, practical way.

Let us read one of these verses as though it were spoken directly to every Christian and every soul winner today:

"I have made you a watchman. Therefore hear the word at My mouth and give warning from Me. When I say to sinners, 'You shall surely die,' and you give them no warning, nor speak to warn them of their sinful ways, to save their lives, those same sinners shall die in their iniquity; but their blood will I require at your hand. Yet if you warn sinners and they turn not from their sinfulness nor from their sinful ways, they shall die in their iniquity, but you have delivered your soul."

This truth has motivated my life.

Think about that statement:

"Their blood will I require at your hand."

Each time we read those words, we review our priorities.

That Scripture has motivated Daisy and me since we were teenagers. We do not want the blood of the unconverted required at our hands.

That is another reason we are soul winners.

Why We Share the Gospel

This is why we share the Gospel.

This is why Daisy and I have given—and continue to give—our lives to worldwide Gospel crusades.

We have consistently done everything we can, using every available tool for evangelism, to reach the unreached.

This is why we have led this ministry in sponsoring many thousands of national preachers as Gospel messengers among the unchurched masses.

This is why we publish hundreds of tons of Gospel literature in **132 languages and dialects**.

This is why we produce films, audio recordings, and videotapes in more than **60 major languages** as tools for soul winners and for distribution through mass media.

This is why we have witnessed the enormous growth of this world ministry.

We simply share the Gospel with people.

This is why we stay on the move.

It is the reason for every outreach of this ministry, and why we encourage faithful Christians to become partners with us by sharing in these outreaches.

Our partners become soul winners with us among these forgotten people, and they share the rewards just as much as those who stand on the front lines.

We are people who have received a word from the Lord.

We are giving warning to flee from the wrath to come.

In the words of the Apostle Paul:

"Woe is unto me, if I preach not the gospel!"

— *1 Corinthians 9:16 (KJV)*

We do not want the blood of the unconverted on our hands—whether at home or abroad.

So we choose to be soul winners.

We Minister as Though It Depends on Us

It is up to us.

We do not pretend that we alone can win the whole world to Christ.

But we involve ourselves in evangelism as though God's plan depended on us alone.

If we cannot win everyone, we shall certainly win some.

And we shall minister as though the reaping depended entirely upon us.

A Question from a Businesswoman

A sophisticated businesswoman of prominence was touring our world headquarters in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

She requested to see me and was welcomed into my office.

She was inquisitive and intelligent.

After responding to her questions, she gave me one final observation.

She said,

"Dr. Osborn, you seem to be very wrapped up in what you call world evangelism. Do you think your activities alone will win the whole world to Christ?"

I replied,

"No, Madam. But we intend to be involved as though the entire opportunity were entrusted to us."

She appreciated that answer and later became one of our partners in soul winning.

Taking God's Word Seriously

We are soul winners because we have taken God's Word seriously.

We do not want the blood of the unconverted ever to be required at our hands.

It is as simple as that.

In my estimation, the greatest opportunity in the life of any Christian—not just ministers, but every believer—is to witness to the unconverted.

Christ reaches people only through men and women in whom He lives.

Soul winning is not a pastime.

It is not a hobby.

Soul winning is Christianity in action every day.

As soon as we are saved, we can share Christ with others.

We are His voice.

We are His mouthpiece.

If we are silent, our Christ is silenced.

He can speak only through us.

This is not something we do only when it is convenient.

Soul winning is our number one priority in life.

It is life's greatest opportunity.

If Every Church Made Soul Winning the Priority

Would it not be wonderful if soul winning became the major theme of every Bible school, every youth group, every Sunday school, every Bible conference, and every convention?

Christians are successful in every conceivable art, trade, and profession.

They can also become successful in soul winning.

Why?

Because this is the number one priority of every believer.

More Christians would succeed in soul winning if they were taught that they, individually, are Christ's body, and that Christ ministers and speaks only through the body in which He dwells.

One Way—Jesus, One Job—Evangelism

Spread across the eastern stone wall of the lobby of our world headquarters in Tulsa is a beautiful map of the world.

Positioned on both sides of the map are these words:

One Way—Jesus.

One Job—Evangelism.

The attention of every visitor is drawn to that motto because it expresses the heart of this transworld ministry.

When God loved, He loved a world.

When He gave His Son, He gave Him for a world.

When Christ died, He died for a world.

God's vision is a world vision.

Our vision must be like His.

How Large Is Your Vision?

Many people are localized in their vision.

Some see only their community.

They think only of their church or denomination.

They have little interest beyond those boundaries.

Others have a broader vision that extends to their state, province, or tribe.

They are concerned with evangelizing that region, but they do not feel responsible beyond it.

Still others see their entire nation. They pray and give for the evangelization of their own country. Yet even they remain local in their vision. Their soul-winning interest is nationalistic.

Others have an even broader vision that reaches their continent. They are committed to continental evangelism and are willing to make sacrifices to reach their continent. Yet even they are still localized.

A John 3:16 Vision

Then there are those Christians who have God's vision.

I call it a **John 3:16 vision**.

They see Europe.

Asia.

Africa.

North America.

South America.

Australia.

The island nations.

They see the whole world.

Every creature.

They possess a transworld vision.

With jet aircraft, television, and satellite communications, we now live on a small, crowded planet.

As Christians, our vision can truly become a world vision.

Racial and political barriers are just as foreign to God's plan as denominational and sectarian walls have always been.

