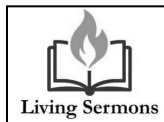

Unpacking the Gift of Salvation

Okay. If I become inaudible, let me know through the comment section, and God will do us good.

This is the second part of our series on salvation. The last time, we spoke extensively about salvation being a gift.

We said that no matter how good our righteous deeds are, they are just futility before God's presence because righteousness is judged by God's standards, not by our good.

Jesus said, when He was called "Good Master," He said, "No man is good except God." What He meant is that He is good because He is God.

His goodness comes from Him being God. Because none can be good in the righteous eyes of God, your goodness, when it is weighed in the balances of the righteous eyes of God, can just amount to futility and filthy rags.

Praise the Lord.

And we understood that the only way we can attain to that righteousness is to receive it from God and to take it by faith as the prescribed means to attain God's righteousness.

For the Bible says:

“For by the works of the law shall no flesh be justified.”

Romans 3:20, KJV

Our justification and right standing with God comes only by our faith in Jesus Christ, the Son of God, the blessed righteous One forevermore.

Amen.

So today, we are going to try a bit to unpack this great mystery.

The Bible says that this mystery was hidden in ages past, but it has now been revealed to His apostles and prophets.

It has been hidden, but let's try to unveil it as God helps us and as He gives us grace.

Amen.

Salvation Is a Gift of God

Ephesians 2:8–9

“For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God:

Not of works, lest any man should boast.”

For by grace you are saved. It is a gift of God.

It is a gift of God.

So God gifted you with salvation, and the way you receive it is by faith.

The way you receive it is by faith.

You are not doing anything to get it. The only thing you are doing is to exercise your faith in receiving it.

The Bible talks of Abraham, who was strong in faith, for he staggered not through unbelief. He just believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness.

So we have understood that we are saved by grace, and this grace is a gift that God gives us.

It is a gift.

And when we receive it, we are able to enjoy the benefits of it.

We are able to enjoy the benefits of it.

There are things this gift of salvation that God gives us entails. It entails a lot.

The thing is, after now knowing that you're born again, you have received salvation, what does this salvation entail?

Does it entail just going to church after professing Jesus?

What have you received?

The Salvation You Received Is a Package

Because you can carry—I can give you my wallet even right now by faith. It has around \$100,000 by faith.

Come on, somebody. You don't believe the man of God.

So, it may have \$100,000, and then I give you my wallet.

And the best many believers do is that Chris gave me a wallet, but you've not opened inside to see exactly what was in this wallet that I was gifted.

That's the problem with many people.

You see, **Hebrews 6:9** says:

“But, beloved, we are persuaded better things of you, and things that accompany salvation, though we thus speak.”

Listen, the salvation you received was a package of many things. And the Bible calls these things **better things that accompany your salvation**.

See, Paul taught until you slept. It is not news.

So many believers receive salvation, but the problem is that they don't know these things that accompany that salvation brought to you.

The Bible calls them **better things that accompany salvation**.

The Power of Ignorance In Salvation

Some of us are like believers in Ephesus when we read **Acts 19:1-2**.

Let's just go there and see how funny these people were.

“And it came to pass, that, while Apollos was at Corinth, Paul having passed through the upper coasts came to Ephesus: and finding certain disciples,

He said unto them, Have ye received the Holy Ghost since ye believed? And they said unto him, We have not so much as heard whether there be any Holy Ghost.”

Paul went to Ephesus. He found disciples of Jesus.

And he said to them, “Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you believed?”

And they said, “No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Ghost.”

These were people that were born again, but they never enjoyed what being saved brings, which is receiving the Holy Spirit.

You can be born again. You can be a disciple growing in church, yet you don't experience some of the things that salvation brings.

Ask your neighbor in the comment section: **After you are born again, do you know what you received, or do you know what was made available for you?**

Salvation was made available. The Holy Spirit was made available for these brethren, but they didn't even know.