Christians no longer ask,

"What church do you belong to?"

Or,

"What creed do you follow?"

Instead, they ask,

"Do you know Jesus Christ, the Son of God, as your personal Saviour and Lord?"

Looking at the World from Above

Many times we have boarded airplanes at international airports, climbed to great altitudes, and looked down upon the vast countryside below.

We have flown over nations, continents, oceans, islands, and then more nations.

As I have looked down from those heights, I have often thought about the soul winners we left behind.

Many of them had once been localized in their vision.

They had been limited by culture, attitudes, religious philosophy, denominational traditions, clubs, or societies.

They had never looked beyond the borders of their city, region, or nation.

Many had never expanded their world through travel or through reading.

But after our ministry, they gained God's viewpoint of the world.

Their vision was no longer localized.

They became concerned for the whole world.

As a result of our seminars, we now know of Africans engaged in evangelism in China, South Americans winning souls in Alaska, Indonesians reaching the lost in Europe, and Asians ministering throughout the Caribbean.

The light God imparted to us when He gave us eternal life can shine into dark places throughout the world.

As we share God's vision and understand the basic truth of Christianity—that we are Christ's body—we become the vessels through which He reaches His world.

I have often said,

"Today we travel to Africa or China as easily as we once drove to Alabama or Missouri."

Around the Clock—Around the World

Another vital part of the motto displayed in the lobby of our world headquarters is this:

Around the Clock—Around the World.

Our actions reveal our priorities.

If transworld soul winning is truly our priority, then we will give it first place.

That is why most of our crusades are conducted overseas.

It is why most of our literature is published in languages spoken by people far away.

It is why most of our funds are invested abroad.

It is why most of our evangelism projects are designed for the unreached.

It is why most of our films, tapes, cassettes, and other evangelistic tools are prepared for soul winning in other nations and for mass media overseas. We practice what we preach.

World evangelism is top priority for Daisy and me.

It is our number one choice.

It is the ministry nearest to God's heart.

It is the one ministry Christ has authorized every believer to share in.

When something becomes your highest priority, you invest more in it than in anything else.

You give more time to it.

More energy.

More planning.

More effort.

More thought.

More money.

Ultimately, you give your very life.

World evangelism is our highest priority because it is the surest way to ensure that the blood of the unconverted will never be required at our hands.

The Best Missionary Program Is a Personal Lifestyle

I say this is our highest priority because we take it personally.

Christ includes every born-again child of God in His Great Commission.

It does no good to outline a fine doctrine, theory, or proposition unless it is expressed through one's personal lifestyle.

I once lectured in a church on investing in evangelism overseas.

Afterward, the pastor took me aside and said,

"Dr. Osborn, you changed me today.

I never viewed Gospel work abroad as a personal opportunity.

I always assumed it belonged to our foreign missionaries.

I never realized I could personally become a Gospel messenger abroad, even if I never traveled overseas myself."

Then he continued,

"I never realized I could invest financially to sponsor someone in my place, or send printed messages and recorded preaching on my behalf."

He added,

"I always took great pride in my denomination's missionary program.

I believed it was the best.

I told everyone about it.

But it was not what I was doing that I was proud of—it was what my denomination was doing.

I talked about our organization, our large program, and our mission projects.

But, Dr. Osborn, I confess today that I never personally invested in missions.

I placed a small offering in the collection, but that was about all.

Now I understand that if every member of my organization had done only what I did, we would have had no soul-winning program at all.

It had become a denominational project to me—not a personal ministry."

Soul Winning Is Our Highest Priority

Our highest priority is soul winning.

My friend, soul winning is not reserved for missionaries, preachers, or evangelists.

You and I can do it.

It is our priority.

Our privilege.

Our opportunity.

Our life.

Our passion.

Our joy.

Our fulfillment.

Our reward.

Christians have been inadvertently impressed that only professional clergy can serve as ministers.

But who said that?

Christ dwells in every believer.

Every Christian is His witness.

Every convert is His mouthpiece.

Christ desires to speak through every believer who can walk and talk.

We are His witnesses.

Millions who may never listen to a member of the clergy will gladly hear the sincere, personal testimony of a consecrated believer. With the tools available today, any Christian can become a successful and joyful witness for Christ—at home, in the local community, in neighboring regions, or even overseas.

Anyone can do it.

Anyone who wishes to travel can carry a tape recorder, recorded messages, Christian literature, or other Gospel tools and witness anywhere in the world.

What a joy it is to serve as Christ's mouthpiece, His messenger, and His representative.

An Elderly Soul Winner

An elderly man once wept as he grasped my hand.

He showed me his old, worn tape recorder and said,

"Dr. Osborn, you're my preacher. I carry you with me on tape from house to house, into hospitals, jails, and convalescent homes. I put you on that old machine, and you preach for me."

Tears rolled down the dear man's cheeks as he continued,

"Then I pray for the listeners, and they get saved. They get healed. Oh, how glad I am to be a soul winner! Thank God, Dr. Osborn, that in the autumn years of my life I have learned to win souls through what you've inspired me to do."

Wasn't that wonderful?

Think what could happen if every believer became a practical soul winner—a practical mouthpiece and representative for Jesus Christ.

Soul Winning Is Our Passion

Daisy and I consider it our highest priority to do everything we can to win souls.

We choose soul winning.

We think soul winning.

We dream about soul winning.

It is our passion.

Our zeal.

Our life's motivation.

As we surrender ourselves completely to Christ, who lives within us, we discover our greatest joy in witnessing for Him, because it is He who is working within us.

We continually remember the greatness of God's love for us.

The Bible says,

"And hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us."

— Romans 5:5 (KJV)

The same love that motivated Him now motivates us.

Dreams Become Vision

Since our youth, we have dreamed of ways to witness for Christ.

Those dreams became visions.

Those visions inspired us to pray.

Faith put action to those prayers.

Soon those dreams became living, vibrant realities in our lives.

Years ago, Daisy and I attended one of **Dr. Oswald J. Smith's** missionary conventions in Toronto, Canada.

As we sat in the People's Church listening to him speak, we dreamed of sending national foot soldiers to the frontiers of evangelism to carry the Gospel into regions beyond.

If people could have read our minds that day, they might have laughed at us as youthful, emotional visionaries.

Many ministers listened to that distinguished missionary leader.

They admired his vision.

They carefully noted the statistics he shared.

They were impressed.

Yet very few acted upon what they heard.

That stately gentleman was kindling an unquenchable fire in the hearts of one young couple.

A new vision was being conceived.

Soon the program of national evangelism was born. A new day dawned for sharing the Gospel worldwide.

Pace Setters with Purpose

From that day until now, no Gospel leader overseas has ever needed to say,

"We would reach the unreached in our area, but we have no funds."

Instead, we have provided financial assistance to Gospel leaders throughout the world so they could send qualified national preachers as full-time messengers into unreached regions where there is no church and no Gospel witness.

By God's grace, we have already sponsored Gospel witness in more than **130,000 previously unreached towns, villages, tribes, and communities.**

Yes, you heard me correctly.

More than **130,000.**

Our office records document these accomplishments.

For several years, at least **one new national church every day** has been opened, established, and strengthened until it became fully self-supporting, allowing our assistance to move on to another unreached area.

That amounts to nearly **400 new churches every year.**

You see, this is not theory.

This principle works. Every arm of our world ministry has followed the same pattern.

First there was a dream. Then a vision. Then prayer.

Then faith. Then action.

Finally, an outreach that has reached millions of lost souls.

The Starting Point

The starting point is simple.

Believe the Scriptures.

Believe the message of our Lord.

Then dedicate yourself to sharing that message with others.

That commitment inspires us to think creatively and dream of new ways to win souls.

There are countless ideas for soul winning that any believing Christian can put into practice.

I believe every sincere believer can do something genuinely effective to reach people for Christ.

Thinkers Become Creators

All thinkers are creators.

All achievers begin as dreamers.

They think.

They plan.

Then they act.

Some criticize.

Others evangelize.

People who receive ideas from God and accomplish something with them are almost always criticized.

Criticism frequently follows success.

Critics usually walk behind achievers.

While some criticize, others evangelize.

Those who truly succeed learn never to react to criticism.

They maintain a positive attitude.

If we become reactionary, we will spend our time defending ourselves.

When we do that, we are destined to lose.

Everyone who succeeds in life eventually discovers that criticism is often admiration expressed in disguise.

People usually criticize the person who is out in front.

People with Problems or People with Solutions

We have learned that criticism is one of the cheapest commodities in the world.

There is always an abundant supply.

It is certainly not worth our reaction.

There are only two kinds of people:

Those with problems.

And those with solutions.

We choose to be people with solutions.

The person who has solutions is always in demand.

Anyone can create problems.

Anyone can discuss them.

Anyone can analyze them.

Anyone can categorize them.

But only the thinker...

The creator...

The achiever...

The person of action...

Produces solutions.

One of the finest pieces of advice we have ever read simply says:

"Don't fight the problem. Get on with the solution."

That principle has shaped our ministry.

Action Instead of Discussion

We have not spent our lives holding conferences about how to succeed in evangelism.

We have been spreading the Gospel.

That is the solution.

We have not searched out church leaders merely to discuss the divisions among Christian workers.

Instead, we have pursued cooperative soul winning. We have not merely talked about the need for Christian literature.

We have supplied it.

That is the solution.

We have not spent our time analyzing the problems of reaching unreached people.

We have applied the solution.

We have sponsored an army of Gospel messengers and provided tons of soul-winning tools.

The enemies of the Gospel have their eyes upon the masses.

So do we.

The difference is that we are doing something that works.

Our Policy

Our policy is simple.

Action—not conventions.

Action—not theories.

Action—not propositions.

Solutions—not problems.

Answers—not endless resolutions.

You can spend your entire life discussing the problems involved in soul winning.

But what the world needs is action.

Solutions.

Answers.

It costs nothing to sit in a discussion group elaborating on the problems of evangelism.

That is why committees are always easy to fill.

You can always find people willing to analyze difficulties and explain complexities.

But the one who produces solutions pays a high price to serve humanity.

Solutions cost money.

Solutions cost lives.

Solutions demand dedication.

Anyone can deliberate.

We want to be people who discover ideas that lead to success.

The millions of unreached people throughout the world certainly present a problem.

But we are not interested merely in discussing that problem.

National evangelism is a solution that is working.

So we continue doing it.

Our films are solutions.

Millions have already been reached through them.

The same is true of our recorded audio messages, video messages, mobile evangelism units, and the countless tons of Gospel literature we distribute.

We are advancing the solutions—not merely analyzing the problems.