That's why we are being taught. We need to be taught. We need to be reminded. We need to sit under tutors and teachers to be able to be brought into these things, because if you don't catch it, you will not enjoy it. It is like a child of a king begging in the streets, feeling angry in the streets, not knowing that my father can buy this street.

Believers are born again. They are professing Jesus, yet they neglect this great salvation. What does it come to?

Do Not Neglect So Great a Salvation

Hebrews 2:3 says:

“How shall we escape, if we neglect so great salvation?”

There is what we call neglect.

How shall we escape if we neglect such a great salvation?

The salvation we are given, it is so great that there is no way you can escape these things if you neglect it.

We can profess that we are born again, but we neglect the things that salvation brings to us.

That's what we need to know.

What has the cross of Jesus procured for us?

And what has the death and the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ made available?

You see, many believers die hoping to receive what Christ had paid for and made available to be received by faith in salvation.

Like, let me say, for example, many believers don't know that speaking in tongues is their portion in Christ. So they keep hoping that one day, when I will fall under the anointing, I'll begin to speak.

No. It is your right. You see:

“And these signs shall follow them that believe; In my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues.”

Mark 16:17, KJV

So there are things that are made available for you as long as you are a believer. Salvation has brought you into them. But enjoying their reality, you need to be enlightened.

You need to be taught. You need to search. You need to seek it.

My People Perish Because They Lack Knowledge

Hosea 4:6 says:

“My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge.”

They lack knowledge.

The reason why you are in that situation is not because God has not made a way out.

It is because you are ignorant about it.

Praise the Lord.

So salvation is a compacted gift that carries many things, many realities.

You know, there are people that just say that forgiveness and salvation is just singing in church.

There are others that even their salvation ended in speaking in tongues.

There are others whose salvation ended in wearing suits and garments.

But there is more to it.

There is more.

There are deeper realities in salvation.

And the more your eyes are open to see what salvation makes available for you, the more you will walk in freedom in all aspects of your life.

Praise be to Jesus.

There Is More to Salvation

So today I will talk about two of the things that salvation has made available.

I want to be slow. I don't want to be fast.

Isaiah 28:10 talks about:

“For precept must be upon precept, precept upon precept; line upon line, line upon line; here a little, and there a little.”

Because doctrine is not built by shouting.

It's built by curriculum and teaching.

May God give you a car. I know somebody wants that. Receive your car.

You don't want cars?

May I say amen on my prayer?

The reason why you don't believe God can give you a car is because you believe salvation is poverty.

Okay?

Now receive your car.

You see, believers right now, when you tell them something, they feel guilty of receiving what God has given you for free.

And I'm not saying God is giving you work hard. You want to work hard.

If you know you still can use your foot, the Bible says, "feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace." Your feet.

On their feet. On their feet.

On their feet. [Laughter]

On your feet is part of the armor.

That's why let none be amongst you, because the feeble knees need to be straightened.

You need to walk.

You can't do door-to-door with a car.

Glory to God.

Forgiveness of Sins and Peace with God

So, number one thing, let's read **Isaiah 53:4–5**.

We'll look at Isaiah 53, verses 4 and 5, for these are two lessons. Then I found nine of them—not nine, eleven of them.

So we'll talk about two today, then the rest in our subsequent classes until we finish. We can go this entire semester.

Let's read:

“Surely he hath borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted.

But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed.”

Isaiah 53:4–5, KJV

Number one thing that accompanied your salvation is **forgiveness of sins and peace with God**.

Note that one down.

Someone can be writing in our comment section for people that I know.

Glory to God.

You see, we were once enemies of God.

You see, when Adam sinned, we became alienated from the life of God.

So the only way—that's why the Bible says that the sacrifices of bulls and goats could not atone for our sins.

So what happened is that God brought the judgment that was due us and placed it on Jesus, so that the atonement of Jesus can procure our forgiveness of sins, that we may have peace with God.

Does the Bible say that He was wounded for our transgressions?

When Christ was being wounded, it was for our transgressions.