Turning Commercial Methods into Gospel Tools

While ministering in Africa, a pastor showed us a commercial company operating a fleet of fifteen beautiful four-wheel-drive vehicles.

Each vehicle was equipped to show secular films.

They continually traveled from village to village, gathered large crowds, showed films, advertised their products, and then sold those products throughout the villages.

Their company was making impressive profits.

Some church leaders were lamenting the situation.

They said,

"Think of it. Those villages are being reached with beer, cigarettes, liquor, and countless commercial products, yet we are not reaching them with the Gospel."

I turned to Daisy and said,

"It will accomplish nothing to sit here discussing the problem.

We can provide a solution."

Out of that meeting, our **Transworld Mobile Evangelism Crusade** was born.

We began supplying fully equipped mobile evangelism units to active soul-winning ministries reaching the unreached.

Since then, we have shipped more than **100 large mobile evangelism units** overseas.

Each unit carries every evangelistic tool we produce in the language of that region, along with **at least one million Gospel tracts.**

That is a solution.

A practical solution.

The commercial world is doing it.

And so are we.

The important thing is this:

We are doing it.

We are not merely talking about it.

The One Who Counts

I would rather place my reputation on the line by doing something for evangelism—sending beautiful mobile evangelism units to believers serving throughout developing nations—than remain comfortably at home criticizing someone else's efforts.

Whose opinion truly counts?

A famous statesman once said:

"It is not the critic who counts; not the man who points out how the strong man stumbled, or where the doer of deeds could have done them better. The credit belongs to the man who is actually in the arena... whose face is marred by dust and sweat and blood... who strives valiantly... who errs and comes short again and again... but who spends himself in a worthy cause... who knows the triumph of high achievement... and who, if he fails, at least fails while daring greatly."

Yes, criticism—and the people who constantly produce it—will always abound.

But those who create and apply solutions are rare.

They are valuable.

Critics come and go.

They rise and they fall. But problem-solvers become the pillars of society. It is not enough to bewail the sinfulness of this generation.

You and I have the solution. We are Christian witnesses. We are soul winners.

Equip yourself with good Gospel literature. Carry it with you. Distribute it wherever you go. Invest a small amount in good Gospel audio messages and the means to share them. Then go where people are and be a witness for Christ.

Many Christian authors and ministries are producing excellent books, recordings, films, and other evangelistic tools for soul winners.

These resources have proven effective throughout the world. They have been prepared to help believers become more successful in sharing Christ.

As the Scripture declares:

"For we are labourers together with God."

— *1 Corinthians 3:9 (KJV)*

That is who we are.

We are labourers together with Him.

Seed as You Breed

We are soul winners because we do not want the blood of sinners required at our hands. After discovering the joy of soul winning in your own community or nation, take the next step.

Plant some of the resources God has entrusted to you in helping soul winners overseas. You can sponsor Gospel tools for national Christian workers serving in other nations.

You may provide recorded messages in one of many major languages for village evangelism, just as you have learned to witness among your own people. In that way, you become personally involved in evangelism abroad.

You also share in the reward of every soul won through that national Christian witness.

Sponsor literature for neglected villages.

Anointed books.

Recorded messages.

Gospel tracts.

These tools never grow weary.

They never change their message. They never compromise. They never argue.

They never become immoral. They remain among the finest Gospel messengers in the world. They go in your place. They become your representatives. They bear witness to Christ in your name. Whatever has blessed your life can bless countless others around the world.

And you will share in the eternal reward.

Put Action to Your Convictions

It is not enough merely to think...

Or talk...

Or pray.

Put action to your convictions.

Do something today while the fire is burning.

Never allow that fire to die.

Keep stirring it.

Act upon it.

It will burn even brighter.

When you dedicate yourself to this highest priority, then, if the unconverted refuse to turn from their sinful ways, they will indeed die in their iniquity.

We cannot change that.

But as God declared through Ezekiel:

"...thou hast delivered thy soul."

— *Ezekiel 33:9 (KJV)*

We Are Soul Winners Because We Have Seen It

Daisy and I are soul winners because of what we have experienced.

For more than three decades we have conducted mass evangelism crusades in over seventy nations.

The response has always been remarkably consistent.

Our most recent crusades have produced the same results as those we conducted during our earliest ministry.

The same strategy.

The same Gospel.

The same hunger.

The same multitudes.

The same miracles.

The same results.

Human beings come and go.

But the Gospel never changes.

When it is proclaimed in the power of the Holy Spirit, it produces the same results in every generation.

Throughout the world we have proven that people of every race, religion, and culture desire to know God.

They may possess forms of worship.

They may practice religious traditions and superstitions.

Yet without Christ, their spirits remain unsatisfied.

They continue searching for reality.

They long for peace but never find it.

They seek God but cannot truly know Him apart from Jesus Christ.

Daisy and I have proven in more than seventy nations that when people hear the Gospel presented in simple language and, as Paul declared,

"My speech and my preaching was not with enticing words of man's wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power."

— 1 Corinthians 2:4 (KJV)

They eagerly respond to receive Jesus Christ as their Saviour.

The Power of Christ Over Fear

In Nigeria we never preached against juju charms or fetishes that people wore around their necks, waists, arms, and legs.

Instead, we simply taught them about Christ and how to receive Him into their lives.

Once they experienced Him, they began removing those charms themselves.

They threw them onto the platform.

We collected large burlap sacks filled with those charms and later burned them, just as believers did in the days of the early church.

The Bible records:

"Many of them also which used curious arts brought their books together, and burned them before all men..."

— Acts 19:18–20 (KJV)

Their reasoning was beautifully simple.

If the Son of the great Creator God came to live within them, they no longer needed charms to protect them from evil spirits.

Christ Himself was enough.

Our First Mission to India

We are soul winners because of what we have experienced.

When Daisy and I first went to India, we were only twenty and twenty-one years old.

There were very few miracles in our ministry.

We did not yet understand miracle faith.

We led a few people to Christ.

But, for the most part, we failed.

When we preached Jesus Christ, He was politely accepted as simply another good god to add to the many others they already worshipped.

Nothing changed.

Muslims reasoned with us.

They asked,

"How do you know Jesus Christ is God's Son? How do you know God raised Him from the dead? That is not true. Jesus Christ is dead. He was a good man, but He was not God's Son, and He certainly did not rise from the dead."

They insisted the Qur'an was God's Word and Muhammad was His prophet.

We declared that the Bible was God's Word and Jesus Christ was His Son.

Then they challenged us.

"Prove it."

We replied,

"Look at these verses."

We began reading from the Scriptures.

Immediately they answered,

"No. That is not God's Word. Reading from your book proves nothing."

Then they opened the Qur'an.

There stood two beautiful black books embossed with gold lettering.

One was the Bible.

The other was the Qur'an.

How could we prove which one truly revealed the living God?

Without miracles, we could not.

Jesus Appeared

We returned to America sick at heart, discouraged, and broken in spirit.

But thank God—we did not quit.

We fasted.

We prayed.

We knew those precious people needed Christ.

We longed to win them.

What was the answer?

One morning at six o'clock, Jesus appeared.

I awakened to find Jesus Christ standing in our bedroom.

As I looked upon Him, I lay there as though dead.

I could not move a finger.

I could not move a toe.

Tears flowed freely from my eyes, though I was scarcely aware I was weeping.

I do not know how long I gazed into His penetrating eyes before He disappeared. Nor do I know how much time passed before I could move from my bed. Eventually I pulled myself onto the floor.

Face down.

Prostrate before Him.

I remained there until the afternoon.

But when I finally walked out of that room, I was a new man.

I had met Jesus.

He was no longer merely a religion.

He was alive.

He was real.

I had seen Him.

He became Lord of my life.

Everything changed.

The opinions of denominational leaders would never again become the controlling influence of my life. My ambition to climb the ladder within my church denomination vanished. From that day forward, pleasing Jesus became the passion of my life. Since then, what people say or think has mattered very little.

I discovered the living Christ.

And He became Lord of my life.

The Gospel Confirmed with Miracles

Not long after that experience, a man of God came to our city preaching and ministering to the sick.

We witnessed hundreds of conversions.

We saw instant miracles of healing.

It seemed as though ten thousand voices cried out within me,

"You can do that!

That is what Jesus did.

That is what Peter did.

That is what Paul did.

Those Bible days are still for today."

I knew then that Christ could do the same works through me.

He had not changed.

So we went after the unconverted.

Jamaica, Puerto Rico, and Haiti

Our first major campaign took us to Jamaica.

In just thirteen weeks, more than **9,000 people** accepted Jesus Christ.

More than **90 totally blind people** received their sight.

Over **100 deaf people** had their hearing restored.

Hundreds of other miracles took place as the Lord fulfilled His promise.

Exactly as Mark records:

"And they went forth, and preached everywhere, the Lord working with them, and confirming the word with signs following."

— *Mark 16:20 (KJV)*

Next we flew to Puerto Rico.

The crowds were even larger.

They came because they longed for reality.

As the Bible says,

"...and a great multitude followed him, because they saw his miracles which he did on them that were diseased."

— *John 6:2 (KJV)*

Then came Haiti.

Again, the crowds overflowed every available building.

People filled the surrounding yards.

Even the roads became crowded with those hungry to hear the Gospel.

After that came Cuba.

By then it was becoming clear that these were not isolated spiritual visitations.

A pattern was emerging.

Tradition Said It Could Not Continue

Despite these victories, tradition continued speaking loudly within the institutional church.

Well-meaning ministers tried to prepare us for what they believed was inevitable failure.

They sincerely advised us not to expect such results everywhere.

Some suggested that God occasionally ordained extraordinary seasons of blessing, but that such miracles could never become the normal pattern.

They urged us to prepare for both victories and defeats.

They insisted that God simply worked that way so we would remain humble.

To us, those explanations sounded more like tradition than Scripture.

We could not accept them.

We Believe the Great Commission

We remained convinced that the Great Commission belongs to every nation and every creature.

Jesus declared:

"And these signs shall follow them that believe..."

— *Mark 16:17 (KJV)*

He never mentioned exceptions.

He promised His presence and power **"unto the end of the world."** (*Matthew 28:20*).

That is what we believe.

We believe that people in every nation will believe when they witness the miracles of Jesus Christ.

It seemed perfectly logical to us that if we faithfully preached the Gospel—the Good News—Christ would confirm His Word with miracles.

We stood firmly on that conviction.

We were not preparing ourselves for failure then.

Neither are we preparing for failure today.

We believe in success because Jesus never fails.

His Word never fails.

The Gospel never fails.