When He was being crushed for our iniquities, upon Him was the chastisement that brought us peace with God.

This peace we are talking about is not the peace that comes when conflict in your empire enters. The peace we are talking about is our peace with God.

We were enemies with God. And now, when Christ took the penalty of our punishment upon Him, and He was crushed and wounded, we had peace with God.

So we obtained peace from God through forgiveness of sins.

The Bible talks of the wages of sin being death. So when we sinned in Adam, our wage, the salary of our sin, was death.

And what happened?

Jesus paid that punishment on our behalf at Calvary.

Romans 6:23

“For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.”

All of us were destined to die. But what happened? God substituted it. He placed that death on Jesus at Calvary, that we may be set free from that eternal punishment.

So when we were forgiven, when Christ took our portion in death, we received forgiveness through His blood and were brought into peace with God.

You Are at Peace with God

Romans 5:1

“Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.”

You are not at war with God.

You are at peace with God in salvation.

Come on, somebody. You're not getting what I'm saying.

You are not warring with God again.

You are at peace with God.

Salvation brought your peace with God.

Colossians 1:20

“And, having made peace through the blood of his cross, by him to reconcile all things unto himself...”

He made peace.

He made peace.

You are forgiven, and you are at peace with God.

Listen, we are no longer God's enemies because we have been redeemed, and the penalty of our sins has been paid for at Calvary.

What made you an enemy with God was sin.

And that sin Jesus took care of.

You Have Redemption Through His Blood

Ephesians 1:7

“In whom we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of his grace;”

So in Christ, you have redemption.

You have been brought back to God.

You are at peace with God.

You see, my question has always been: How can God, who is so holy, God who hates sin, forgive sinners?

But then let me tell you something.

I know in Christ you're not supposed to hate anybody. But then, when we used to hate people, you realize that you hated them not because of who they are, but you hated them because of what they did to you.

True?

Choose one of the true.

You hate.

So, so you became an enemy to God not because you are an enemy, but because you sinned.

So my question is: How can God come and forgive the sinner, yet God hates sin?

The Bible says:

“Thou art of purer eyes than to behold evil, and canst not look on iniquity...”

Habakkuk 1:13

How can God be so holy, so righteous, and forgive the sinner?

He hates sin, yet forgives the sinner.

And I realized because the punishment that was due us was laid at Jesus at Calvary, and we were declared free, forgiven, and redeemed.

Our Redemption Was Paid Complete

God is the One who found fault with us. He's the One who is sinned against, and He's the One who paid the price of our redemption.

It's like—let me use Wilmer.

Wilmer borrowed money from me at my multi-million business in Nairobi, and then she has refused to pay. This is an example. And then she has become my enemy.

What happens?

What God did—I go and pay what Wilmer took so that Wilmer can become my friend again.

That's what God did.

You wronged Him.

He paid for your wrong that you may become His friend. That's what we call, “What manner of love God has for you.”

He's the One that you wronged.

Not your boyfriend that left you.

Not your girlfriend that left you. Not your friend that gossiped about you and you left. When they were gossiping, they were not wronging you. They were wronging God. And God paid for their sins. Who are you not to forgive them when God is the One that forgave?

Somebody doesn't like this. Don't put in your heart people that God has forgiven. A forgiven sinner is hating another forgiven sinner, and God has forgiven them both, instead of now them forgiving each other.

Are you getting now what I'm saying?

It is God that you sinned against, and it is God that paid the price of your sins and set you free.

It Is God Who Justifies You

Romans 8:33–35

As we continue, look at this:

“Who shall lay any thing to the charge of God's elect? It is God that justifieth.

Who is he that condemneth? It is Christ that died, yea rather, that is risen again, who is even at the right hand of God, who also maketh intercession for us.”

I always say this jokingly, and I say that for me, Jesus intercedes for me in heaven. The Holy Ghost intercedes in me on earth.

I cannot fail.

Two-thirds of the Godhead have just specialized in praying for me.