People Are the Same Everywhere

When we arrived in Cuba, spiritual leaders again cautioned us.

They spoke about balance.

Patience.

Realistic expectations.

They explained that Cuba would surely be different from Jamaica, Puerto Rico, or Haiti.

Their reasoning was that Jamaica already possessed a strong Christian heritage.

Puerto Rico, they said, had been greatly influenced by the United States.

But Cuba was different.

Its people were deeply religious.

Perhaps the results would not be the same.

Yet people are people everywhere.

Despite all those sincere warnings, Cuba proved to be exactly the same.

An organized procession of one hundred religious leaders marched through the streets warning the public not to attend our crusade.

Nevertheless, tens of thousands came.

Multitudes turned to the Lord.

Every crusade in Cuba became a massive gathering.

After Cuba came Venezuela.

There, once again, local leaders told us,

"Things are different here. Religious opposition is much stronger. You are now on the South American continent..."

Some warned us before we entered Venezuela.

"You could be stoned to death," they said.

But Venezuela proved to be exactly like Cuba.

Multitudes believed.

Thousands were saved.

It was no different.

Then we traveled to Japan.

Before we arrived, many letters reached us saying,

"Don't come. Japan is different. Miracles are not for this land. The Japanese seek academic enlightenment. They look to their ancestors as their spiritual source."

Others wrote,

"There are already too many healing cults in Japan. We Christians do not want our faith identified with those healers. Miracles will never convince the Japanese concerning Jesus Christ."

Still others explained,

"Japan is Buddhist and Shinto. You are accustomed to preaching in the Western Hemisphere where people already believe the Bible. They believe Jesus is the Son of God and that His blood was shed for sin. The Japanese will never believe that. They are not emotional people. They will not respond."

Tradition Could Not Explain It

The continued success of our crusades seemed to threaten the very foundation of long-established church traditions.

At that time it was almost unheard of for someone to enter a nation, preach openly in public places, and see thousands come to Christ repeatedly.

Many concluded,

"It must be emotionalism."

Others insisted,

"Those converts cannot possibly endure."

They reminded us that earlier missionaries had labored patiently for years to win only a handful of converts.

Those few converts, they said, were solid.

Handpicked.

Genuine.

I can still hear people proudly talking about those "good old solid converts"—that precious handful that required years to reach.

According to them, this "Osborn-style" mass evangelism was superficial.

It would never stand the test of time.

One pastor in India told me,

"I've ministered here for five years and have never won a single soul. That's simply the way it is. You must learn patience."

Yet, quietly, a revolutionary pattern was taking shape.

There Are No Exceptions

It seems that traditional minds naturally reject anything new that challenges established policies and accepted positions.

Yet God wanted to demonstrate to His people everywhere that there are no exceptions in Gospel evangelism.

His Great Commission proves effective wherever the Gospel is proclaimed with living faith and obedient action.

Not every church leader in Japan was pessimistic.

Some wrote encouraging letters saying,

"Come and help us. Modernism will never save Japan. Our people must see miracles."

I still remember the words of a Baptist pastor who wrote,

"Japan is full of counterfeit healing teachers. The Japanese need to see the real thing. Our modern churches lack miracle power. Come, and help us. You have what we need to win this wonderful nation to Christ."

We accepted the challenge.

Japan proved to be exactly like Jamaica.

Exactly like Cuba.

Exactly like Venezuela.

When the Japanese witnessed the miracles of Christ, they cried.

They wept.

They repented.

In fact, they often responded with even greater emotion than people in many other nations.

Kyoto Responded to Christ

We conducted meetings in historic Kyoto, the religious heart of Japan.

Thousands gathered in a large open field near the center of the city to hear the Gospel.

During one crusade alone, **forty-four deaf people** testified that they had been healed.

Many other mighty miracles took place.

Those devoted Buddhists and Shinto worshippers responded just like the Jamaicans and Cubans.

Thousands believed on Christ.

The Japanese were no different from people anywhere else.

Then Came Thailand

Next we traveled to Thailand, the stronghold of Southeast Asian Buddhism.

Again we heard the familiar warnings.

"Daisy and T. L.,"

they said,

"This will not be like Japan. The Japanese have been influenced by the American occupation after the war. They are accustomed to Westerners. But Thailand is different. These are traditional Buddhists. They have never been ruled by foreign powers. They will not listen to foreigners."

When we first ministered there, fewer than a dozen people in the entire nation had received the baptism of the Holy Spirit.

Even they hesitated to preach publicly because they believed such an approach violated Thai culture.

They considered public evangelism too aggressive for such a gentle and reserved people.

But everything changed when they witnessed Christ at work.

When the blind received sight...

When cripples walked...

When lepers were cleansed...

When the deaf heard...

Their response was exactly the same as the Japanese...

The Venezuelans...

The Cubans...

The Puerto Ricans...

And the Jamaicans.

They gladly received the living Christ and enthusiastically began following Him.

Today, thousands of Spirit-filled believers worship throughout Thailand, and strong soul-winning ministries continue to flourish there.

Indonesia: Reaching the Muslims

When we first ministered on the island of Java in Indonesia, approximately ninety-five percent of the population was Muslim.

Throughout the world we had been told how difficult Muslims were to reach.

After all, they do not believe Jesus is the Son of God.

Neither do they believe God raised Him from the dead.

Daisy and I remembered how helpless we had felt years earlier in India when we tried to convince Muslims through argument alone.