Jesus in heaven.

The Holy Ghost in me.

Who is he that condemns?

Verse 35:

“Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?”

Nothing.

Why?

Because it is God that came in the gap and paid the debts of my sin.

I am free.

I am set free.

I am forgiven.

I am at peace with my Maker.

Somebody, you need to keep that in your heart from today:

I am at peace with God.

Yes, I know you always say, “I have failed God.”

But God has paid for your failure.

He has paid for it.

I know you give yourself condemnation for what happened many years ago.

I know maybe you did unimaginable things.

You thought God cannot even look at you.

I tell you the truth.

He is the One that died for you.

There are people that are in guilt. They cannot forgive themselves.

They think that what they did—

Let me tell you the truth.

Some of us who are preaching, what we did—Kai!

Some of you should mentor us. Most of you, actually.

If it were by works, I could be sitting under most of you because what I did is more than what you think you did.

You just stole sugar and you think—

It is God that justified you.

If it were not for God giving us peace in Christ Jesus, we couldn't even be doing what we are doing.

That's why we love Him, because he that much is forgiven loves more.

I'm quoting the Scriptures, though. I'm not saying now that because you misbehaved before Christ, now you have no story.

You are also forgiven.

You Are Saved by Grace Through Faith

I hear people talk of their negatives before they came to Christ until you are like, you wish that you are given opportunity to sin—

Before you come to Christ.

Please, glory to God.

If you never knew anybody, if you never slept with any man or woman before coming to Christ, I honor you.

And if you did, I also honor you.

You are not out.

Christ forgave you.

Only that you need to work more harder to delete Egypt from your system.

Glory to God.

No, nowadays people talk of their negatives.

When you hear Reverend Cassian preaching, you're like, "Oh, God, I wish I had a bit of the world. It is too late."

We need to have a Reverend Cassian to have an apostle to balance the equation in the Body.

One is saying, "I've never touched a woman since I was born."

Another one is saying, "I touched more than 50."

And all of them right now, they are under grace.

So stop stressing yourself.

You are saved by grace through faith, not of your works.

How many believe they have peace with God?

Raise your hand.

Only eight?

And the rest?

Praise the Lord.

So number one is that we were forgiven, and we have peace with Him.

And I'm starting from the lowest basics.

As we go higher, as we proceed, we realize there are things that your salvation has for you.

Praise the Lord.

Hallelujah.

Turn to your neighbor and tell them:

"You have peace with God."

You have peace with God.

Some of you are suffering under guilt.

You can't even pray.

Somebody can't even pray.

When you go to pray, the devil brings to you:

“Remember what you did. God can never use you.”

God Can Still Use You

Paul was the persecutor of the church.

Paul was the persecutor of the church.

And Paul—God used Paul.

You couldn't even—

Peter, that had never eaten unclean things, God told Peter, “Go.”

No.

So, Lord, in Acts, there was the same grace that works in Peter for the Jews; it is the same grace that works in Paul to the Gentiles. God is not biased. When you believe in Jesus, you have peace. And that peace is because you have been forgiven.

You're not a sinner. **You're a saint.**

Even the church of Corinth, that was very carnal, Paul called them saints.

Praise God.

Healing

Number two.

Nowadays, I'm learning to stick within the parameters of the syllabus, and I trust God I'll finish in time—or on time, depending on the school you went through.

Bethwell knows better. He was in Alliance.

Some of us were in Kanye through CDF-sponsored schools. We learned English in Luo.

But we thank God.

Number two is our **healing**.

And listen to me when I'm going to talk about healing.

The second aspect that salvation brings, in that gift, when you unpack it, is **healing**.

With His Stripes We Were Healed

Isaiah 53:4–5 says:

“Surely he hath borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted.

But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed.”

With His stripes we were healed.

So when Jesus was being caned, He was beaten.

I think I had given an illustration of how the Romans came at Jesus. They were thirty-nine, and I don't want to go into that.

That's emotional trauma.