But by the time we arrived in Jakarta, everything was different.

We had learned to believe God for miracles.

Thank God.

If Christ Is Alive

On the very first night, I did something unusual.

At the close of my message I told the audience,

"I do not expect you to accept Jesus Christ unless He proves Himself alive through undeniable miracles."

I explained that a dead Christ could do them no good.

I reminded them that Jesus was confirmed by miracles two thousand years ago.

If He is alive today, then God will once again confirm that fact by performing undeniable miracles before their eyes.

They already knew about the historical Jesus.

They acknowledged that He had been a good man.

Many even believed He was a prophet who performed miracles.

They knew He had been crucified.

But they believed the Christian message of His resurrection was false.

There is only one message that truly answers such unbelief:

If Jesus Christ is alive...

Let Him do today the miracles He performed before His crucifixion.

If He is dead, He cannot.

If He is risen, He will.

A Muslim Priest Receives a Miracle

I invited deaf people to come forward.

I told the audience,

*"I will pray in the name of Jesus. If Christ is dead, His name has no power.
But if He is alive, He will do today what He did before He was crucified."*

The very first person presented for prayer was a Muslim priest about fifty-five years old.

He wore the traditional black fez, indicating that he had completed the pilgrimage to Mecca.

He had been totally deaf in one ear from birth.

He had never heard a single sound through that ear.

I first spoke to him about Jesus Christ.

Then I explained how I would pray.

I told him that God was looking upon us.

I testified that God had raised His Son from the dead.

I explained that God desired people to know Jesus Christ is alive and would therefore demonstrate His resurrection through this miracle.

Then I turned to the audience and said,

"If this man does not hear when I finish praying, you may say that I am a false preacher and that Jesus Christ is dead. But if he hears, you will know that Christ is risen, because a dead Christ cannot perform such a miracle."

I looked at the man and prayed,

"That it may be known that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, that God raised Him from the dead, and that only through Jesus and His shed blood can we come to God and receive eternal life, let this be made known according to the Scriptures by causing this deaf ear to hear, in the name of Jesus Christ. Amen."

The entire audience gasped.

That Muslim priest immediately began hearing even the faintest whisper.

He could hear the ticking of a small watch.

Thousands lifted their hands that night, expressing their desire to receive Jesus Christ as their Saviour.

How different this was from the embarrassment we had experienced years earlier in India when we tried to argue Muslims into believing the Gospel.

Those Muslims responded just like the Japanese.

When they witnessed the proof of the Gospel, they believed.

Christianity Is More Than Another Religion

Christianity without miracles cannot demonstrate that Jesus Christ is alive.

Remove the miraculous from Christianity, and all that remains is another religion.

Muslims know that Muhammad is dead.

But we know that Jesus Christ is alive.

When that truth is demonstrated by the power of God, people leave the dead prophet and follow the living Saviour.

Without miracles, there is no demonstration.

That is why Jesus commissioned every believer to preach the Gospel to all the world, promising that supernatural signs would follow among all nations until the end of the age.

He knew miracles would always reveal to the world that Jesus Christ is alive.

The Difference Between India and Indonesia

When we were young missionaries in India, Muslims challenged us,

"Prove that your Christ lives."

At that time we were helpless.

Embarrassed.

We had only two choices.

Either settle into a life of patient endurance without results...

Or discover God's answer.

We could not accept a ministry without results.

Indonesia was different.

One evening during a great campaign, a young Muslim priest, filled with anger, rushed toward the platform while I was preaching.

He intended to interrupt the meeting.

Daisy noticed him first.

She intercepted him before he reached the platform.

He exclaimed,

"That man is false! Jesus is dead! He is not God's Son! Let me speak to the people about Muhammad, God's true prophet!"

Daisy tried to reason with him, but he was too emotional.

Finally she said,

"Listen. I am a Christian, and I will interrupt my husband on one condition. You and I will go together to the microphone. We will not argue. Instead, we will discover which prophet is alive."

She continued,

"Let us call for someone who is totally blind. You pray first in the name of Muhammad. If that person receives sight, we will believe your prophet. But if no miracle happens, then I will pray in the name of Jesus. If that blind person sees, then you and your people will know that what the Bible says is true—that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, that God raised Him from the dead, and that He is the Saviour of the world."

People Everywhere Want the Living Christ

The young Muslim priest refused Daisy's challenge, turned away, and left in a rage.

This was something we could not have done in India as young missionaries. But finally, fourteen years later, we experienced the joy of returning to India, where we had so miserably failed.

We returned to the same university city where we had been unable to prove to the Hindus and Muslims that Jesus Christ is the living, resurrected Son of God—the Savior of the world.

This time, we were different.

Crowds of between 20,000 and 40,000 people gathered in front of the great stadium grounds. We preached that:

"Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever"

— *Hebrews 13:8 (KJV)*

Then we prayed.

The deaf heard. The crippled walked. Blind people received their sight. Lepers were cleansed. Thousands accepted Christ.

Jesus was showing Himself alive to India through us.

Our search for truth had paid off.

This is the way world evangelism was meant to be carried out.

Acts 1:3 KJV says that Christ: "**shewed himself alive after his passion by many infallible proofs**".

Jesus Showed Himself Alive

A young Hindu university student stood in the crowd, ridiculing everything that was taking place.

When we prayed, Jesus Christ suddenly appeared to him, dressed in a purple robe. He opened His nail-pierced hands, stretched them toward the young man, and spoke these words:

"Behold my hands. I am Jesus."

The young man fell to the ground weeping, repenting, and sobbing.

Then he rushed to the microphone. With tears streaming down his face, he told the people what he had seen and urged them to believe on Jesus Christ.

How different it was from our meetings fourteen years earlier.

With miracles, India proved to be the same as every other nation.

Africa Was No Different

Next, it was Africa.

Again, we proved that people are the same everywhere.

A Muslim beggar, paralyzed by polio, had crawled on the ground for thirty years. He dragged himself through the dirt until he reached the crusade.

He listened to the Gospel.

When he believed on Jesus Christ, he was instantly and completely healed.

He walked through the crowd and came onto the platform before the multitude to show everyone the miracle he had received.

Standing there in tears, he cried out:

*"Jesus Christ must be alive! Otherwise, how could He have healed me?
Muhammad is dead, but Jesus is alive! Look at me! You know me! I've
begged in your streets. Now I can walk. Look! This Jesus lives!"*

What greater sermon could be preached than that?

It sounded like the Book of Acts being reenacted in our own generation.

The Gospel Is the Power of God

Around the world, we have seen that people want the living Christ.

They seek reality.

They believe when they have proof that Jesus is alive and real today.

God made all human beings alike.

People were created to walk with God. Instinctively they seek Him.

That is why every unevangelized tribe practices some kind of religious ritual in search of God.

The Gospel, presented straightforwardly and in simple terms—not merely explained but proclaimed—is:

"the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth"

— *Romans 1:16 (KJV)*

People want the Gospel.

Our task is to preach it, witness it, tell it, and confess it everywhere—to crowds or to individuals, in public places or in private homes.

People want what we have.

We have proven this around the world.

That is another great reason why we are soul winners.

Europe Is No Different

The cynic may say,

"That may be true among people in developing nations, but not in the industrialized world."

Yet one of the greatest crusades we ever conducted—with audiences numbering more than 150,000 people in a single meeting—was held in the capital city of Holland.

Culture has reached few greater heights than sophisticated Europe.

Yet when they saw the miracles, multiplied thousands were saved for the first time in their lives. It has proven to be the same throughout Europe, Great Britain, and North America.

Two Kinds of Christian Workers

There are only two kinds of preachers or Christian workers:

- Negative and positive.
- Doubters and believers.

Some think that if they preach on the streets, no one will listen.

They believe passersby will laugh at them.

They assume the literature they distribute will be thrown on the ground.

They expect doors to be slammed in their faces.

That is a negative attitude toward a very positive opportunity.

We believe differently.

We believe that when we preach on the streets, crowds will gather, eager to hear the message.

We believe people passing by will be delighted to see Christians witnessing openly.

We believe that when we distribute Gospel literature, it will be gladly received, treasured, and read.

We believe that when we knock on doors, we will find families who welcome our help, sick people who need healing, people with problems that need solutions, and hearts and ears open to the counsel and prayers of dedicated Christians filled with living faith.

That is the positive approach.

And it works.

Our Priority Until Christ Returns

We are soul winners. We have proven, in every conceivable circumstance around the world, that people want Christ when they know He is alive and real.

They long for God.

They long for His salvation.

They long for eternal life.

They were made in God's image to be like Him, to walk with Him, and to fellowship with Him.

They will never be content until they find Jesus Christ, who said:

"I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me."

— *John 14:6 (KJV)*

With sixty million unreached people being added to our generation every year—people seeking light and life—our priority is to witness, to share the Gospel, and to produce soul-winning tools for Christians.

This remains our priority until Christ returns.

Outbreak in Soul Winning

We first published these **Seven Reasons Why We Are Soul Winners** in our magazine, *Faith Digest*.

That magazine has reached hundreds of thousands of Christians and Gospel ministers in more than 130 nations around the world. Letters poured into our offices from every continent, describing this series as one of the most challenging teachings on soul winning ever presented.

Hundreds of believers, preachers, teachers, missionaries, and national leaders rededicated themselves to reaching the unconverted with fresh passion. Tens of thousands of Christians began taking Gospel literature, anointed messages on cassette, and other soul-winning tools into markets, streets, homes, jails, and hospitals.

They became active in personal evangelism.

They prayed for the sick.

They led the unconverted to Christ wherever they found them.

That is what the early church did.

That is what is happening again in this generation among those who truly believe the Gospel and the Book of Acts. That is what we are encouraging believers around the world to do:

Become soul winners.

Closing Exhortation

This is why I wrote this soul-winning book.

That is why I am recording these messages for you.

They are producing fresh motivation in the lives of thousands of Christians throughout the world. Because we know people want the Gospel—because we have proven it worldwide—we are soul winners.

I believe a fresh passion for souls has been born in your heart as you have listened to these messages.

New ideas are coming to you.

New possibilities are opening before you.

Now go.

Let Christ witness through you where people are.

Go and tell them about Christ.

You will be choosing the lifestyle that guarantees true success, genuine happiness, and lasting fulfillment.

Soul winning is the greatest opportunity on earth.

The tools are available to you.

Use them.

Let them open the door to a fresh new ministry of reaching people—not only in your own area, but everywhere.

Dr. T. L. Osborn (1923–2013) was an American Pentecostal missionary evangelist, author, and Bible teacher whose ministry profoundly influenced global evangelism during the twentieth century.