Listen to this.

The aspect being talked about here is **physical healing**.

I know there are people that are born spiritual; they want to spiritualize everything.

See, there's healing that was there.

You mean that spiritual healing?

No.

Here we are talking about **physical healing**.

Listen.

Jesus was wounded physically that we may be healed physically.

Are you getting me?

We are healed.

When He was being beaten, it is for your healing—physical healing.

Healing Was Included in the Atonement

Listen, when the Bible speaks about the atonement, the death of Jesus, it never speaks about healing in future.

Listen to this.

When you read Isaiah, you see:

“And with his stripes we are healed.”

We are healed.

This was before the cross.

We are healed.

This was before the cross.

We are healed.

So even before the cross, this dimension was available to everyone that could access it by faith, like Abraham with his tribe.

Physical Healing Is Part of Salvation

We thank God. We thank God.

Let us go to **Matthew 8:16-17**:

“When the even was come, they brought unto him many that were possessed with devils: and he cast out the spirits with his word, and healed all that were sick:

That it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Esaias the prophet, saying, Himself took our infirmities, and bare our sicknesses.”

Listen to that.

That evening, they brought to Jesus many who were oppressed by demons, and He cast out the spirits with a word and healed all who were sick.

This was after He had healed Simon Peter’s mother-in-law, who had a fever. He rebuked the fever, and the fever went.

One thing I want to challenge you with is this: **How can a fever be cast out? Can fever have a personality?**

We will talk about that when we talk about healing as a ministry.

But notice what Matthew says: Jesus “healed all that were sick.”

And verse 17 says this was to fulfill what was spoken by Isaiah the prophet:

“Himself took our infirmities, and bare our sicknesses.”

So, the healing that Isaiah spoke about was **physical healing** of people who were sick and people who were oppressed.

Are you together up to that place?

The fulfillment of that prophecy of Isaiah was physical healing according to this Scripture.

By His Wounds You Have Been Healed

Now, **1 Peter 2:24**. Be fast; I only have ten minutes.

The Bible says:

“Who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed.”

Look at this. It is **past tense**.

When Peter is talking about Isaiah, he is speaking in the past tense. Isaiah says, “with his stripes we are healed.” Peter is saying, **“by whose stripes ye were healed.”**

Come on!

Do you realize that sickness—whatever it is—is a past tense in God's agenda, in God's calendar, in God's dealing?

Praise God!

Peter said, “By whose stripes ye were healed.”

Somebody, you need to stay on that word:

I have been healed in Jesus Christ.

And stick to it until you see its physical manifestation.

It may take time, but refuse to believe that you are not healed. In Christ, you are already healed.

It may take ten years, but stick to that word. Speak it. Confess it. Give God thanks.

Stop telling God every day, “Oh God, this malaria.”

Tell God, “**Thank You for healing me of this malaria.**”

And keep giving Him thanks.

The Bible says:

“We having the same spirit of faith, according as it is written, I believed, and therefore have I spoken; we also believe, and therefore speak.”

We believe and we speak.

We believe that we have been healed.

The same way I believe I have been forgiven.

Even if I feel as if I cannot pray, even if I feel as if God is far away, you see, the thesis is this: don't say, “Lord, You seem far away, a million miles away.”

Yes, He may seem like that.

But I know that **I have peace with Him.**

Even if I don't feel it, I will confess it.

I will thank Him for what He did on Calvary.

And I will not allow emotions and feelings and reality to change my confession.

I confess His Word.

I know I'm forgiven.

I know I'm healed.

I am not complaining again. I am giving glory to Jesus for what He has done.

That's how men of faith transact.

By faith.

Come on!

I feel like blasting in other tongues, but the Bible says, "How will it profit you?"

Oh, come on!

It will not profit you.

Hallelujah!

Healing Is Part of Your Salvation

Physical healing is part of your salvation.

It is part of it.

Don't take healing at the expense of medical care. Yes, I'm not saying you don't go to the hospital.

Of course, I've trained six years to be paid for visiting me!

But we thank God.

I'm telling you that what you are paying me for, **Jesus paid for it.**

What you are paying me for, Jesus paid for it.

But it's for you. You see?

Yes.

As you are growing in faith, it is good to visit me, and I'll take it.

Even just seeing me will be like five or ten thousand shillings!

And the Lord—it will be the Lord who has provided for me through you because He has sent you.

And I need to be very careful unless I lose my daily meal.

Praise God!

So, have you noticed that now?

Healing is part of salvation, and you are healed by His stripes.

It is not a future thing.

It is now.

Only that it may not manifest now, but **it is done in God's calendar.**

Praise be to Jesus!

It is done.

When Your Heart Condemns You

Now, what you need to do is thank God when you feel as if you don't have peace in your heart with God.

Can we get— is it First John 4?

I'm sorry, I'm going back to peace with God. Let me just open my Bible.

1 John 3:20.

The Bible says:

“For if our heart condemn us, God is greater than our heart, and knoweth all things.”

What is this Scripture saying?

Sometimes your heart may condemn you.

But what does He say?

God is greater than your heart.

God is greater.

What God did is greater than what your heart makes you feel.

Praise God!

Let's go back to healing.

Salvation and the Healing of the Lame Man

Let's read this passage in **Acts 4:7**.

I'm quite sure that Samuel took one-hour bundles and they are about to finish, so it will just be fast!

And I'm praying that God will do you good.

Are you able to hear me?

This is the story. You remember when Peter—of course, all of you know this thing. If you listen to me, you know this:

“Silver and gold have I none.”

This was the man. This is the story after he was healed.

Peter and John were taken to the Sanhedrin, and they were giving their defense. And when they had set them in the midst, they inquired:

“By what power, or by what name, have ye done this?”

Then Peter, filled with the Holy Ghost, said unto them:

“Ye rulers of the people, and elders of Israel,

If we this day be examined of the good deed done to the impotent man, by what means he is made whole;

Be it known unto you all, and to all the people of Israel, that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom ye crucified, whom God raised from the dead, even by him doth this man stand here before you whole.”

Well, Jesus was crucified.

Then Peter says:

“This is the stone which was set at nought of you builders, which is become the head of the corner.”

Verse 12 is my emphasis:

“Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved.”

Look at what I'm bringing to you.

Have you realized that **salvation is tied to that man's healing?**

The story was about the healing of that man.

And yet Peter is telling us that it was because of **salvation**.

Have you gotten it really?

Your healing is part of the package that salvation brought.

Stop postponing it.

Confess it.

Refuse to be put down by a medical doctor's report.

Lay hold.

I'm not saying you refuse to go to clinics. Of course, you guys are learned. You can think better than that.

But what I'm saying is, don't skip that.

I know of people in Africa and Kenya who don't believe in blood transfusion.

And I'm like, "Okay, really? You'll die? Just be transfused by faith as you pray."

That's also part of faith!

Even as Isaiah was going to administer the prophecy of healing to Hezekiah, he took some leaves as medicine.

So, I'm not anti-medicine. Otherwise, I couldn't waste six years of my life doing so!

But what I'm telling you is that **your healing was part of the package.**

Praise God!

Your healing was part of the package.

Refuse to be put down by sickness that Christ paid for.

Praise be to Jesus!

Refuse.

Lay hold on what God has given you in Christ Jesus.

Closing Prayer

Lord Jesus, we thank You. We bless You for today's class. We thank You for forgiveness and peace. We thank You for healing.

Lord, I pray that anyone here that is sick, may You touch them. May You touch them. May it become a reality and experience of their lives. Anyone there that is sorrowful, that is in depression, that has no peace within them, we pray for the joy of the Spirit.

We pray for the joy of the Spirit. May You release that reality that Christ paid and died for, in the name of Jesus.

Thank You, precious Lord.

We thank You.

We bless You.

In Jesus' mighty name we pray.

Amen.
